THE PRESBYTERIAN CHURCH OF CHATHAM TOWNSHIP WELCOMES NEW PASTOR

The Presbyterian Church of Chatham Township (PCCT) has elected The Rev. Dr. Ellen Clark Clémot as its new Senior Pastor. She will begin serving the 750-member church on November 15, 2020.

Dr. Clémot, who goes by "Pastor Ellen" in the church family, is an ordained Minister of Word and Sacrament in the Presbyterian Church (USA) and a second career pastor. Previously she spent over 20 years practicing international business and finance law in New York City, London, and Paris. Dr. Clémot comes to PCCT from her prior leadership of the Larchmont Avenue Church in Larchmont, New York. She and her husband, André, will be moving into the community this fall and expect to receive regular visits from their two young adult daughters who work and reside in New York City and Washington, D.C.

Dr. Clémot received her Doctor of Ministry degree from Duke Divinity School in May of this year and her Master of Divinity degree from Princeton Theological Seminary in 2012. She has won awards for her writing on Christian ethics, and on Black church leadership during the civil rights movement, and she plans to publish a recently completed book on refugee welcome.

"What most strongly captured my sense of call to PCCT is the feeling of being a committed church family together," Pastor Clémot said. "I look forward to becoming an integral part of the local community to help meet residents' needs, provide educational opportunities on social justice issues, and continue to open our church campus to make PCCT a wholesome, healthy place for families and people of all ages to make friends, worship God, and play an active role in community outreach."

The 11-member Pastor Nominating Committee (PNC) began their work in February of this year and reviewed more than 100 candidates' resumes. As they came to know Dr. Clémot over the summer, they were drawn to her inspiring and relevant sermons, her joyful warm

spirit, her strong interpersonal skills, and her humble leadership of a church similar to PCCT in size and demographic. Andy Oosterheert, comoderator of the PNC, said, "We are grateful that God has called Pastor Clémot to serve at PCCT. Her wisdom, leadership, spirituality, and intellectual rigor make her a wonderful fit for our church."



ORGAN DONOR ENROLLMENT DAY

On October 8, NJ Sharing Network and its many healthcare partners and volunteers throughout the state worked together to register organ and tissue donors in celebration of Organ Donor Enrollment Day. The non-profit, federally designated organ procurement organization set a goal of amassing at least 2,020 new donor registrations on 2020 Organ Donor Enrollment Day. The 2,020 goal helps create a positive spin on the number '2020' as opposed to the negative '2020' references seen virtually everywhere due to the challenges faced this year.

Currently, there are nearly 110,000 Americans - nearly 4,000 of whom live in New Jersey waiting for a life-saving transplant. You can register to be a donor at any time by visiting njsharingnetwork.org/register.

"Organ Donor Enrollment Day is about taking action and inspiring others to learn more about how they can save lives through organ and tissue donation," said Joseph S. Roth, president and chief executive officer of NJ Sharing Network. "One organ and tissue donor can save eight lives and restore health to over 75 people."

In New Jersey, one person dies every three and friends about their decision to donate. days waiting for an organ transplant. However, the generosity of those in the Garden State is providing hope for the future. New Jersey's organ and tissue donor registrations continue to rise thanks to strong community education and outreach efforts as well as simplified ways to register as an organ and tissue donor are also helping to save more lives. COMMUNITY PAPER SHRED FUNDRAISER – NOV 7

In the past months, many of us have had time to clean out attics and home offices and compile unwanted documents and papers like tax and medical records, old bills, and financial statements. The Senior Center of the Chathams is holding a Paper Shred fundraiser to help everyone declutter and dispose of those unwanted documents securely on Saturday, November 7, 2020 from 9:00 a.m. to 12:00 p.m. (or until the shred truck is full) at Chatham Middle School, 480 Main Street. All proceeds will support the programs and services of the non-profit Senior Center of the Chathams. The suggested minimum donation is \$5 per grocery bag, \$10 per small cardboard box, and \$15 per large trash bag or large storage bin payable by cash or check.

The paper shred is open to the public and participants do not need to be residents of Chatham. The event will take place rain or shine and is sponsored by Barth's Market, T.M. Ward Coffee, Brian Siegel Architects, Pine Acres Healthcare and Rehabilitation Center, and Sycamore Living East Hanover.

Center staff and volunteers will be adhering to

public health and safety guidelines at the shred. Those who bring papers to the site will be required to remain in their cars for social distancing.

The Senior Center of the Chathams (SCC) is a 30-year-old independent 501(c)(3) non-profit organization located at 58 Meyersville Road (lower level), Chatham, NJ. The Center has helped older adults age in place by providing a wide array of activities and services that educate, empower, and promote community engagement. There is no membership fee. Many programs are offered free of charge, while others involve only a minimal charge thanks to individual donations, fundraising events that benefit the organization, and grants. During the pandemic, the Center has offered remote and outdoor programs that provide support, guidance, and enrichment; coordinated area volunteers who have grocery shopped for older adults; and helped people attain necessary resources and services during this challenging time.


