Representing the state, Ashley will compete in evening gown, interview and a runway fashion show event in order to claim the honor of being crowned the national winner.

Ashley has been a performer since she was two years old, when she started dancing. Her love for the arts grew, and at four years old, she started playing the piano. She is trained in martial arts, as well, and can play the violin. She loves to sing and enjoys musical theatre, as well as baking. She was a peer leader at Green Brook middle school, and upon graduating, received an award. She is planning a fundraiser for the Red Cross, and many other community service projects. At "The Academy," she is Student Council Vice President, with a 4.0 GPA. She is dedicated to volunteering, appearing virtually and donating, even through the pandemic. As the USA National Miss NJ Jr Teen, she wants to take her platform, SelfLove, to a wider audience. She also wants to raise awareness and talk about bullying, through the UNM platform Crown CARES.

USA National Miss provides young women ages 4 to 25 with the opportunity to combine their love of pageantry with other optional elements to custom design their pageant experience- whether their focus is on fashion and modeling, or talent, education, community service, and mentorship. Delegates can also earn titles, crowns, prizes and scholarship money in optional competitions in areas of interest to them including academics, community service and talent.

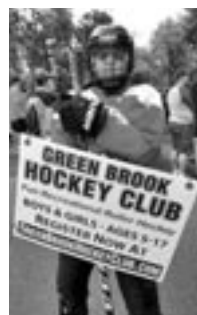

CRISIS COUNSELING FOR RESIDENTS AFFECTED BY COVID-RELATED STRESS

The Somerset County Richard Hall Community Health & Wellness Center (RHCHWC) obtained a \$360,000 grant from the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) and the NJ Division of Mental Health and Addiction Services. The grant funds Hope and Healing – a free crisis counseling program (CCP) that is available to all county residents who have been emotionally impacted by the pandemic. Professional counselors at Hope and Healing currently conduct essential services through virtual meetings via Zoom, phone sessions and community partnerships.

The overall goal of the program is to help individuals learn about recovery options, acquire coping strategies to manage trauma, have access

to confidential emotional support, and help them connect to agencies, resources and peer-support.

Beyond the pandemic, Hope and Healing will help residents and communities recover from the effects of any local, state, or national emergency by providing community-based outreach and psycho-educational services as well as short-term interventions.

For more information about Hope and Healing or to speak to a counselor, the Hope and Healing helpline is available from 8 a.m. to 8 p.m., seven

days a week at 908-231-6414.

ROGER, a search platform for New Jersey veterans, launched on November 9th, just ahead of Veterans Day 2020. The platform was created by Backpacks For Life founders Brett D'Alessandro and Alexa Modero. After serving the Veteran community for 6 years, they found many inefficiencies and convoluted systems that prevented veterans from getting the care they need in a quick and efficient way. From lengthy intake processes to outdated information on organizations' websites, the Backpacks For Life team knew there was a better way to get veterans the care they needed.

ROGER allows veterans and their family members to search for programs, resources and care by a variety of factors such as zip code, branch of service, discharge status and income. With these customizable search features, veterans will see only the programs that they qualify for. This helps mitigate time wasted for not only veterans searching for programs that fit their needs, but also the service providers to ensure the veteran is a good fit for them.

"Navigating through resources is hard...we get it. As a veteran myself, I was often running around in circles trying to find programs that I was eligible for and that fit my needs. When we're working with veterans, every minute matters and with ROGER we can work more quickly to get veterans what they need. We're excited to bring ROGER to the NJ veteran community." - Sgt. GRANTS FOR \$277,750 FUND JOB TRAINING

Residents in Somerset county who are unemployed because of COVID-19 have access to a new training grant program through the counties' workforce development boards.

The Consortium of the Greater Raritan Workforce Development Board (serving Hunterdon and Somerset counties) and the Workforce Development Board of Middlesex County has received \$277,750 in COVID-19 Dislocated Worker Grants from the New Jersey Department of Labor and Workforce Development.

This first-time collaboration between the two workforce boards aims to serve at least 50 individuals from the three counties through their One-Stop Career Training Services Centers who have lost their jobs or face significant reduction in hours because of the pandemic. Training opportunities in the new program focuses on four industries that are experiencing post-COVID-19 growth: healthcare; transportation, logistics and distribution; warehousing; and selected retail sectors (food stores and home centers).

Each workforce board through their One-

Stop Career Training Services Center already offers individual training grant programs for the unemployed and underemployed. This new Consortium program expands the number of residents that can be assisted and covers the program's applicants now through August 2021.

“We know that more than 214,000 individuals in the three counties have filed for unemployment since mid-March,” said Kevin Kurdziel, director of Middlesex County’s Office of Career Opportunity and CEO of the county’s Workforce Development Board. “While many have gone back to work, many others are still looking for their next opportunity. The goal of the Consortium is to help out-of-work or underemployed residents displaced by the pandemic obtain industry-valued credentials and employment in sustainable wage career pathways.”

Eligible participants in this grant opportunity also will have the benefit of earning certificates in SkillUp Middlesex and SkillUp Greater Raritan, a free online learning portal for residents in the three counties.

“Workforce boards focus on ensuring residents have access to programs and information that help them get good-paying jobs,” said Paul Grzella, director of the Greater Raritan Workforce Development Board. “Training grants are one component of what our One-Stop Career Centers do every day, and the staffs regularly guide people to success.”

In addition to the training grants, the Consortium's partners have other ongoing career-related services, including registered apprenticeship programs, personal assessment tools, career counseling, case management, work-readiness training, resume assistance, interview practice and preparation, job development and job placement and more.

Through the Adult Learning and Engagement portal, Library customers have the ability to virtually connect to author talks and concerts; experience virtual travel and hobbies; discover numerous resources for language learning; and explore health and wellness tips.

AUTHOR TALKS AND CONCERTS

The Library strives to keep customers engaged by providing live and pre-recorded programs that offer community members the chance to connect with author talks and musical performances. This winter, Library customers will even have the chance to meet Pulitzer Prize-winning author Caroline Fraser on February 8 at 7 p.m.

“All of these virtual service pages are designed to accentuate focuses that have developed during the pandemic,” said Darryl Voorhees, manager of adult services, programming and collaborations, public services. “Author talks and concerts epitomize the type of engaging content that we continue to provide.”

TRAVEL AND HOBBIES

“Self-care is a critical component of staying healthy,” said Voorhees. “That is one of the many reasons that we added a travel and hobbies focus to the Adult Learning and Engagement portal. The travel and hobbies page serves as a virtual bridge to keep Library customers active in safe ways.”

The travel and hobbies webpage offers links to online tours to a number of local attractions including the Brooklyn Botanic Garden and The Museum of Modern Art (MoMA); virtual tours of sights around the world like Yosemite National Park and the Royal Botanic Gardens, Kew, in England; and a link to Creativebug, an award-winning arts and craft video resource featuring classes taught by design experts and artists.

“SCLSNJ’s expert staff compiled this exciting list of travel destinations and creative resources in hopes that our customers will discover new talents, activities, and destinations without any travel risks,” said Terri Coss, adult services librarian.

LANGUAGE LEARNERS

“According to Data USA, 31.2 percent of Somerset County residents are speakers of a non-English language, which is higher than the national average of 21.9 percent,” said Catherine

DeBerry, branch manager. “In an effort to better serve those community members interested in learning English and support those who desire to learn a second language as the world becomes increasingly globalized, SCLSNJ curated relevant content for language learners.”

The webpage, which was designed to support diverse populations throughout the county, includes links to the language learning resources Mango Languages and Rosetta Stone; digital news resources including PressReader, which houses thousands of publications in over 60 languages; and connections to community English language learners (ELL) classes and organizations.

HEALTH AND WELLNESS

Finally, the portal offers a section dedicated to health and wellness. This webpage consists of live and pre-recorded health and wellness based programs including meditation and yoga; connections to community health resources; and links that can help Library customers locate a doctor or medical professional that best meets their needs.

KEAN STUDENT-VETERAN RECEIVES SERVICE DOG

A special ceremony was held on Kean University’s Union campus as senior Jason Pryor, a U.S. Army veteran, introduced the K-9 service dog that he received through an on-campus fundraiser.

Pryor, a senior from Elizabeth majoring in exercise science, did tours in Iraq and Honduras and suffers from PTSD. He received the K-9, named Keen, at the start of the Fall semester as a gift from the Kean Office of Student Government.

“Being with Keen has taught me to be more patient,” said Pryor, whose dog accompanies him to class. “Keen is used as a measure to help prevent me from going through the symptoms and effects of spiraling down, by me tending to his needs and having him tend to me.”

Kean is ranked first in the nation among large public schools for its programs supporting student-veterans, according to the Military Friendly Schools survey.

Student Government raised nearly \$20,000 to support service dogs through Rebuilding Warriors, a volunteer non-profit organization whose mission is to provide trained service dogs to veterans. The bulk of the funds raised went toward training Pryor’s dog, and the rest was donated to Rebuilding Warriors to help train other K-9 dogs.

At the ceremony held outside Miron Student Center, Vito Zajda, director of Veteran Student Services at Kean and a U.S. Coast Guard veteran, called Pryor a remarkable student.

“He has been a big support and influential person in our program,” Zajda said. “He has helped open our eyes about how the University can best support its vets.”

Vice President of Rebuilding Warriors Jeff Mullins, also a veteran, said post-traumatic stress disorder (PTSD) is a condition that can’t be seen

“The physical and psychological well-being of our communities is a matter of paramount importance in a time of increased vulnerabilities,” said Nicole Pascoe, civic services supervisor. “We are optimistic that this compilation of information will help empower customers to stay informed on health and wellness topics, especially during the pandemic.”

by others. “It’s invisible, stays with you your entire life, and it’s not easy sometimes,” he said. “Our goal is to provide veterans and first responders with a service dog to help them achieve their new normal.”

The University’s Veterans Day event included a color guard, a performance of the national anthem by the Kean Gospel Choir, and the presentation of other honors.

Juan Leon Torres, a senior from Spotswood also studying exercise science and a U.S. Navy veteran, received the 2019 Kean Veteran’s Award for Outstanding Mentor. He develops transition opportunities and initiatives, and mentors a student-veteran each semester.

“Being a veteran and going back to school is super hard because you go from one community to a different lifestyle,” Torres said.

Zajda noted that it is important to support veterans at all times. “The importance of Veterans Day is to recognize that it’s 365 days a year, as veterans go through different highs and lows in their lives,” he said.

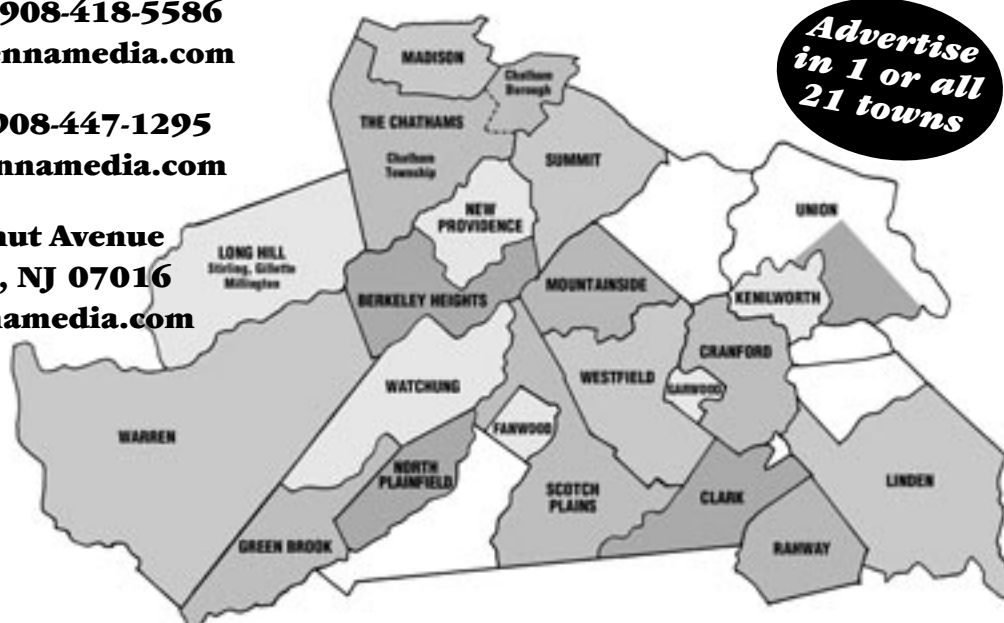

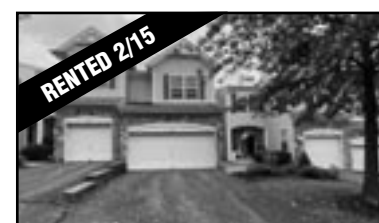

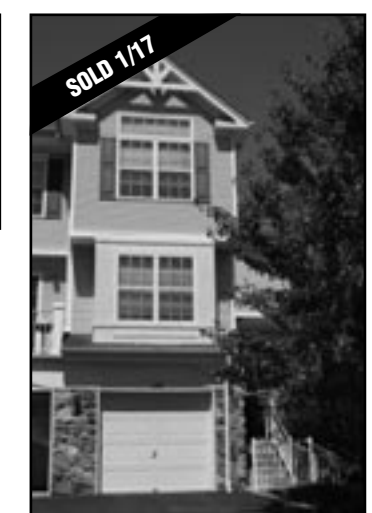
