

LIONS CLUB DEDICATES MONUMENT IN ARTHUR LEWIS PARK

In October 2020, the Green Brook Lions dedicated a monument in Arthur Lewis Park, located on the site of the former Green Brook Swim Club. The monument was envisioned in 2017 as a celebration of the 100th anniversary of Lions Clubs International.

Inscribed on the monument are the Lions logo and motto, 'Not above you, not beneath you, but with you'. The monument will celebrate outstanding community leaders, and bears the name of four people who helped shape Green Brook into the wonderful community that it is.

Those inaugural names are: Irene E. Feldkirchner, Alvin P. Kappelman, Jr., Vernon A. Noble and Arthur L. Lewis

Irene Feldkirchner started as a teacher in Green Brook in 1926, in a two-year-old school on the site where the Green Brook Municipal Building now sits. She taught grade 5 through 8. In 1938, the school was moved to a new building, and Irene was the first principal of the Andrew Street School. She dedicated 47 years to education, and the school was renamed to honor her service.

Alvin Peter Kappelman, Jr., was killed on September 11, 2001 at the age of 57. He was an insurance executive who worked at the World Trade Center. Following in his father and uncles' footsteps, Al became a member of the Green Brook Volunteer Fire Department at the age of 16. He served the department for more than 41 years, including many years as a department officer and as Fire Chief. His dedication to the Fire Department helped mold the department. His service is

the symbol of the volunteerism that sets Green Brook apart from other communities.

Vernon A. Noble was a charter member of the Green Brook Lions Club, which was established in 1950. In addition to his philanthropic efforts on behalf of this club, Vern was very involved with the Elks Club, and their efforts on behalf of the handicapped. Vern was an elected and appointed official in Green Brook, serving on almost every board and commission. He served as Mayor of Green Brook Township and as a Somerset County Freeholder. He was a founding member of the Green Brook Flood Control Commission. The decadeslong effort began in 1973 following significant flooding throughout the 64 square mile Green Brook basin. In 1999, those efforts were finally realized, as construction began on the protection in Bound Brook. The project is expected to last another 25 years, at a cost of more than \$1.4 billion.

Arthur L. Lewis, the namesake of the Park, was a member of the GB Lions Club. Art was a member of many other community organizations, including the GB Seniors, BPO Elks and Moose International. He was a Green Brook Mayor and Tax Assessor, and a founding board member of the Green Brook Swim Club, which operated for six decades prior to the conversion to a Township park.

Somerset County Library System of New Jersey Library System's physical locations. (SCLSNJ) is piloting borrowing systems for Library customers that live in community living centers and those in a housebound or other qualifying situation.

In early 2021, SCLSNJ will begin to test the home borrowing service for individuals unable to physically access the Library due to a housebound or other qualifying situation. During this trial phase, 25 customers will receive Library materials via the U.S. Postal Service (USPS).

"This pilot initiative is critical as we look at the current public health situation," said Christopher Korenowsky, director of public services. "SCLSNJ's offerings will only continue to grow as libraries reshape their public offerings. Identifying new and innovative ways to connect customers and materials remains a vital strategic priority for the Library System."

"These rapidly growing groups of Somerset County residents are Library customers and taxpayers who have cherished and supported services throughout their lifetimes," said Nicole Pascoe, civic services manager. "Many find themselves encountering transportation, health, and mobility issues that limit their physical access to SCLSNJ branches and services."

In mid-2021, the home borrowing service will become more widely available to qualifying individuals including those facing health, mobility, and transportation barriers to the

As 2021 closes, the initiative will extend to Somerset County's community living centers, where SCLSNJ will partner with facility staff to coordinate pickup of materials at the nearest Library branch. Community living centers include assisted living facilities, group homes, and senior housing complexes.

"We are looking forward to the expansion of both home and community living borrower services planned for later this year," said Pascoe. "Relaunching these valuable and important services in a streamlined, safe, and sustainable way is a priority of SCLSNJ."



BICYCLE COLLECTION FOR DEVELOPING COUNTRIES

Faith Lutheran Church collected and repaired 170 used bikes from residents of New Providence, Berkeley Heights and neighboring towns. The collection was conducted on behalf of Pedals for Progress, an organization which recycles bikes for persons in developing countries. Faith contributed \$1,700 toward the shipment of the bikes.

In the United States daily transportation occurs conveniently with little or no forethought. This is not the case in developing countries, where a village may not have one car. The mode of transportation for commuting to work, going to market and receiving medical care is frequently a pedal bike.

Later this year, Faith will again be asking In August 2020, Renna Media reported that persons to donate bikes for Faith to process through Pedals for Progress. A person may ask Faith to pick up the bike from his/her house or deliver the bike to Faith. If one wishes to donate a bike before the request, one may place the bike by the shed at the back of Faith's parking lot located at 524 South Street, New Providence, NJ. 

The students said they were pleasantly surprised to be honored for their achievement in the challenge, and enjoyed the learning experience.


WHRHS Principal William Librera said WHRHS is very proud of this achievement by all the students. He said their achievement is a testimony both to their academic abilities and their work ethic.
