Congratulations to Kathryn (Katy) DaSilva of Long Hill's Girl Scout Troop 82224 for achieving the highest award possible – the Girl Scout Gold

For her Gold Award, Katy built a Legacy Wall, now sitting outside the child development center at The Center for Great Expectations (CGE) in Franklin, NJ. The Legacy Wall is a collection of painted tiles that were created by the residents and staff of the CGE, as well as other community members. The wall is displayed outside of "Katy's Place," the child development center at CGE.

Katy's Place is named for Katy Deitchman, Katy's beloved Auntie Katy, who died in 2003 from a rare form of cancer. The goal of Katy's project was to help raise awareness for CGE's mission of caring for homeless pregnant or parenting women and adolescents, and breaking the cycle of trauma, homelessness, abuse, and

The designations are based on scores by these students on the Reading Test, Writing and Language Test, and Mathematics Test for the 2018 PSAT (Preliminary Scholastic Aptitude Test)/NMSQT (National Merit Scholarship Qualifying Test (NMSQT) last Fall.

This year's four National Merit Semifinalists means that as many as 52 WHRHS students have qualified as National Merit Semifinalists during the most recent six years.


The year-to-year totals have been:

Class of 2015 - 11; Class of 2016 - 6;

Class of 2017 –10; Class of 2018 – 15;

Class of 2019 - 6; and Class of 2020 - 4.

The National Merit Scholarship Program reports that the Finalists will be named later in the year. A percentage of Finalists are expected to compete for National Merit Scholarships, according to the scholarship program. Taken into account for those scholarship selections will be a variety of factors, including the student's subsequent SAT scores that confirm the score in the PSAT/NMSQT, an essay, as well as an endorsement and recommendation from the student's high school, demonstrations of leadership and participation in school and community activities.







There was plenty of food to choose from, and even a potted-plant raffle. The day was met with great weather, good food, and lots of smiling faces.




