OPENING CEREMONY OF 1995 TIME CAPSULE

The Mountainside community joined Mayor Mirabelli and the Town Council for the opening of a time capsule which was buried in 1995. The town held the ceremony on October 22nd, 2020 in the parking lot of Constitution Plaza.

Residents and community leaders from Mountainside helped with the unveiling of the contents which included memories from 25 years ago, old pictures, newsletters, a 100-year celebration t-shirt, and information from the Borough.

Speakers that day included leaders and members from: Mountainside Rotary Club, Mountainside Restoration Committee, Girl and Boy Scout troops, Foothill Club, Our Lady of Lourdes Parish, Mountainside Public Library, Mountainside Softball and Baseball League, Board of Education, Mountainside Music Association, Newcomers Club, and the Community Presbyterian Church.

The opening of the capsule served as a final celebration for Mountainside's 125th anniversary. Attendance was limited due to social distancing requirements. The event was also live streamed on Channel 35 and 39, Facebook, and Youtube.



VILLAGE SHOP HOLIDAY OPENING HOURS

The Village Shop located in the Mountainside Restoration Committee's Levi Cory House announces opening hours for the 2020 holidays. Volunteers are looking forward to welcoming shoppers. The Shop will be open on Fridays and Saturdays, December 4, 5, 18, 19 from 10 a.m. to 3 p.m. Face masks, limited numbers allowed inside, temperature checks and hand sanitizing are required for the safety of guests and volunteers.

The Levi Cory House officially opened to the public in December of 2018. The circa 1818 Levi Cory House, which was moved to Constitution Plaza five years ago, was originally located at the corner of New Providence Road and Mountain Avenue. The house was the location of the first Children's Country Home during the 1890s, before expanding to its current location as the Children's Specialized Hospital. After years of repair, renovation and restoration, the Levi Cory House is now open as a Museum for Children's Interests and the Village Shop.

The Village Shop serves as a fundraiser for the continued restoration and maintenance of the Levi Cory House and maintenance of the Deacon Andrew Hetfield House. The Shop has been restocked with hundreds of new items for the holidays for gift-giving, home décor, jewelry, antique and vintage items, furniture pieces and many interesting items and curiosities. All are offered at extremely reasonable prices. Stop by to browse and you may find something that speaks to you. There is something for everyone. Purchases benefit the Mountainside Restoration Committee.

The Levi Cory House and Deacon Andrew Hetfield House are located at Constitution Plaza (Watchung Ave., off Birch Hill Rd.) adjacent to the Mountainside Library. The Mountainside Restoration Committee is a 501(c)(3) charity and a committee of volunteers whose purpose is to maintain the Deacon Andrew Hetfield House, restore and maintain the Levi Cory House and collect and save historic Mountainside information and items from destruction. 
