#### SUE PANGIS SWORN IN AS ADVOCATE FOR LOCAL FOSTER YOUTH

CASA of Union County

Nine community members ranging from age 22 to 63 make up the newest class of volunteer child advocates for CASA of Union County, the only nonprofit advocating for the best interests of Union County youth removed from home due to abuse or neglect, and placed in foster care. Sue Pangis of Berkeley Heights is among them.

"In March 2020, COVID-19 turned our world upside down. During the early months of quarantine and slowing down, I reflected on what is most important in my life. I wanted to make a difference but didn't know how. Luckily, I crossed paths with a current CASA volunteer who told me how she stays connected to the community through her service. I knew right away CASA would be a great way to give back," explained Pangis.

Superior Court Judge Marc R. Brown presided over the recent swearing-in ceremony via Zoom; advocates will now be matched to a foster youth or sibling set and begin putting their 30 hours of training into practice. The class includes both non-parents and parents, and such backgrounds as teaching, freelance, law, and homemaking. In addition to Pangis, they are Jacqui Lenner and Nicole Sandstedt of Westfield, Laurie Litterio of Cranford, Rebecca Muston and Amy Saunders of Summit, Tamara Parraga-Sez of Newark, Lydia Pernia of Linden, and Jackie Rodriguez of Clark.

Prior to administering the oath, the judge shared, "I find the value of CASA volunteers immeasurable. ... CASA is so significant; I always make a point of hearing from the CASA volunteer during the hearing." Acknowledging that COVID-19 requires the swearing-in and court hearings remain virtual for now, he added, "I so look forward to being able to shake your hand and congratulate you. The assistance you will provide is, again, immeasurable. Thank you for doing this."

Currently, the organization serves just over 80 percent of all Union County foster youth in care. With a goal to provide an advocate for every vouth that needs one, the organization has remained steadfast – despite the pandemic – in

efforts to ensure its work continues. To that end, a fully online training and recruiting infrastructure was put into place, and protocols implemented to ensure advocates remained both connected to their youth and able to report to judges, and staff continued recruiting and training volunteers to help meet the need for youth still awaiting an advocate.

Said Executive Director Mariel S. Hufnagel, "In the face of the challenging life circumstances we are all facing due to the COVID-19 global health pandemic, this tremendous group of women still made a decision to give of their time and energy, and train virtually to become advocates. I am so proud to welcome them to the CASA family and can't wait to see all of the ways in which they positively impact the youth to whom they will be assigned."

Upon being court-ordered to a case, the CASA volunteer has access to the youth as well as foster parents, doctors, caseworkers, therapists and teachers in order to identify concerns and unmet needs, and protect best interests. 



#### THE IMPACT OF COVID - A LOOK BACK WITH GRATITUDE

On January 24, Home for Good Dog Rescue (HFGDR) achieved a milestone of the 9,000th dog adoption in just ten years since our founding. This new year is full of hope and thus, we look back to 2020 with gratitude to our friends, supporters, and community partners who lifted us up in the midst of the COVID pandemic.

Like so many others, the effects of the pandemic certainly presented challenges to the rescue. The immediate objective was to ensure the safety of our staff, volunteers, foster and adoptive families while continuing to carry out our mission of saving the lives of thousands of dogs living in squalid conditions, abusive situations, or on death row at high-kill shelters in the South.

From the pandemic, two trends emerged. First, changes in household routines and more time spent at home increased the community's interest in dog fostering and adoption. Second, the financial hardship of some households in the South exacerbated the need for dog rescue and respite in already severely life-threatening conditions.

"A year of quarantine and isolation has provided an opportunity for all of us to take stock of what is important in our lives," says Bernie Cicirelli, HFGDR Board Member and Director of Operations. "At the top of that list are our families, of which our dogs are an integral part."

The local community rallied around our mission and offered support in so many ways and for that, we are grateful. An emergency aid grant from the Berkeley Heights Business and Civic Association was a lifeline for the rescue. Other resources came in the way of supply and gift card donations and an increased participation in fostering and adoption.

The heart and generosity of our community continues to be a beacon of hope and light to pave the way to an even greater impact in 2021. On behalf of the dogs we save, and the families who have been enriched through fostering and adoption, we extend our deepest appreciation for the support of our community.



#### **SUMMIT LIONS CLUB CELEBRATES 95 YEARS**

The Summit Lions Club celebrated their 95th Anniversary in February. The Club was chartered in 1926 at the Blue Lantern Tea Room (where Winberrie is located) with a group of 27 businessmen. The first president was Eric Von Siefart. Charles Baum was the secretary. The meetings were then held at the Grand Summit Hotel. The club reached a peak of 65 members in

Lou Havanick in 1988.

The Club membership is now 20 and meets once a month at Marco Polo. Members come from Summit and surrounding towns. Helen Keller challenged the Lions to become the knights of the blind in 1925 at the Lions National Convention in Cedar Point Ohio. The club's main mission is to assist the blind and visually

the 1970's. The first woman president was Mary impaired locally and throughout the world. We collect over 1,000 pairs of unwanted eyeglasses each year and distribute them around the world to millions who need but cannot afford eyeglasses. Other missions include the environment, diabetes, youth and hunger.

#### **ART CONFERENCE - THE MATURING ARTIST**

"What has evolved from our working together to create a series of articles on the Maturing Artist and what we drew from each other was so eye-opening to me about my own work, the roots of my own art, that it has been quite a mind-blowing experience to have with someone who works in a totally different medium from me," said Linda.

Linda Vonderschmidt-LaStella, a widelyexhibited ceramist, established Earthsongs Ceramic Studio in 1993 in Metuchen, NJ. She has taught ceramics in formal settings at every level from pre-K to college and given workshops in the more informal settings of studios and community gatherings. Her ceramic murals are permanently installed in public, commercial and residential spaces in the tri-state area and Ireland. Currently her focus is on creating original work both for commissions and her own creative designs.

Nancy Ori, owner of New Jersey Media Center in Berkeley Heights is respected internationally as a corporate photographer and photography instructor for many years. She

teaches workshops both locally internationally and was affiliated for many years with the Ansel Adams Workshop in California. She currently teaches privately and is on the faculty of numerous museums and art centers throughout the state.

Ori says, "I came up with this idea of collaboration with other artists and invited Linda to be the first one. I would like to continue these conversations with other artists throughout the year and share our thoughts through our newsletters on a variety of topics. It will be a great networking opportunity for everyone. The idea of the Zoom conference is a great way for experienced artists to share their inspirations and realizations to help other artists. The conference will be void of discussions on anything political or negative. I would like the attendees to walk away with some positive energy and tips for how to plan for what to do after the quarantine. How will they redefine their normal?"



#### Home For Good Dog Rescue

On Saturday, February 20, a very special delivery was made from Aiken, South Carolina by volunteer pilots from "Pilots to the Rescue." Home for Good Dog Rescue (HFGDR), a 100% foster-based non-profit organization located in Berkeley Heights, NJ, accepted an offer from PTTR to transport 15 dogs from high kill shelters in the South. The precious cargo arrived at Caldwell Airport at 5:30 p.m. The dogs were then placed into loving foster families, where they await adoption into their forever homes.

Toni Ann Turco, co-founder of Home for Good Dog Rescue, said of the mission, "This is a partnership a long time in the making. We are extremely grateful to Pilots to the Rescue for coordinating and executing this maiden voyage."

Pilots to the Rescue is a non-profit 501c3 aviation organization, whose mission is to transport animals at high risk of euthanasia. They rely on their trusted network of volunteer pilots, who fund their own rescue flights.



#### SAGE THANKS VOLUNTEERS FOR COURAGEOUS SUPPORT DURING COVID-19

Looking back over the last 12 months, SAGE's Meals on Wheels staff say they have much to be grateful for. Along with a record number of community donations sent to the nonprofit, including frozen meals, masks, paper goods (even hard to come by toilet paper), offers to make phone calls and write letters, freezer space, baked goods and much more, they feel especially grateful to the volunteers who continued to come in monthly, weekly and even daily to continue delivering meals. According to Meals on Wheels Director, Marianne Kranz, Meals on Wheels delivered 50,000 meals in 2020, an increase of 7,000 meals over the previous 12 months.

The courage and selflessness of these individuals was recently acknowledged when three volunteers were called out for their above and beyond dedication during this unprecedented time. Amy Stuart, SAGE's Volunteer Coordinator fought back tears as she thanked the three individuals. "The fact that you risked your safety and the safety of your families to continue the

work we do is just incredible. I don't know how we would have done this without you and all of our amazing volunteers." Meals on Wheels Manager, Robin Handwerger added, "There are no words to express how I feel about these people; they are family and make my heart so full. We worked seamlessly together during a very chaotic and scary time."

Asked what it was that made the three continue to help during such an unprecedented time, Venessa Rittman of Mountainside said it was a relief to have a purpose and know she could be useful. "It gave me a focus. I'm a social worker by trade, so jumping in when people are in need used to be my job. I helped take care of my aging parents before they died and I couldn't imagine them stranded alone, not knowing how they would get their next meal. Helping to make sure our clients had food was an easy decision." She added, "My husband was nervous at first that I was exposing myself, but he also knew that it was necessary to help. I think my kids thought I was lucky to be getting out of the house."

Christopher Glacken of Berkeley Heights is a former SAGE trustee and has been volunteering for five years. Glacken said not coming in was never an option. "I thought if we don't continue helping these people who will, how will they get food? We don't just deliver meals, we check in to make sure everyone is okay. Too often we are the only visitor these people see."

Volunteer Nataile Cahoon of Berkeley Heights, who will celebrate her 90th birthday later this year, continued coming in every day as well. Cahoon has been a Meals on Wheels volunteer for 18 years and said she chose SAGE for her service because of the wonderful home care SAGE provided to her mother years ago. "SAGE helped my mother live to 100," she said. Like her fellow volunteers, Cahoon, who just received her vaccine in March, said she never questioned if she should or should not continue to help. "These people depend on us. I live alone, my family is located in Ontario and California and I have been unable to visit them for over a year. Volunteering organizes my life, gives it a sense of purpose and motivates me. It makes me feel good knowing I am helping people. I consider Meals on Wheels to be my family in NJ. This is what you do for family."
