STUDENTS LAUNCH NONPROFIT CLOTHING COMPANY BE NICE CO. WILL GIVE PROCEEDS FROM DEBUT LINE TO LOCAL VETERANS

It's been a cruel year. But a group of Kenilworth art students has blended fashion and compassion to offer a little comfort.

Students in the Practical Arts course at David Brearley Middle-Senior High School recently launched the Be Nice Co. clothing line and website. Their mission is to spread a muchneeded positive message and to care for their community. In fact, the nonprofit company's Veterans Day launch was a nod to the Kenilworth VFW, which will benefit from the proceeds of the inaugural Be Nice Co. clothing line.

Practical Arts folds in the concepts taught in web design and multimedia art and design classes. The students' Be Nice Co. sprouted from an idea to teach some life lessons as well.

"Kids love fashion and streetwear and I wanted to take that route to give students the opportunity to be creative, learn new skill sets, but also put a positive spin on," said technology teacher Jacob Ulasevich. "Back in my first year (and still now), the simple rule of my classroom was to be nice. That year I taught and got close with all of the 8th-graders (current sophomores) and they'd always joke about how often I said it so it became a running thing with us. When the clothing idea came to me the name just seemed to work - we are a company, but we are also trying to promote being nice."

The kids are already impressing their principal, which is always a nice idea.

"It inspires you to think that a bunch of teenagers combined creative marketing with course content and technology to spread a message that the adults are always telling the kids: Be nice," said Principal Jeremy Davies.

The students are spreading the word about their orange logo-emblazoned hoodies and Tshirts on social media, where they also share inspirational quotes, messages, and videos.

"The goal that we want to be spread through the charity and the name, Be Nice Co., is to think about others. Not everyone has it easy in life, nor does anybody have a perfect life. So this charity is to help others in need and to think about other

people's situations in life," said sophomore Vaughn Marranca.

The reviews on the website show that the entrepreneurs have a talent for comedy as well.

"The best thing since sliced bread, I promise!" raves a customer described as "Literally Our Teacher." And "Our Social Media Manager's Mom" notes, "My son looks really handsome in these clothes."

The community benefits from the Be Nice Co.'s positive message and cause, but the nonprofit also has been paying off for its student team.

"One major thing I always struggled with was my confidence doing pretty much anything ... like social media, emails, or even just talking to people I have never talked to before," said junior Justin Hemhauser. "Over time, I have become more present with facing my confidence like in skits, emails, conversations and pretty much everything. Be Nice Co has helped me with confidence in order to complete the projects we have had with a smile on my face and a little extra kindness in my heart."

Be Nice Co.'s first product line was for sale through December 16, with all proceeds going to the veterans group.

A focus on compassion isn't a new concept for Kenilworth Public Schools, which has expanded its Social and Emotional Learning curriculum as students struggle with increased isolation and anxiety as a result of the pandemic. The district also participated in September's "Start with Hello Week," a Sandy Hook Promise initiative that aims to prevent kids from feeling left out.

Davies said that even as the Brearley students have experienced their own challenges during the COVID-19 era, they've chosen to concentrate on others.

"These kids have been through a lot recently — rhetoric has been ugly, society has been caustic. They're looking for simplicity, peace, something nice. For the good of others. Because they know that others are wounded. These Brearley kids have empathy," Davies said.



ROGER, FOR NEW JERSEY VETERAN COMMUNITY TO FIND SUPPORT

ROGER, a search platform for New Jersey veterans, launched on November 9th, just ahead of Veterans Day 2020. The platform was created by Backpacks For Life founders Brett D'Alessandro and Alexa Modero. After serving the Veteran community for 6 years, they found many inefficiencies and convoluted systems that prevented veterans from getting the care they need in a quick and efficient way. From lengthy intake processes to outdated information on organizations' websites, the Backpacks For Life team knew there was a better way to get veterans the care they needed.

ROGER allows veterans and their family members to search for programs, resources and care by a variety of factors such as zip code, branch of service, discharge status and income. With these customizable search features, veterans will see only the programs that they qualify for. This helps mitigate time wasted for not only veterans searching for programs that fit their needs, but also the service providers to ensure the veteran is a good fit for them.

"Navigating through resources is hard...we get it. As a veteran myself, I was often running around in circles trying to find programs that I was eligible for and that fit my needs. When we're working with veterans, every minute matters and with ROGER we can work more quickly to get veterans what they need. We're excited to bring ROGER to the NJ veteran community." - Sgt. WHAT, WHERE, AND WHEN IN OLD KENILWORTH: KENILWORTH 100 YEARS AGO - PART 2

The borough had four ponds. Station Pond chickens. David "Old Man" Stein of 481 was off the Boulevard behind what is now Access Self Storage. Hiller's Pond was just west of St. Theresa's School. Jackson Pond, about 10 acres, was the largest and covered much of the Brearley High School campus except for the building itself. The only pond remaining is Shallcross Pond in Black Brook Park. All were known for winter skating and some were known for abundant water lilies.

There were four farms. The Charles Frost farmhouse on Cross St. still stands. Silas Fink and Michael Burke farmed along Galloping Hill Rd., on lands now part of Graceland Cemetery and the Merck complex. The Dimmicke farm stood along the west side of Faitoute Ave.

It was common for locals to farm vacant land. Among the most prolific was the Vitale family of Downtown. They toiled on acres of land in today's Boright Ave. area hauling water from a creek for their crops. Many residents had minifarms with homes built on 25 ft. X 100 ft. lots with an adjacent, vacant lot of the same size. On the empty lot they grew vegetables, had a fruit tree or two; chickens, and possibly a horse, goat, or cow which they kept in a small shed. Chickens were plentiful and dogs often ran about unleashed and unlicensed with residents clamoring for local officials to do something about it – especially when dogs terrorized their

Washington Ave. was a dairyman. He had numbers of cows he let roam about town freely grazing on open land. He sold milk and gave his precious butter to "special" folks. There were only two houses of worship in 1920. The old Methodist Episcopal Church on the corner of Monroe Ave. and N. 20th St. and

the original First Baptist Church on N. 8th St. near Washington Ave., primarily an African-American congregation. Catholic families often traveled by foot to St. Michael's Church in Cranford or walked or rode the trolley to the old Church of the Assumption in Roselle Park. Members of the Jewish faith typically worshipped at the old Temple Beth El in Cranford.

The Great Migration of African-Americans heading north from the South after WWI seeking jobs is reflected in Kenilworth's growth. The 1915 census indicated 45 African-Americans living here. By 1920 they rose to 144. One was Howard Anthony. He became a prominent businessman and the first African-American to serve on a New Jersey school board.



KYLE ARLINGTON KENILWORTH'S EMPLOYEE OF THE YEAR

Kyle Arlington's first day Superintendent of Kenilworth Public Schools, a storm dropped a half-foot of snow in the borough.

That day in March 2019 might have been an omen – or maybe it was just an opportunity for the district's new leader to jump into the crisis management skills that would soon come in

Arlington's ability to steadily guide the schools through difficult times resulted in his selection as Kenilworth Borough's Employee of the Year. The honor was presented at the borough's Dec. 9 Council meeting.

"I would like to acknowledge Mr. Arlington for the tremendous success he has achieved in keeping our schools running and our children learning," Mayor Linda Karlovitch said as she presented the award. "You play a crucial role in our community and I'm grateful to you. Your work ethic and involvement is admirable and we're very lucky to have someone as devoted as you are."

Arlington took a team approach to managing the district's pandemic response. When schools closed across the state in the spring, he assembled committees to plan reopening strategies for areas including technology, scheduling and safety protocols.

Arlington has prioritized clear and regular communication with the school community to help parents, staff and students navigate changes, including short-term closures and quarantines. A weekly Superintendent's Update and new COVID-19 Dashboard are among the channels used to share information.

"It is incredible how he is able to keep

reinventing the wheel," Karlovitch said. "I don't think there is any place where policy and procedure has changed as much and as frequently as it has other than in our schools."

By expanding a focus on social and emotional learning (SEL) to support students and to help identify those who could use additional services, Kenilworth was well positioned to meet children's additional needs during the pandemic. Along with Director of Student Personnel Services Dawn Cuccolo, Arlington has also made SEL training such as teacher resiliency and psychological first aid available to staff.

Always interested in new ways to connect with students, Arlington launched a "Small Community, Big Reads" initiative over the summer. The social-media campaign continues, with teachers and administrators posting videos about their favorite books.

Promoting a love of literacy comes naturally for Arlington, who began his career in as an English teacher for the Vernon Township School District. He quickly took on leadership responsibilities, becoming Academic Chairperson of Language Arts for the district, then an Assistant Principal. Positions as the Director of Humanities and the Assistant Superintendent for Curriculum, Instruction, Personnel and Policy followed.


