MIDDLE SCHOOLERS "GET FIT WITH FANWOOD'S FINEST"

The whistle sounds and forty t-shirted young people sprint across the blacktop at the Stamler Police Academy in Scotch Plains as six instructors urge them on. But these aren't police recruits. They are middle school students who signed up for a one week program of fitness and fun created by the Fanwood Police Department. Get Fit With Fanwood's Finest was the idea of Chief Richard Trigo and his administrative assistant Dianne Howarth, with the help of a \$2,000 grant from the First Responders Children's Foundation and donations from the Union County Prosecutor's Office.

"We wanted to get the kids out of the house," said Chief Trigo. "So, we said let's do something where we workout with the kids. I approached some of our officers assigned to the Union County Emergency Response Team about what daily workouts they go through with their training. I said I'd like to incorporate that into something for the kids. And the officers just took off with it."

The two hour gathering is not the rigorous, boot-camplike routine that actually occurs at the police academy, but an informal and relaxed set of basic exercises mixed with field games, tug-of-war and relay races.

"We can make workouts enjoyable," said Officer Elliott Bernard, one of the instructors. "It doesn't have to be just push-ups, sit-ups and running for hours at a time."

The five-morning program is free, thanks to the grant. In addition to being an end-of-summer activity, it allows police officers to reach out to children in a non-official capacity, an investment in future relationships.

"We're not in uniform, we're not in that patrol car," said Sgt. Marc Gottlick. "We're out here. We're running relay races with them, giving high-five and fist-bumps. They're getting to know us a little more individually."


"All the officers in Fanwood are approachable," added the chief's assistant Dianne Howarth. "Now the kids see it. So, if they ever have a problem, they're not going to be afraid to come to the police department or reach out to one of the police officers."


In the last event of the day, a tug-of-war pitting the six officers against a group of kids, the kids won.

"You see what you accomplished when you work together?" Chief Trigo told the students afterwards. "Great job, everyone!"




HEARING SOCIETY SPEECH READING CLASSES

1,200 VOLUNTEERS SPEND A DAY OF SERVICE IN SCOTCH PLAINS

Evangel Church of Scotch Plains sent approximately 1,200 volunteers out into the streets of Scotch Plains, Plainfield, Fanwood, and Woodbridge as part of Service for Service on Sunday, October 13, 2019.

Hundreds of volunteers packed over 118,000 meals for Feed My Starving Children, which will feed 324 malnourished children for just over a year. Other volunteers helped build two homes with Habitat for Humanity, while local first responders were treated to surprise lunches.

Another group of volunteers went to three public schools to paint, while some went to visit patients at the local veteran's hospital and nursing homes. In addition, over 50 local homes received some much-needed handiwork. Yet another group of volunteers helped rehab a room and kitchen at the Plainfield Cultural Arts Center. In total, over 30 projects were completed.

Birthed out of the havoc wrought by Superstorm Sandy, Service for Service volunteers

If you live in any one of the 21 Union County municipalities and need to apply for a U.S. Passport, chances are there is a Post Office within an easy 5-10 minute commute that can accept your application. Twelve Post Offices throughout Union County offer convenient passport application service on behalf of the United States Department of State.

The Union County Post Offices that offer passport application service include: Berkeley Heights, Cranford, Elizabeth Main Post Office, Fanwood, Garwood, Linden Main Post Office, Netherwood Station in Plainfield, Scotch Plains, Springfield, Summit, Union Main Post Office, and Westfield.

Although some Union County Post Offices like Garwood, Netherwood Station, and Scotch Plains accept walk-ins, many Post Offices offering passport services require an appointment. For appointments during regular passport processing hours, the U.S. Postal Service has made scheduling easier with the USPS Retail Customer Appointment Scheduler tool (RCAS) at usps.com/scheduler.

The RCAS tool will display available appointment times for participating Post Office locations that offer passport appointment services within the selected radius. Users will receive notifications of their scheduled appointment via email or text.


