

I AM MY BROTHER'S KEEPER! ARE YOU?

A few years ago, I was approached by a friend and co-worker of mine who expressed how extremely depressed he was and that he wanted to take his own life. Initially, I was completely shocked because this guy always seemed to be upbeat and happy all the time. Immediately, I asked him to come with me to a private office so we could talk about his awful situation. This was the first time in my life that I had a friend talk to me about suicide, and I knew I had to really do my best to help him get through this horrible ordeal. We spoke for a few hours and I listened closely to everything he said. I was able to convince him to immediately get some help and we went to the hospital. I stayed with him at the hospital and met with him when he was released. I did everything to show my friend that I had his back and because of this he is alive today. This awful situation inspired me to do whatever I possibly can to help others in need and shortly after we created our mobile outreach program.

In today's day and age, most of you have known a veteran or first responder that has taken their own life. Every day we lose nearly twentytwo veterans and approximately three hundred first responders every year to suicide. Even with all the awareness and new anti-suicide programs available, this number has not changed and, in some cases, has increased. The Veteran Hospitals' PTSD and mental health programs are packed with patients and unfortunately, they continue to grow. More of our first responders are also seeking help and utilizing some of the state programs being offered. So many people want to help and put an end to this crisis but sadly there isn't a foolproof program available that will stop this ever-growing crisis from destroying our uniformed heroes and their family's lives.

For the last two years our team has been working tirelessly with other charities to come up with a better solution to help prevent this epidemic from continuing. Personally, we believe our "Mobile Outreach Team" is really making a difference and everyday it helps our uniformed heroes live a better way of life.

The first thing we learned is to lose your



"EGO" and seek out other groups and organizations that are looking to save lives. Then we find the right volunteers who are committed and dedicated with being a mentor to a person in crisis. Volunteers are extremely valuable because they want to be there, and they usually care more than the people who get paid for their services.

To date, we have been able to change and save countless lives because of the incredible commitment from the volunteers and other supporting

Our approach is to aggressively seek out and contact a veteran or first responder in crisis. Our goal is to immediately work on building trust by being completely honest with the person in crisis. Using our network is wonderful, but it's more important to show the person in need that we are there for them and won't give up. Usually, we go out and meet with those in crisis and spend whatever time is needed to help them get in a better frame of mind. Bottom line "Human Contact" and "Friendship" is the key to saving a life.

Our Mobile Outreach Team is unique because it consists of mentors from all over the state that are willing to do whatever it takes to save and change a life.



On November 9 from 4:30 - 5 p.m., families will have the opportunity to meet local children's author Valerie Peña and her certified therapy dog Zoey with the Somerset County Library System of New Jersey (SCLSNJ) through a virtual program.

During the program Peña, an occupational therapist and therapy dog handler, will read her first published book "Wally's Wish" from the Wally's World series; discuss how she writes and where her ideas come from; and answer any questions Library customers may have.

"The 'World of Wally' books were written to be a source of comfort and empowerment for all children," said Peña. "When I began writing, I became aware of the parallels between the topics in the stories to the issues children face in their lives. Their purpose is to help children believe in themselves and their own abilities to face and conquer whatever life throws their way."

Continued Peña, "Children face many challenges in their lives, and sometimes it is difficult to know how to overcome them. My books provide a way for children to experience life's difficulties through the eyes of Wally, who faces many of the same challenges that they do. Whatever it is that a child may be experiencing, it is comforting to know that Wally has also gone through a similar situation, and was able to overcome it."

In addition to delving into her experiences as

an author Peña, who has visited SCLSNJ's Watchung Library branch with her therapy dog Zoey, will also explore the benefits of reading to a therapy dog.

"I believe therapy dogs provide unconditional love and comfort without any judgement, and enable children to be themselves without feeling intimidated, the way they might feel being around people," said Peña. "What I would like to accomplish through my therapy dog visits is to work with Zoey to help develop self-esteem, comfort, and happiness in every child we meet and with whom we develop relationships."

"Valerie and Zoey have become a beloved part of SCLSNJ's programming lineup," said Lynn Mazur, youth services supervisor. "I am so excited for Valerie to share her first book with the children of Somerset County, and to give them the chance to explore her writing process. She will surely help children discover a lifelong love of reading and writing."



The non-profit, federally designated organ procurement organization set a goal of amassing at least 2,020 new donor registrations on 2020 Organ Donor Enrollment Day. The 2,020 goal helps create a positive spin on the number '2020' as opposed to the negative '2020' references seen virtually everywhere due to the challenges faced this

Currently, there are nearly 110,000 Americans nearly 4,000 of whom live in New Jersey – waiting for a life-saving transplant. You can register to be a donor at any time by visiting njsharingnetwork.org/register.

"Organ Donor Enrollment Day is about taking action and inspiring others to learn more about how they can save lives through organ and tissue donation," said Joseph S. Roth, president and chief executive officer of NJ Sharing Network. "One organ and tissue donor can save eight lives and restore health to over 75 people."

HOME SAFETY REPAIR PROGRAM DESIGNED TO HELP PEOPLE IN-NEED

For low-to-moderate homeowners in Somerset and Hunterdon Counties, resolving critical home safety repairs is financially impossible. There are a significant number of residents who are living with water leaks and cold drafts due to failing roofs, doors and windows. Raritan Valley Habitat for Humanity (RVHFH) has developed a new Home Safety and Repair Program with these residents in mind. RVHFH is actively seeking qualified Somerset and Hunterdon County homeowners in need of home safety repairs to apply for this program.

This program focuses on helping local homeowners to continue to live independently, safely and comfortably in their homes. RVHFH's Home Safety and Repair Program serves low-tomoderate income homeowners of any age including veterans, people with disabilities and seniors. The program also assists non-profit organizations that offer permanent or temporary shelter.

Program projects have included: leaky roof repairs, weatherizing and increasing security of aging doors and windows, and home modifications and ramp installations for people with disabilities. One homeowner served by the program in Somerset says, "A volunteer installed a screen door and fixed the lock on my front door. Now my home is secure and water no longer comes in. I am so grateful and finally warm in my home."

Ramp installations are a crucial part of what RVHFH does for the safety of those in wheelchairs. A recent program recipient was a local non-profit organization that needed a ramp built for the people they serve. The Executive Director there commented, "We truly appreciate the professional work of Raritan Valley Habitat for Humanity. They built a beautiful ramp to make our building accessible for all clients."

Other program services help senior residents "age in place." Most seniors want to stay in their homes but many need to make costly repairs or improvements in order to do this. According to a family served by our program, "The Raritan Valley Habitat for Humanity team who came out to install grab bars for my mom were like angels sent from heaven."


