



# FOOT LOCKER AWARDS BROOKE GALLO \$20K SCHOLARSHIP

In addition to leading the Unified Sports team, Brooke is also the captain of her varsity tennis team, a member of the varsity swimming team, and the Lieutenant Governor for New Jersey District for Key Club. A 3.7 GPA student, Brooke will attend Nova Southeastern University's speech pathology program and plans to help the university develop a Unified Sports Program of its own.

# **UNION COUNTY RESIDENTS JOIN LITERACY VOLUNTEER TUTOR PROGRAM**

Literacy New Jersey welcomes ten new volunteer tutors from Union County who have joined the ranks as English as a Second Language tutors after completing a 15-hour training course. The new trainees include Leah Brown, Joan Craig, Carolyn Daurio, Tom Ganley, Tom Kaercher, Sherry Krakauer, Laura Lesniak, Ken Mirsky, Wilneris Santana and Teresa Tejeda-Melo. The training prepares tutors to work with adults who struggle with reading, writing and speaking English. Literacy New Jersey tutors work in libraries, schools and church centers throughout Union County helping adults improve their skills in order to find better jobs, help their children in school, and become more involved in the community.

Several of the new trainees got right to work and are already teaching at locations such as the Elizabeth Public Library and Summit High School, where Literacy New Jersey has thriving ESL programs. These programs serve the



growing immigrant population in Union County. Part of the recent Literacy New Jersey training included class observations at these locations where the new tutors had the opportunity to meet students and observe experienced tutors in action.

According to one trainee, "The tutor training program is very well put together. The trainers are amazing! I am confident about all I have learned and I am both excited and nervous to meet my students." Literacy New Jersey runs tutor training twice a year, in January and September. The training provides a practical, hands on approach to working with adults, and includes ideas for materials and activities as well as strategies for lesson planning. # KEAN UNIVERSITY STUDENT-VETERAN RECEIVES K-9 SERVICE DOG

A special ceremony was held on Kean University's Union campus as senior Jason Pryor, a U.S. Army veteran, introduced the K-9 service dog that he received through an on-campus fundraiser.

Pryor, a senior from Elizabeth majoring in exercise science, did tours in Iraq and Honduras and suffers from PTSD. He received the K-9, named Keen, at the start of the Fall semester as a gift from the Kean Office of Student Government.

"Being with Keen has taught me to be more patient," said Pryor, whose dog accompanies him to class. "Keen is used as a measure to help prevent me from going through the symptoms

and effects of spiraling down, by me tending to anthem by the Kean Gospel Choir, and the his needs and having him tend to me."

Kean is ranked first in the nation among large public schools for its programs supporting student-veterans, according to the Military Friendly Schools survey.

Student Government raised nearly \$20,000 to support service dogs through Rebuilding Warriors, a volunteer non-profit organization whose mission is to provide trained service dogs to veterans. The bulk of the funds raised went toward training Pryor's dog, and the rest was donated to Rebuilding Warriors to help train other K-9 dogs.

At the ceremony held outside Miron Student Center, Vito Zajda, director of Veteran Student Services at Kean and a U.S. Coast Guard veteran, called Pryor a remarkable student.

"He has been a big support and influential person in our program," Zajda said. "He has helped open our eyes about how the University can best support its vets."

Vice President of Rebuilding Warriors Jeff Mullins, also a veteran, said post-traumatic stress disorder (PTSD) is a condition that can't be seen by others. "It's invisible, stays with you your entire life, and it's not easy sometimes," he said. "Our goal is to provide veterans and first responders with a service dog to help them achieve their new normal."

The University's Veterans Day event included a color guard, a performance of the national

presentation of other honors.

Juan Leon Torres, a senior from Spotswood also studying exercise science and a U.S. Navy veteran, received the 2019 Kean Veteran's Award for Outstanding Mentor. He develops transition opportunities and initiatives, and mentors a student-veteran each semester.

"Being a veteran and going back to school is super hard because you go from one community to a different lifestyle," Torres said.

Zajda noted that it is important to support veterans at all times. "The importance of Veterans Day is to recognize that it's 365 days a year, as veterans go through different highs and lows in their lives," he said.

# **UNION COUNTY TEEN GETS CREATIVE IN SERVICE DOG QUEST**

During a routine 12-year check-up two years ago, Cranford's Maeve Boger-O'Bryan was sent from her pediatrician's office directly to the emergency room at Children's Goryeb Hospital in Morristown. Thanks to her doctor recognizing signs of the autoimmune disease Type 1 Diabetes, Maeve received the urgent medical care she needed, which included several days in intensive care.

Type 1 Diabetes (T1D) occurs when the immune system attacks the cells in the pancreas that produce insulin, the hormone that regulates blood sugar. There is no cure. Unlike the more common Type 2 diabetes, T1D is unrelated to food choices or exercise. In order to survive, those with T1D must act as their own pancreas, regularly injecting insulin to maintain healthy blood sugars. Determining correct insulin amounts requires counting carbohydrates in all food and drink, and accounting for sports, the weather, even if they have a cold. Stressing about tests at school can send blood sugars awry, as can the warm water of a pool, bath or shower.

Maeve and her parents make no secret of the struggle to adjust. From classmates wary of "catching her diabetes" to stepping away from fun with friends to test, calculate and dose or treat a low. Sleep is impacted, too. Maeve wears a continuous glucose monitor (CGM), a sensor she inserts every 10 days, to ease blood sugar management and allow her parents to monitor levels by phone and during the night. Alarms sound if levels become dangerous.

There's another tool for those with T1D and, for many, it's a game-changer: Specialized service dogs trained to the scent of their handler's chemical shifts from high or low blood sugars. Well-trained diabetic alert dogs can sense changes at least half an hour before they happen or the CGM can register it. Preventing dangerous levels lessens risks for seizure, loss of consciousness, coma and more. Costs for such a dog, though, are steep, often well into the \$20,000s. After insulin, supplies and hospitalizations, that sum is out of reach for many

families.

When Maeve asked to start a Go-Fund-Me campaign, her parents tapped the brakes. "It's so important to us, nearly as much as her having this life-saving companion and support, that Maeve understand hard work brings the best results. We agreed to fundraising but told her she must have 'skin in the game.' That's when the brainstorming began," says mom Gretchen.

Enter Maeve's alter ego, GlucaGirl. In November, the 14-year-old began selling coasters she creates with alcohol ink on ceramic tile. Sealed with a glassy finish that withstands moisture and 270 degree heat, the unique \$10 works of art have been selling nearly as fast as Maeve — and now her parents — can make them. After a "porch pop-up" shop at their home, holiday craft shows and community members spreading the word or donating funds, Maeve is closing in on \$5,000.

She says, "I don't think of myself as creative, but these are fun. I love seeing what the inks can do and then seeing people excited to pick their favorites. There's still a ton I need to make to reach the goal, and some days that's hard because some days after school I just want to relax. I know it won't matter, though, once I bring my service dog home." When the time comes, Maeve plans to ask those who've supported her to choose the dog's name with an online vote. She adds, "If I raise more than I need, I'm going to help others waiting for their service dog."


