GIRL SCOUTS DAY OF SERVICE COLLECT 6500LBS OF FOOD

On Saturday March 6, 2021, Chatham Girl Scouts of all ages, ranging from Daisy to Ambassador level, gathered for their annual Day of Service. This year the Day of Service was a drive-through food drive with an initial goal of 1200 pounds but by the end of the day a total of 6500 pounds had been collected, consisting of countless necessary items for the Chatham United Methodist Church's (CUMC) community food pantry.


The annual Day of Service is a culmination of a year of Chatham Girl Scouts focusing on the issue of hunger and how they can make a difference. Throughout this year, troops have continued to hold meetings despite the challenges of COVID-19, and 68% of all Chatham Girl Scouts supported various community service projects related to hunger. Troops conducted food drives in their school, neighborhoods, caroled for cans, used cookie funds to donate produce boxes as well as Ambassador troop 81981 used their troop funds to build the CUMC outdoor food pantry that exists today. Daisy troop leader Laura Bojanowski made a significant contribution to the weekly Wednesday food distribution behind CUMC by creating a signup to make sustainable lunches available each week. Since May Laura has spearheaded the supply of over 5,160 sustainable lunches from Chatham Girl Scouts, Chatham High School National Honor Society and Key Clubs, Cub Scouts, Chatham Methodist preschool families, Junior League of Summit, and generous residents.

This year's Day of Service drive-through food drive ran from 10:30 a.m. - 3:00 p.m. and featured socially distanced carnival games run by older Girl Scouts. Younger scouts were able to safely participate in the games from their cars as a reward for all of the hard work they have put in during this difficult year of Girl Scouts. As the food piled up, volunteers and scouts were kept busy unloading cars, greeting donors, sorting groceries, and stocking the storage room and outdoor pantry. The constantly rising tally of groceries collected kept everyone motivated and spirits high on the cold winter day.

Nobody can phrase our thanks better than CUMC pastor Jeff Markay. He said "We are humbled by the outpouring of support, compassion, and leadership that surrounded our community food pantry. Thank you to all scouts for coming together and showing how to love your neighbor. Like our shelves and storage, our hearts are full. We are grateful."

PAPER SHRED FUNDRAISER - APRIL 24

In the past months, many of us have been cleaning out home offices and collecting unwanted documents and papers like tax and medical records, old bills, and financial statements. The Senior Center of the Chathams is holding a Community Paper Shred fundraiser to help everyone declutter and dispose of those unwanted documents on Saturday, April 24 from 9:00 a.m. to 12:00 p.m. (or until the shred truck is full) at Chatham Middle School, 480 Main Street. All proceeds will support the programs and services of the non-profit Senior Center of the Chathams. The suggested minimum donation is \$5 per grocery bag, \$10 per medium cardboard box, and \$15 per large trash bag or large storage bin payable by cash or check.

The paper shred is open to the public and participants do not need to be residents of Chatham. The event will take place rain or shine and is sponsored by Chatham Disposal Company and HomeWell Care Services. Center staff and volunteers will be adhering to public health and

safety guidelines at the shred. Those who bring papers to the site will be required to remain in their cars for social distancing.

The Senior Center of the Chathams (SCC) is a 31-year-old independent 501(c)(3) non-profit organization located at 58 Meyersville Road (lower level), Chatham, NJ. the Center has helped older adults age in place by providing a wide array of activities and services that educate, empower, and promote community engagement. There is no membership fee. Many programs are offered free of charge, while others involve only a minimal charge thanks to individual donations, fundraising events that benefit the organization, and grants. During the pandemic, the Center has offered programs that provide support, guidance, and enrichment; coordinated area volunteers who have grocery shopped for older adults, and helped people attain necessary resources and services during this challenging time. CHATHAM RESIDENT'S CONNECTION TO ORGAN DONATION COMES FULL-CIRCLE

Veronica Horvath (Chatham, NJ) was only eight-years-old when her father, Richard, passed away following a tragic accident while working at a construction site. Her family's grief was beyond measure, but they found some comfort in knowing that they honored Richard's wishes of being an organ donor.

"Although it was more than 20 years ago, I still remember that moment like it was yesterday," said Veronica. "I was sitting next to my mom and she never hesitated when asked about donation. My father's gifts of his kidneys and liver saved the lives of three people. He became a true hero that day and he will always be a hero in my heart."

In 2013, Veronica's powerful connection to donation continued when she began her career at NJ Sharing Network after graduating from Susquehanna University.

"My family's experience with NJ Sharing Network inspired me and I wanted to be a part of its life-saving mission," said Veronica. "I remember continually checking NJ Sharing Network's website for job opportunities, and I will never forget receiving a call for an interview. I knew this is where I belonged."

Veronica has been an important part of NJ Sharing Network's team, serving in a variety of roles, including community outreach, marketing communications and resource development. This experience helped prepare her for her new role as a Hospital Services Manager interacting directly with hospital partners and donor families in a clinical setting to support the donation process.

"In many ways, it feels like my professional and personal experiences have come full-circle," said Veronica. "I now have the honor of speaking with families, and I understand the many emotions that they are feeling while at the bedside of a loved one. It makes me take a pause because I always want to do what is right to support them."

Veronica's first experience in approaching a family to discuss organ and tissue donation proved to be an extraordinary one. She met with the mother, father, sister and sister-in-law of a man in critical condition at a local hospital. The family immediately gasped in disbelief when Veronica entered the room and introduced herself by her first name. At that time, Veronica was unaware that the sister and her wife had discussed naming their first child 'Veronica.'

"I guess we all felt a sense of divine intervention," said Veronica. "We had an immediate connection, and they took it as a sign of a light in the darkness during a difficult time. I felt inspired by their decision to give the gift of life to others."

In New Jersey, there are nearly 4,000 residents currently waiting for a life-saving transplant, and one person in New Jersey dies every three days waiting for a transplant. Just one organ and tissue donor can save 8 lives and enhance the lives of over 75 people. Transplantable organs include heart, kidneys, liver. pancreas and intestine. lungs, Transplantable tissue includes corneas, heart valves, skin grafts, and bone grafts, ligament and tendons.





Home For Good Dog Rescue

On Saturday, February 20, a very special delivery was made from Aiken, South Carolina by volunteer pilots from "Pilots to the Rescue." Home for Good Dog Rescue (HFGDR), a 100% foster-based non-profit organization located in Berkeley Heights, NJ, accepted an offer from PTTR to transport 15 dogs from high kill shelters in the South. The precious cargo arrived at Caldwell Airport at 5:30 p.m. The dogs were then placed into loving foster families, where they await adoption into their forever homes.

Prior to their departure from the South, the dogs were filmed for a special "Meet-the-Pawsengers." Broadcasted on the live-streaming Internet service Twitch, viewers tuned in live to interact virtually and get to know the pups. They also met the crew: pilot and PTTR founder Michael Schneider, co-pilot Daniel Baumel, and social media influencer Savannah Vinson.

Toni Ann Turco, co-founder of Home for Good Dog Rescue, said of the mission, "This is a partnership a long time in the making. We are extremely grateful to Pilots to the Rescue for coordinating and executing this maiden



Emma Rothman of Cranford, NJ will be graduating this spring from Syracuse University with a degree in Food Studies. Like most college graduates, she has mixed emotions about taking the next step in her life's journey.

"I am definitely a bit terrified, but I am excited about the variety of opportunities that lie ahead," said Emma.

This is a remarkable time for Emma as she is also celebrating the 10th anniversary of her lifesaving heart transplant (April 1). She is humble and always thankful for her donor who gave her the gift of life and made her achievements possible.

"Everything after my heart transplant was working towards moments like this," said Emma. "It motivates me to appreciate the day to day – being able to travel, go away to school, and have life experiences without my health dictating what I can and cannot do is a blessing. I owe all of this to my organ donor's act of extraordinary humanity."

In March 2011, Emma was 12-years-old when she suddenly began to feel extremely fatigued and could not make it through an entire day at school. Her parents brought her to Newark Beth Israel Medical Center (NBIMC) for what was supposed to be a quick, routine blood test. However, Emma went into cardiac arrest, was put on life-support under an induced coma and was rushed to the pediatric cardiac intensive care unit at New York-Presbyterian/Morgan Stanley Children's Hospital.

Emma, who showed no prior symptoms, was somehow battling end-stage heart failure brought on by hypertrophic cardiomyopathy. On April 1, 2011, Emma, underwent a successful emergency heart transplant, which saved her life. Just 15 days later, Emma was discharged, taking with her new knowledge about what a heart transplant is and how she could best care for her new heart at home.

"The last thing I remember was feeling uncomfortable while the nurses were attempting to draw blood at the hospital thinking I might have had mono or a virus," said Emma. "I woke up six days later and learned that I had a heart transplant. Prior to that, I had never heard of organ and tissue donation or transplantation."

In 2013, Emma and her family, guided by their firsthand experience, established Hearts for Emma, a 501 (c)3 organization that provides assistance to families of children with heart disease, and supports educational initiatives related to heart transplantation and promotes awareness of organ and tissue donation. As part of a joint outreach effort, Hearts for Emma established a Partner Fund within the NJ Sharing Network Foundation that has raised more than \$50,000 since its inception. The Hearts for Emma Partner Fund has helped educate more than 100,000 students in New Jersey about organ and tissue donation and transplantation through the production and distribution of education materials and related programs, and



provides scholarships to high school seniors who are advocates of or personally impacted by the mission.
