## **OVER 120 VOLUNTEERS HELP IN ANNUAL FOOD COLLECTION**

Members of the community participated in the 38th annual food collection and sorting event at Faith Lutheran Church in New Providence on Sat., November 23, 2019.

Every year, non-perishable food items are collected by the Cub Scouts and Boy Scouts of New Providence from locals in their "Scouting for Food" drive. These items are for the Starfish Food Pantry in Plainfield, as well as for struggling families and individuals who receive assistance from the Community Service Association of New Providence.

Boy Scouts and Cub Scouts delivered grocery bags the weekend before the drive to residents' homes and then they returned on the 23rd to pick up the filled bags and brought them to Faith Lutheran Church. From 9:00 a.m. to 1:00 p.m., volunteers from Cub Scout Packs 99, 263, 363 and 368, and Boy Scout Troops 1 and 68, from both New Providence and Berkeley Heights, unloaded bags of food from a steady flow of cars of the scouting families of New Providence. More volunteers from the community then sorted, packed and prepared the donations for delivery to food pantries and to residents in need.

This year, over 120 volunteers from the parish of Faith Lutheran, the Community Service Association of New Providence, residents of Lantern Hill, residents of New Providence and Girl Scouts, Cub Scouts and Boy Scouts assisted in the event. Hundreds of bags of food were collected, valued at approximately \$53,000.

On November 30, volunteers again helped, this time to deliver the food to the Starfish Pantry and local residents in need.

As Cheryl Bock, organizer of the event for Faith Lutheran said: "It's a wonderful event my family has been involved with and to me it's just not Thanksgiving without it."







The Union County Post Offices that offer passport application service include: Berkeley Heights, Cranford, Elizabeth Main Post Office, Fanwood, Garwood, Linden Main Post Office, Netherwood Station in Plainfield, Scotch Plains, Springfield, Summit, Union Main Post Office, and Westfield.

Although some Union County Post Offices like Garwood, Netherwood Station, and Scotch Plains accept walk-ins, many Post Offices offering passport services require an appointment. For appointments during regular passport processing hours, the U.S. Postal Service has made scheduling easier with the USPS Retail Customer Appointment Scheduler tool (RCAS) at usps.com/scheduler.

The RCAS tool will display available

appointment times for participating Post Office locations that offer passport appointment services within the selected radius. Users will receive notifications of their scheduled appointment via email or text.

Application forms and information on the costs and how to apply for a passport can be found at usps.com/passport.

The U.S. Department of State's National Passport Information Center is available to answer passport questions by phone or email in English or Spanish. If you have a question about passports you can call toll-free 1-877-487-2778 or email NPIC@state.gov.



## INTERFAITH WORSHIP SERVICE OF NEW PROVIDENCE, BERKELEY HEIGHTS

The thirteenth annual New Providence-Berkeley Heights Interfaith Thanksgiving Service occurred on Monday evening, November 25, 2019, at Faith Lutheran Church in New Providence.

The participating worship communities were Berkeley Heights churches Little Flower Roman Catholic Church, Union Village United Methodist Church, and Westminster Presbyterian Church; New Providence churches Faith Lutheran Church, Our Lady of Peace Roman Catholic Church and St. Andrew's Episcopal Church; Congregation Shalom/Summit Jewish Community Center – Summit; and the Islamic Society of Basking Ridge - Basking Ridge.
