NIKKI GRIFFITHS RECEIVES CONTINUING EDUCATION SCHOLARSHIP FROM JUNIOR LEAGUE OF SUMMIT

The Junior League of Summit (JLS) proudly names Chatham High School senior Mikayla Meyler, and Governor Livingston High School seniors Domenico Deluca, Jill Zimmerman, and Allie Zimmerman, as recipients of our annual Shirley Wight Keeney Voluntarism Scholarships. As in recent years, the JLS is also offering a Continuing Education Scholarship, which was awarded to Nikki Griffiths of Summit.

“We are continually impressed with the caliber of our scholarship applicants. Each year brings more and more remarkable accomplishments and academic success. The achievements and contributions of these individuals are an inspiration to us all, and we look forward to seeing what they accomplish as they continue their education,” said Junior League President, Erika Melchiorre.

Nikki Griffiths will be attending Oregon State University (E-Campus), pursuing a degree in Fisheries & Wildlife Science to follow her passion for animals, conservation, and our ecosystems. Nikki has been a member of several non-profit organizations in the Summit area, including the Summit Volunteer First Aid Squad, the Summit Police Department, Family Promise, Mylestone Equine Rescue and most recently S.H.I.E.L.D. with the new precautions set in place in an effort to keep our seniors and homebound residents safe.

Nikki volunteered with Family Promise-Union County to address food insecurity issues among their guest families and their graduate families. With their National Headquarters based in Summit, Nikki was able to orchestrate an annual food drive. In the second year of the event, Family Promise teamed up with the Junior League of Summit to contribute food donations initially to “No Kid Goes Hungry,” and most recently “Loaves and Fishes.” Over the last five years, this initiative has donated over 5,000 pounds of non-perishable food items.

The Shirley Wight Keeney Voluntarism Scholarships are awarded annually by the Junior League of Summit to local, graduating seniors. The Continuing Education Scholarship award is given to an adult woman who has demonstrated a commitment to voluntarism in her community and is

CITY OF SUMMIT ANNOUNCES THREE OCTOBER 2020 HALLOWEEN EVENTS

The City of Summit Department of Community Programs is announcing a number of Halloween events to be held in the month of October, including a Scream on the Green movie night, annual Halloween parade modified to meet COVID-19 restrictions, and Haunted Hike.

Scream on the Green movie night will be held on Friday, October 16 on the Village Green, featuring the movie The Addams Family. A family dance party begins at 6 p.m. and the movie is shown at dusk. Bonfires will be available for attendees. Movie goers are encouraged to bring a blanket or chairs as no seating is provided for the movie.

The Summit Police Athletic League and Department of Community Programs are hosting Summit's annual Halloween parade on Saturday, October 24, which will be modified for 2020 to remain in compliance with State of New Jersey COVID-19 restrictions. Beginning at 3 p.m., children and families can register to participate in 30-minute increments, which will be limited to 100 individuals or groups. Registered participants should arrive at their scheduled time

to receive a registration number. Individuals will be called by registration number to the stage to walk in front of the panel of judges. At the end of the half hour, the top three winning costumes will be announced. While waiting to be called to the stage for judging, all attendees will be asked to remain a safe physical distance of six feet from one another. Face coverings, if not part of a costume, will be required.

The second annual Haunted Hike will be held on Friday, October 9 at Martin's Brook Park located on Butler Parkway. A less-scary hike for younger children will take place from 6 p.m. to 7 p.m. Adult supervision is required for any child in fourth grade or younger. The scary hike will take place from 7 p.m. to 8 p.m. and feature spooky characters jumping out along the trail. For more information, go to: summitcommunityprograms.com. The rain date for this event is Saturday, October 10. This event is sponsored by the Summit YMCA.

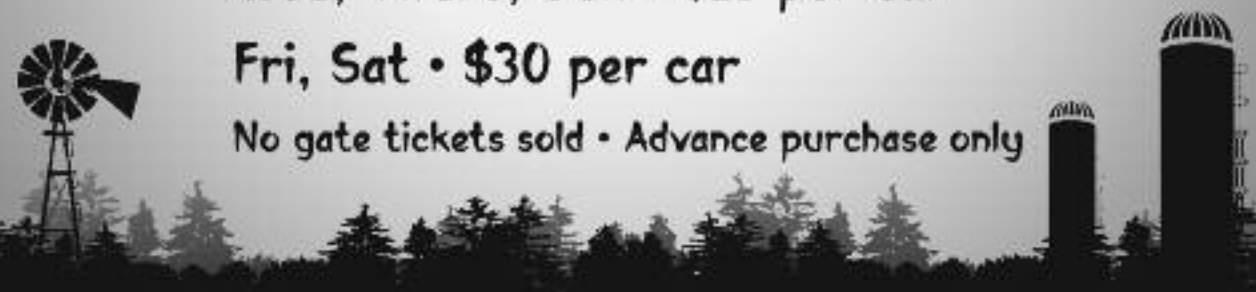

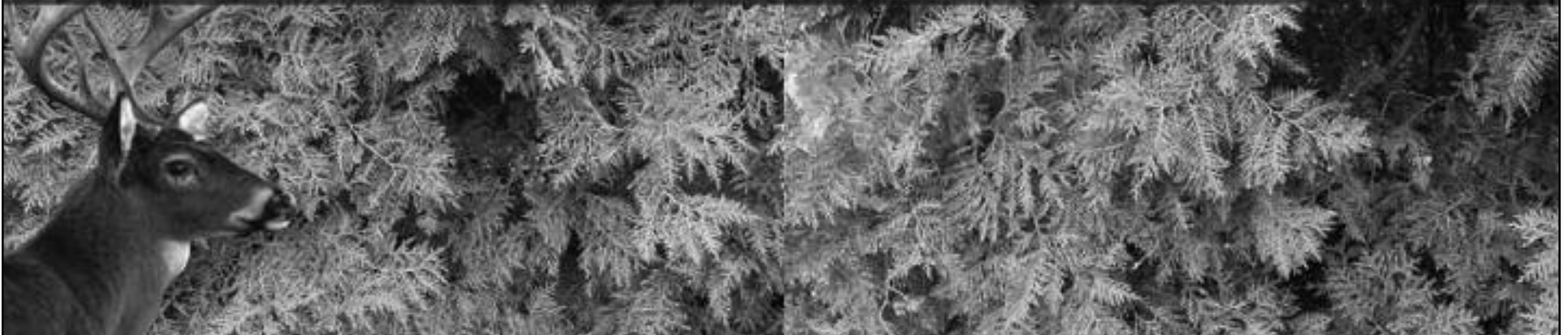

VOTING INFORMATION FOR THE NOVEMBER 3 GENERAL ELECTION

The City of Summit is providing information from the Union County

Clerk's Office on voting in the November 3, 2020 General Election.

Every active, registered voter in New Jersey will receive a ballot in the mail. Ballots can be returned by mail with a

postmark on or before November 3, 2020 to be counted as a valid ballot by the County Clerk, if received by 8PM

on November 10. Ballots without a postmark that are received within 48 hours of the closing of polls on November

3, 2020 shall be considered valid. Step-by-step instructions on how to complete a ballot are available at

www.unioncountylvotes.com.

Provisional ballots will be used at all polling locations instead of voting machines. Each polling location will have

one voting machine available for use by those who are physically unable to complete a provisional ballot. A full list

of Wards and Districts can be found at www.cityofsummit.org/elections. Summit polling locations are as follows:

at Lincoln Hubbard School gym on 52 Woodland Ave.

VOLUNTEER FIRST AID SQUAD AWARDED \$23,900 IN GRANTS

The Summit Volunteer First Aid Squad recently received a \$20,000 grant from The Summit Foundation to help fund the purchase of new computers that will be used to complete electronic call reports and other required documentation after Squad members respond to 911 calls. The new computers replace outdated equipment and will enable crews to more efficiently write the comprehensive reports required by each call.

In addition, The Summit Foundation helped the Squad to defray significant COVID-19 expenses with a special grant of \$3,900 for the purchase of a U/V light to decontaminate ambulances and equipment after crews return from calls.

"We sincerely appreciate The Summit Foundation and its continuing support of the Squad, particularly with essential help during the

pandemic," explains Summit Volunteer First Aid Squad President Robert Flanagan. "By generously funding the purchase of the U/V light and new computers, The Summit Foundation helped to keep our members safe, while enabling them to be more productive as well. They are a true community partner and we are very fortunate to have their significant support."

The Summit Foundation fosters philanthropy by identifying local needs and offering donors flexible ways to make a difference in the lives of

its neighbors. In the past 10 years, it has awarded nearly \$5.7 million through more than 400 competitive grants to nonprofit organizations in New Jersey.

The Summit Free Public Library will continue virtual programming via Zoom in October with a number of informative programs being offered for adults.

The library's popular Explore Your World: Minicourses for Adults series continues on Friday, October 23 at 2:00 p.m. with the return of perennial favorite, Robert Comeau of Union County Community College presenting The Great American Road Novel. This seven-week minicourse will explore and journey through four great American 'Road' novels, each with their own unique perspective on the myth it presents. Comeau will discuss William Faulkner's As I Lay Dying; John Steinbeck's The Grapes of Wrath; Jack Kerouac's On the Road; and John Updike's Rabbit, Run! THREE FOUR-WAY STOPS INSTALLED

As part of a coordinated citywide effort to enhance traffic safety, the Summit Police Department and Department of Community Services engineering division have installed three four-way stops at the intersections of Prospect and Tulip streets, Ashland Road and Tulip Street, and Ashland Road and Maple Street. The new all-way stops became active on August 26, and are intended to increase overall safety at intersections with significant vehicle, bicycle and pedestrian traffic.

- Look all ways before crossing street.
- Cross only at corners and use crosswalks.
- Obey police officers, school crossing guards and traffic signals.
- Watch for turning cars and distracted drivers.
- Be particularly alert in bad weather.
- Do not run or play near motor vehicle traffic.
- Walk in groups to and from school.
- If you notice something dangerous, report it to an adult.
- If riding a bicycle, wear a helmet and follow the rules of the road.

WEAR A MASK REWARDS CAMPAIGN

The Summit Police Department is partnering with Summit Downtown Inc. in an initiative to encourage elementary, middle and high school-age students to wear masks in groups, or when maintaining a safe physical distance of six feet is not possible.

FIRE PREVENTION WEEK SUMMIT FD ISSUES KITCHEN SAFETY TIPS

From Sunday, October 4 to Sunday, October 10, 2020, the Summit Fire Department will join firefighters across the nation in celebrating Fire Prevention Week. With unattended cooking as the leading cause of kitchen fires in the United States, the National Fire Prevention Association is focusing on cooking safety and preventing kitchen fires at home with its topic this year - "serving up fire safety in the kitchen." This message is particularly relevant as people are spending more time at home and cooking more often during the COVID-19 pandemic.

The Summit Fire Department has provided the following safety tips to educate residents on kitchen safety:

While cooking, check the progress of food in the oven and on the stove top regularly. Use a timer to remind you that you are cooking.

Stay indoors until you are finished cooking and if you leave the kitchen, turn off the stove.

Always have a lid nearby when cooking. In the

event of a small grease fire, cover the pan with a lid and turn off the burner. Leave the pan covered until it is cool. For an oven fire, turn off the heat and keep the door closed.

Keep anything that can catch fire such as food packaging, paper towels, dish cloths and pot holders away from the stove top.

Avoid wearing baggy or very loose clothing that can make contact with burners and catch fire while cooking.

Have a "kid-free zone" of at least three feet around the stovetop, oven and microwave areas where hot food or drinks are prepared to avoid contact and potential burns to children.

If you have any doubt about fighting a small fire, just get out. When you leave, close the door behind you to help contain the fire. Call 9-1-1 from outside the home.

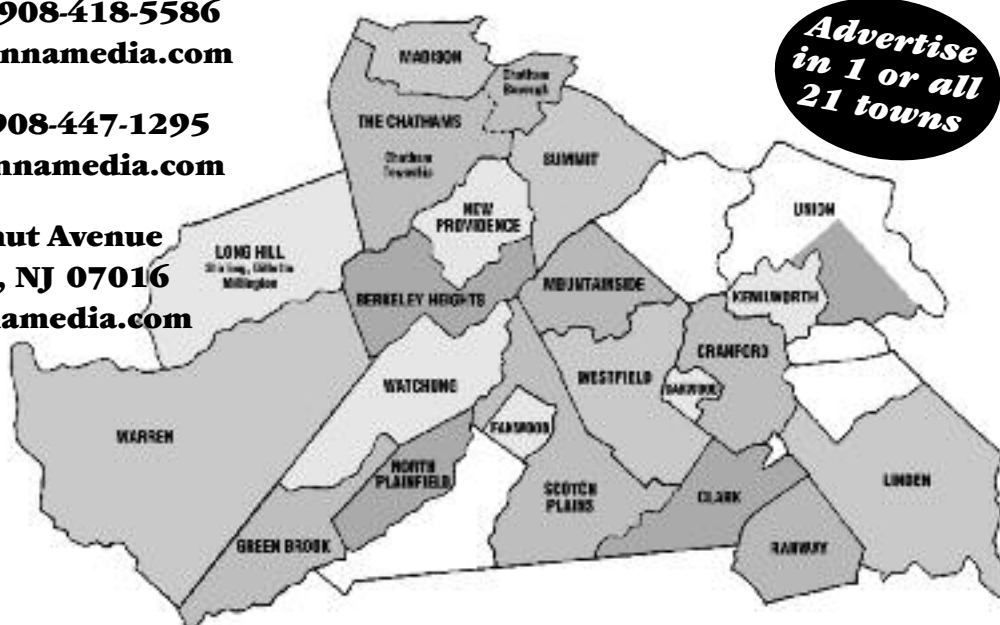
