RIVERWALK RESTORATION PROJECT RESUMES ACTIVITIES

The Cranford Heritage Corridor is a 5,000-foot recreational area that spans across Cranford's most recognizable landmarks along the Rahway River.

The Riverwalk Committee hosed a Riverwalk Restoration Project on Saturday, September 12. Though COVID-19 interfered with maintaining the grounds, it was deemed safe for volunteers to return and follow CDC guidelines. Participants wore masks and practiced social distancing while cleaning up and performing other maintenance to the grounds.

A monthly Riverwalk cleanup and maintenance of the grounds will continue the 2nd Saturday of each month from 10 a.m. – 12 p.m. (weather permitting). The next is scheduled for October 10th. Volunteers are to report to either the intersection of South Avenue and Lincoln Park East in Cranford, known as the Heritage Plaza, or behind Droescher's Mill on Lincoln Park East, also in Cranford.

The Cranford Heritage Riverwalk, a part of the Union County parks system, is as old as Cranford itself. Committee members are calling upon people within the community to come forward and help revitalize this area so it becomes a focus of celebration once again. In particular, the Riverwalk Committee hopes that this space will become a central focus of Cranford's 150th anniversary in 2021.

Participants both young and old can report to the volunteer stations located on either end of the Riverwalk and offer their time and energy to contribute. Tasks such as mulching, weeding, clearing the pathway and more are constant needs. Volunteers are asked to wear masks while the COVID-19 pandemic is still occurring. They are also asked to bring work gloves and any gardening tools that may help in this effort.

"Safety, of course, is paramount to our group," stated Mason when asking for volunteers to participate. "The path itself is eight-feet wide, allowing us the recommended six feet of distance between each person. Using these measures, we feel comfortable inviting the public to help be a part of history. Children will benefit by learning more about the town and seeing history come to life right before their eyes, and adults will find another section of Cranford transition from being forgotten, to becoming a gem for passive recreation."

The Cranford Heritage Corridor includes the parklands from Orange Avenue at the Cranford Canoe Club from the 19th century, and meanders through town following the Rahway River to the Williams-Droescher Mill from the early 18th century. The century-old stone walls and iconic stone columns are still in place, but are in need of restoration and preservation. Future plans include repairing the Kaltenbach

Estate Skating Pond, Victorian Footbridge and Squire Williams Picnic Grove. There are over 20 special projects that are a part of the master plan.

"Cranford is known as 'The Venice of New Jersey', complete with river carnivals, boating, fishing and skating on the Rahway River. Residents and visitors gather here for fun and relaxing all the time. We hope that the Cranford Heritage Corridor will once again be returned to its former glory," said Mason.

Since that time, a group of dedicated volunteers have taken up the mantle in an effort to see the Riverwalk re-established and become a central part of the Cranford community. The Cranford Heritage Corridor, part of the Rahway River Parkway, Union County Department of Parks and Recreation, is a 210-acre recreational area that spans across Cranford's most recognizable landmarks along the Rahway River. The Cranford Heritage Plaza and Riverwalk Committee hosts regular cleanups and advocates to restore the Riverwalk back to its original glory.

JAMIE WARNER NAMED COUNTY TEACHER OF THE YEAR

The New Jersey School Boards Association recently named the 21 outstanding educators who have been selected as the County Teachers of the Year for 2020-2021 including Jamie Warner, an 8th grade social studies teacher at Orange Avenue School in Cranford.

"Teachers and schools have the power to change lives, said Interim Education Commissioner Kevin Dehmer. "The County Teachers of the Year who were announced today are being honored not only for their outstanding performance, but also for their high expectations for all students."

The County Teachers of the Year will network with educators throughout the state and serve as ambassadors for New Jersey's public schools. A panel of educators then will select the New Jersey State Teacher of the Year based on written applications, video submissions, and interviews with the top finalists.

The New Jersey State Teacher of the Year is typically announced at the State Board of Education's October meeting and will go on to represent New Jersey in competing for the title of National Teacher of the Year.





VFW KICKS-OFF SCHOLARSHIP COMPETITION

Jay Boxwell, Commander of Veterans of \$30,000 college scholarship. Foreign Wars of the U.S. Post 335 in Cranford announced the kick-off of this year's VFW's Voice of Democracy Scholarship competition. Local high school students have the opportunity to compete for thousands of dollars in scholarships and a trip to Washington, D.C.

Students must write and record a three-to-five minute essay on the selected theme using an audio CD or flash drive and present their recording, typed essay and completed entry form to their local VFW Post by October 31. The 2020-2021 theme selected is "Is This the Country the Founders Envisioned" Students begin by competing at the local post level, then post winners compete at the district level with the winner advancing to the state competition.

All state first-place winners receive a fourday trip to Washington, D.C., and the chance to compete for their share of more than \$150,000 in scholarships. The first-place winner receives a

The National Association of Broadcasters (NAB) started the Voice of Democracy Scholarship program in 1947. The VFW became a national sponsor in the late 1950s and assumed sole responsibility for the program in 1961. The competition was created to provide students grades 9-12 the opportunity to express themselves in regard to democratic ideas and principles. Around 40,000 students participate in the competition each year and VFW awards more than \$2.1 million in educational scholarships every year.

Student entries, accompanied with a completed entry form, must be submitted to a local participating VFW Post. The deadline is Oct. 31, 2020.





IMAGINE SUPPORT PROGRAM FOR NURSES

Imagine, A Center for Coping with Loss announced the expansion of its virtual group support programs with one designed to help nurses dealing with the stressors of healthcare work during Covid-19. Imagine, which serves more than 2,000 individuals annually and is nationally recognized for its work helping bereaved children and their families, offers its Peer Support Group for Nurses at no cost. Interested nurses can join the weekly support group at 7:30 p.m. on Wednesdays beginning September 30.

When asked about the decision to launch this program, Imagine's Founder and Executive Director Mary Robinson said, "Through the pandemic, we recognized a gap in support for some of the people we rely on most: our nurses. Supporting nurses who are themselves supporting grieving families felt like a perfect fit for our mission."

Robinson, who was named a 2019 CNN Hero, went on to say, "Nurses continue to selflessly care for others despite their own fears about their potential exposure to Covid-19. We need to ensure they have a place to turn to for support."

For many, the anxiety they feel going to work in a healthcare environment comes on top of grief they were feeling before the pandemic even hit.

Talia Sion, a newly minted nurse, had attended Imagine's Young Adult Group for support following the death of her mother in January, and then joined the organization's pilot support program for First Responders when the pandemic hit.

Of her experience, Sion said, "I was quickly

overwhelmed with the weight of so many sick and unstable patients, not knowing if and when things would ever get back to 'normal.' Once again, Imagine created a program for me to turn to with people who understood how I feel; people who understood what I was facing on a daily basis at work."

"New Jersey is no longer a hotspot for Covid-19, but many of the nurses here are processing what they went through and bracing for a resurgence," possible Robinson "Meanwhile, there are nurses in other states in similar positions to where we were a few months ago. Sharing these stories, fears, and challenges at all different stages in a peer support model is proven to be an effective way to learn coping strategies."

As with all of Imagine's offerings, this free Peer Group Support for Nurses program will be available year-round for as long as is needed. Those who are interested can register at imaginenj.org/nurses.

Imagine, A Center for Coping with Loss is a New Jersey-based grief support center for children, young adults and families dealing with the death or life-altering illness of a parent, sibling or child.

In addition to its peer grief support programs, Imagine provides training through education and outreach programs across the state to a variety of organizations including schools, houses of worship and corporations. Its goal is to create communities where grief and loss are transformed into resilience, empathy and compassion; and where no child grieves alone.

pleased to announce that Donna Schlenker has been selected as the Educator of the Year and Paula Nowicki has been selected as the Educational Services Professional of the Year from nominations made by the BPS community as part of the New Jersey Department of Education 2019-20 Governor's Educator of the Year Program. BPS is a grades K to 5 school in Cranford.

Ms. Schlenker has taught at BPS for 27 years, with the past 14 of those years teaching first grade. She has taught every grade except for second grade. She received her master's degree in reading at Millersville University and holds an early childhood education undergraduate degree from University of Delaware. She also holds a reading specialist certification.

"I had a hard time reading and I wanted to make sure no one else had a hard time reading too," Ms. Schlenker said when asked why she decided to teach. She also was the youngest of five and always enjoyed being around children.

She teaches with patience, kindness and respect, she said. Safety is also a key component as a teacher, she added.

"Especially at this time in my career I consider this an honor," she said of being named the Educator of the Year at BPS. "For them to vote for me, I'm still on top of my game, and I feel good about that. I feel like I'm an old house... instead of tearing down the old home, I feel like I've been renovated several times over. I still retain the character of the old house, but I always try to keep fresh. All the new things coming down the pike, I learn them and then I keep some of the old and some of the new," said Ms. Schlenker, who added she is a team player and enjoys collaborating with her colleagues.

Throughout the school day, she provides her students with a lot of movement and opportunities to share and be engaged, she said.

An important part of her learning environment is incorporating music. Ms. Schlenker is known for playing the guitar while the children sit on the

Brookside Place Elementary School (BPS) is rug and listen. "Music can help you learn...and it also gives them a nice break," she explained. She teaches them songs, such as the doubles rap that aids in the six- and seven-year-olds to learn their math doubles addition, as well as patriotic songs to teach them respect for their country and the flag. The children also learn over a dozen songs, which they then perform at the Edward K. Gill Apartments for seniors in Cranford.

> Ms. Schlenker has also always had a class pet, something she said "fosters kindness and respect in a different way." For the last four years, the class pet is a guinea pig named Oreo, who the children are invited to take home and care for on weekends.

> "I love the innocence of first graders and their honesty," she said of why she likes teaching first grade. "I believe you learn more in first grade than any other grade. First grade is a big growth year. I try to make it as fun as possible because I want them to like school," Ms. Schlenker said.

> Ms. Nowicki started her career at Brookside over 20 years ago. "It's like a family here," she said of BPS. She currently is an Education Services Professional (ESP) in the fifth grade, assigned as an aide to a child, and has assisted in every grade throughout her years as an ESP. "It's an honor," she said of being chosen. "An entire fifth-grade class sent in letters saying why I should receive this honor," she explained. "I love the kids. They get me," said Mrs. Nowicki, who sometimes tells jokes over the intercom system. Some of those letters told how the children "love seeing her happy face when she opens the door in the morning," she explained. Another letter said, "When I see her waiting at door smiling, it makes me feel safe."

> Ms. Nowicki, before becoming an ESP, helped to put together the BPS Olympics, an annual oneday field event where the students are grouped into teams of countries and compete in field games such as frisbee throwing, sack races, tug of war, and more. She keeps coming back to manage it because seeing those "400 happy faces" makes it all worthwhile, she said. She's

also an emcee of the BPS Variety Show, doing comedy skits with Principal Michael Klimko in between student performances, and manages the entire springtime show where each class rehearses and then performs a dance.

HEARTS FOR EMMA PARTNER FUND AWARDS SCHOLARSHIPS

The NJ Sharing Network Foundation recently awarded scholarships to high school graduates for their passion and dedication to raising awareness of organ and tissue donation. These scholarships are made possible thanks to several of the Foundation's family and partner funds.

The Hearts for Emma Partner Fund, which was created to celebrate the successful heart transplant of Emma Rothman of Cranford, awarded three scholarships to recognize graduating high school seniors whose lives have been touched by organ and tissue donation and transplantation. Each student was individually presented with their scholarship award at NJ Sharing Network's headquarters in New Providence during a private ceremony in the Landscape of Life Meditation Garden. Hearts for Emma Partner Fund's 2020-2021 scholarship winners are:

Elexa Rogolsky of Morganville (2020 graduate of Marlboro High School) has been continually organizing activities to promote donation since her father's life was saved by a heart transplant when she was 8-years-old. Elexa served as the President of MHS's Donate Life club for four years, served as MHS's Team Captain for the 5K Celebration of Life and raised more than \$20,000 by leading dozens of fundraising events, including bubble releases, and basket and scarfmaking activities. Elexa plans to attend the University of Florida in the Fall.

Tiffany Rolon-Lucas of Woodbridge (2020 graduate of Colonia High School) was met with the biggest hurdle of her young life during her sophomore year when she was diagnosed with degenerative kidney disease. She fought for her life while on dialysis and returned to school with a catheter in her chest and a tube in her stomach. Thanks to a successful kidney transplant, Tiffany is living a healthy and active life, including competing in high school sports. Tiffany plans to attend Seton Hall University in the Fall.

Sydney Shea of Skillman (2020 graduate of Montgomery High School) is a transplant

recipient who received life-changing ligament extracurricular activities and advocacy for organ reconstruction surgery on both of her knees. She is forever grateful for her donor and has led peer group discussions and a school-wide presentation to promote organ and tissue donation. Sydney plans to attend Bucknell University in the Fall.

If you met Emma Rothman of Cranford today, you would never suspect that at the age of 12 she received an emergency heart transplant to save her life. Today, she is a college student at Syracuse University and is thankfully able to enjoy life to its fullest - enjoying days at the beach, volleyball and surfing, and spending time with family and friends. Emma is actively involved in supporting many important causes, especially raising awareness of the need for organ, tissue and blood donation. In January 2019, Emma was honored as a float rider on the Donate Life Float at the Rose Parade in Pasadena.

Hearts for Emma, a 501(c)(3) non-profit, was founded by the Rothman family of Cranford and provides assistance to families of children with heart disease and supports educational initiatives relating to heart transplantation and organ and tissue donation. The Hearts for Emma Partner Fund, a program of the NJ Sharing Network Foundation, supports the production and distribution of education materials and programs to help promote the importance of organ and tissue donation. The Fund has raised more than \$50,000 since its inception and has helped educate more than 100,000 students about donation and transplant through NJ Sharing Network's formal high school outreach program.

"Hearts for Emma is focused on educating present and future generations to ensure everyone understands the importance of organ and tissue donation and transplantation," said Nancie Rothman, Emma's mother. "This year's scholarship winners, Elexa, Tiffany and Sydney, serve as perfect examples of what it means to take an active role in supporting these important outreach efforts."

The Foundation's scholarship program applicants were measured on academic achievement, community and volunteer efforts, and tissue donation. The application process was completed in June, and applications were reviewed by a committee of the NJ Sharing Network Foundation Board members and volunteers.

"We are grateful for the generous support of Hearts for Emma and their ongoing commitment to rewarding students who share a commitment to our life-saving mission," said Elisse E. Glennon, Executive Director of the NJ Sharing Network Foundation. "We know that all of our scholarship recipients will continue to be strong leaders in educating others about donation and transplantation as they move forward to begin college."






