### STEVANIE RHIM RECEIVES 2020 MARC HARDY HUMAN RIGHTS AWARD

Stevanie Rhim, a senior at David Brearley Middle-High School, was recognized for her commitment to raising awareness and concern for the values and importance of human rights in a video ceremony on April 26, 2020 and presented with the 2020 Marc Wesley Hardy Human Rights Award by the First Congressional Church of Westfield.

The award is named in honor of Marc Hardy who was killed in a car accident in 1990 shortly before his graduation from Westfield High School. He was a National Merit Scholar, a gifted singer and actor, and very passionate about human rights.

This award is presented to recipients demonstrating: openness and friendliness to people of all races, creeds and nationalities; involvement and leadership in organizations and activities committed to improving human relations; unusual personal dignity; the willingness to risk for what he or she believes is right; unqualified acceptance of others; respect for diversity, personal integrity, caring and willingness to listen; and the ability to lead by example. Stevanie lives every day exemplifying these qualities. She has an amazing ability to bring people together and to make them see the things that they share instead of those that divide them.

Miss Rhim is an active leader in the Race Matter Alliance at David Brearley Middle-High

School and the creator of the videotaped series "Conversation Matters" bringing students together for panel discussions on difficult issues.

About three years ago I received a call from our team's sponsor Gieco Insurance, regarding a new car donation for New Jersey disabled veterans. Gieco connected me to Benner's Auto Body in Cranford. The next day I met with the owner, Joseph Oneill, who grew up in Kenilworth, and we spoke about a possible car donation. Joe explained how he wanted to donate newer cars to disabled veterans. Joe was so passionate about this, he felt it was just one way to give back.

We spoke for a few hours and Joe was

extremely committed to working with disabled veterans and their families. We immediately found two disabled veterans in need and Joe and his team began working on two newer cars for both of these men. While the two veterans were waiting for their cars to be completed, Joe had Enterprise Rent a Car provide them with temporary transportation.

It didn't stop there, Joe hosted a huge party to honor the veterans at the River and Rail Cantina. After the event Joe told me that he wanted to get more involved and believed that we could work together and get countless veterans newer cars. Since then Joe and his team have been able to provide over a dozen cars for disabled veterans throughout the state.

When I spoke to Joe I learned that he played hockey at a high level and wanted to try out for a professional team. However, his dream was cut short because he was diagnosed with Hodgkin Lymphoma; this ended any chance of playing professional ice hockey. After undergoing treatment at Memorial Sloan Kettering Cancer Center, he has been cancer free. After getting a second chance Joe decided to live life to the fullest and always put others first.

Joe never got to play hockey but he did become a sponsor for the New Jersey Devils and has been friends with their staff and players for years. Recently, Joe was able to have the team work with us on various charity events. When Joe found out that one of our Devils fan team members was being honored at a game, he surprised us and got a luxury suite and was able to have our veteran and his family honored at the game. During the game, Joe was able to have the veteran meet a few retired players and got him the team's autographs.

My friend, Joe Oneill is currently serving on our board. He is constantly helping our car donation program grow throughout the state. This caring and kind man is loved by so many. I am so lucky to be able to work alongside this great man.

## WHAT, WHERE, AND WHEN IN OLD KENILWORTH: VENTERS FLORISTS – SEVERAL TRAGEDIES

The Venters family came to Kenilworth from Roselle in the early 1920s. Walter D. (1886-1959) and Bertha M. (1889-1960), their daughter, Grace (1925-2006), and son Walter Raymond "Ray" (1920-1992) settled on Richfield Ave. off Michigan Ave. The couple operated a flower shop with a substantial greenhouse which was connected to their home. They cultivated the land around it from Michigan Ave. to Market St.

Walter and Bertha quickly became active in local Republican politics. Walter ran for the council twice, ultimately elected in 1929. Bertha became a county committeewoman and was elected to the school board, serving from 1935-1938. She was only the third woman to serve. She was active in the PTA, the Methodist Church, and VFW Post 2230 Ladies Auxiliary. Walter worked full-time as a diamond setter but spent long hours

at the flower shop.

Tragedy first struck in March 1928. An aggressive fire broke out in the house. Damage was estimated at \$6,000 – a huge sum in 1928. Fire chief Paul Arthur attributed the fire to faulty wiring. The family moved to Passaic Ave. until they built a new home next to the old site at 164 So. Michigan Ave. The Venters relocated the greenhouse and flower shop adjacent to it.

During WWII, son Ray served in the US Navy as a petty officer and armed guard gunman. After the war Ray worked with his parents. In 1949 his sister Grace married Dominick Viligor and moved to Clark. They had one son.

Tragedy fell again in March 1959. Mr. Venters went missing after he left the shop on March 10 to make a floral delivery to Beth Israel Hospital in Newark. On March 14, he and the truck were found in Newark where it was determined he had sustained a fatal heart attack. Bertha passed away fourteen months later. Ray, 39 years old, suddenly had the weight of the entire business on his shoulders.

Tragedy occurred yet again. On the night of February 26, 1968, a blaze, discovered by a police officer near 11 p.m., was underway in the greenhouse. Forty members of the volunteer fire department, under command of Chief Angelo Raimondi, battled the fire for four hours. The two-story residence was gutted by the flames. The house and greenhouse were in shambles.

Ray was able to resurrect the business which continued in operation until the 1980s. He passed away in 1992. The property was sold and subdivided. In 2004 and 2005, three new homes at 703-711 Richfield Ave. were erected on the former site of the Venters's home, greenhouse, and flower shop.
