13TH YEAR OF MENORAH LIGHTING AT FAITH LUTHERAN

On the evening of Sunday, December 22, 2019, the first of the eight days of Hanukkah, Faith Lutheran Church in New Providence and the three synagogues of Summit, Temple Sinai, Congregation Ohr Shalom-Summit Jewish Community Center and Congregation Beth Hatikvah, lit the first candle of the Menorah on the lawn of Faith Lutheran. This was the thirteenth consecutive year that Faith and the synagogues have partnered in the lighting of the Hanukkah Menorah at Faith.

In view of the recent horrific anti-Semitic actions in the United States and throughout the world, the evening was especially meaningful to the persons attending from the four houses of worship.

The evening began with an address by Rabbi Dennis Ross of Temple Sinai. He expressed the gratitude of the members of the three synagogues to Rev. Jane McCready, pastor of Faith, for the long-term partnership that the synagogues have had with Faith. Rabbi Ross' words were followed by prayers and songs of Hanukkah, the latter being led by Cantor Janet Ilene Roth of Congregation Ohr Shalom.

Cantor Roth also spoke of the great respect and love that the Jewish community has for the memory of Rev. Dr. Murdoch MacPherson, who was pastor of Faith for thirty-five years and passed away in August 2017. In response to an anti-Semitic incident in the community in 2007, Pastor MacPherson initiated discussions with Rabbi William Horn, now Rabbi Emeritus of Congregation Ohr Shalom and Rabbi Stuart Gershon, now Rabbi Emeritus of Temple Sinai. The result was the first lighting of the Menorah at Faith during Hanukkah later that year. Accompanying the Menorah was a sign saying, "In Celebration with our Jewish Brothers and Sisters." The sign has continued at each subsequent Hanukkah.

Also, on Faith's lawn during the Christmas season was a manger, lying on straw within a small, open wooden stable. On early Christmas morning, a wrapped gift was placed within the manger. This represented the birth of Jesus, a gift

from God to all people. Christianity was born from the Jewish tradition.

Subsequent to the lighting ceremony, everyone went to the sanctuary of Faith where all sang fun Hanukkah songs. Leading the singing were Cantor Roth and Steve Wetter, volunteer cantor at Beth Hatikvah. At the conclusion of the songs, Cantor Roth described the kosher refreshments of fruits, cheeses, breads, nuts, cookies and jelly donuts, which are traditionally served at Hanukkah celebrations, that were waiting for all on a buffet table in Faith's Educational Hall. The congregants responded to the singing and the food with a round of applause.

MASTERS OF THE ORCHESTRA ON FEB 23

(NJIO) will showcase various works by masterful composers with its annual winter concert on Sunday, February 23 at Lawton C. Johnson Summit Middle School, 272 Morris Ave, Summit, NJ. The performance will begin at 3:00 p.m., and will feature performances from all three of NJIO's orchestral ensembles, beginning with Prelude's onstage performance, as well as its Flute Choir in the lobby during intermission. Admission is free; donations are gratefully accepted at the door.

NJIO's Symphony Orchestra, conducted by Artistic Director Warren Cohen, will be performing Sergei Prokofiev's Symphony No. 7. Written in 1952, one year before Prokofiev's death, this was the last of his symphonies. Symphony No. 7 was originally written with a quiet ending to the final movement, but due to pressure from Russian officials at the time, Prokofiev added an energetic coda to be played at the end. This addition earned him the coveted Stalin Prize, although Prokofiev noted that he did prefer the original, quieter ending himself.

NJIO's Symphony will also perform Maurice Ravel's Tzigane featuring Dylan Hamme, our 2019 Concerto Competition Winner, on violin. The piece features a virtuosic violin solo alongside the orchestra, and its characteristics mirror traditional Gypsy music (the title, Tzigane, comes from the French word for "gypsy"). Ravel completed Tzigane only days before it was

premiered by famous violinist Jelly d'Arányi in The New Jersey Intergenerational Orchestra 1924, where it was universally praised by critics. Intermezzo Orchestra will be performing the first movement of Johann Stamitz's Sinfonia in D Major along with the first of Ludwig van Beethoven's German Dances.



The primary source of income for the League is the Junior League of Summit Thrift Shop located at 37 DeForest Avenue in Summit. The Thrift Shop was established in 1933, making it the oldest retail business in downtown Summit. All profits generated by the shop are used to support and develop local interests in the form of grants, scholarships, projects and programs. Earlier this year, the Junior League awarded over \$65,000 in grants and scholarships, which is in addition to the funds provided to support the League's signature outreach initiative, GRACE (Giving and Receiving Assistance for our Community Essentials).

The Thrift Shop manager, Marie Avigliano, has been at the forefront of the shop's success since she joined the team in July 2010. Marie has brought the shop into the 21st century by creating various events and sales incentives throughout the year, increasing revenue by \$120,000 over her 9-year tenure.

A major renovation in 2015-2016 allowed the staff to sort and process merchandise more efficiently, which increased sales. The shop recently underwent a basement underpinning which created additional storage space for donations. Marie relied on her previous retail experience to design the shop to be organized and aesthetically pleasing to the shop's dedicated customers, many of which are on a first name basis with the shop staff.

In addition to the shop's incredible sales history, the shop has donated items such as books to start libraries in communities in Africa and South America through local ministries, clothing to natural disaster victims, and baby items for mothers that are not able to otherwise provide for their children.

"It's super rewarding and heartwarming to have such a great experience at work," says Ms. Avigliano. "I am just grateful to have the opportunity to be connected with the community in the way the shop connects. We have shared so many experiences with our customers from the birth of a baby to even the loss of some of our elderly patrons. It's all very meaningful to me and I feel blessed to be a part of it."

The Junior League is incredibly lucky to have Marie at the helm of such an important part of the Junior League's legacy in the community and looks forward to what the future holds.

The Junior League of Summit is a nonprofit, charitable, and educational organization of women who are committed to promoting voluntarism, developing the potential of women, and improving the community through the effective action and leadership of trained volunteers.
