ERIN MCGEE TAKES OATH AS ADVOCATE FOR FOSTER YOUTH

Court Appointed Special Advocates (CASA) of Union County has added five new child advocates to its roster, including Mountainside's Erin McGee. The newly trained volunteers were sworn in by Judge Marc R. Brown via Zoom and Judge James Hely logged in to offer congratulations and thanks.

Said McGee, "I feel very lucky to be part of CASA because it's an opportunity to practice my values each day. This is a unique opportunity to learn and provide support within our community by connecting with people on a personal level."

She and classmates Cynthia Evans and Suzanne Staszak-Silva of Scotch Plains, Kevin Charles of Roselle and Kathy Davis of Roselle Park will be matched to one or more of Union County's most vulnerable youth removed from home due to abuse, neglect or abandonment. Considered extra eyes and ears for family law judges, the advocates will be assigned to their youth by court order, which grants access not only to the youth but to their foster parents, doctor, attorney, caseworker, therapist and teachers. Advocates regularly visit youth and connect with the case stakeholders to determine any outstanding needs or concerns, then report to the court and make recommendations.

Successful advocates come from all walks of life and have varied backgrounds. Erin's class ranges in age from 30s to 70s, are parents and non-parents, and bring backgrounds in management, coaching, publishing, the U.S. Postal Service and service with other nonprofits. One new advocate previously served with the CASA program in Essex County.

Executive Director Julienne Cherry noted, "This is our third class to be trained and sworn in virtually since Covid-19 emerged. While the power of a pandemic is undeniable – from impeding our ability to train in person and take oaths in court, to wreaking tremendous havoc and loss on our community, our state, our nation and the world – it is no match for the power of a community coming together to help those in need. This class is no exception: Despite personal, family and professional responsibilities, each has stepped up to help change the lives of Union County's most vulnerable citizens, and I'll let you in on a secret: It won't be long before this journey changes their lives, too."

There are approximately 400 Union County youth from birth to age 21 living in foster care, and each deserve the consistency of a caring, responsible adult in their corner. Is that you? For details on how to secure a seat in the next training, contact Abby at agallego@casaofunioncounty.org.

MOUNTAINSIDE POLICE WARN OF COMMON FRAUD SCHEME

On September 23 a senior citizen resident of Buffalo N.Y. contacted the Mountainside Police Department regarding bail money she had sent for her granddaughter via Fedex to an address in the Borough. She was making an inquiry as to when her granddaughter would be released from police custody once the money was received. Knowing there was no such person in custody police were able to determine it was an all too common fraud generally perpetrated against senior citizens.

Detectives from the Mountainside Police Dept. were able to track the package in the Fedex system which was scheduled for delivery that morning to an unoccupied home listed for sale. Officers then set up a surveillance of the home to await delivery of the package and to observe any actors retrieving it.

After several hours of surveillance four actors from Perth Amboy N.J. were observed retrieving the package minutes after the driver left it on the porch of the vacant home. As a result of this investigation \$7,800.00 in cash was successfully retrieved and returned to the 67 year old victim. The actors were charged with 3rd Degree Theft by Deception and 3rd Degree Money Laundering.

All actors were released without bail on a summons as per N.J. Court rules, the vehicle used in the crime has been seized by police who have filed for forfeiture of the vehicle.

These efforts by Mountainside Police have assisted many other police agencies in similar investigations.

Assisting in the arrest and surveillance were Sgt Michael Jackson, Corporal Shaun Bendik, and Police Officers Ryan Carr and Tristan Corigliano.

On September 23 Mountainside police received a telephone call from a victim in Chesapeake Virginia stating his elderly mother had sent cash money via The U.S. Postal Service to an address in the borough. The money was requested by actors posing as police as bail money for the victim's grandson. Family members learned of this transaction who were aware that the grandson was in Virginia and not in police custody.

Mountainside Police investigating the incident were able to recover \$4,800.00 in cash which will be returned to the victim. Police are continuing to investigate the incident.

The Mountainside Police urges anyone who receives a call of a family member requiring bail money that you confirm the phone number from the website of the police agency. An inquiry to the police agency holding the person should be made using the official number before any money is sent

The Mountainside Police ask that you have a conversation with seniors and other people in your circle of family and friends regarding this all too common fraud.



Literacy New Jersey welcomes ten new volunteer tutors from Union County who have joined the ranks as English as a Second Language tutors after completing a 15-hour training course. The new trainees include Leah Brown, Joan Craig, Carolyn Daurio, Tom Ganley, Tom

Kaercher, Sherry Krakauer, Laura Lesniak, Ken Mirsky, Wilneris Santana and Teresa Tejeda-Melo. The training prepares tutors to work with adults who struggle with reading, writing and speaking English. Literacy New Jersey tutors work in libraries, schools and church centers throughout Union County helping adults improve

their skills in order to find better jobs, help their children in school, and become more involved in the community.

Several of the new trainees got right to work and are already teaching at locations such as the Elizabeth Public Library and Summit High School, where Literacy New Jersey has thriving ESL programs. These programs serve the growing immigrant population in Union County. Part of the recent Literacy New Jersey training included class observations at these locations where the new tutors had the opportunity to meet students and observe experienced tutors in action.

According to one trainee, "The tutor training program is very well put together. The trainers are amazing! I am confident about all I have learned and I am both excited and nervous to meet my students."

IMAGINE LAUNCHES SUPPORT PROGRAM FOR NURSES

Imagine, A Center for Coping with Loss announced the expansion of its virtual group support programs with one designed to help nurses dealing with the stressors of healthcare work during Covid-19. Imagine, which serves more than 2,000 individuals annually and is nationally recognized for its work helping bereaved children and their families, offers its Peer Support Group for Nurses at no cost. Interested nurses can join the weekly support group that takes place via Zoom from 7:30 – 8:30 p.m. on Wednesdays.

When asked about the decision to launch this program, Imagine's Founder and Executive Director Mary Robinson said, "Through the pandemic, we recognized a gap in support for some of the people we rely on most: our nurses. Supporting nurses who are themselves supporting grieving families felt like a perfect fit for our mission."

Robinson, who was named a 2019 CNN Hero, went on to say, "Nurses continue to selflessly care for others despite their own fears about their potential exposure to Covid-19. We need to ensure they have a place to turn to for support."

For many, the anxiety they feel going to work in a healthcare environment comes on top of grief they were feeling before the pandemic even hit.

Talia Sion, a newly minted nurse, had attended Imagine's Young Adult Group for support following the death of her mother in January, and then joined the organization's pilot support program for First Responders when the pandemic hit.

Of her experience, Sion said, "I was quickly overwhelmed with the weight of so many sick and unstable patients, not knowing if and when things would ever get back to 'normal.' Once again, Imagine created a program for me to turn to with people who understood how I feel; people who understood what I was facing on a daily basis at work."

The nature of the program's virtual environment breaks down geographic boundaries for those seeking support. Nurses from New Jersey and throughout the country are welcome to attend.

"New Jersey is no longer a hotspot for Covid-19, but many of the nurses here are processing what they went through and bracing for a possible resurgence," Robinson said. "Meanwhile, there are nurses in other states in similar positions to where we were a few months ago. Sharing these stories, fears, and challenges at all different stages in a peer support model is proven to be an effective way to learn coping strategies."

As with all of Imagine's offerings, this free Peer Group Support for Nurses program will be available year-round for as long as is needed. Those who are interested can register at imaginenj.org/nurses.
