WHS MUSICIANS VIRTUAL CONCERT FOR SENIOR CITIZENS

In recent years, members of the Westfield High School (WHS) Band and Orchestra have volunteered their talent and time to perform a concert for the residents at Westfield Senior Citizens Housing.

This year, with COVID-19 keeping everyone at home, WHS band directors Christopher Vitale and Trevor Sindorf came up with a way to provide some virtual entertainment to the senior residents through a unique remote learning project.

"The students had the option to create a performance on their instrument (solo or collaboration with peers) or a video message using the song of their choice," says Vitale. "We asked them to pick music written between 1940 and 1980 so it would be relatable for their audience."

Vitale and Sindorf say they are "extremely proud" of their band students, all of whom submitted videos to be considered for the 30-minute virtual concert, which was emailed in May to the senior residents. The video could not be posted publicly, due to copyrighted materials.

"Thank you to you and your gifted students for producing such a wonderful program for the Westfield Senior Citizens Housing," writes recreation director Carezza Motley in an email on May 27. "We have enjoyed the astonishing creativity from such a talented group of students. I hope we can thank them all face-to-face one day soon."





WESTFIELD HIGH SCHOOL NAMES AWARD WINNING TEACHERS

Westfield High School community with awards of excellence. At virtual announcements to staff and students on May 13-14, principal Mary Asfendis named the award winners, who were nominated by students, staff and parents at the school.

Science teacher Suzanne Glynn is the recipient of the Distinguished Teacher of the Year Award, established to annually recognize a teacher who, through both excellence in teaching and a demonstrated commitment to intellectual pursuits beyond the classroom, serves as a model and inspiration to the high school community. Those who nominated Glynn say "the time, effort, and care she puts into her classes" and her obvious love of "every aspect of chemistry" makes her deserving of the award. "Her excitement is infectious as I have never seen anyone leave chemistry without a smile," one student nominator says. "Mrs. Glynn answers all of our questions and we have the best class discussions."

The Above and Beyond Award recognizes a teacher or counselor who has made a difference in the life of a struggling child either socially, emotionally or academically, This year's recipient is special education teacher Lillian (Gail) Alston who is lauded as an educator who believes in her students and encourages them to follow their interests. "From the time I started in her Earth Science class, she always encouraged

> Mathematics/Project '79 teacher Louis DeAngelo received the Parent-Teacher-Student Organization (PTSO) Teacher of the Year Award which annually recognizes a teacher who is encouraging and motivating, is a good role model, and shows respect for co-workers, students and parents. DeAngelo, who also serves as advisor to the Robotics Club, is applauded by those who nominated him for his "infinite patience," "endless energy," and for teaching students to be leaders. "He is completely devoted to teaching and to the students," says one nominator.

For providing extra support for struggling

students and for "checking in on his students to make sure their academic and personal lives are going well," mathematics teacher Matthew Gironda was honored with the Robert and Linda Foose Memorial Award, named for a former principal and teacher. "In addition, Mr. Gironda has prepared full hour virtual lessons while we are on home instruction due to COVID-19," says a student nominator. Rotary International District 7475 has donated much needed critical care equipment to Overlook Hospital in Summit, NJ to help with the COVID 19 Pandemic.

Overlook Hospital renovated two additional floors to become ICU units, and sought funding to help purchase the equipment. They have ordered 20 Critical Care Beds, model Hillrom Progressa Bed System. The beds can be upgraded in the future and cost \$34,000 each and have technology to help patients breath. The hospital does not like to transfer patients between beds, because it increases the risk of nonsocomial infections, which means getting an infection in the hospital. Therefore, these beds are designed to be used in other therapeutic modalities. They are designed to be mobile- you can wheel them down the hall to other departments. The useful life of one of these high tech beds is 12 to 15 years. Each bed could potentially save thousands of lives.

Past District Governor Dr. D. Michael Hart is the Foundation Chair for the District. He was able to write a grant proposal which was matched by The Rotary International Foundation totaling \$34,000 to purchase one bed for Overlook Hospital.

Dr. Hart recently wrote two other grants totaling \$100,000 to purchase 10 ventilators for Trinitas Hospital in Elizabeth, NJ and RWJ Barnabas Hospital in Somerset, NJ. Robert Wood Johnson Barnabas is the largest health system in New Jersey with 15 hospitals. Overlook is part of the Atlantic Health System with 5 hospitals. Hospital chains share equipment as needed, or divert patients to open hospital wards as needed, so these donations will help the two largest health systems in New Jersey.



EDUCATOR JEANINE GOTTKO AWARDED ROTARY PHILHOWER FELLOWSHIP

Jeanine Gottko, who taught first and fifth grade at Franklin Elementary School in Westfield before working with both students and teachers in the district as a master technology teacher, is the 2020 recipient of the Rotary Club of Westfield's Philhower Fellowship in recognition of outstanding teaching at the elementary school level.

Gottko received the news on April 23 during a virtual meeting with Assistant Superintendent for Curriculum, Instruction and Programs Paul Pineiro, to which Superintendent Dr. Margaret Dolan paid a surprise virtual visit.

"Jeanine is so deserving of this important recognition," says Dolan. "Her years as a classroom teacher combined with an impressive knowledge of digital learning tools and technology has been invaluable to our school community, especially during the educational upheaval caused by COVID-19."

A Westfield native, Gottko joined the Westfield Public School District in 1997 as a first grade teacher at Franklin, moving down the hall two years later to teach fifth grade for 13 years.

"I always hoped I would teach in Westfield because I had received such an outstanding education here and I knew what a wonderful district it was," says Gottko who received a Bachelor of Science in Education from the University of Delaware in 1997. "I also liked the sense of community and the ability to continue the district's tradition of excellence for future students."

In nominating Gottko, a team of teachers at Tamaques Elementary School noted her expertise in instructional technology. "Her knowledge and skills reflect her continued pursuit of professional

"Our recent abrupt switch to distance learning put Jeanine's skills in the spotlight, as she is suddenly in charge of teaching everyone in the district, including staff, administrators, and parents, how to use an overwhelming number of different tools. She has instilled in all of us that we are capable of using technology to make distance learning effective."

Another letter from a fellow educator lauds Gottko for going above and beyond to provide elearning tools and assistance throughout the school year. "When the district moved to distance learning and the weight of the entire district was suddenly upon her shoulders, she has continued to support us in an astounding way."

Gottko has been a master technology teacher for grades K-8 for the past 7 years, serving as an instructional coach for teachers and administrators, planning and conducting professional development sessions, and visiting classrooms to incorporate technology into student lessons. In 2013, Gottko was named one of the National School Boards Association's "20 to Watch," a prestigious recognition of "emerging U.S. education leaders for their ability to inspire fellow educators and their innovative use of technology to contribute to the creation of high-quality learning environments."

"Jeanine is that unique combination of experienced classroom teacher and educational technology wiz," says Pineiro. "She is respected and trusted. Her calm and compassionate approach has gone a long way in soothing our school community during this adjustment to distance learning."

Gottko also has created a Distance Learning webpage for parents, with helpful e-learning resources on Webex, Google Hangouts/Meets, Google Classroom, and other digital instructional tools.


When asked about a professional highlight, Gottko says, as a longtime teacher, she enjoys keeping up with what former students are doing. "Quite a few have become teachers themselves and others are doing extraordinary things despite having lives that weren't as simple as they planned."

She credits her parents, former Rotarian and Westfield Town Administrator Ed Gottko and Jean Gottko, a nurse, with encouraging her to volunteer outside the classroom. "My parents always encouraged me to join different committees, to play a role in my community, and to never limit myself."

Gottko received the Rotary Philhower Award on May 5 as a guest of honor during a virtual Rotary Club meeting. That evening, she was recognized as well at a virtual meeting of the Board of Education.

The Philhower Fellowship was established in 1993 by the Rotary Club to honor former Westfield Rotarian Charles Philhower and to recognize the importance of teaching in the elementary grades. An educator for more than 50 years, Charles Philhower, who died in 1962, was supervising principal (superintendent) of Westfield schools for three decades as well as cofounder and past president of the Rotary Club of Westfield, and District Governor.



Five Westfield student teams demonstrated creativity, ingenuity, and presentation skills in specific problem-solving categories at the Gateway Regional Odyssey of the Mind Tournament, held on March 7 in Sayreville, NJ, with three teams placing first, second, and third in various categories.

A team comprised of students from Edison and Roosevelt Intermediate Schools placed 1st in the "Mechanical Problem," building a networking device capable of transmitting an image, email and text message between three different network segments. The team also was required to include a pop up advertisement, a malware character to "infect" the network and an anti-virus hero to rescue the network. The Franklin Elementary School team, new to the tournament this year, placed 2nd in the "Balsa Wood Problem," building an adjustable balsa wood structure that could sustain a maximum weight without breaking. These two teams were

eligible to advance to the state Odyssey of the Mind competition, which has been cancelled due to COVID-19.

A team from Tamaques Elementary School placed 3rd in the "Classics" category and two primary teams from Tamaques and McKinley Schools participated in the competition as well. Primary teams are not given awards but gain valuable collaborative, problem-solving, and presenting skills.

Odyssey of the Mind is an international educational program for students from kindergarten through college. According to njbrotm.org, "team members apply their ingenuity and creativity to solve problems that range from building mechanical devices to presenting their own interpretation of literary classics," bringing their solutions to regional, state and world competitions.

UNION COUNTY POSTMASTERS SHARE TIPS FOR RESPONSIBLE PET OWNERSHIP

Last year 169 letter carriers were victimized by dogs in New Jersey, including 16 in Union County. The 15 postmasters serving the 21 municipalities in Union County are therefore raising public awareness of the importance of responsible pet ownership in helping prevent dog bites.

To prevent dog bites, Union County Postmasters recommend the following responsible pet ownership tips:

- Obedience training can teach dogs proper behavior and help owners control their dog in any situation.
- When the letter carrier comes to your home, keep your dog inside, away from the door, in another room, or on a leash.
- Dogs can be protective of their territory and may interpret the actions of letter carriers as a threat. Please take precautions when accepting mail in the presence of your pet.
- Dogs that haven't been properly socialized, receive little attention or handling, or are left tied-up for long periods of time frequently turn into biters.

By following these few simple tips, pet owners can significantly improve neighborhood safety for everyone.



The deadline for Westfield residents interested in considering a term on the Board of Education (BOE) is Monday, July 27 at 4 p.m. when nominating petitions should be filed with the Office of the Union County Clerk in Elizabeth.

Please note that, at the time of publication, two bills are pending in the New Jersey legislature that would require an electronic process for the collection of petition signatures and their submission for elections during the duration of the COVID-19 public health emergency. Westfield school board candidates should check with the Union County Clerk about current filing

requirements.

The Westfield Board of Education will have three open seats in November. The two board members whose three-year terms are expiring on December 31, 2020 are Kent Diamond and Peggy Oster. Additionally, the one-year unexpired term held by Brian Morrissey will expire on December 31, 2020, creating a three-year seat on the November ballot.



During the past 20 years, over 2000 of Rahway's street trees have died or were removed and never replaced. Resident Bob Markey is producing a three-episode video which provides viewers with a sobering look into this serious crisis affecting Rahway's trees.
