ANNUAL SCOUTING FOR FOOD DRIVE SET FOR NOVEMBER 23

New Providence's Boy Scouts and Cub Scouts join together once again with Faith Lutheran Church for their annual Scouting for Food drive. Now in its 38th year, this community-wide event collects non-perishable items for the Starfish Food Pantry as well as struggling families and individuals who receive assistance from the Community Service Association of New Providence.

Boy Scouts and Cub Scouts will deliver grocery bags to Borough residents' homes on Saturday, November 16 and Sunday, November 17. On Saturday, November 23, they will pick up the filled bags and bring them to Faith Lutheran Church where they will be sorted, packed, and prepared for delivery to the food pantry and to the New Providence residents in need.

Monica Macauley, a New Providence mom and Scout coordinator for this event said, "This service project is really what New Providence is



all about. Neighbors helping neighbors. New Providence residents have always been so generous with their non-perishable food donations. She continued, "As the holiday season approaches, let's continue to be mindful of those who may be struggling financially to put food on their tables. The scouts in New Providence continue to exemplify the scout oath by taking part in this food drive. Thank you all those who continue to donate food or volunteer their time to this event, including our local supermarkets for their generous food bag donations."

She also urges neighbors to remember that the scouts will be busy in the town on these days, "We ask local drivers remember to use caution as the boys head door-to-door and cross streets as they place and collect the food bags."

In addition to staples such as pasta, soup, and cereal (both cold and hot), other items requested for the food drive include mayonnaise, ketchup, mustard, pancake mix, and pancake syrup. The organizers and volunteers respectfully ask that residents do not send in food items past their expiration dates.

Scouting for Food would not be possible without the support of area grocery stores including Kings in Summit, ShopRite in Stirling, and Stop & Shop in Berkeley Heights (at press time). These stores generously donate more than 5,000 grocery bags to the cause.

VETERAN'S DAY REMEMBRANCE

Veterans, family and friends are cordially invited to attend the Eleventh Hour Service at American Legion Post 433, located at 357 Elkwood Avenue, New Providence. Doors open at 10:30 a.m., on Monday, November 11, 2019.

This day 101 years ago, commemorates the cessation of hostilities during WWI between Allied and German forces at "the Eleventh Hour on the Eleventh Day of the Eleventh Month" 1918. After four years of bitter fighting, the Great War was finally over. The Armistice was signed at 5 a.m. in a railway carriage in the forest of Compiegne, France on November 11, 1918. Six hours later at 11 a.m. the war ended.

This year we celebrate the 100th Anniversary of the American Legion chartered and incorporated by Congress in 1919 as "the patriotic organization devoted to mutual helpfulness and social change for hundreds of benefits for our veterans and the important programs for our children and youth." Doors at the Post Home will open at 10:30 a.m., please be there before 10:45 a.m. so all are settled in for the events of the day. The American Legion Post #433 members will lead an inspiring short service promptly at 11:11 a.m. to remind us of that momentous occasion as we also honor our local Veterans lost during 2019.

And there will be music by our local vocalists, Kathy Martin and Mary Damato, "The Cover Girls." AUTHOR INGRID CHARLERY SPEAKS AT FAITH LUTHERAN

Charlery spoke at the Forum of Faith Lutheran in New Providence. The weekly Forum occurs between the two Sunday morning liturgical services.

Ms. Charlery told the members of Faith of her inspirational story, which she has authored in her book, "The Strength of a Woman! Through the darkness came light and strength." She described the circumstances that forced her and her young daughter from a comfortable home onto the dirty and uncomfortable floors in shelters for the homeless.

As she sought to improve her and her daughter's status, Ms. Charlery learned of Family Promise that serves persons who have lost their housing and in which Faith Lutheran has participated for thirty years. Periodically during the year, for a week at a time, Faith provides rooms, beds, meals, showers, a washing machine and dryer for persons who participate in Family Promise. Ms. Charlery and her daughter were guests of Faith.

Ms. Charlery's main message was that she survived the seemingly insurmountable emotional pain through the power of prayer. Today, she is a public speaker and a counselor for the depressed, desperate and suicidal.

The following are words of Ms. Charlery:

"The Strength of a Woman" was written to On Sunday, September 22, 2019, Ingrid rebuild, empower, inspire and strengthen others going through depression and the thought of suicide. I wanted to help others come out of the stigma that others put us in. I want everyone to know no matter what obstacles that may come their way, Don't Give Up. God is able to pull through it. I took all of my pain and turned it into a Gain."

2019 LEAF COLLECTION

Residents will have three (3) options for leaf collection this fall:

1. Put leaves in cans, open containers, or paper bags and place at curbside for Monday collection. Leaves, grass, brush, and garden debris are collected every Monday through December 9. (Must be placed at curb prior to 5 a.m.)

- Have your landscaper collect leaves. Landscapers are responsible for disposal of leaves and are not permitted to dump at DPW. If your landscaper plans to blow leaves into the curb they must follow the pickup schedule for your street and pay for a permit to have them vacuumed.
- 2. You may purchase a permit for \$55 to have your leaves vacuumed from the curb.

(Fee is waived for seniors who receive a \$250 Senior Deduction, Disabled Person Deduction, or Widow of Senior/Disabled Person Deduction. Please note the Senior Deduction is not the same as the Property Tax Reimbursement or the Homestead Credit, and qualified individuals must meet income and age requirements set by State of NJ. To verify eligibility you may contact the Borough Clerk's Office 908-665-1400 x0.)

LEAF COLLECTION GUIDELINES

Residents who choose to purchase a leaf permit must place the permit in a window or door that is visible from the street during their collection week. These residents will have their leaves vacuumed at curbside in accordance with the schedule listed below.
