

STUDENT BROADCASTERS STAY ON THE AIR FROM HOME

with working separately to get their jobs done during the COVID-19 outbreak.

The student broadcasters at Linden High School are no different.

Students in the school's TV/Digital Media advanced class - along with all of their schoolmates - have been learning from home since March 16, when schools were closed because of the coronavirus. After a week of getting acclimated to the unprecedented situation, they decided it was time to get the news cameras rolling again for their TNT News. (TNT stands for Tiger News Today, named for the school mascot.)

But it wouldn't be easy. All of their equipment, including cameras, microphones, sound board, teleprompters, professional editing software, and their TV news set, were locked up inside "Studio 301A," named for the room number at Linden High School. And social distancing prevents students from interviewing classmates in person. But they made it work.

"I am so proud of how all of the students worked together to get the news show done," said teacher Chris Paskewich.

Journalists around the world have had to learn to cope "It was definitely a group effort. While working in the classroom, we like to have control and we can oversee the progress of how the news show is coming together. This was nerve-wracking for me because of having to wait to see the finished product, but overall I was impressed with how well the students completed the show."

> The first show was posted to YouTube on March 31 and shared with staff and students at the high school by Principal Yelena Horré.

> "I am so proud of our TV/Digital Media students that are still producing shows, even in this new learning environment, under the leadership and guidance of Mr. Miller and Mr. Paskewich," she said in her message to staff.

> The show included features on how to stay safe from COVID-19, how to cope with remote learning, and the district's initiative of inviting families to post uplifting artwork in windows and doors for the community to see.

> "We just gave them a very general idea on what to make their news segments about because we weren't sure exactly how well this would work," said co-teacher Gary Miller, who is also the district's communication coordinator. "They came (continued on page 2)

them, and it came out great. We were so happy with how it turned out.

Students filmed with their own phones and cameras and edited with iMovie, software that is provided on MacBook Air laptops that the school district gives to all students at the high school. (Elementary and middle school students all get iPad tablets.)

The teachers and students ran into some technical hurdles while getting the first show done, but learned from the experience. They hope things are a little smoother as they work on a second show, which may cover topics

up with their own ideas, filmed them, edited including teachers' experiences with remote learning, talking electronically to athletes who have had their sports put on hold, and highlighting cast members from the school play that was canceled.

> "I am so proud of our TNT News students and how dedicated they are to producing this show," Paskewich said. "The students definitely stepped up to the plate, from coming up with their ideas, filming and editing the segments together, and even hosting the show. They helped each other and worked together as a team to get the show done. They certainly amazed me."



LOCAL COMPANY HELPS PROTECT FIRST RESPONDERS DURING PANDEMIC

A generous donation from a Linden company will be used to help protect Linden Police Officers working during the COVID-19 global pandemic.



Linden Public Schools head nurse Joyce Joyce has been recognized with the Union County School Nurse of the Year Award," said Steven Viana, director of health, physical education, medical services, and athletics. "Every single day when she comes to work, she brings her passion, her expertise, professionalism all to the table. In my opinion, she is not just the school nurse of the year this year, but every year. Congratulations on this prestigious and amazing achievement."

> Hirsch was scheduled to be surprised with her award at the association's virtual meeting on May 4, which was attended by more than 100 nurses. But she spotted the announcement in an errant email about the meeting's agenda. She was, however, surprised with a tribute video put together by several of Linden's school nurses who serve under her.

> "In retrospect it was probably better for me to have the time to process it ahead of the meeting," she said. "I have yet to fully process the video though. I will cherish it for a long time to come. This award and video mean more to me than I can possibly express because it comes from the very people I have worked with day in and day out for years. We are a small department, but we are unique in our roles and the contributions we bring to Linden Public Schools."

> Hirsch has been working in health care for 40 years and has been with Linden Public Schools

"It comes as absolutely no surprise to me that for the past 23 years. She started as a school nurse at School No. 9 in 1997, then moved to Linden High School in 2013.

> "Having moved from elementary to the high school gave me the opportunity to follow so many of them right through their school careers," she said. "I've seen them mature and grow in their self-reliance – especially the students with chronic illnesses - and self-confidence. I love being a part of their story and having them be part of mine."

> Interim Superintendent Denise Cleary called Hirsch "a shining light."

> "I couldn't be more proud to say she is my colleague," Cleary said. "This distinct honor is so well-deserved and I have to say that Linden is lucky to have her."

> Before becoming a nurse, Hirsch worked as a medical assistant and as a hospital staffing supervisor. She became head nurse for Linden Public Schools in 2015.

> "Linden has been my work home for 23 years and I've probably seen just about everything," Hirsch said. "I've been so fortunate to have had wonderful administrators, faculty, and staff to work with over the years. When I look back on my career, I'll remember the challenges and rewards, the co-workers and the families. But most of all I'll remember the children. They have been some of the biggest challenges and greatest rewards for me. Some I will remember forever."

2 HIGH SCHOOL SENIORS HONORED AS OUTSTANDING SCHOLAR ATHLETES

Two Linden High School senior athletes are track at Georgia State as a walk-on. being honored for their excellence on the field of play and in the classroom.

Chisom Uzor, a standout high-jumper and sprinter on the girls track and field team who is ranked No. 3 in the Class of 2020, has been chosen as a scholar athlete of the year by the New Jersey State Interscholastic Athletic Association as well as the Union County Athletic Conference.

Dami Awoyinfa, a dominant defensive end on the football team who is in the Top 5 percent of the class, is being honored as a male scholar athlete of the year by the Union County Athletic Conference.

"We couldn't ask for two better representatives of our Athletic Department and our district," said Athletic Director Steven Viana. "Dami and Chisom are the very definition of a studentathlete, as well as fine young adults. They have accomplished so much at Linden High School and will surely carry that success on to college and through the rest of their lives."

Each is being awarded a scholarship of at least \$1,000 for their honor from the Union County Athletic Conference.

Chisom Uzor has been on the winter and spring track teams for four years, as well as two years on the cross-country team and a year on the volleyball team. She placed third in the high jump at the Union County Championships as a junior and senior and took third in the North Jersey Section II State Championship as a junior and second as a senior.

Uzor has accepted a full academic scholarship to Georgia State University, where she plans to major in nursing. She hopes to one day go to medical school to become a trauma surgeon.

Considering her athletic prowess, it is not surprising that Uzor's favorite class at LHS was Sports, Exercise, and Health Science, which is part of the International Baccalaureate program, the school's most rigorous and challenging course of study.

Her hard work translated to the track team as well, which she said was just as important to her as her classwork. She intends to continue with

Dami Awoyinfa was on the football team for four years, as well as the spring track team for three years, winter track for one, and basketball for one.

He started to stand out as a junior on the football team when he became a starter at defensive end. He finished his career with 139 tackles, 23 sacks, seven forced fumbles, two fumble recoveries, and two touchdowns. In 2018, he was voted First Team All-Watchung Division and First Team All-Group 4. In 2019 he was voted First Team All-Watchung and Second Team All-Group 4. He was selected to play in the 2019 Phil Simms North vs. South All-Star Classic.

Awoyinfa recently committed to join the Rutgers University football team on scholarship.

"As a highly successful student-athlete he was pursued by many Division 1 programs as well as Ivy League schools such as Dartmouth and Columbia," Chiola said. "Each time a college coach visited Dami, they walked away extremely impressed, with not just with his academics and football skills but the character traits of Dami the person."

Defensive coach Anthony Reinoso said Awoyinfa's size and speed on the defensive line made things difficult for opponents.

Awoyinfa said his two favorite classes were political science and IB history, which were both taught by Meghann Mohan. He said he plans to major in political science at Rutgers.

His coaches will be keeping an eye on him and expect nothing but success.

"With proper training, nutrition, and technique there is no limit to the player he could become this year as he starts his career at Rutgers competing in the Big 10," Reinoso said, "which is one of the most competitive football conferences in the country.


LINDEN EMERGENCY RESPONSE SYSTEM OFFERS PEACE OF MIND

Today's spotlight is on our thriving Linden CIC location, which works closely with the Honorable Mayor, Derek Armstead and the City Council to meet the needs of residents of all wards. The one-stop-center is housed in the City of Linden Recreational Center, 1025 John Street, providing Youth, Adult, and Family Empowerment services to more than 1,000 individuals annually.

Services include, but are not limited to, utility assistance (Flex Funds, NJ Shares, LIHEAP); SNAP for food assistance; Anger Management Training for court-ordered cases; Mentoring with life coaches for youth ages 8-16 year-round; Youth Awaiting Adjudication hearings and their families; Juvenile Justice-Involved Youth, Computer Literacy Classes; Budgeting and Financial Literacy Classes; CIC's Women's Support Group; Senior Programming; Monthly Family Dinners and Game Nites, Cooking Classes, a Community Garden; Arts & Crafts classes and more.

The Linden First Employment and Job Readiness Program, under the City of Linden Mayor Armstead and the Linden City Council, assisted in Linden's economic development. Almost 300 pre-screened referrals were made for jobs at the Linden Super Walmart and more than 150 pre-screened referrals were made to

Superfresh, not including those referred for local and Union and Essex County open positions with Wawa, Amazon, CAU, the hospitals and more.

During the COVID-19 Pandemic, CIC staff is working from home and has innovatively been able to continue their youth mentoring, Linden First and other areas of social services by personally helping clients by phone to navigate the many systems including unemployment, motor vehicle matters, medical connections, connections to alcohol and mental health programs and some food services. Despite limitations from shelter in place orders, CIC has still provided direct services to 60 families in need of food and toiletries using mostly donated gift cards from funders, with a priority on those who have not yet received their unemployment and the undocumented. Thankfully we can make referrals to the Mayor's COVID 19 food programming. CIC has disseminated masks and gloves to some families in need and provided utility assistance to many families.

CIC's staff is remarkable: Dr. Tremaine Afetorbor; Kishon DuBose; Shayla Hatcher, MSW; Jessica Jensen; David Jones; Tiffanie Jones; Dr. Pamela B. 



One small step by Linden High School (LHS) worked hard to sell enough socks. students will mean a lifetime of steps for a man halfway around the world.

LHS juniors recently completed a project in which they sold socks to raise money to buy a prosthetic leg for someone in need. The effort was spearheaded by student Michelle Gaston as part of her Creativity, Activity and Service (CAS) project, a requirement for students in the International Baccalaureate (IB) program, the most challenging course of study at LHS.

"I was looking to establish something that could not only help me interact with the community but also find a way to give back to those less fortunate," Gaston said. "This fundraiser really helped me engage with people and make them realize that something small can really go a long way."

Gaston recently learned that the money she and her classmates raised went toward buying a prosthetic for a man named William in Uganda, who had lost his leg in a car accident. He had been unable to work or support his family but now is back to leading a normal life.

"I am so happy and proud to have been part of such an impacting and rewarding fundraiser and I hope that this wonderful experience is only the beginning to many more," Gaston said.

Anthony Fischetti, coordinator of the IB program, said that Gaston and the other juniors

"They are truly a socially conscious group of teenagers that are aware that giving back to the less fortunate is a cornerstone of not just the IB program, but to the mission of our district as well," he said.

The project was completed through an organization called We Help Two, which provides socks with funky patterns to the student to sell, then uses the money raised to buy the prosthetic.

Gaston wanted to thank everyone who bought the socks and helped make a difference.

"Not only were these generous people buying a pair of socks, but they were also contributing to the wellbeing and happiness of someone in need," she said. "I think that's what I truly enjoyed seeing when I involved myself in this fundraiser."

Fischetti, who took over as IB coordinator this school year, said this junior class is special to him.

"They are really my first cohort of students that will start and complete the IB program under my supervision," he said. "They have been ambitious from the start, logging various CAS activities throughout the year, including ones organized by our LHS Alumni Association like the Thanksgiving food donation and distribution back in 2019."

LINDEN MIDDLE SCHOOL'S LITTLE LIBRARIES NOW OFFER FOOD FOR THOSE IN NEED

Soehl Middle School in Linden has converted its Little Free Libraries to "Little Free Pantries" during this time of difficulties for so many families.
