SUMMIT FOUNDATION ANNOUNCES CHANGES TO ITS BOARD

The Summit Foundation announces the appointment of two members to its board and the retirement of a longstanding trustee.

Jonathan Betz and Mark Yeager have joined the board. Sandra R. Lizza has retired from the board.

The Summit Foundation has awarded more than \$305,000 in grants to 17 local nonprofit organizations providing vital food, shelter, education, arts, culture, and health programs and services. Some of the grants include:

- \$25,000 to GRACE
- \$15,000 to YWCA of Union County
- \$10,000 to ECLC Foundation
- \$8,500 to Friends of Summit Public Art
- \$26,000 to Overlook Foundation

Other organizations receiving grants include ARTS by the People, Morristown Medical Center Foundation, Summit

Speech School, Imagine, Good Grief, Center for Hope Hospice, St. Joseph Social Service Center, Community FoodBank of NJ, Boy Scouts of America Patriots' Path Council, Summit Chorale, and Summit Area YMCA.

In 2020, The Summit Foundation's support totaled \$1.2 million, including \$100,000 in emergency grants to help organizations respond to COVID-19 restrictions, \$665,000 in competitive grants to 34 local nonprofits, \$50,000 in college scholarships for local high school students, and more than \$385,000 through donor advised and community pass through funds.

COVID-19 VACCINES ARE IN THE PIPELINE SCAMMERS WON'T BE FAR BEHIND

Division of Consumer and Business Education, FTC

The release of COVID-19 vaccines plans for distribution are still being worked out.

While we wait for a timeline and more information, there's no doubt scammers will be scheming. Here's what you need to know to avoid a vaccine-related scam:

- You likely will not need to pay anything out of pocket to get the vaccine during this public health emergency.
- You can't pay to put your name on a list to get the vaccine.
- You can't pay to get early access to the vaccine.
- No one from a vaccine distribution site or health care payer, like a private insurance company, will call you asking for your Social Security number or your credit card or bank account information to sign you up to get the

vaccine.

• Beware of providers offering other products, treatments, or medicines to prevent the virus. Check with your health care provider before paying for or receiving any COVID-19-related treatment.

If you get a call, text, email — or even someone knocking on your door — claiming they can get you early access to the vaccine, STOP. That's a scam. Don't pay for a promise of vaccine access or share personal information. Instead, report it to the FTC at ReportFraud.ftc.gov or file a complaint with your state or territory attorney general through consumerresources.org, the consumer website of the National Association of Attorneys General.

SUMMIT EMS RESPONSES – DECEMBER 2020

Summit's EMS Volunteers closed out a hectic 2020 by answering 170 emergency calls for help in December. These included 108 medical emergencies: 15 falls; 9 motor vehicle accidents, including 1 into a tree; 9 traumatic injuries; 1 woman in labor; 6 cases of overdose or poisoning; and 10 responses to a medical alarm. Squad Volunteers also provided 4 "lift assists" to patients who did not require transport to a hospital as well as 2 non-emergency ambulance transports.

Among the Squad's emergency calls in December was a large scale missing person search to which 14 Squad members responded and conducted searches of area buildings, backyards, parks, wooded areas, etc. After a 4 hour search effort, the individual was found in a neighboring town. The Squad also helped a cardiac arrest patient who was successfully revived and has since returned home. In that case, a nearby Summit Police officer arrived on scene almost immediately with an Automated External Defibrillator (AED) and administered a shock to restore an effective heart rhythm. The Squad arrived just a minute later, continued treatment and transported the patient to Overlook Medical Center.

After treating 9 possible COVID-19 patients in November, the Squad saw just 3 in December.

During December, 22 emergency calls were answered by an off-duty "back-up crew" of volunteers responding from home or work when the on-duty crew is busy. 9 emergency calls were to provide mutual aid assistance to neighboring towns. 19 patients transported to a hospital by Squad members also received advanced life support care from hospital-based paramedics who accompanied the Squad's ambulance.

The Squad answers calls for help 24 hours a day and at a variety of locations. December's responses included 99 to patients' homes or apartments; 19 for accidents or medical emergencies on roads or highways; 3 calls were to an assisted living facility; 2 in public buildings; 8 at a local business; and 2 to a health care professional's office. There were also 5 medical incidents on sidewalks; 2 in parking lots; 1 at a church; 1 in a park; 11 at Summit's Train Station; and 11 on the grounds of a local hospital.

The all-volunteer Summit First Aid Squad responds to emergency calls 24/7, is entirely funded through private donations and does not bill for service. The Squad is always looking for new volunteers to join its ranks. All needed training, uniforms and equipment is provided. SCHEDULE YOUR COVID VACCINATION

The County of Union opened an online registration system at ucnjvaccine.org for those eligible to receive the COVID-19 vaccination.

Please note the registration system will only log those who are eligible to receive the vaccination. Those who are ineligible to receive vaccinations will not be allowed to pre-register, and must wait until they are eligible.

Those who are eligible to receive the vaccine include paid and unpaid persons serving in health care settings who have the potential for direct or indirect exposure to patients or infectious materials and long-term care residents and staff, and also sworn law enforcement personnel and

fire professionals. Residents 65 and older are also eligible to receive the vaccinations, as are those between the ages of 16-64 with medical conditions, as defined by the CDC, that increase the risk of severe illness from the virus.

The county is offering the Moderna vaccine. The vaccination clinic is located at Downs Hall at Kean University in Union, and is currently open five days a week from 3-7 p.m. Once more vaccines are available, the county is planning to offer the COVID-19 vaccine in different areas of the county.

BICYCLE COLLECTION FOR COUNTRIES IN NEED

In August 2020, Renna Media reported that Faith Lutheran Church collected and repaired 170 used bikes from residents of New Providence, Berkeley Heights and neighboring towns. The collection was conducted on behalf of Pedals for Progress, an organization which recycles bikes for persons in developing countries. Faith contributed \$1,700 toward the shipping bikes.

In the United States daily transportation occurs conveniently with little or no forethought. This is not the case in developing countries, where a village may not have one car. The mode of transportation for commuting to work, going to market and receiving medical care is frequently a pedal bike.

Later this year, Faith will again be asking persons to donate bikes for Faith to process through Pedals for Progress. A person may ask Faith to pick up the bike from his/her house or deliver the bike to Faith. If one wishes to donate a bike before the request, one may place the bike by the shed at the back of Faith's parking lot located at 524 South Street, New Providence, NJ. If you would like a bike picked up call 908-464-5177.

Since 2002 Faith has been participating in the Pedals for Progress program. For the past five years, Casey Walsh has chaired the ministry.
