#### **SCHOOLS EARN 3 AWARDS FOR COMMUNICATION & OUTREACH**

Linden Public Schools received three awards at the New Jersey School Communication Awards on September 26, 2019 – the only school district statewide to be honored three times.

The awards, given out by the New Jersey School Public Relations Association, represent the best work of school communication professionals in getting news and information out to students, families, and the community during the 2018-19 school year. There were 64 entries from 34 school districts. Entries were judged by 11 judges in four states, including professors and practicing communication professionals.

The honors were accepted by Linden Communication Coordinator Gary Miller at an awards ceremony at the Heldrich Hotel in New Brunswick.

"It was an honor to represent Linden Public Schools at the School Communication Awards," he said. "Recognition like this serves to underscore how many great stories there are to tell about teachers, administrators and students in Linden Public Schools."

Interim Superintendent Denise Cleary said the district is fortunate to have Miller handling communication and media relations.

"Mr. Miller's stories, photos and media highlights get the word out on all we have to celebrate in the Linden Public Schools," she said. "His stories are often picked up by larger media outlets, and he truly deserves the recognition from the New Jersey Schools Public Relations Association. Gary is an invaluable staff member and we look forward to more great things to come as he continues to keep us in the spotlight."

Linden was honored with a second place in the electronic newsletter category; third place for media relations human interest; and third place for photography.

The electronic newsletter award was given for Superintendent's Report, the district's interactive newsletter that is sent out monthly. (The newsletter was recently renamed #LindenCelebrates for the 2019-2020 school year.) It has brief articles followed by links to longer articles and sometimes more photos and videos on the district website. The award was

The media relations award was given for a story about a memorial service at School No. 4 for kindergartner Sophia Thomas, who was killed along with her grandmother in a car accident last year.

The photography award was given for a photo of School No. 6 thirdgrader Adrien Williams on a day when representatives of Apple visited his school and School No. 8, both designated as Apple Schools. The photo shows Adrien displaying work on his MacBook Air laptop, surrounded by students and teachers, many from School No. 8.

"I've always liked that photo because it shows three things that are very important to all of us in Linden Public Schools," said Miller, who took the photo. "Diversity, technology, and collaboration. It shows that we're like a family in Linden, but also focuses on real academic achievement."

The NJSPRA School Communication Awards were developed to recognize professional school communicators in New Jersey, and the products they develop that go above and beyond to disseminate important messages to their communities.

"Congratulations to Linden Public Schools for both the outstanding tool they have created for their audiences as well as setting a standard for all of us in this important field of school communications," said Lori Perlow, president of NJSPRA and communications manager at Camden County Educational Services Commission.

### TWELVE UNION COUNTY P.O.S OFFER CONVENIENT PASSPORT APPLICATION SERVICE

If you live in any one of the 21 Union County municipalities and need to apply for a U.S. Passport, chances are there is a Post Office within an easy 5-10 minute commute that can accept your application. Twelve Post Offices throughout Union County offer convenient passport application service on behalf of the United States Department of State.

The Union County Post Offices that offer passport application service include: Berkeley Heights, Cranford, Elizabeth Main Post Office, Fanwood, Garwood, Linden Main Post Office, Netherwood Station in Plainfield, Scotch Plains, Springfield, Summit, Union Main Post Office, and Westfield.

Although some Union County Post Offices like Garwood, Netherwood Station, and Scotch Plains accept walk-ins, many Post Offices offering passport services require an appointment. For appointments during regular passport processing hours, the U.S. Postal Service has made scheduling easier with the USPS Retail Customer Appointment Scheduler tool (RCAS) at usps.com/scheduler.

The RCAS tool will display available appointment times for participating Post Office locations that offer passport appointment services within the selected radius. Users will receive notifications of their scheduled appointment via email or text.

Application forms and information on the costs and how to apply for a passport can be found at usps.com/passport.

The U.S. Department of State's National Passport Information Center is available to answer passport questions by phone or email in English or Spanish. If you have a question about passports you can call toll-free 1-877-487-2778 or email NPIC@state.gov.

LJ added, "Everyone was saying, 'Congratulations' and 'We're so proud of you.'"

But they didn't let it go to their heads.

"Then we went back to our day, going to classes and stuff," LJ said.

Students were allowed to take shots at their principal during the "Pie the Principal" fundraiser, lining up to throw pies - actually Styrofoam plates of whipped cream - at Olivero.

The event raised \$250 for the school's Positive Behavior Support in Schools (PBSIS) program, which rewards the students for good behavior and helps develop a family atmosphere at the school.

"Although the main objective of the fundraiser School No. 4 Principal Suzanne Olivero took was to raise funds to update the game room," Olivero said, "I thought this would be a good way of showing the entire school community that I am 100 percent vested in the success of our students, and I am willing to do whatever it takes to ensure their overall success."

> Students paid 50 cents to get a lottery ticket for a chance to throw a pie. The more they paid, the more tickets they got. Students were randomly selected from each grade level to throw a pie. Staff members made larger donations for the chance to throw a pie at their boss.

> Olivero was protected by a plastic jump suit and goggles, but was nevertheless coated with whipped cream at the end of each of two sessions. The event was held in the school cafeteria on top of plastic tarps.

> "Everyone from the students to the staff had a great time," Olivero said. "I think this event allowed for all to see me in a different, less serious light."

> Before the main event, students learned about the PBSIS program. Staff members give out what the school calls "Victory Vouchers" to children for good behavior. The vouchers can be cashed in for trips to the school's game room or for items in the school store.

> The students learned about the Six Pillars of Character on which the PBSIS program is based: trustworthiness, respect, responsibility, fairness, caring and citizenship. These traits will be reinforced throughout the school year at PBSIS events and in everyday lessons.

> The school also created a "Buddy Bench" as part of the program. The Buddy Bench sits near the school playground, and students who are feeling lonely or need a playmate can sit on the bench to let other children know to invite them to play.

> "Students are eager to exhibit good behavior and character, and reap the rewards associated with that," Olivero said. "I want the excitement to continue, and for all students and staff to put their best foot forward to ensure we have an amazing school year."
