FEBRUARY 25TH DECLARED SUMMIT COLLEGE CLUB DAY

In celebration of Summit College Club's founding 100 years ago, Mayor Nora Radest issued a Proclamation declaring February 25, 2020 as Summit College Club Day. This recognition by the mayor's office of Summit College Club's 100th anniversary will be formally presented to Summit College Club at a gala 100th anniversary celebration on Sunday, April 5, at the Grand Summit Hotel.

The Mayor's proclamation states that over the past 100 years, Summit College Club programs and policies have focused on advocacy, action, research, lifelong learning and equity for women in order to respond to community, county, state, national and international concerns.

Summit College Club has been involved in the formation of valued community service agencies such as Sage, Meals on Wheels, The Child Care Center, environmental groups, achievement awards, and WomanArt, all of which have served to provide an improved quality of life in the Summit Area.

For more than 50 years, the club has run a week-long Book Sale in the spring. The income from this sale has allowed

Summit College Club to provide more than a million dollars in scholarships to young women graduating from local high schools. This year, Summit College Club's Book Sale will run from April 28 through May 3 at the American Legion Post #433, 357 Elkwood Avenue, New Providence.

Other programs in recent years have ranged from Christie Whitman talking on the environment to a children's book giveaway on Martin Luther King Day; from showing a film about Toni Morrison to sending eight graders to a week-long summer STEM camp. Last fall, the club ran a workshop in salary negotiation for women. The club's calendar also includes meetings for small groups interested in books, films or food and social gatherings for all members.

The Summit College Club is a branch of the American Association of University Women, which promotes equity for all women and girls through advocacy, education, philanthropy, and research.

UNION COUNTY COLLEGE TEAM CHOSEN FOR PRESTIGIOUS NASA CHALLENGE

Union County College is proud to announce that a team of four engineering students have been chosen to participate in NASA's Micro-G Next Challenge Artemis Program. Union's team is one of only two community colleges selected to compete in this category, which has a total of 20 teams, and includes teams from universities such as Cornell, Columbia, University of Texas, Ohio State, University of Alabama, University of Nebraska, and Arizona State.

Union's team is comprised of four students: Michael Kirkland of Westfield, Bruce Aranda of Elizabeth, Dmytro Govdan of Summit, and Antonio Mena of Cranford. Our students submitted a proposal for the Lunar Sample Coring Drill competition which if chosen, will be used on the Artemis mission to drill samples from the moon's surface.

The young men on our team are now in the process of building their drill which will be tested at NASA's Neutral Buoyancy Lab (NBL) at the Sonny Carter Training Facility near the Johnson Space Center in Houston, TX. The NBL is the large pool where astronauts train for future missions.

"For engineering students interested in working for NASA, this is the experience of a lifetime, and we are so proud of our students for being chosen for this competition," stated Union County College President Dr. Margaret M. McMenamin. "I thank the leadership in our engineering faculty for the guidance and instruction they've provided to assist our students with achieving their goal of building an effective coring drill."

Union County College Associate Professor of Physics/Engineering Nicholas Gilbert is serving as the Head Coach to the team. Associate Professior of Engineering Jennifer Ebert serves as the research and technical advisor to the team.

Court Appointed Special Advocates (CASA) of Union County will host its second annual Women's Leadership Luncheon on Wednesday, March 11 — the heart of Women's History Month — to highlight two Union County women whose contributions positively impact their community.

Among them is Tina Renna, Cranford resident and owner of Renna Media, publisher of 21 community newspapers including the Summit Times.

Renna, who coordinates content for more than 135,000-issues circulated to towns in Union, Somerset and Morris counties, uses her writing, editing and photography, she says, "to tell the stories of ordinary people who do extraordinary things, big or small, that inspire others and their communities.

CASA of Union County recruits, trains, supervises and supports community volunteers to advocate for abused, neglected and abandoned children placed in foster homes or residential facilities. There are more than 500 Union County youth, from birth to age 21, in foster care. With court-ordered access to a foster child and all parties in their life, volunteer advocates report findings to the judge so as to ensure best interests remain a priority, needs are met, and already experienced trauma is not exacerbated.

CENTRAL PRESBYTERIAN CHURCH MOVES TOWARDS INCLUSION

For some members of the community, church is hard. Older buildings can be difficult to access with a walker or wheelchair, amplification systems can be problematic for those with hearing challenges, Sunday School may not be equipped to deal with children on the autism spectrum, as well as many other issues. Central Presbyterian Church in Summit has been working on these issues to make their community of faith more inclusive.

Central began removing barriers years ago with the installation of an assisted listening system in their Sanctuary. More recently, changes to the main entrance included a ramp connecting the ground level to the Sanctuary and Auditorium to ease the way for those with mobility issues.

Programming for children and youth has been a focus in the last few years, especially with the hiring of Rev. Deborah Huggins as Associate Pastor. Deborah is a doctoral student in Special Education. Before becoming a pastor, she worked as a teacher certified in Special Education. Deborah oversees the children and family ministry at Central. The church has also recently hired a Behavior Support Aide to work in their Sunday School classrooms with children who need some extra help. Parents are free to worship and engage in small group fellowship and study, knowing that their kids are safe and welcome. Adults with disabilities are also welcome at Central, where it is recognized that these adults also need a place to belong. Central continues to work to be a place of belonging for people across the spectrum, with opportunities for worship, service, and fellowship for people of all abilities.

The church offers a unique worship experience on first and third Sunday evenings, titled "WAVE". A contemporary worship service, WAVE is held in the accessible auditorium, where children and others are free to move around the space. Dancing and spontaneous expressions of joy are common and encouraged. Seating is flexible with small tables, couches, and plenty of room for wheelchairs and strollers.

Senior Pastor Don Steele said, "The Church should be open to everyone. The congregation of Central wants to welcome everyone by removing as many barriers as possible. We are always willing to listen to those whose needs are not yet being met, so maybe we can address their issues in the future."

For those who still cannot physically attend church (or prefer not to), Central broadcasts their Sunday 10:00 a.m. service live on Summit's Hometowne TV, and posts the video to their YouTube channel, Central Presbyterian. Services are also available through their website, centralpres.org. Central is located at 70 Maple Street in Summit, NJ.

SAGE PREPARES FOR 2020 MARCH FOR MEALS

City officials and members of community organizations are invited to join SAGE Eldercare in March as it participates in the 18th annual March for Meals – a month-long, nationwide coming together of local community organizations, businesses, government officials and caring individuals to ensure that homebound, older adults are not forgotten. The average age of the clients SAGE delivers meals to is 83. Of those, 65% say they rarely have visitors other than their Meals on Wheels volunteer.

March for Meals participants have included NJ State Senator Thomas Kean Jr., Summit Mayor, Nora Radest, Police Chiefs from Summit, New Providence, Berkeley Heights, Springfield and Mountainside and local government officials and volunteers.

Established in 1966, SAGE's Meals on Wheels is the oldest continuously run home delivery meal program in New Jersey. In 2019, approximately 400 volunteers delivered more than 43,729 meals to 212 people in Union County (Berkeley Heights, Mountainside, New Providence, Springfield, and Summit), Essex County (Millburn and Short Hills), and Morris County (Chatham and Madison).

"The services that we provide older adults in our area are critical; it's not just a warm meal, but also a vital wellness visit," said Marianne Kranz, SAGE Director of Meals on Wheels. "Together, we can keep older adults living independently, healthier at home and feeling more connected to their community as they age."

Summit Repair Café is back for their fourth event to help the public restore their beloved broken items to working order. Twice each year community volunteers, who are accomplished repairers, are on hand to assist in mending, glueing, screwing or a variety of techniques to get items back to working order.

ORDINANCES RESTRICTING USE OF SINGLE-USE PLASTICS

The City of Summit Common Council has passed three ordinances restricting use of singleuse plastics. The first ordinance prohibits use of single-use plastic bags by businesses at the point of purchase. The second ordinance is a ban on polystyrene (commonly known as Styrofoam) food containers. The third ordinance limits businesses to provide plastic straws by customer request only. The ordinances will go into effect on May 1, 2020.

"Restrictions on single-use plastics like other initiatives undertaken by the city were an inclusive process," explains Summit Mayor Nora Radest. "Before ordinances were considered by Common Council, community workshops were held to gather feedback to pass ordinances that positively impact environmental sustainability without negative outcomes for local businesses."

In October of 2019, city and elected officials held two community workshops to answer questions and obtain input from the business and residential communities on the development of the ordinances. The ordinances were passed by Common Council on November 18, 2019.

Summit joins neighbor towns of Chatham, Madison and Maplewood in passing single-use plastics restrictions. The New Jersey state legislature is expected to introduce legislation restricting single-use plastics during its next session. If the state passes stricter regulations on plastics use, it will supersede any local Summit ordinances.
