NEW JERSEY NATIVE ENTERS CLASS OF 2023 PLEBE SUMMER AT THE U.S. NAVAL ACADEMY

ANNAPOLIS, Md. – John Robert Trombetta a graduate of Morristown – Beard School in Morristown, NJ was inducted into the Naval Academy Class of 2023 Thursday, June 27, and will begin six challenging weeks of basic midshipman training as part of Plebe Summer.

Approximately 1,200 candidates are selected each year for the Academy's "plebe" or freshman class, and each student is required to participate in Plebe Summer. Last year the Naval Academy received over 16,000 applications for the Class of 2022.

During this time, plebes have no access to television, movies, the internet or music, and restricted access to cell phones. They are only permitted to make three calls during the six weeks of Plebe Summer.

The pressure and rigor of Plebe Summer is carefully designed to help plebes prepare for their first academic year at the Naval Academy and the four years of challenge, which awaits them.

As the summer progresses, the new midshipmen rapidly assimilate basic skills in seamanship, navigation, damage control, sailing, and handling yard patrol craft. Plebes also learn infantry drill and how to shoot 9 mm pistols and M-16 rifles.

Other daily training sessions involve moral, mental, physical or professional development and team-building skills. Activities include swimming, martial arts, basic rock climbing, obstacle, endurance and confidence courses designed to develop physical, mental and teambuilding skills. Forty hours are devoted to the instruction of infantry drill and five formal parades.

Founded in 1845, the U.S. Naval Academy today is a prestigious four-year service academy that prepares midshipmen morally, mentally and physically to be professional officers in the naval service. More than 4,400 men and women representing every state in the U.S. and several foreign countries make up the student body, known as the Brigade of Midshipmen. U.S.

News and World Reports has recognized the Naval Academy as a top five undergraduate engineering school and a top 20 best liberal arts college. Midshipmen learn from military and civilian instructors and participate in intercollegiate varsity sports and extracurricular activities. They also study subjects such as leadership, ethics, small arms, drill, seamanship and navigation, tactics, naval engineering and weapons, and military law. Upon graduation, midshipmen earn a Bachelor of Science degree in a choice of 25 different subject majors and go on to serve at least five years of exciting and rewarding service as commissioned officers in the U.S. Navy or U.S. Marine Corps.

The Brigade of Midshipmen is comprised of approximately 4,400 students from every state in the union and a handful of international students. Each year, approximately 1,200 young men and women are admitted to the Naval Academy's incoming class.


Claus Shop can purchase the gifts that allow less fortunate neighbors to experience the joy of holiday giving without financial burden.

STARTING OVER AFTER FIRE GUTS HOME OF 56 YEARS

A house fire left a Summit family with just only minor injuries. clothes on their backs in less than 10 minutes on Veterans Day when an electrical fire at 59 Morris Avenue destroyed a family home and left its eight occupants with essentially only the clothes they were wearing when they escaped the blaze.

Billye Brown, age 87, owned the two-family home, which she occupied with her granddaughter and her family.

The fire broke out on Monday morning shortly after breakfast and quickly spread throughout the house. Qadra Brown, mother of three small children, ages 6-months 2 and 3, along with her grandmother Billye were forced to pass the infant though a broken first floor window to safety. Mercifully, all family members evacuated the building safely with

This fire leaves my grandmother along with my sister and her three children homeless and without any possessions. I'm just looking to raise money to help them in the short term so The little foundation hopes the Summit they can rent a long term residence and with winter coming I want to make sure they have clothes etc. I know this is hard asking for help with it's the holiday season but anything will help even if only a dollar.







We are very proud of her."

"This award means we are able to shine an even bigger spotlight on our mission of supporting children, teens, young adults, and their families, who are coping with loss due to death or illness," said Mary. "In NJ alone there are currently over 114,000 bereaved youth who have had a parent die. Nationally the number is over 4.9 million. At Imagine over 430 children and adults from 59 towns across New Jersey attend our support groups every two weeks in Mountainside and Newark. However, serving 430 people at our centers is just the tip of the iceberg in terms of youth needing support. Therefore, our mission also includes a focus on education, to make sure wherever a grieving child or teen turns in their life, there is an adult who pays attention and understands the need to provide support and to listen. Our goal is to create grief-informed communities, school districts, agencies, workplaces, and neighborhoods in New Jersey and nationally.

"Volunteering and working in the field of Children's Grief Support since 1997, I am so honored to receive this award," said Robinson.



12. The Summit Fire Department teamed up with the National Fire Protection Association (NFPA) to promote the 2019 Fire Prevention Week campaign: "Not Every Hero Wears a Cape. Plan and Practice Your Escape!" The goal of the campaign is to educate about the small but important actions people can take to keep themselves and those around them safe.

In 2017 U.S. Fire Departments responded to 357,000 home structure fires. Fires caused 2,630 fire deaths and 10,600 fire injuries. On average, seven people died in a home fire per day during 2012 to 2016.

"These numbers illustrate how home fires continue to pose a significant threat to safety," reports Lorraine Carli, NFPA Vice President of Outreach and Advocacy. "In a typical home fire people may have as few as one to two minutes to

Fire Prevention week was October 6 through escape safely from the time the smoke alarm sounds. Escape planning and practice is essential in giving everyone enough time to get out."

> While NFPA and the Summit Fire Department are focusing on home fires, these messages apply to virtually any location.

> "Situational awareness is a skill people need to use wherever they are," explains Chief Eric Evers. "When entering a new location, I always advise people to look around for available exits. If the alarm system sounds, take it seriously and exit the building immediately."




