There are more than 500 Union County youth, from birth to age 21, in foster care. With court-ordered access to a foster child and all parties in their life, volunteer advocates report findings to the judge so as to ensure best interests remain a priority, needs are met, and already experienced trauma is not exacerbated.





SUBSTANCE ABUSE PREVENTION PARENTING PROGRAM

The Carl H. Kumpf Middle School in Clark, NJ will be hosting the Partnership for a Drug-Free New Jersey's (PDFNJ) 15 Minute Child Break program on Thursday, March 5, 2020 beginning at 6:30 p.m. The Clark Township Municipal Alliance will provide food (wraps and sandwiches) and refreshments beginning at 6:15 p.m. and greet parents to answer questions on how to become involved with the Municipal Alliance. This program is intended for adults only, but the Kumpf PTA will provide free child care services if needed. Parents of students in all grades are welcome.

The 15 Minute Child Break is a one hour multimedia presentation offered by the PDFNJ, according to Angelo Valente, Executive Director of the PDFNJ. He explained that information on the importance of the parent or caregiver's role on substance abuse prevention will be discussed; as well as how to talk to children about drugs, signs of use and abuse to look for, current terminology, and trends of use. He noted that the presentation is based on New Jersey specific research conducted by the PDFNJ's Center for Prevention Research.

"We are glad to bring the 15 Minute Child Break back to Kumpf Middle School according to Rick Delmonaco, principal of Kumpf Middle School. The program delivers a powerful message for parents about what to look for and how to assist their children in regards to substance abuse as they enter their teen years. It is one of the most useful and informative hours a parent can spend in helping to guide their child."

Nemeth stated, "It was truly an honor to be recognized in this capacity. Every day, I strive to do my absolute best."



IndieFlix, a leading independent online streaming platform, along with its non-profit arm, the IndieFlix Foundation, is sparking a global conversation about anxiety through screenings of its brand-new documentary. The event will feature a viewing of the 56-minute film, followed by an informative question and answer session led by School Psychologists Lauren Camera and Brooke Nacht and School Counselor Ellen Zamboni. The event is open to parents and children attending the Clark and Garwood Public Schools. All children must be accompanied by an adult. Appropriate for ages 10 and up. Producers Scilla Andreen and Karin Gornick have one goal: to start a global conversation and raise awareness around anxiety. Through candid interviews, they utilize the power of film to tell the stories of many kids and teens who discuss their anxiety and its impacts on their lives and relationships, as well as how they've found solutions and hope. The film also includes a special interview with Michael Phelps, a mental health advocate and one of the greatest athletes of all-time. In addition, the documentary provides discussions with mental health experts about the causes of anxiety and its sociological effects, along with the help, resources and tools available to address the condition.

Part of the beauty of this film is the openness of the children and young adults featured; for some of them, the "Angst" project marks the first time they are publicly sharing their experiences with anxiety. Our hope is that their candidness and bravery will inspire our community to do the same.

Noah, a teenager in the film, describes it this way: "Anxiety doesn't define me. It's not just a curse; it also gives me strength."

"Everybody needs to know that anxiety disorders are real, common and treatable instead of viewing them as a personal choice or something to be ashamed of," said Dr. Jerry Bubrick, Senior Director of Anxiety Disorders Center, Child Mind Institute. "Getting help early is crucial in giving people the tools they need to feel better. We just need to start the conversation."

"We felt it was important to make a movie that could raise awareness to open up the conversation and provide hope," said Andreen, IndieFlix CEO and "Angst" Producer. "So many people struggle with anxiety and have trouble talking about it. We want to change that."

Anxiety disorders are the most common mental health challenge in the U.S., impacting 54 percent of females and 46 percent of males, with age seven being the median age of onset, according to the World Health Organization. While anxiety disorders are highly treatable, only one-third of those suffering receive treatment. Everyone involved in the development of "Angst" has a personal experience with anxiety – from the producers to the interviewees.

"The conversation surrounding mental health really hits home for me," said Michael Phelps. "Many people don't understand how debilitating mental illness truly can be, and even more than that, how common it is, yet people are afraid to have the serious discussions about it. "
