BENCHES FROM THIN-FILM PLASTICS - COLLECTION RESUMES

Since June 2018 when the Berkeley Heights Environmental Commission started the program of collecting thin film plastics in Trex® bins around town, the Township has collectively amassed a total of 12,805 pounds of thin-film plastics. Thanks to the community members who contributed their plastics to these bins, as well as to the volunteers, organizations, and businesses around town who delivered these plastics from these bins to Trex® partner store locations, Berkeley Heights has now earned a total of 17 Trex® benches.

The Trex® Company sources a portion of its raw materials for its outdoor decking products from the plastics it receives from its distributors. Trex® then uses these plastics in its manufacturing process. So, essentially, the plastics dropped off at the bins in town help produce the Trex® benches our town has received.

Because Vegan Fest was cancelled this year due to COVID-19, the Berkeley Heights Environmental Commission (BHEC) resolved to use funds that would otherwise have gone toward the event instead for engraving each bench earned with the name of the group or business responsible for delivering the collected plastics to partner stores. Most of the engraved benches now reside in the Lower Columbia Park tennis courts. Other benches appear outside the doors of local businesses, such as Taylor Rental and Smith Chiropractic, whose owners “adopted” a bin.

According to Dr. Patrick Smith, “I have always believed strongly in the importance of recycling and plastics are a particularly important resource to recycle. So, when Smith Chiropractic was asked to help host a plastics bin, we partnered with Paul Neuwirth at Taylor Rental, who has the perfect collection site. Together, we have recycled several thousand pounds of thin-film plastics. Our hopes are to collect thousand more pounds, helping to provide free sustainable benches to our community, and making our world a little better place for now and for the next generation.”

At this time, the BHEC is resuming the town-wide thin-film plastics collection. “The

Environmental Commission truly appreciates it that Taylor Rental and the Wharton Institute for the Performing Arts are stepping up to take in thin-film plastics,” said Environmental Commission Chair Richard Leister. “It is clear that many residents are interested in this recycling effort.” The public can drop off their clean plastics (plastic grocery bags, produce bags, bread bags, case overwrap, dry cleaning bags, newspaper sleeves, ice bags, wood pellet bags, Ziplock® & other re-sealable bags, produce bags, bubble wrap, salt bags, and cereal bags) at the bin located inside Taylor Rental, located on Springfield Avenue (taylorrentalbh.com). Wharton Institute for the Performing Arts will also be accepting thin film plastics from those who come for lessons or rehearsals (whartonarts.org/).

The benches, as well as the thin film plastics collection program itself, are helping our local businesses attract customers while enabling them to give back to the community. Says Paul Neuwirth, owner of Taylor Rental who proudly displays his Trex bench outside his store, “Taylor Rental welcomes the opportunity to collect thin film plastics for recycling. A lot of our customers are surprised the first time they enter our building not only by the variety of items you can rent but with the size of our party store. So getting people in the door is a priority. To be able to do that as well as help the environment and build benches for the town is a triple bonus.”

BUMBLES DOLLS DONATED TO SAGE ELDERCARE'S OLDER ADULT CLIENTS

SAGE Eldercare's clients got a special gift in November: handmade Bumbles Dolls. Bumbles were created in 2014 by Max Loeffler of Summit. The dolls were inspired by his sister who was in the hospital for an extended period, Loeffler explained. She always carried her favorite doll around the house and at the hospital. Like the Velveteen Rabbit, she loved it so much, she hugged the face right off. Bumbles do not have faces either.

Loeffler was 17-years-old when he started the organization. His mom, Vanessa, siblings, and various volunteers, have helped over the years to scout fabric, sew dolls and make deliveries.

Since the beginning, Bumbles has collaborated with well known brands, such as Prada, and delivered to many nonprofits including: NJ Institute of Diabetes, hurricane victims in the Bahamas, Ronald McDonald House, Fort Bragg (special camouflage fabric had been donated), Overlook Foundation and Bonds of Courage. They have delivered approximately 2,000 dolls in six years. Loeffler said he is so busy, Bumbles is his full time job.

The introduction to SAGE came from Loeffler's grandfather, who is a SAGE Meals on Wheels client. "SAGE has had such a big impact on the community," Loeffler said. "It felt good to give back, especially during COVID-19." Dozens of dolls were distributed between Meals on Wheels and Spend-A-Day participants. Many of the recipients are alone and isolated. The dolls were greatly appreciated.

"We are so grateful that Max chose SAGE as a nonprofit to donate to," said Interim Director, Marianne Kranz. "The look on the faces of our clients when the Bumbles were delivered was priceless. We thank Max and his family for their support and commitment to helping others."

FIRE DEPARTMENT ACCEPTS DELIVERY OF NEW TOWER-1 TRUCK

WARNING: SPOTTED LANTERNFLY ARE NOW IN BERKELEY HEIGHTS

The Environmental Commission is warning residents that the spotted lanternfly has been sighted in Berkeley Heights near Governor Livingston High School. This highly invasive pest feeds on many plants, including grapevines and ornamentals. Its presence in the Township has been reported to the State of New Jersey.

If you think you have seen SLF on your property you can report it to the NJ State Department of Agriculture by emailing slf-plantindustry@ag.nj.gov or by calling 609-406-6943.

The Department appreciates residents reporting the addresses of Spotted Lanternfly sightings and assisting us in keeping this pest from spreading. While we will not return confirmation calls and emails at this time, the information provided to us is important in our mission against the Spotted Lanternfly.

If you are able to eliminate the Spotted Lanternfly, please do so.

On November 2nd the Berkeley Heights Fire Department accepted delivery of the new Tower-1. This new truck will replace a 25-year-old ladder truck. The new Tower-1 is a mid-mount, which will be a departure from the previous rear mount.

The reasons for this change are the new buildings that will soon be built in the Township. Many of the new buildings will be closer to the street which necessitates a shorter more compact aerial ladder.

Some of the other advantages that come with

a mid-mount are the vehicles center of gravity which is greatly improved resulting in better handling and safer driving. With the bucket at the rear instead of the front, the driver will have greater visibility, as well as a lower overall height.

The new Tower-1 will be placed in service after all of the equipment is mounted and members have been trained in its operation.

CONTACT TRACING

Berkeley Heights and other towns cannot get their numbers under control if people do not cooperate with contact tracers. For COVID-19, the ability to scale our contact tracing capability is absolutely crucial to break the chain of transmission, slow community spread and restart the economy. Contact tracing is a long-standing process; if you're getting called, it's because you tested positive for COVID-19 or may have come into close contact with someone who has. Contact tracing goes hand in hand with testing. It is part of the process of supporting patients with suspected or confirmed infection. Here's how it works.

Contact tracers will reach out via phone, text message, or letters dropped off at your door. Contact tracers will provide their name, agency, and a phone number. If you have any doubts about the legitimacy of your conversation with a contact tracer, you may hang up and call your local health department. Our Berkeley Heights Health Officer can be contacted at: (908) 518-5620. You should also feel free to request the name and ID of anyone who calls.

To ensure you have the care you need and the support to keep you and your family safe, you may be asked:

To confirm your date of birth, address, or other basic information.

Discuss any symptoms you may have had, whether you were hospitalized, or any underlying health conditions that might put you at greater risk.

Details about your living situation so you can be informed on how to safely self-isolate or self-quarantine.

If you are uninsured, so we can give you additional information about free testing and care.

You may also be asked about your job to determine if you are a health care worker or essential worker and therefore must comply with additional safety requirements.

If you tested positive for COVID-19:

A contact tracer will work with you to identify your close contacts - anyone you spent 15 minutes or more with over a 24-hour period and were within 6 feet of while you were infectious (2 days before onset of symptoms to 10 days after).

If you don't have symptoms, we'll ask about your activity during the two days before your diagnosis.

We will also ask for the phone numbers of anyone you tell us about, so they can be called and cared for.

What a Contact Tracer Will NOT Ask...

A contact tracer will never ask for your social

security number.

A contact tracer will never ask for confidential financial information like your bank or credit card number.

A contact tracer will never ask about your immigration status and ICE will not be notified about your location.

The information you share will not be used for the purposes of law enforcement or immigration enforcement in any way.

The information you share will not negatively affect your public charge assessment or be used to deny access to health care or any other essential service.

Your cell phone is never tracked, a GPS location is not followed, and geolocation data is not collected or used.

If someone is requesting personal information covered above, it is likely a scam. You can report these calls online to the New Jersey Division of Consumer Affairs or by calling 973-504-6240.

Your information is confidential. Neither your name or your COVID status will not be released to your contacts, or your COVID-19 status; that information will only be known to public health officials and our local health departments.

BLOOD DONORS URGENTLY NEEDED CHRONIC SHORTAGES THREATEN HEALTHCARE SYSTEM AS POTENTIAL SECOND WAVE LOOMS

New Jersey Blood Services, a division of New York Blood Center (NYBC), wants to increase blood donations for area hospitals. The COVID-19 pandemic has created a chronic shortage across the country that shows no sign of improving. This is particularly dangerous given the looming uncertainty surrounding the pandemic's trajectory over the course of the next few months.

Blood is urgently needed. The region's healthcare system requires 1,500 donations each day to treat patients ranging from trauma victims and cancer patients to newborn babies and their mothers. Prior to the pandemic, blood drives were held at businesses, high schools, colleges and community groups. Most of those groups have had to cancel their blood drives due to COVID-19. Donations are at just 65% of pre-pandemic levels - well below what is needed by hospitals and patients in our area.

"This is an incredibly challenging time for our communities. We are now relying on people seeking out a place to donate. So far, that is not happening at the level we need," said Andrea H. Cefarelli, Senior Executive Director of Recruitment & Marketing for New York Blood Center.

We are asking our community to visit our

donor centers or to find a convenient community blood drive to donate. "The Covid-19 pandemic has created blood shortages for all New Jersey and NY hospital systems, said Cefarelli. Donated blood is essential for trauma and surgery patients in need. We encourage healthy New Jersey residents, aged 16 to 75, to donate blood at NJBS blood drives and donation sites now. Visit NYBC.org or Call 1-800-933-BLOOD (2566) to make an appointment today."

POSTAL INSPECTION SERVICE LISTS SCAMS TARGETING VETERANS; OFFERS VALUABLE INFORMATION TO PROTECT AGAINST THEM

Operation Protect Veterans, a joint crime prevention program created by the U.S. Postal Inspection Service and AARP, is alerting the more than 17 million U.S. veterans to scams specifically targeting them.

THESE INCLUDE:

Secret Veterans Benefits Scam: Veterans are told they qualify for "secret" government programs or benefits that offer thousands of dollars. But first, they attempt to collect personal information or a fee.

Pension Poaching Scam: Scammers often offer veterans lump sum payments up front, in exchange for signing over all their future monthly benefit checks.

Bogus Employment Scam: Scammers post fake job descriptions to collect personal information from a veteran's job application, or they charge an employment fee.

VA Loan Scams: Offers to refinance VA loans at extremely low rates.

Update Your File Scam: An imposter, claiming to be from a government agency, attempts to get a veteran's personal information to "update their file," so they can maintain their benefits.

Aid and Attendance Scam: Veterans (or their family members) receive an offer to move their assets into a living trust so that they can qualify for financial assisted living benefits.

According to research conducted by AARP, veterans are twice as likely as the general public to be victims of scams. What can veterans – and those who care about them – do to prevent being taken advantage of by scammers?

The Postal Inspection Service advises every veteran do the following:

Visit the Postal Inspection Service's website (uspis.gov) to learn about scams targeting

veterans and what they can do to prevent becoming a victim.

Check out any offer with a trusted family member, friend or your local veteran's affairs office before acting.

Don't be pressured into acting immediately. If you are dealing with a legitimate outfit, they won't try to pressure you to act before having a chance to check it out and think about it. If they do, just say "no" and hang up.

Get an answering machine and caller ID display. Then, let the machine answer the phone for you. If you don't recognize the person leaving a message, don't pick up the phone!

Contact your telephone service provider, and ask them what kind of services they offer to help you block unwanted calls.

Report if you believe you have been the victim of a scam. Contact your local police or AARP (protectveterans@aarp.org or 877-908-3360).

Get credible information on how to qualify for veterans' benefits by contacting your state veterans' affairs agency. Visit nasdva.us, and click on "Links."

"Veterans have access to special benefits and share a special bond that scammers know and use to take advantage of them," said Chief Postal Inspector Gary Barksdale. "The Postal Inspection Service works hard every day to stop scams targeting veterans, but we need everyone to become better informed, so they can help spread the knowledge to the veterans they know and love. I encourage all Americans to make this Veteran's Day not only a day of remembrance and thanks for our veterans, but also to make it the start of learning about, and helping to spread information on scams targeting veterans."

THE GIFT OF SIGHT: SAYING YES! CAN CHANGE SOMEONE'S LIFE

"I am passionate about spreading the important lifesaving and enhancing message of organ and tissue donation because I know the powerful impact it can have," said Peter DeSarno, member of the New Providence Lions and double cornea transplant recipient. "It is an honor to bring together two organizations (The Lions Club and Eversight) that do so much good and have personally impacted my life".

That was the way the presentation at the November 4 New Providence Lions Club meeting began as members heard the personal story of one of its own members receiving the gift of sight and discussed the 50-year history of Eye Banking in New Jersey with Jennifer Rosenblatt, Director of Philanthropy at Eversight.

Peter went on to share that when he was in high school, he was diagnosed with a condition called Keratoconus that affected both of his eyes and at the age of 24. He then received two cornea transplants that restored his vision and forever changed his life.

The gift of his first donor cornea in his left eye came to him with the assistance of the Lions Eye Bank of Texas. The second transplant in his right eye was procured with the assistance of the Lions Eye Bank of New Jersey (now Eversight) working in conjunction with the New Providence based, NJ Sharing Network.

Peter put his experience into perspective by saying that today he looks out of the eyes of two other individuals. Peter explained that unfortunately he has not been able to make contact with and thank his donor families. He said what he does know is that they were two heroic human beings who came from two loving, caring and generous families who in their darkest hour displayed an incredible amount of love and compassion in providing him with the gift of sight. He said that he doesn't think humanity gets any more beautiful than that.

The Lions Club's work in fighting blindness goes back many years. In 1925, as an ambassador for the newly formed American Foundation for the Blind, Helen Keller addressed the Lions Club International Convention in Cedar Point, Ohio hoping that the Lions would partner with the American Foundation for the Blind and lend their support as an organization to those who had lost their sight.

It was at that convention where she appealed to the Lions and challenged them to become "knights of the blind in this crusade against darkness."

She had no idea just how far the association would take her challenge. Before the convention was over, the association dedicated itself to making Keller's dream a reality and the Lions would become Keller's Knights of the Blind.

Since 1925, millions of lives have been changed through the vision-related work of Lions around the world, and today the association is as dedicated as ever to hastening the day when no one should suffer unnecessarily from vision problems. Lions work to end preventable blindness and aid the visually impaired through eye centers and hospitals, medicines and surgeries, eye glasses and eye banks.

Jennifer Rosenblatt, Director of Philanthropy of Eversight, shared with the New Providence Lions Club an inspiring presentation about the Eye Bank in New Jersey and the work of her organization. Specifically, the work at Eversight to restore sight and prevent blindness through the healing power of donation, transplantation and research.

From its home in Clark, NJ, Eversight proudly partners with NJ Sharing Network, Lions Clubs, surgeons, businesses and philanthropists throughout New Jersey to advance its mission.

In 2019, Eversight worked with the families of 882 New Jersey residents who gave the gift of
