# RAHWAY'S DEBORAH STUART SQUARE FOOT GARDENING FOUNDATION'S "FEATURED INSTRUCTOR"

Lifelong Rahway resident Deb Stuart was recently recognized as the Featured Certified Instructor by the Square Foot Gardening Foundation for her work teaching both kids and adults how to garden.

Square Foot Gardening, created by best-selling garden author Mel Bartholomew, is a simple method of creating small, orderly, and highly productive kitchen gardens that are easy to grow, are fun, and take up very little space. Vegetables and flowers are grown in raised boxes filled with an organic soil mix and then divided into perfect 12" squares. Deb notes that this method is estimated to cost 50% less, uses 20% less space, 10% of the water, and only 2% of the work compared to single-row

One of Deb's earliest memories of gardening is the day when she was a little girl wearing a beautifully smocked dress with pristine white socks. She went out to the garden and, when she returned late in a less-thanclean outfit, her mother fussed at her. "I'm not dirty, Mommy," she responded, "It's the earth!"

Gardening extraordinaire Deb Stuart is also a Rutgers trained Master Gardener. When she isn't gardening and starting seeds at home, she tirelessly spends time as the President of the Rahway Garden Club and a Board of Trustee member of the Garden Club of NJ, and also manages Rahway's JFK Community Garden as well as teaching kids Square Foot Gardening at Rahway's Helping Hands Learning Academy. In addition, Deb has played a key role in helping her gardening colleague Bob Markey expand his Square Foot Gardening Program for summer campers at three NJ YMCA's.

"I teach by example using the Square Foot techniques and sharing that info with all who are interested. Often the best compliment that I receive is a fellow gardener looking at my raised beds and saying, WOW that's an amazing amount of veggies and flowers in such a small space...please show me how you do it. I just let the results speak for themselves!"

# RAHWAY BOWLER, MARTY CASSIO, REACHED NATIONAL PROMINENCE ON THE WAY TO HALL OF FAME CAREER

In the annals of athletes who came out of Rahway, Marty Cassio, who became a nationally known bowler, ranks right up with the best of them. In a career that spanned four decades (1920s-1950s), Cassio's accomplishments on the alleys earned him a place in the United States Bowling Congress Hall of Fame, the New Jersey Hall of Fame, and the Union County Hall of Fame where he was the first from his sport to be inducted. Known as "the Little Bowling Tailor," (he stood at 5'5" and weighed 140 pounds), his accomplishments and records against the best in the sport are truly remarkable.

Born in Palermo, Italy in 1904, Cassio came to the United States at age five. When a teen, one of his first jobs was setting pins at the Rahway YMCA and at age fourteen he figured he would try the game from the other end of the alley. By sixteen, he was averaging 190.

Cassio family members were tailors and it was likely the young man would follow in the business. At seventeen he took on a job in a Milton Avenue tailor shop where an accident occurred that almost put an end to what would become a career as a professional bowler. One afternoon while carrying an armful of clothes, he slipped and fell into a plate glass window seriously cutting his right hand. Doctors told the seventeen-year-old, "We can save your hand, but it will never be normal again." The doctors turned out to be correct in their prognosis. The mishap had left Cassio's bowling hand shrunken with his ring finger and little finger permanently curled.

Less driven individuals might have given up any thoughts of a future in sports, but Cassio would not accept defeat and promised himself he would bowl again. Using a ball specially fitted for his grip, he would come to rely on accuracy rather than wrist strength as he continued practicing to exercise his hand. In time, his strenuous practice regimen paid off and he

became good enough to join and excel on the professional level.

It was during the 1930s and 1940s that Cassio put up his best numbers. Over the two-decade period, he maintained an average of over 200. He won the State Individual Tournament in 1939 and held the title for ten years in a row and after losing it in 1949, regained it in 1953. His best All-Events showing in American Bowling Tournament play came in 1940 when he finished third with a 1,943-pin total. He bowled 300 three times in sanctioned play and held a high series of 803. One of his perfect games came in national competition in 1944. Speaking of perfect 300 games, over his career, he performed the feat twenty-three times and once hit twenty-two straight strikes pinning scores of 280 and 300. Overall, his tournament record included fifteen titles. He finished in the Top Ten sixteen times in ABC Tournaments in singles, doubles, and allevents and his ABC average for twenty-nine years was 197. He is listed in the Encyclopedia of Sports for having rolled six series of 1,800 or better for five and ten year averages of 208.25 and 203.67 respectively.

His success on the lanes came in no small part from his fierce competitive spirit perhaps a result of the strenuous work he put in after the accident suffered as a young man. He always played to win and was known to glare at the pins if they failed to fall, glare at his opponents, and even at teammates if he felt they were not taking a match seriously. Fans referred to him as a "Money Bowler" who never got rattled and who was at his best when the match was on the line. He bowled in eighty match games winning seventy-two of them. In rematches of the eight he lost, he won seven with one having never been replayed. He was willing to take on all comers and once offered to bowl anyone in the country for a

\$1,000 stake in a sixty or eighty game home and home series.

In 1946 AMF (American Machine and Foundry), manufacture of recreational equipment, began producing bowling films to promote the sport. Cassio was selected to star in their first effort. The movie short titled "Ten Pin Magic" was shown throughout the country with a special showing at the Rahway Theater. An ad for the film announced, "Special Extra Attraction... Ten Pin Magic... Marty Cassio, Rahway's own champion bowler... A real treat for those who have seen him and those who have not."

Marty Cassio died in December, 1972. On March 23, of that year he became the fifty-forth bowler inducted into the American Bowling Congress Hall of Fame (The ABC became the United States Bowling Congress in 2005 after a number of mergers.) At his induction ceremony it was noted that although he never won an ABC Tournament Championship (he came in third in 1940), he had nine game all-events totals over 1,800 in twelve tournaments and in 1946 led the ABC Open Championships ten-year average list with 203 for ninety games across thirty sets of lanes. A bronze tablet bearing his likeness is housed in the USBC Hall of Fame Museum in Arlington, Texas.



### **FORSYTHIA**

Everyone who lives in our region would easily recognize the Forsythia shrub, even if they don't know it by name. Forsythia is the first shrub that blooms in the early spring, March and April. It heralds the end of winter and the beginning if spring.

Forsythias' popularity is due to its bright, golden yellow flowers that bloom on bare branches. They create a spectacular display when other plants are just waking up from their winter dormancy.

Forsythia is native to high elevations in China and have been cultivated in China and Japan for centuries.

Discovered by a Swedish botanist in Japan around 1775/76 Forsythia was first introduced to Holland in 1833. Forsythia then reached England in 1850. Later the plant was named Forsythia after William Forsyth (1737-1804), the superintendent of the Royal Gardens at Kensington and St. James Palaces. Forsythia finally arrived in America in 1917.

Today there are hundreds of Forsythia cultivars for sale. Although the golden yellow is still the most popular, there is also a white variety and lighter shades of yellow available. There are now a few dwarf Forsythia on the market but Forsythia is, for the most part, larger shrubs not suitable for border plantings.

Long lived and hardy, these disease resistance plants can live to be fifty or sixty years old. Many of the problems that Forsythia have, such as stem galls, can be easily corrected simply by pruning the sickly stems off. These galls look like golf balls growing along the branches.

Fast growing plants, Forsythia can be easily propagated from soft or hardwood cutting. In the wild, Forsythia often propagates itself by 'stem layering'. A branch that hits the ground and becomes covered with soil or leaves develops its own roots and soon becomes its own viable plant. In the home garden this new plant can later be cut away from the original and replanted in a different area. This is a horticulture technique that can be stimulated in the home garden as well.

Propagation from seed takes a long time, up to two years, starting with harvesting seeds and safely overwintering them outdoors. The avid gardener might enjoy trying this but there is no guarantee the offspring will have the desirable qualities of the parent plant.

Since Forsythia are long-lived fast-growing plants, site selection is very important. A mature shrub can reach the height of 8 to 10 feet and 12 feet wide. When planting along a fence line, give plenty of room to avoid unnecessary conflicts with neighbors in the future. Because of its eventual size Forsythias should not be added to a border planting as they will quickly outgrow the

According to Michael Dirr, Manual of Woody Landscape Plants "Shrub borders, mass groupings and along banks are the most

The most spectacular appropriate sites." plantings are along fence lines and on roadsides where they have plenty of space and sunlight to grow.

Correctly pruning Forsythia is the key to the most beautiful display in the spring. Since they bloom on last season's new branches, pruning should be done soon after blooming in the spring. After the leaves grow in, the young buds for next year's bloom are already formed. Later pruning will remove these flower buds. When pruning, remove the thick old wood in the center to encourage new growth.

Forsythia looks best when they are allowed to maintain their weeping, flowing habit so the less pruning the better. If you prefer your garden tightly pruned with rounded shrubs, Forsythia are not the best selection for you.

Forsythia has been used in traditional Chinese medicine for at least four thousand years. It is still used, often blended with other plants, to treat skin infections, colds, fever and jaundice. Laboratory studies have confirmed its anti-tumor, antibacterial and anti-inflammatory actives.

### FORCING FORYSTIA FLOWERS INDOORS

Forcing Forsythia to bloom indoors in early spring is an easy way to bring spring color indoors. Select a branch with as many buds as possible. Give it a good cut on an angle and place it in water. Cutting it on an angle helps the cutting absorb more water. A few hours later give your branch another fresh cut and put it in fresh, clean room temperature water. It's also a good idea to strip off the flower buds that will be under water since these will rot and possibility smell. A sunny window helps your Forsythia branch flower sooner. Change the water once or twice a week and soon you will have a beautiful display of flowers.

Often these forced braches will develop roots and become a new young plant. Prune off the top of the branch, leaving about eight inches and put it back in fresh water. When the roots are about six to eight inches long it's time to plant it. Allowing the new root to become too long is not a good idea. These 'water roots' have a harder time adjusting to their new life in soil, increasing possibility of failure. Plant your new Forsythia in the garden or directly in a pot if you plan to exchange it at a plant swap or give it as a gift.

The first year is crucial for the new roots to develop so don't forget to water your young plants at least once a week.

### **NEW JERSEY OUTDOORS: ARCHIVE NOW AVAILABLE ONLINE**

New Jersey is far more than just a "garden" state. While well known for its vast network of fields and farms, fresh produce and fruit orchards, New Jersey boasts incredible ecological diversity. Even those who only know New Jersey from the Sopranos have heard of the Pine Barrens. The 1.1 million acre swath of forest and wetland that confounded Chris and Paulie in the episode "Pine Barrens," was actually the country's first National Reserve and designated by UNESCO as a single-site biosphere reserve. It is the largest body of open space on the Mid-Atlantic seaboard and home to dozens of rare and endangered species.

Yet even though the Pine Barrens claim some 22% of the state's land, it is not the only highlight when it comes to New Jersey's environmental diversity. Our state hosts portions of the Appalachian Trail and the black bears who live along it, streams full of native brook trout, fields where wild turkey roam and song birds compete for blueberries, and homes for marine wildlife all along the Jersey Shore.

New Jersey Outdoors was created with the idea of highlighting and celebrating New Jersey's rich environmental heritage. First published in 1950

Economic Development – the precursor to the modern Department of Environmental Protection New Jersey Outdoors featured articles on hunting, fishing, and conservation related topics. The combination of photography and illustration by local artists gave each issue a unique personality.

The New Jersey State Library is pleased to provide free online access to its entire collection of New Jersey Outdoors. Issues from 1961-2002 have been digitized in color and are available through the Library's Digital Collections.

Browsing the table of contents reveals the breadth of topics in each issue – from in-depth commentary on particular species, to fishing tips, and profiled conservation projects. The issues also provide a glimpse at how environmental concerns changed over time.

For example, the January 1963 issue features commentary on what could happen to New Jersey's wildlife and food supply in the event of nuclear disaster. Tensions between sportsman and environmentalists were highlighted in the August 1971 issue – just a year after the first Earth Day

by the Department of Conservation and and the rise of the new environmental movements. In July/August 1983, an article on urban waterfront restoration projects showed the culmination of years' worth of work. Peppered throughout the issues are articles on historical and archaeological topics, as researchers explored human interaction with their environment.


> New Jersey Outdoors was published monthly from 1961-1973, bimonthly 1973-1991, and then seasonally from 1991-2003. Publication ended in 2003 after the publication of the Department of Environmental Protection's new magazine, Fish and Wildlife Digest. Fish and Wildlife Digest eventually split into three separate, annual magazines: Hunting and Trapping Digest, Freshwater Fishing Digest, and Marine Digest. These magazines are also available through the Library's Digital Collections.

### **MAKING MAGICAL MEMORIES AT CAMP FATIMA**

Like most nonprofit organizations, Camp Fatima of New Jersey is experiencing major challenges due to COVID-19. Founded in 1968 by four Seton Hall seminary students, the camp offers free sleep-away programs for disabled children and adults. And it's determined to continue doing so. Seeing the smiles on the faces of those it serves, and providing a respite to their families, is not something that can be sacrificed due to a pandemic.

And smile they do. It's not called FATIMAGIC for nothing. The campers, regardless of their disabilities, get to do things that most able-bodied children and adults take for granted. They splash around in pools, sing songs, eat s'mores, dance,

and take part in arts and crafts. Every child has his or her own dedicated counselor to ensure the utmost care, so each activity can be individually tailored according to the camper's ability.

Its mission statement, "Camp Fatima provides free, life enriching camp experiences for children and adults with developmental disabilities," says it all. Some of the campers are in wheelchairs, while others have neurological, sensory or other serious issues. Camp Fatima and its volunteers open their hearts to all who come. It truly is a magical place.

The volunteers come from diverse ethnic and socio-economic backgrounds. Most have experience working directly with the disabled, and include teachers, nurses, police officers,

firefighters, college students and other professionals. For these selfless individuals, the sounds of laughter and the looks of pure joy on the campers' faces are all the payment they need.

Many of these volunteers live locally. Billy Malone, a Scotch Plains firefighter and Fanwood resident, became a volunteer in 1994 and has been the chairperson for the past 13 years. Scotch Plains resident and former Scotch Plains police officer, Jamie Denman, has been a volunteer since 1979, and is the current director.

Even though no one at the camp is paid, all this magic requires funding. It costs several hundred thousand dollars to operate the two children's summer sessions and the four adult weekends each year. Funding to support and host the more than 200 campers and over 450 on site-volunteers comes from generous benefactors, corporate matching gifts, private giving, and fundraising. Because of COVID-19, many of the usual fundraisers are not able to take place. So this year, Camp Fatima is looking for individuals to sponsor a camper. The cost to feed, house, and supply materials to each camper is more than \$1,000.


