MICHAEL NAYA PRESERVES THE HISTORIES OF WWII VETS

Michael Naya hopes to be a history professor one day. While the Kean University freshman pursues that professional dream, he is doing the work of a historian, recording the military experiences of World War II veterans from around the country.

Since the age of 14, Naya has interviewed more than 100 World War II veterans to capture their oral histories of the war and one day preserve them in a book. Now 18, the history major from Kenilworth is a founding member of the Young Historians Program through the group D-Day Squadron.

"I want you all to remember the thousands and millions of people who served in World War II. These were the quiet heroes," Naya said. "Every Memorial Day, we honor those who died, and their stories are often widely known, but we very rarely remember those who came back from the war and built our communities."

Naya said getting a book about the Titanic in first grade ignited his interest in history. Then, when he was 14, he watched a video about two World War II veterans reuniting after 70 years.

"I looked over at my mom and said, "Mom, I want to interview these veterans," he said.

His mother connected him with a family friend, John Rembish, who served in World War II, and Naya's passion for interviewing veterans from the Greatest Generation flourished. By reaching out to veteran-related associations, he has talked with veterans across the country.

One of them is 95-year-old Chuck Brown of SeaTac, Washington, who saw combat with the 12th Armored Division in Alsace, France, and helped liberate concentration camps during his three years in the army. He calls Naya a "close friend."

"I think the world of him. He is 18 years old and in his first year of college. I am 95 years old, but we talk on equal terms. For me, it is a wonderful experience. I can't get enough of the guy. There is no age difference when we speak," he said.

Brown, who was drafted at 18, shared with Naya his recollections of the fear, the "terrible cold" and the lack of sleep that dominated his time in the war.

"The only reason that a guy like myself served was for the 12 guys in the squad. You weren't serving for some Hollywood reason," he said. "You were scared to death, and the only thing that meant anything to you were the guys next to you. You would do anything for them."

Through the D-Day Squadron, a group of owners and operators of Douglas DC-3 vintage

aircraft and World War II veteran airplanes, Naya is developing the Young Historians Program.

"They want to educate young children, teenagers and young adults on World War II through peer outreach, and I find that to be a great idea," Naya said. "It's our job as the next generation to carry on the torch of preserving that memory."

Lyndse Costabile, director of corporate relations, communications and marketing at the D-Day Squadron, said Naya brings experience, innate talent and a passion for history to the Young Historians Program.

"He's very persistent and passionate. That persistence is what sparked our interest in him. He is very charismatic, just a genuine, good-hearted person with a great soul, and those are the types of people we like to surround ourselves with and involve in our efforts," she said.

Naya hopes more Kean students will get involved in the project, something that Adjunct Professor John Lestrange, who has Naya in his World of History class, endorses.

"I absolutely wish that more students were involved in projects like this. Oral histories like what Michael is conducting are very important primary sources, and there are so many historic events that we can record this way," he said.

With plans to become a high school history teacher and, ultimately, a college history professor, Naya said he chose Kean because of its outstanding reputation for educating teachers. While he hasn't yet set foot on campus this semester as he learns remotely during the COVID-19 pandemic, Naya said he is having a great experience. "I absolutely love

Right now, Naya is focused on finding and interviewing survivors of the attack on Pearl Harbor, which launched the U.S. into the war.

"There are still so many men and women out there in our own communities who've never told their stories. They never wanted to talk about it. They came home. They put their duffel bags away. They folded up their uniforms, and they put the war behind them," he said. "I'm glad that I'm able to keep in touch with these eyewitnesses. How many people my age get to say they spoke to a World War II vet? I think it's a privilege and an honor I get to do work like this."

SCHEDULE YOUR COVID VACCINATION

The County of Union opened an online registration system at ucnjvaccine.org for those eligible to receive the COVID-19 vaccination.

Please note the registration system will only log those who are eligible to receive the vaccination. Those who are ineligible to receive vaccinations will not be allowed to pre-register, and must wait until they are eligible.

Those who are eligible to receive the vaccine include paid and unpaid persons serving in health care settings who have the potential for direct or indirect exposure to patients or infectious materials and long-term care residents and staff, and also sworn law enforcement personnel and

fire professionals. Residents 65 and older are also eligible to receive the vaccinations, as are those between the ages of 16-64 with medical conditions, as defined by the CDC, that increase the risk of severe illness from the virus.

The county is offering the Moderna vaccine. The vaccination clinic is located at Downs Hall at Kean University in Union, and is currently open five days a week from 3-7 p.m. Once more vaccines are available, the county is planning to offer the COVID-19 vaccine in different areas of

KENILWORTH'S OLDEST BOY SUCCUMBS AT AGE 100

Eugene Coppola oldest native son remembered

Kenilworth icon Eugene Victor Coppola passed away quietly at home of natural causes on Friday, December 19, 2020. Born at home at 21 N. 20th St. on March 3, 1920, he was one of six children of Amedeo and Rosa Coppola who came to Kenilworth about 1912.

Gene, as he liked to be called, was very proud of being the oldest male resident ever born here to still be living in town. And proud of being among the last of local students who attended Roselle Park High School and to be in the first graduating class in 1938 from the then new Jonathan Dayton Regional High School in Springfield. With enthusiasm he shared stories of growing up in Kenilworth and was eye witness to many historical events taking place here.

On the occasion of his 100th birthday last year he recalled, "As a boy I helped my father in his vegetable store on N. 20th St. It's Morabito's Pharmacy now. My father and sister Sally saw John Kennedy come into the store after the war looking for a girl who lived on N. 22nd St. My father drove a Model T pick-up truck to Newark to get vegetables, sold them from the store, and we delivered them to homes all over. The only paved street in town was the Boulevard. There were practically no houses south of the Boulevard when I grew up. Kenilworth was small; everyone knew everyone else."

"My father was a fireman. I went with him in a snow storm to the Flats Fire [1927] on Passaic Ave. The fire hydrant was frozen; the building burned to the ground. I went to the site of Jimmy Doolittle's plane when [1929] it crashed on Faitoute Ave. There was a big crowd at the scene. It wasn't much of a secret during Prohibition where speakeasies could be found in town. During the Depression marathon dances were held in the fields on Galloping Hill Road. Boys picked water lilies to sell from Jackson Pond that was behind Harding School. It was the Depression and making a few dollars here and there for your family was important."

"Kenilworth was a big baseball town. One of the ballfields was where the Methodist Church is on the Boulevard. Small planes used to land there and later the airfield was moved up to where the Kenilworth Diner is today."

"I saw the Ku Klux Klan march up to the old Upsala College campus. I worked at the Kensington Riding Stables where the Wells Fargo Bank is, and also at Neville's Stables off the Boulevard near N. 9th St. Polo matches, rodeos, and air shows drew thousands of spectators. The shoot-out at the old borough hall in 1940 caused a tremendous stir in town. When I first saw my future wife, Evelyn, I knew I wanted to marry her. We married during the war in 1943 and have a beautiful daughter, also

named Evelyn. I am a very lucky man."

Gene, a WWII US Army veteran, was honorably discharged as a private first class. He served on the planning board, rescue squad, as president of the fire department, as president of the Homeowners' Association, as secretary of the Married and Singles Club, and member of VFW Post 2230. After many years of working at local factories, Gene established in the 1960s his own lunch truck catering business which was well known throughout the Kenilworth region.

In addition to his daughter, Evelyn, Gene is survived by her husband, Gary Delatush; sisters Sally Brokaw and Doris Picaroni; grandsons Lee, Todd, and Scott; great grandchildren Kaitlyn, Nathan, Greyson, and Griffen; and many nieces and nephews. He was predeceased in 2020 by his wife of 76 years, Evelyn, and earlier by brothers Vincent and George, and sisters Elmina DeGatano and Lucy Pepe. Funeral arrangements were by the Opacity Funeral home with participation from the VFW, the Fire Department, Rescue Squad, and the Police Department. A funeral Mass, December 30, at St. Theresa's Church, was officiated by Rev. Giovanni Rizzo, pastor. Burial was at Graceland Memorial Park, Kenilworth.

In an effort to create a safe and supportive environment for girls to gain confidence and knowledge at her high school, Sarah, a resident of Kenilworth and now a Magnet High School alumna, formed a Women in Leadership and Service club during her senior year.

As part of her Gold Award project plan, Sarah and her team worked with school administrators to create the club, recruited new members, and then conducted weekly meetings that involved guest speakers, discussions on global women's issues such as education, and the creation of informational posters to display around the school.

"Knowing the importance of supportive friendships, I wanted to create this environment for girls to have the chance to come together and raise each other up whenever they needed it," said Sarah.

Despite being an outgoing senior last year, Sarah's vision, and the new club will remain sustainable beyond her involvement through commitments from younger club members and the club's advisor.

Sarah, who has been a part of Girl Scouts Heart of New Jersey (GSHNJ) Troop 40128 for 13 years, said being a Girl Scout has taught her the value of selflessness and that anyone is capable of making the world a better place.

"Being a part of a Girl Scout troop has also


taught me the power that girls have when we come together; because when we do, we always make a positive change," she added.


