BOTTLE HILL DAY CANCELLED DUE TO PANDEMIC

The Madison Downtown Development Chair, Suzy Whitehorn noted, "It is unfortunate Commission (DDC) voted to cancel its annual street festival, Bottle Hill Day, originally scheduled for Saturday, October 3, 2020, due to the ongoing health concerns and uncertainty around potential restrictions on large gatherings associated with the COVID-19 pandemic. At this time, the risks and challenges are too great to effectively plan and carryout an event of this size.

This year would have marked the 46th Anniversary of this signature Madison, NJ event. The DDC's objective is to promote economic growth and business development so that Madison's beautiful downtown continues to thrive. Bottle Hill Day was created in 1974 by Mayor Elizabeth Baumgartner to promote the business district. The name originated from Madison's original establishment in 1715 of the village called "Bottle Hill". The event has grown exponentially over the last decade with over two hundred vendors participating annually and drawing between 10,000 and 20,000 people to the heart of Madison each fall for this beloved community celebration.

This event is a significant fundraiser for the DDC that helps support the commission's efforts to maintain, beautify and market the commercial district but the commissioners unanimously agreed that any financial benefit is far outweighed by current health and safety concerns. The commission, if restrictions allow, will consider a much smaller celebration of the Madison business community this fall. DDC

that our favorite town-wide day of the year, Bottle Hill Day, has to be canceled this year. However, by now, we all know that gathering in large crowds, elbow-to-elbow, even if outside, is not a good idea during this unprecedented pandemic. Please rest assured that as soon as New Jersey's relaxes its limits more on the number of individuals that are allowed at outdoor gatherings, we hope to plan a smallerscale event to celebrate Madison. It takes time to plan a large event and the planning cannot begin until the restrictions are further relaxed but a new event will be well publicized when it is permitted. In the meantime, we are hoping that everyone stays safe and healthy. Before we know it, we will all be safely enjoying a wonderful Madison street fair together and we cannot wait! "

Bottle Hill Day has evolved over the years into a family-oriented entertainment event with music featuring live music on four stages, amusements, and the DDC Beer Garden. "Bottle Hill Day is quintessential Madison. This day takes hundreds of hours to plan and execute in the weeks and months before the first weekend in October. While we are no less a community in 2020, protecting that community must be our number one goal. I look forward to fall 2021 when we can all hopefully once again safely return and enjoy a day of music, amusements, community, and, of course, a beverage at the beer garden.", added Eric Range, DDC Vice Chair.

ROTARY ENCOURAGES REDUCE, REUSE AND RECYCLE HOME ITEMS

As Rotary International recently named "supporting the environment" its newest area of focus, Madison Rotary is inviting the public to its biannual Community Shredding Day, joined by Habitat for Humanity's ReStore collection truck. The event will take place from 9 a.m. to 12 noon on Saturday, October 17, 2020 at Madison Municipal Parking Lot #1, at the corner of Prospect Street and Kings Road by the Madison Volunteer Ambulance Squad.

All are encouraged to take advantage of Morris Habitat for Humanity and Madison Rotary's services to reclaim valuable space in their homes and offices at the same event, both by donating unneeded items and by safely destroying and recycling sensitive documents. All participants are required to wear masks and practice social distancing.

Madison Rotary has contracted Security Shredding, Inc. to provide secure destruction of sensitive documents on-site, after which the shredded papers will be recycled into other paper products. The cost is \$5 per box or grocery bag. Larger containers will be accepted and priced accordingly. Cash and checks will be accepted. All proceeds from the shredding event will be used by the Madison Rotary, a 501(c)(3) charity, for service projects benefiting the community.

A truck from Habitat for Humanity's ReStore will gratefully accept area residents' new or very gently used home building materials, lighting and plumbing fixtures, hardware items in original packaging, fine art and collectibles, and furniture and other home furnishings in excellent condition. Having the ReStore truck come to Madison is a convenience for would-be donors, as the ReStore facility is located in Randolph. ReStore's inventory is 100% donated by businesses and individuals and sold to the general public at a fraction of the retail price. Proceeds are used to build affordable homes in Morris County and surrounding areas. According to Jeannie Tsukamoto, former President of both Madison Rotary and Morris Habitat for Humanity, "donations to ReStore have built 28 homes in Morris County and have kept over 10,200 tons of reusable materials out of landfills since 2007." Donations to ReStore are taxdeductable. A receipt will be provided for ReStore donations.



POLICE URGE RESIDENTS TO LOCK CAR DOORS

The Madison Police Department would like to urge all residents to please take a few minutes each night to ensure that your vehicle has been locked and any/all valuables are removed - this includes your purse/wallet and keys.

Since the weekend of August 29, Madison residents have reported a number of unlocked vehicles that were burglarized in their driveway. All of these motor vehicle burglaries and thefts were the result of vehicles that were left unlocked.

In 2020 we have seen a significant increase in vehicle thefts and burglaries. These types of incidents are not unique to Madison. The majority of Morris County and other towns in New Jersey have been subject to these crimes of opportunity involving unlocked vehicles.

As a result of the increase of thefts and burglaries, Madison Police have increased their residential patrols while incorporating other enforcement measures. Notably, Madison officers caught individuals in the process of burglarizing unlocked vehicles in a residential neighborhood. Additionally, on two consecutive nights, Madison officers intercepted vehicles that were in the process of being stolen and made an apprehension.
