SARA ABRAHAM HONORED BY NJ VETERANS NETWORK

On Veterans Day the New Jersey Veterans Network hosted its first team awards ceremony at the Union VFW. Sara Abraham was one of over 50 contributors(called team members) were honored during a ceremony that practiced social distancing protocol.

The New Jersey Veterans Network is a volunteer mobile outreach team that aggressively seeks out veterans and their families members in need.

In the last few years the NVN has saved over a dozen lives, donated 20 cars, 400 business suits, and during covid the team provided over 3,000 meals and thousands of PPE items for disabled veterans and active servicemen.

The team is fully backed by the NJ VFW, NJ American Legion, NJ PBA, NJ FOP, NJ FMBA, multiple service groups, and several elected state

Former VFW State Commander Barbara Hagemann presented over 30 NJ VFW Award Commendations.

NJVN President Michael Boll presented all the members in attendance with NJVN team plaques in recognition of their contributions. Each member also received a proclamations from the New Jersey Senate and Assembly.

Congressmen Tom Malinowski presented the Presidents Volunteer Service Award with a Gold Medal and a Congressional Commendation to the team's executive board including Michael Boll, Sara Abraham, Frank Schupp, Bob Johnsen, and Leo Graf. Frank Schupp was presented an American Flag that was flown over the Capital Building in his honor. Schupp is the mobile outreach program director. He was awarded for his outstanding work mentoring veterans during Covid and organizing an effort to feed over 3,000 veterans.



RESIDENTIAL GUIDELINES FOR SNOW PLOWING

3" or more inches of snow has accumulated.

Sidewalks are to be cleared by the resident within 24 hours of a snowstorm.

On two-way traffic streets, shovel your driveway by the street to the right. If you live on a dead end street, shovel the snow towards the dead end side of the driveway. If you live on a one-way street, shovel the snow towards the

Cars are to be removed from the street once end of the street side of the driveway. The plows will then carry the snow away from the driveway, which will minimize the amount of snow pushed back into the driveway.

Do not shovel or blow snow into the

It is recommended that you wait until your street is plowed curb to curb before clearing your sidewalk or driveway.

GARWOOD HISTORICAL COMMITTEE NEWS

As with many other committees and meetings, the current pandemic has put a damper on many of the activities of the Garwood Historical Committee, however, two notable events are still happening.

Before everything shut down, the Committee was in the process of replacing the veteran's signs that are attached to the borough street signs. Many were weathered and faded by the sun beyond legibility. Working with Chief Wright of the Garwood Police Department and the Garwood DPW, that project is still going forward. We had hoped it would have been done in time for Veteran's Day, but that was not the case. Bracket and pole issues developed so the signs were not able to be installed in time as planned. The project is still in the works and will be done as soon as the issues can be resolved.

The second project is a Trex Plastic Bag Challenge. The Garwood Historical Committee is collecting clean grocery bags, vegetable, bread, and other plastic bags so that we can get a bench, made from recycled materials from the Trex Company, installed at the site of the Aeolian Building complex on North Avenue, when it is built. It is planned that the Garwood Historical Committee will have a permanent home for its archives in that facility for the public to view. Anyone who has a collection of clean plastic bags can drop them off at the box located in the Garwood Library during regular library hours. Please do not put them in the book

23 ARTHUR L. JOHNSON STUDENTS RECOGNIZED BY COLLEGE BOARD AS AP SCHOLARS

Arthur L. Johnson is excited to announce that 23 of its students have been recognized as Advanced Placement School Scholars by The College Board. The awards recognize high school students who have demonstrated collegelevel achievement through AP courses and exams.

17 students have been noted as AP Scholars receiving a score of 3 or higher on three or more AP exams.

2 students have been recognized as AP Scholars with Honor receiving an average score of at least 3.25 on all AP Exams taken and scores of 3 or higher on four or more of these exams.

ALJ has 4 AP Scholars with Distinction receiving an average score of at least 3.5 on all AP Exams taken and scores of 3 or higher on five or more of these exams.

1 of these Scholars with Distinction also earned the title of National AP Scholar receiving an average score of at least 4 on all AP Exams taken and scores of 4 or higher on eight or more of these exams.

5 of these 23 scholars also earned the AP Capstone Diploma achieving scores of 3 or higher in AP Seminar and AP Research and on four additional AP Exams of their choosing.

2 of these 23 scholars earned the AP Seminar and Research Certificate receiving a score of 3 or higher in AP Seminar and AP Research.

According to The College Board Website, "AP Seminar is a yearlong course in which students investigate real-world issues from multiple perspectives. Students learn to synthesize information from different sources, develop their own perspectives in research-based written essays, and design and deliver oral and visual presentations, both individually and as part of a team. During the course, students complete a team project and an individual paper and presentation, as well as take a written end-of-course exam. These components contribute to the overall AP Seminar score.

AP Research lets students deeply explore an academic topic, problem, or issue of interest to them. Students design, plan, and conduct a yearlong research-based investigation to address a research question, documenting their process with a portfolio. The course ends with a 4,000-to 5,000-word academic paper and a presentation with an oral defense which contribute to the overall AP Research course."

"These students have demonstrated their consistency in terms of being able to succeed with college-level work while still in high school and, by doing so, have made us exceptionally proud. The challenges that accompanied last spring's AP testing make these accomplishments even that much more noteworthy," stated Edward Grande, Superintendent.




