#### LIBRARY SYSTEM DONATION DRIVE Submitted by Tracy Carney staff was able to continue the Lib

A recent article from "The Wall Street Journal" cited that approximately 1.2 million New Jersey residents cannot afford regular access to food, which is a "33 percent increase prior to the pandemic." In response to this community need, staff from the Somerset County Library System of New Jersey (SCLSNJ) donated non-perishable food items and school supplies to The Food Bank Network of Somerset County.

"Libraries are all about sharing and I couldn't be more proud to work with such a fine and generous staff," said County Library Administrator Brian Auger. "The Library System's drop-offs have been a reliable and significant source for the food bank for the last decade. Even during these trying times caused by the pandemic, Library staff rose to the occasion and made contributions from their own resources."

Library System staff donated approximately 1,000 pounds of food, 10 boxes of school supplies, and 100 backpacks to the organization.

"The Food Bank Network of Somerset County regularly services 350 families, but that number has nearly doubled this year due to the impact of the pandemic," said SCLSNJ Operations Supervisor Edith Lit. "For the 10th year, SCLSNJ staff was able to continue the Library System's mission to help those in need through their dedication to give back. Because of our staff's donations, hundreds of families will have school supplies for their children and food on the table."

### **BLOOD DONORS URGENTLY NEEDED CHRONIC SHORTAGES THREATEN HEALTHCARE SYSTEM**

New Jersey Blood Services, a division of New York Blood Center (NYBC), wants to increase blood donations for area hospitals. The COVID-19 pandemic has created a chronic shortage across the country that shows no sign of improving. This is particularly dangerous given the looming uncertainty surrounding the pandemic's trajectory over the course of the next few months.

Blood is urgently needed. The region's healthcare system requires 1,500 donations each day to treat patients ranging from trauma victims and cancer patients to newborn babies and their mothers. Prior to the pandemic, blood drives were held at businesses, high schools, colleges and community groups. Most of those groups have had to cancel their blood drives due to COVID-19. Donations are at just 65% of prepandemic levels - well below what is needed by hospitals and patients in our area.

"This is an incredibly challenging time for our communities. We are now relying on people seeking out a place to donate. So far, that is not happening at the level we need," said Andrea H. Cefarelli, Senior Executive Director of Recruitment & Marketing for New York Blood Center.

We are asking our community to visit our donor centers or to find a convenient community blood drive to donate. "The Covid-19 pandemic

## **VULNERABLE RESIDENTS CAN SIGN UP** FOR A FREE SAFETY RESOURCE

Somerset County's Office of Emergency Management supports the New Jersey "Register Ready" system - a special needs registry for vulnerable residents to use as a safety resource during a disaster or other emergency.

Experts agree the best way of managing a crisis is to be proactive and have a plan. Residents with disabilities and others who have special needs can better prepare for an emergency by signing up for Register Ready. Through this safety resource, emergency response teams have access to each registrant's specific health and safety needs as well as their location.

Caregivers or family members can register on behalf of their loved one or patient. Each individual's personal information is kept confidential. The service is password protected and will not be shared with other entities. Personal information will only be used for wellness checks and emergency response activities. Register Ready profiles will expire after one year, so personal information must be updated annually.

### **POSTAL INSPECTION SERVICE LISTS SCAMS TARGETING VETERANS; OFFERS VALUABLE INFORMATION TO PROTECT AGAINST THEM**

prevention program created by the U.S. Postal Inspection Service and AARP, is alerting the more than 17 million U.S. veterans to scams specifically targeting them.

#### **THESE INCLUDE:**

Secret Veterans Benefits Scam: Veterans are told they qualify for "secret" government programs or benefits that offer thousands of dollars. But first, they attempt to collect personal information or a fee.

Pension Poaching Scam: Scammers often offer veterans lump sum payments up front, in exchange for signing over all their future monthly benefit checks.

Bogus Employment Scam: Scammers post fake job descriptions to collect personal information from a veteran's job application, or they charge an employment fee.

VA Loan Scams: Offers to refinance VA loans at extremely low rates.

Update Your File Scam: An imposter, claiming to be from a government agency, attempts to get a veteran's personal information to "update their file," so they can maintain their benefits.

Aid and Attendance Scam: Veterans (or their family members) receive an offer to move their assets into a living trust so that they can qualify for financial assisted living benefits.

Operation Protect Veterans, a joint crime veterans are twice as likely as the general public to be victims of scams. What can veterans - and those who care about them - do to prevent being taken advantage of by scammers?

> The Postal Inspection Service advises every veteran do the following:

> Visit the Postal Inspection Service's website (uspis.gov) to learn about scams targeting veterans and what they can do to prevent becoming a victim.

Check out any offer with a trusted family member, friend or your local veteran's affairs office before acting.

Don't be pressured into acting immediately. If you are dealing with a legitimate outfit, they won't try to pressure you to act before having a chance to check it out and think about it. If they do, just say "no" and hang up.

Get an answering machine and caller ID display. Then, let the machine answer the phone for you. If you don't recognize the person leaving a message, don't pick up the phone!

Contact your telephone service provider, and ask them what kind of services they offer to help you block unwanted calls.

Report if you believe you have been the victim of a scam. Contact your local police or AARP (protectveterans@aarp.org or 877-908-3360).

veterans' affairs agency. Visit nasdva.us, and click on "Links."

"Veterans have access to special benefits and share a special bond that scammers know and use to take advantage of them," said Chief Postal Inspector Gary Barksdale. "The Postal Inspection Service works hard every day to stop scams targeting veterans, but we need everyone to become better informed, so they can help spread the knowledge to the veterans they know and love. I encourage all Americans to make this Veteran's Day not only a day of remembrance and thanks for our veterans, but also to make it the start of learning about, and helping to spread information on scams targeting veterans."

### JAGDEEP SINGH BHATIA AWARDED SECOND PLACE IN REGENERON SCIENCE TALENT SEARCH

Watchung Hills Regional High School (WHRHS) Class of 2020 graduate Jagdeep Bhatia has won the second place prize in the 79th Regeneron Science Talent Search, and in so doing, he has been awarded \$175,000 in prize money.

Bhatia plans to continue his education at Massachusetts Institute of Technology (MIT), Cambridge, Mass., and he plans to apply the prize money toward his continuing education.

He has said he plans to study Computer Science in college, and perhaps later pursue a Ph.D or a more entrepreneurial tract.

"We are tremendously proud of all of Jagdeep's accomplishments, including this latest welldeserved recognition," said WHRHS Superintendent Dr. Elizabeth Jewett. "He has left an indelible mark on the WHRHS school community. I eagerly anticipate learning about his continued achievement throughout his future educational and professional journey."

The Talent Search winners were announced as part of a virtual awards ceremony in July, where more than \$1.8 million was awarded to 40 finalists across the country. They were "evaluated based on the scientific rigor of their projects, their exceptional problem-solving abilities and their potential to become scientific leaders," according to the announcement from the talent search organizers. Bhatia says that "the three days of virtual judging were nerve-racking but fun. The best part was getting to know the other finalists. It feels amazing to receive recognition for my work, and I'd like to thank all the people who inspired me and guided me in my research."

The Regeneron Science Talent Search is a science and mathematics competition for high school seniors. Regeneron Pharmaceuticals, Inc. is an American biotechnology company headquartered in Tarrytown, N.Y.

According to the Regeneron press release, Bhatia, 18, of Green Brook Township, earned this honor for solving an open problem and "developing two fast and simple machine learning algorithms for computer programs that are attempting to learn new concepts under the tutelage of an instructor, either a computer or human. His Artificial Intelligence (AI) algorithms do not only ask random questions but, like a savvy detective, ask just the right ones. His AI algorithms could help train robots and other automated devices faster and easier." Bhatia's research has the potential to solve some of the most pressing problems in machine learning.

Earlier this year, Bhatia provided a more



detailed description of his project. Its title is: "Simple and Fast Algorithms for Interactive Machine Learning with Random Counter-Examples."

Bhatia explained that the current processes of training machines – what is generally thought of as "Artificial Intelligence" – tend to be slow, requiring a lot of data.

"This is why robots still seem so primitive in their thinking and understanding, and my project tries to solve that," he said, "tries to make the whole process more data efficient. My research asserts that there is a more data efficient way to train machines, which I prove using mathematics." A future application of these algorithms may be robotics, "where a surgical robot adapts to an individual's anatomy, or where a factory robot learns a human's habits and patterns so that the two can work effectively together."

While at WHRHS, Bhatia was President of the Computer Science Club, which has included, among other things, helping to organize and stage the WHRHS "HillsHacks" Hackathons the last two years. He and the Class of 2020 Salutatorian Mayur Sharma, gave leadership to that program. The day-long program, held this year on Sunday, February 23, just weeks before the COVID Pandemic forced the 4-month school closing and shift to Distance Learning, attracted scores of computer-interested students, from grade schoolage through high school-age from around the North Jersey region, and involving a core of WHRHS computer-interested WHRHS students as peer leaders led by Bhatia and Sharma.

In addition, Bhatia was president of the WHRHS Math Team, and a four-year athlete on the WHRHS Cross Country Team.

At the annual Senior Awards Ceremony for the Class of 2020, held virtually in June, Bhatia was recognized for having won the Class of 2020 "Excellence in Mathematics and Computer Science Award."

First place honors in the Regeneron Science Talent Search went to Lillian Petersen of Las Alamos, N. M., who earned \$250,000 for her entry, inventing a simple tool for predicting harvests early in the growing season. Other Top Ten winners earned from between \$150,000 to \$40,000 for their project entries.

In addition, the competition also recognized another 30 entrants from across the country, who each earned \$25,000 for their projects. Each year, around 2,000 student submit original research in critically important scientific fields of study and are judged by leading experts in their fields.
