# RAHWAY GARDEN CLUB DAFFODIL PROJECT

Since 2013, the Rahway Garden Club (RGC) has been planting two hundred daffodils every year with our local Girl Scouts from Cadette Troop 40979 and Junior Troop 40745. At first eight hundred daffodils were planted at The Rahway Historical Society, now known as Merchants and Drovers Tavern and Museum. In the last two years the RGC / Girl Scout team planted another four hundred daffodils at Veterans Park diagonally across Saint George's Avenue. The first daffodil planting in Veterans Park in 2017 honored the '100th Anniversary Of The End Of World War I'.

When the RGC started planting with the Girl Scouts our motto was "Planting Daffodils and Planting Memories".

The Rahway Daffodil Project is a new project designed to expand the Girl Scouts plantings and spread spring colors throughout our city.

Last autumn, on November 21, 2019, eighteen people joined together to plant one thousand daffodils in the field at the corner of Saint Georges and Central Avenues, also known as Kiwanis Park. Volunteers from the Rahway Garden Club, Master Gardeners of Union County and Rahway's citizens,

including council woman Joanna Miles, planted the thousand daffodils in one and a half hours.

Additionally, the Madison School Garden Club with assistance from the RCG, planted 60 daffodils in front of their school. Due to the heat of the bricks and the sun exposure, I think these are likely going to be the first flowers to bloom.

The Madison School Garden Club led by Mrs. Sweeney, Mrs. Padula and Mrs. Lewis is an 'after' club with students from kindergarten to fourth graders. They have started a tradition we will all enjoy for years to come.

This project would not have been possible without the support and encouragement of Mike Smalling and the Department of Public Works.

Additionally, Mr. Bartell, of Bartell's Farm Supply in Clark, coordinated with RGC President Debra Stuart, to purchase the bulbs for the Garden Club at no extra cost to the city. Les Bartell is well known for his generosity to local garden clubs and organizations.

Most importantly thanks to the volunteers\* who came out and planted the daffodils on a chilly November morning.

# RETIRED SCOUTS HELP MAINTAIN **BOY SCOUT CAMPS**





### RAHWAY CHURCHES FEATURE VARIETY OF ARCHITECTURAL STYLES

Part 2 of 2 / Submitted by Al Shipley, city historian and Rahway Library Research Consultant

1. St. Thomas: A few years after

a community of Byzantine Catholics founded a church in 1912, a sanctuary that had previously served two early Protestant congregations, became available. Built in the 1860s, the church stood on the west side of Irving Street between Seminary Avenue and Grand Avenue. The Byzantine congregation, then called St. John's Greek Catholic, would worship there until 1968 when they built a new sanctuary on St. Georges Avenue and changed their name to St. Thomas Apostle Catholic Church of the Byzantine Rite. Their new home, constructed in the Contemporary Byzantine style, was designed by famed architect J. Edward Luders, the man who designed the Vatican Pavilion at the 1964-65 New York World's Fair. The most dominant feature is the large, rounded gold dome which is topped by a jeweled triple bar cross. Three smaller golden domes, symbolic of both burning candles and the trinity, are positioned below the main dome. A magnificent stained glass, semicircular window above the entrance covers most of the front façade.

2. Church of the Good Shepherd (formerly Holy Comforter): As neighborhoods grew in the mid-1800s—and new congregants were moving into those areas—a number of established church groups saw the need to build churches for their members who lived far from the home church. Such was the case with Holy Comforter. Founded in 1867 as a mission church of St. Paul's Episcopal Church, the original structure (1870-1896) stood on the corner of St. Georges Avenue and Seminary Avenue until it was destroyed by fire. The present church building was built in 1898 in the Gothic Revival style. The one story, rectangular stone edifice has its gabled end facing St. Georges which features a round stained glass window. The steeply pitched roof and pointed Gothic arched windows and doors are characteristic of the Gothic style. Built for an Episcopal congregation, the sanctuary has the

traditional red doors on the north, south, and east sides to symbolize the blood of Christ and signify the sign of the cross.

- 3. Zion Lutheran: In 1852, a Lutheran congregation was established in Rahway by Americans of German descent. Founded as the German Independent Evangelical Lutheran Zions Church of Rahway, their original home was located on Grand Avenue just west of Allen Street. In 1916, the congregation moved into a new church on Campbell Street where they would worship for the next thirty-seven years. The current church, built in 1953 at the northwest corner of Elm Avenue and Esterbrook Avenue, is constructed in the Colonial Revival style. The brick building has a pediment gable above the entrance which is supported by six Ionic columns. A transom window is set above the two leaf door with Georgian motif over the transom. A large, rounded window, flanked by two smaller windows on the Elm Avenue side, have sunburst motifs with keystones on top and to either side of the round heads. Three similar rounded windows face Esterbrook. A steeple is set on the center ridge on the south end.
- 4. Word of Life Apostolic Center (formerly St. Paul's Episcopal): The Episcopal congregation of St. Paul's was established in 1836, and within seven years, was able to construct a church on the corner of Irving Street and Elm Avenue. Built in 1843 in the Gothic style, the church has many characteristics of the building style popular in the mid-1800s. The imposing four-story entrance bell tower has a two leaf door through a pointed arch opening and two pointed Gothic windows to either side. Above the entrance is a tall, narrow, bricked-in window with pointed arch top (lancet window). Circular windows, also bricked-in, are set in the third level. The belfry story has paired lancet louvered openings on all sides and sharply pointed corner finials. Pointed arch windows with Gothic tracery are on both sides of the main building. Finally, being constructed as an Episcopal structure, it also features red doors on

the north, south, and east sides.

5. Second Baptist: Since its founding in 1892, the congregation of Second Baptist has worshiped in four different houses of worship. Within a few years after their founding, the group built a small chapel on Haydock Street. In 1921, they built a church on E. Milton Avenue located approximately where the city recreation building stands today. In 1950, the congregation built and moved into their third church on the corner of E. Milton and Lenox Place. The church soon became too small for the growing congregation so a new church was built-in 1982-and connected to the forty-year old structure. The current, contemporary styled sanctuary has clean lines and a gently sloping, six-sided hip roof with a tall, slender steeple set in the rear. Entrance doors with stained glass transoms and sidelights are set to each side of center steps. Tall, thin, stained glass windows on the front walls and Lawrence Street side add to its modern appearance.

6. Trinity Methodist: Founded in 1849, this Methodist group was called Second Methodist and worshiped in a church on Railroad Street (eliminated when Rahway elevated the tracks) between E. Milton Avenue and Emerson Avenue on the east side of the tracks. Although noise from the passing trains had a disruptive effect on Sunday services, the congregation worshiped there for forty-three years. In 1893, the group changed its name to Trinity United Methodist and built the beautiful, brick, Romanesque-styled church on the corner of E. Milton Avenue and Main Street. The irregular church plan features steep roof lines with a tall main corner tower and two shorter towers to each side. The three story entrance tower has a belfry with three arched louvered windows on each side topped by a tent roof. The shorter towers have similar tent roofs. Two recessed entrance doors have rounded tops. The huge, rounded arched stained glass windows on the south and east sides are impressive features of this classic design.



- Keep it simple begin with quick fabric crafts like bookmarks, sachets, fabric pendants, pouches or a fabric collage that can also become a simple art piece suitable for framing.
- Mending is Trendy! Show them how to creatively mend their clothes and/or add decorative patches and pockets with hand stitching and easy embroidery stitches.
- Take into account the child's personality when planning your quilting session. For younger kids, keep it fun (and safe) by avoiding projects that require precise measuring and cutting. Instead, pull out some precuts from your stash, focusing on the fun of design and the creativity of blending colors and patterns.

• For older kids, or those who are naturally inclined to math and geometry might be open to the more precision-based aspects of quilting, where templates & rulers are used.

- Remember that children's taste levels are more sophisticated than ever; have a variety of fabrics and embellishments available for experimentation. Provide the opportunity to work with batiks and other cool "adult" fabrics that aren't strictly juvenile in design and coloration.
- Let the child work with scraps of one of your own current projects, to create a small "featured block" you can use as the back label for your quilt. The label can include both of your signatures.

• Remember, creative expression can help to relieve some of the stress of the situation for people of any age — with any luck, you might also create a budding new fiber artist in the process! Have a follow-up project in mind to keep up the momentum and encourage their efforts as they work. The follow-ups can introduce new techniques to gradually increase their quilting skills.

# ELKS OFFER VOCATIONAL SCHOLARSHIPS






