

# JEREMY DAVIES APPOINTED PRINCIPAL OF KENILWORTH'S DAVID BREARLEY MIDDLE-HIGH SCHOOL

Mr. Jeremy Davies was unanimously appointed to lead the Kenilworth School District's David Brearley Middle-High School at the Kenilworth Board of Education meeting held on June 8, 2020. Mr. Davies will succeed Ms. Dana Chibbaro who resigned to serve another district.

The selection of Mr. Davies came after a comprehensive search process that included rounds of interviews with teachers, parents, students, administrators and board of education members. Additionally, the public provided input into the profile of the ideal candidate which was used to govern parts of the interview process.

Mr. Davies is an English teacher by trade, having launched his career in the Westfield Public School District, later serving as Assistant Principal in that same district. Additionally, Mr. Davies served as high school principal of the Mountain Lakes School District for six years and as a Supervisor of Instruction for the Hanover Park Regional High School District.

Mr. Davies holds a master's degree from the College of St. Elizabeth in Educational Administration, another master's from the University of Notre Dame in Education and did his undergraduate work at Villanova University.

Mr. Davies, upon hearing of his appointment stated, "I am thrilled to be appointed principal of David Brearley Middle School-High School. Throughout the interview process, I found each panel — students, teachers, the leadership team, parents, Board of Education members — genuine and kind, eager for growth, and full of pride for David Brearley. I quickly came to share Superintendent Arlington's belief in the exciting potential of Kenilworth. I am eager to begin building trusting relationships with everyone in the district and working to push each student and staff member to be his or her best. Thank you to Mr. Arlington and the Board for trusting me with this key responsibility and opportunity."

Superintendent of Schools, Kyle Arlington said: "Mr. Davies was a top contender throughout the robust interview process. His interpersonal skills, coupled with his intellect, shone through. He has a track record of collaborating successfully with stakeholders not only to increase achievement but to build school spirit and morale. The best part of the





#### STATE ASSISTANCE FOR RENTERS

COVID-19 Emergency Rental Assistance Program (CVERAP) will be open on Monday, July 6, 2020, at 9 a.m. until Friday, July 10, 2020, at 5 p.m.

The COVID-19 Emergency Rental Assistance Program (CVERAP) will provide temporary rental assistance to low- and moderate-income households that have had a substantial reduction in income or became unemployed due the COVID-19 pandemic.

Applicants may be eligible for a maximum of up to six months of emergency rental assistance.

The Statewide Open Enrollment Site for the The assistance will be capped at DCA's fair market rent standard or the total of the rent, whichever is lesser. All participants will be reviewed at the three-month interval to see if they are still in need of assistance. Persons applying must meet all applicable CVERAP income and eligibility requirements. You must be eighteen years of age or older to apply or be an emancipated minor. Only one pre-application per household will be accepted. All participants will be selected through an online lottery process.

# WHAT, WHERE, AND WHEN IN OLD KENILWORTH: OLDEST GIRL SCOUT TURNS 99

Resident Edythe C. Frank joined scouting 90 years ago when in 1930 at the age of nine she became a Brownie troop member in her native Jersey City. She officially became a registered Girl Scout in 1935. Even after she surpassed the age to be a Girl Scout, she continued to pay her dues over the years and to this day remains a dues-paid member. She is believed to be the longest serving Kenilworth Girl Scout and possibly the longest serving ever in New Jersey.

She married George J. Frank on Armistice Day, 1943 while he was on short leave from the U. S. Army. She said, "He came home one day and we got married the next." George passed away in 2012 after 68 years of marriage. After the war they rented space in Millburn and soon had two children – George (aka "Stretch') and Laurie-Jo. The couple bought some building lots in Kenilworth and began to erect their own home with their own labor and that of relatives and friends. She remarked, "I handed him the cinder blocks and he added the mortar." At last, in 1949, they moved in and later had two more children – Sue-Ellen and Donna-Claire.

Husband George and son were with the local Cub Scouts; and Edythe and daughters with the Brownies and Girl Scouts. She first served as Brownie troop leader. As those girls became older the group transitioned into Girl Scout Troop 855. Edythe was a leader from 1957 to 1971, serving with some of Kenilworth's most revered early

Resident Edythe C. Frank joined scouting 90 local Girl Scout leaders such as Esther Cassera, ars ago when in 1930 at the age of nine she came a Brownie troop member in her native McGeehan, among others.

Edythe recalls trips to Camp Wild Cherry and the old Girl Scout cabin at the end of N. 18th St. adjacent to Black Brook Park. There she enjoyed seeing young girls toast marsh mellows by campfires, bake cakes on reflective sun ovens, sun-dry dishes, study plants and flowers, and help girls earn merit badges. She reported, "There was really nothing around there at the time. There was a lot of open space." She advised that there were lots of wild cherry trees, poison ivy, dirt, and dust. She stated, "We couldn't wait to wash off all of the dirt from camp.

"When we got home after day camp, the first thing we did was to shower to get rid of the dirt."

In 1995 Edythe was honored by the Washington Rock Girl Scout Council with a 60-year service pin and again in in 2005 with a 70-year pin. Still a dues-paid Girl Scout after 90 years, Edythe indicated a few years ago, "Everyone worked nicely together at Camp Wild Cherry. We really were sincere about following the Girl Scout Promise and Law. I still follow it today."

#### **NEW COMMEMORATIVE COVERLET PAYS** TRIBUTE TO FIRST RESPONDERS AND VETERANS

(throw) featuring many of Kenilworth's prominent historic sites and landmarks, particularly those that represent first responders, the U.S. Postal Service, veterans and small businesses, is available on a pre-order basis from the Kenilworth Historical Society. As with its predecessor, which was produced in 2007, this second edition coverlet is being viewed as a wonderful heirloom gift to be enjoyed and treasured from generation to generation.

The 48" x 68" colored woven design reflects the Kenilworth Historical Society's mission, through the Oswald J. Nitschke House "living history" museum and cultural arts center, of "Bringing Cultures and History Together." It features such historic sites/landmarks as the Kenilworth Municipal Building (c. 1962); Kenilworth Public Library (c. 1936); Shallcross Pond/Black Brook Park (c. 1957); Sayre-Shallcross House (c. 1710); and McKinley School (c. 1902) plus the Kenilworth Police, Fire & Rescue Building/Vehicles (1950s); Fire House and Reo Fire Truck (1921); Kanane Building/Post Office (c. 1899); Robert E. Jeans

### **HISTORICAL SOCIETY SEEKS PANDEMIC** STORIES/VISUALS FOR UPCOMING EXHIBIT

The Kenilworth Historical Society is seeking local stories, letters, diary entries, photos, projects and other items that will help tell the story of the COVID-19 and Spanish Flu pandemics of 2020 and 1918-1920, respectively. In addition to documenting these significant times in history, the material collected will be utilized for an exhibition to be presented at the Oswald J. Nitschke House "living history" museum and cultural arts center during Union County's annual "Four Centuries in a Weekend" historical sites tour on October 17 and October 18, 2020.

The exhibition will feature a COVID-19 timeline and related oral testimonies that David Brearley Middle/High School senior and Kenilworth Historical Society member Michael T. Naya Jr. is compiling, as part of the organization's oral history program, in an effort document and preserve, for future generations, an account of daily life during the current pandemic. Another part of the exhibition will tell the story of the devastating Spanish flu pandemic that occurred a little over 100 years ago, during Oswald J. Nitschke's first term as mayor of Kenilworth.

#### FRIENDS OF BLACK BROOK PARK U.C

Friends of Black Brook Park and its mission statement was founded in 2001 to protect the natural setting of Black Brook Park and to ensure the respectful use of it, by way of including continuing service to project its' history also, for the understanding of the park users and "friends." If you care about the park, you are a "friend." The Olmsted history included, reflects today's needs. A brief Olmsted history of the park is especially helpful now.

As we all remember the social protocol during these Covid19 times while at the park, such as social distancing and the wearing of masks to keep each other safe there is an increase in its' usage. I am happy to say, respectfully, rightfully harmoniously.

While using the park, I would like to remind you of the Olmstead design of the park. Having learned about this design firm it is quite great to say that Blackbrook Park is an Olmstead park.

This architectural landscape designed by the sons of Frederick Law Olmsted on Black Brook Park's conceptualization, was done in 1921. As you take a minute, look around the park and you'll notice the well designed placement of the trees around the park that gives you the sense that indeed, it was carefully planned. The County of Union continues to follow the Olmstead design and most recently has planted an elm tree through their Rutgers Extension Program, on the south west bank of the Shallcross Pond by the Black Brook. This was planted to block out traffic noise, a great beautiful addition among other things, the Olmsted firm stood for even after his

passing in 1903.

greenway when Black Brook and the other parks hustle and bustle of everyday life. in the county East West "parkway" were formed.
