ELEVEN STUDENTS NAMED NATIONAL MERIT SEMIFINALISTS

Eleven students in the Watchung Hills Regional High School (WHRHS) Class of 2021 have been named National Merit Semifinalists, according to information released by the National Merit Scholarship Corporation (NMSC) of Evanston, Ill.

The WHRHS Semifinalists are: Michael Horzepa, Victor Hu, Elizabeth Huang, Charles Margulies, Nora Mehler, Rohil Novani, Paulina Przybylski, Wesleu Tseng, Neha Venkatesh, Valerie Wang, and Tyler Wu.

WHRHS'S 11 National Merit Semifinalists this year are the latest of the 63 WHRHS students who have qualified as National Merit Semifinalists during the most recent seven school years. The year-to-year totals have been: Class of 2015 – 11; Class of 2016 – 6; Class of 2017 –10; Class of 2018 – 15; Class of 2019 – 6; and Class of 2020 – 4, and Class of 2021 – 11.

As part of NMSC's annual national announcement, about 16,000 Semifinalists have been named in high schools across the country, and that from that number, about 15,000 are expected to be named National Merit Finalists in February.

Students who qualified as Semifinalists did so by taking the 2019 Preliminary Scholastic Aptitude Test/National Merit Scholarship Qualifying Test (PSAT/NMSQT) in the Fall of 2019. The annual PSAT/NMSQT serves as an initial screening of program entrants.

"The nationwide pool of Semifinalists, representing less than one percent of U.S. high school seniors, includes the highest scoring entrants in each state," the NMSC's release states. "The number of Semifinalists is proportional to the state's percentage of the national total of graduating seniors."

The release continues, "To become a Finalist, the Semifinalist and a high school official must submit a detailed scholarship application in which they provide detailed information about the Semifinalist's academic record, participation in school and community activities, demonstrated leadership abilities, employment, and honors and awards received. A Semifinalist must have an outstanding academic record throughout high school, be endorsed and recommended by a high school official, and write an essay."

Semifinalists have the potential to compete for National Merit Scholarship awards, corporate-sponsored Merit Scholarship awards, and college-sponsored Merit Scholarship awards.

OUTLINE OF 2020 GENERAL ELECTION

The Somerset County Clerk's office will provide guidance for residents who are interested in voting in the 2020 General Election to occur on Tuesday, November 3, 2020. This year is unprecedent in New Jersey since it is the first time a General Election will be held primarily by mail after Governor Phil Murphy issued an Executive Order mandating this new voting process.

"The process for voting by mail will be similar to the 2020 primary election, but we understand that this is still unfamiliar for the majority of voters and want to ensure every voter who wishes to cast a ballot has their vote counted," said Somerset County Clerk Steve Peter. "We have had to adjust our processes due to COVID and the need to protect the health of voters and poll workers, but we also have to protect the rights of people to speak through secure and safe voting via the US Postal Service."

As the election proceeds, the county Clerk's Office will continue to update the voting public on the election, by providing a video that will explain exactly how to fill out a ballot to ensure that it is counted, expand sections of the website with detailed information, and social media posts so that all segments of the population will be informed.

Active registered Somerset County voters will receive ballots by mail from the Clerk's Office by beginning late September until October 5. To check if you are an active registered voter, visit https://voter.svrs.nj.gov/registration-check or call the Somerset County Board of Elections at 908-231-7084.

Because all active voters will be mailed a ballot, there is no need to request a ballot. Newly registered voters will automatically be sent a ballot without needing to request one. There are exceptions to having to request a replacement ballot, such as if an active voter has lost, damaged or filled out the form incorrectly. Voters cannot request a second ballot if they have already submitted one. Applications are available on the Clerk's website at http://bit.ly/scvbm.

Ballots for the 2020 General Election will have

a prepaid label so that voters can submit their ballot without paying postage. The ballots will be considered first class mail, so there is no benefit to the voter if they use a stamp.

Vote by Mail Ballots Can Be Submitted in Several Ways

- Ballots can be submitted by mailing them to the address on the preprinted envelope with a postmark before 8 p.m. on Tuesday, November 3. It is highly recommended that mail-in voters submit their ballot earlier.
- Ballots can be submitted by inserting them in one of the ballot drop-off boxes located throughout Somerset County. There will be at least 13 ballot drop-off boxes in the County locations will be announced.
- Voters can go to a polling location from 6 a.m. to 8 p.m. on Tuesday, November 3, 2020. There will be at least one polling location in every Somerset County town. Voters can bring their paper ballot to a polling place, or if they do not have their paper ballot, they can cast a provisional ballot. Voters who are disabled and require an accommodation will be able to vote on a special device.

IMPORTANT DATES DURING THE ELECTION

- Monday, October 5, 2020 Ballots for active voters will be mailed out by this date. Ballots can be submitted as soon as they are received, which may happen before this date.
- Tuesday, October 13, 2020 This is the last day to register to vote and be able to cast a ballot in the 2020 General Election.
- Friday, October 23, 2020 This is the last day to request a replacement ballot through the mail. Ballots can still be requested in person at the Clerk's Office (location TBD due to COVID restrictions) through 8 p.m. on November 3, 2020.
- Wednesday, October 28 This is the last day Qualified Overseas and Military Voters can request electronic balloting.
- Tuesday, November 3, 2020 Election Day.







IMAGINE LAUNCHES SUPPORT PROGRAM FOR NURSES

announced the expansion of its virtual group hit. support programs with one designed to help nurses dealing with the stressors of healthcare work during Covid-19. Imagine, which serves more than 2,000 individuals annually and is nationally recognized for its work helping bereaved children and their families, offers its Peer Support Group for Nurses at no cost. Interested nurses can join the weekly support group at 7:30 p.m. on Wednesdays beginning September 30.

When asked about the decision to launch this program, Imagine's Founder and Executive Director Mary Robinson said, "Through the pandemic, we recognized a gap in support for some of the people we rely on most: our nurses. Supporting nurses who are themselves supporting grieving families felt like a perfect fit for our mission."

Robinson, who was named a 2019 CNN Hero, went on to say, "Nurses continue to selflessly care for others despite their own fears about their potential exposure to Covid-19. We need to ensure they have a place to turn to for support."

For many, the anxiety they feel going to work in a healthcare environment comes on top of grief they were feeling before the pandemic even hit.

Talia Sion, a newly minted nurse, had attended Imagine's Young Adult Group for support following the death of her mother in January, and then joined the organization's pilot support New Jersey-based grief support center for

Of her experience, Sion said, "I was quickly overwhelmed with the weight of so many sick and unstable patients, not knowing if and when things would ever get back to 'normal.' Once again, Imagine created a program for me to turn to with people who understood how I feel; people who understood what I was facing on a daily basis at work."

The nature of the program's virtual environment breaks down geographic boundaries for those seeking support. Nurses from New Jersey and throughout the country are welcome to attend.

"New Jersey is no longer a hotspot for Covid-19, but many of the nurses here are processing what they went through and bracing for a possible resurgence," Robinson said. "Meanwhile, there are nurses in other states in similar positions to where we were a few months ago. Sharing these stories, fears, and challenges at all different stages in a peer support model is proven to be an effective way to learn coping strategies."

As with all of Imagine's offerings, this free Peer Group Support for Nurses program will be available year-round for as long as is needed. Those who are interested can register at imaginenj.org/nurses.

WATCHUNG HAS A NEW BOOK - "HISTORIC TALES OF WATCHUNG"

Robert "Bob" Mayers, an author, historian and longtime resident of Watchung, has written Historic Tales of Watchung that was released in September. His book begins with the borough's first residents, the native Americans, and spans four centuries. It tells of Indian legends, colonial days, its place at the crossroads of the Revolutionary War, the town's industries, businesses, old homes and misfortunes and its notable residents.

This book is truly a Watchung creation. The main sources are oral accounts of local people with a special interest and knowledge of the town's tumultuous past. Source documents researched are from the archives of the Historical Committee at the Texier House and the Watchung Public Library. The Watchung Writer's Group critiqued all the contents of the book.

Bob Mayers arrived in Watchung, with his family, over 50 years ago. With his wife Norma, they built their dream house high on a hill overlooking the valley below. Their children, Bob, Ron and Dawn attended Watchung schools and now a third generation is growing up in the town. Ron and Annette's kids, Max and Madeline Mayers are eager scholars at Bayberry Elementary and The Giving Nest Preschool.

Here, over the centuries, all the tales that are depicted in his book have unfolded. Living close to the town's many historic places he has personally witnessed many of the more recent events he describes. Mayers values most the many friends and neighbors and members of the Watchung Historical Committee who are local history "witnesses," people with special knowledge of the town's past. These caretakers of Watchung's history provided him with special insights and information that cannot be found in recorded history.

Mayers claims that these people, with special knowledge of the town's past, are the real caretakers of Watchung's history. They provided him with special insights and information that cannot be found in previously recorded history. Some are descendants of original settlers whose ancestors are buried in local cemeteries. He








salutes their eagerness to share treasured and often previously uncovered details, their reverence for old places and their passion to preserve Watchung's history for future generations. "They are the people who keep the spirit of this borough alive and carry the torch of knowledge of its past."

Bob Mayers comments, "My research efforts centered around The Texier House Museum maintained by the Watchung Historic Committee. It's one of the finest museums of local history in New Jersey with an impressive collection of hundreds of artifacts, photos, works of art and manuscripts. Watchung's Public Library provided a plump scrapbook with an unusual number of original materials and press clippings."

Mayers, a professional author and historian, has written several books about the Revolutionary War that sell worldwide. His works are based on his on-site exploration and the discovery of original documents and oral accounts. He says that most people he met while preparing this book were enthralled by Watchung's fascinating past, but regret that during their school days they tuned out the town's history as distant and dull. "We must find ways to tell our young people about the astonishing events that happened here." Visit him and see a video preview at revolutionary detective.com.


