Renna, who coordinates content for more than 135,000-issues circulated to towns in Union, Somerset and Morris counties, uses her writing, editing and photography, she says, "to tell the stories of ordinary people who do extraordinary things, big or small, that inspire others and their communities. 

WHAT, WHERE, AND WHEN IN OLD KENILWORTH EUGENE COPPOLA TURNS 100

Boulevard. Except for the houses Arthur [James

On March 3, 2020, Eugene Coppola, a true Kenilworth legend, turns 100 years old. He is one of six children of Amadeo "George" and Rosa Coppola, who arrived at Kenilworth about 1911. He holds the honor of being the oldest male resident ever born here to be living in town. In a February interview Gene shared many memories of his home town.

"As a boy I helped my father in his vegetable store on N. 20th St. It's Morabito's Pharmacy now. He and my sister Sally saw John Kennedy come into the store after the war looking for Wanda Perlowski who lived on N. 22nd St. My father drove his Model T pick-up truck to Newark to get vegetables, sold them from the store, and we delivered them to homes all over. The only paved street in town back then was the

Arthur] built in the Park section of town there were practically no houses south of the Boulevard. Kenilworth was small; everyone knew everyone else."

"My father was a fireman. I went with him to the Flats Fire [1927] on Passaic Ave. The

"My father was a fireman. I went with him to the Flats Fire [1927] on Passaic Ave. The building burned to the ground that winter because the fire hydrant was frozen. I went to the crash site of Jimmy Doolittle's plane on Faitoute Ave. There was a big crowd when it happened [1929]. It wasn't much of a secret during Prohibition where a speakeasy could be found. During the Depression marathon dances were held in the fields on Galloping Hill Road. Many boys picked water lilies behind Harding School to sell and make money for their families."

"Kenilworth was a big baseball town for kids and young grownups. There were many ballfields. One was across the street from the McKinley School where the Methodist Church is now. When it was lunchtime just about every boy ran across the Boulevard to get in as many innings of play before the late bell rang. We didn't always make it back on time. Small planes used to land there and later the airfield was moved up near N. 24th St."

"I saw lots of things. Saw the Ku Klux Klan march up to the old Upsala College campus. As

a teenager and in my twenties, I worked at the Kensington Riding Stables where the Wells Fargo Bank is, and also at Neville's Stables off the Boulevard near N. 9th St. The polo matches, rodeos, and air shows drew thousands of spectators. The shoot-out at the old borough hall in 1940 caused a tremendous stir in town. Mayor [Oswald] Nitschke lived near us. When I first saw my future wife, Evelyn, I knew I wanted to marry her. We married during the war in 1943 and have a beautiful daughter. I am a very lucky man."

Gene served in the US Army along with his two late brothers, Vincent and George "Chickie." He served on the planning board and rescue squad, and as president of the fire department. His two living sisters are Sally (Brokaw) and Doris (Picaroni). Sisters Elmina (DeGatano) and Lucille (Pepe), passed away some years ago. His daughter, Evelyn, is married to Gary Delatush. Gene and his wife have three grandchildren and four great-grandchildren. Gene is well remembered for his "Gene's Lunch" truck business which he started after retiring as a factory supervisor in town.

TRINITAS NURSING SCHOOL HOLDS GRADUATION CEREMONY

nursing diplomas at the Trinitas School of Nursing 161st Convocation Ceremony held recently at St. Michael's Church in Cranford. Including Kareema E. Abdelfattah of Kenilworth.

Surrounded by family, friends, and staff that supported their efforts every step of the way, 99 women and 10 men proudly accepted their pins and became eligible to sit for the registered nurse licensing exam.

"The Trinitas School of Nursing is so proud of the 109 graduates- the first graduating class of the new decade, the Class of January 2020," said Dr. Rose Santee, Dean of the Trinitas School of Nursing, a collaborative nursing program with Union County College. "The graduates receive a diploma in nursing from Trinitas School of Nursing that will authorize them to sit for the RN licensing exam and Union County College

Science degree. Their determination and hard work has paid off. It's exciting for the administration, faculty, staff members, and their families when our students graduate. We will miss them, but more, we are full of the satisfaction that we have guided yet another group of capable nurses who are now ready to join the nursing workforce."

Trinitas School of Nursing, operated jointly by Trinitas Regional Medical Center and Union County College, currently holds full accreditation from the Accreditation Commission for Education in Nursing (ACEN), and the New Jersey State Board of Nursing. STUDENT-VETERAN RECEIVES K-9 SERVICE DOG FROM REBUILDING WARRIORS

A special Veterans Day ceremony was held on Kean University's Union campus as senior Jason Pryor, a U.S. Army veteran, introduced the K-9 service dog that he received through an on-campus fundraiser.

Pryor, a senior from Elizabeth majoring in exercise science, did tours in Iraq and Honduras and suffers from PTSD. He received the K-9, named Keen, at the start of the Fall semester as a gift from the Kean Office of Student Government.

"Being with Keen has taught me to be more patient," said Pryor, whose dog accompanies him to class. "Keen is used as a measure to help prevent me from going through the symptoms and effects of spiraling down, by me tending to his needs and having him tend to me."

Kean is ranked first in the nation among large public schools for its programs supporting student-veterans, according to the Military Friendly Schools survey.

Student Government raised nearly \$20,000 to support service dogs through Rebuilding Warriors, a volunteer non-profit organization whose mission is to provide trained service dogs to veterans. The bulk of the funds raised went toward training Pryor's dog, and the rest was donated to Rebuilding Warriors to help train other K-9 dogs.

At the ceremony held outside Miron Student Center, Vito Zajda, director of Veteran Student Services at Kean and a U.S. Coast Guard

veteran, called Pryor a remarkable student.

"He has been a big support and influential person in our program," Zajda said. "He has helped open our eyes about how the University can best support its vets."

Vice President of Rebuilding Warriors Jeff Mullins, also a veteran, said post-traumatic stress disorder (PTSD) is a condition that can't be seen by others. "It's invisible, stays with you your entire life, and it's not easy sometimes," he said. "Our goal is to provide veterans and first responders with a service dog to help them achieve their new normal."

The University's Veterans Day event included a color guard, a performance of the national anthem by the Kean Gospel Choir, and the presentation of other honors.

Juan Leon Torres, a senior from Spotswood also studying exercise science and a U.S. Navy veteran, received the 2019 Kean Veteran's Award for Outstanding Mentor. He develops transition opportunities and initiatives, and mentors a student-veteran each semester.

"Being a veteran and going back to school is super hard because you go from one community to a different lifestyle," Torres said.

Zajda noted that it is important to support veterans at all times. "The importance of Veterans Day is to recognize that it's 365 days a year, as veterans go through different highs and lows in their lives," he said.

The Academy of Continuing Education (ACE), located in Cranford, NJ, is accepting applications for its March 2-April 24 semester. ACE offers adults with developmental or physical disabilities the opportunity to pursue continuing education as an alternative to traditional day programs.

"Adults with disabilities who have graduated from the public school system or specialized schools often have limited choices when planning their future," said Robin Morris-Marano, ACE director of educational services. "Their options often are limited to generic day programs that do not offer the intellectual stimulation and growth provided by our academy. Our program also is ideal for older adults with disabilities who wish to sharpen previously learned skills."

ACE's course offerings for the upcoming semester include math, reading and creative writing, explore your world through science,

jewelry design and merchandising, visual arts and crafts, musical expression, theatre and performance, time traveler (history), career and financial literacy, media production, cardmaking and self-understanding/peer leadership.

Based on their interests, students may take as many or as few classes as they choose.

"ACE differs from a traditional day program, where the attendee's day is planned for them," Morris-Marano said. "We work with our students and their families to help them select the classes that will bring them the most enjoyment and from which they will get the most benefit."

Sebastian Ruiz has been attending ACE for four years, steadily increasing his classes each semester. He works six days a week at Nautica at the Jersey Gardens Mall but was bored at home when not working. He said he enjoys attending ACE because it keeps his mind active.

"I like to learn and I like to meet new people,"

he said.

Last semester Ruiz switched from math and reading into jewelry and merchandising and card-making, and now has added career and theater financial literacy, and understanding, bringing his classes to six spread over five days.

"Math and reading are so quiet and calm," he said. "Jewelry and card-making are fun and they make money."

Ruiz also aspires for a more challenging job and hopes self-understanding will help him get a new position somewhere.

"(Career class) helps people get jobs, like what to wear and what not to do in an interview," he said.

"Sebastian is a perfect example of the flexibility of our program and the ability for our students to tailor their classes to their personal interests," Morris-Marano said.

Whenever possible, ACE curricula are developed in accordance with the New Jersey Department of Education (NJDOE) guidelines, implementing Core Curriculum Content Standards and aligned with the most current information offered by the NJDOE, according to Morris-Marano. The ACE Program is approved by the New Jersey Division of Developmental Disabilities for Day Habilitation through the department's Supports Program.
