#### THE PURIM AMAZING RACE

Congregation Beth Israel of Scotch Plains and Temple Emanu-El of Westfield, along with area Jewish camps, conducted The Purim Amazing Race on Sunday, February 21, in advance of the Jewish holiday of Purim. The Purim Amazing Race provided a safe and fun way for families to celebrate the festive holiday during the Covid-19 pandemic.

The Purim Amazing Race was modeled after the popular television show, The Amazing Race. The scavenger hunt was open to congregants of all ages and abilities. To enroll, participants contributed items for the local food pantry, fulfilling the Purim commandment of giving gifts to the needy.

Approximately 75 teams of families raced around the towns of Scotch Plains and Westfield in their cars, with the goal of helping Queen Esther save the Jewish people, the way she did in the Biblical Purim story. Participants stopped at places such as the YMCA, the JCC of Central NJ, and Kramer Park in Scotch Plains, and visited sites such as the Westfield Memorial Library, Mindowaskin Park, and McKinley School in Westfield. At each of the 15 outdoor locations, contestants participated in missions that were both educational and enjoyable, such as designing a crown for Queen Esther, or performing a family talent act for the Biblical King Ahasuerus' pageant.

"We needed to replace the traditional Purim carnival held in a crowded indoor space with an









alternative activity held outside," said Aviva Tilles, Director of Congregational Learning at Congregation Beth Israel. "We collaborated with Temple Emanu-El because our two synagogues faced the same challenges. And we realized that we could develop and implement something really great if we joined forces."

Aviva Tilles partnered with Temple Emanu-El's Samara Schwartz, Director of Youth Learning & Engagement, and Samantha Eichert, Assistant Director of Youth Learning & Engagement.

Area Jewish camps also helped with the Purim Amazing Race by creating and running four of the stops along the course. The camps included: Camp Yachad at the JCC of Central NJ; Camp Nah-Jee-Wah; Camp Ramah in the Berkshires; and Camp Harlam. Additionally, One Happy Camper, a non-profit organization, provided additional funding for the Purim Amazing Race because of the camps' participation.

Feedback from parents and children alike was positive; many congregants remarked afterwards that they preferred the scavenger hunt to the usual Purim carnival.

"What an amazing job ... you and your 'leaders' did - 15 stops, all those activities, but moreover, an opportunity to get outside, interact with 'real people', have a few laughs ... and just get silly," wrote Kathi Wolder, a congregant from Temple Emanu-El. "We sang; we danced; we did crafts; we ran; and we learned a little more about Purim. Everyone was so cheery, and embracing, and welcoming."


This project was undertaken in honor of the

Three Westfield High School students will perform in the New Jersey State Solo and Ensemble Festival in April, an inaugural virtual event launched by Arts Ed NJ for the 2020-2021 school year to recognize student achievement in music education across the state.

#### RAKE AND HOE GARDEN CLUB SUPPORTS JARDINE ACADEMY

Since the first year of its founding in 1952, the Rake & Hoe Garden Club of Westfield, NJ has been committed to supporting students with cerebral palsy at the Jardine Academy in Cranford.

As part of this commitment, each Spring and Fall garden club members select an appropriate children's book and make 100 ornaments inspired by the story. Club members take the ornaments to the Academy, read the story to the students, and decorate a tree with the ornaments. The tree stands in the school foyer for all to enjoy. A copy of the book is donated to the school library.

Unlike other years, Rake & Hoe club members did not visit the academy due to concerns over the spread of the Coronavirus. This year, Rake & Hoe Garden Club member Mary Lou Nolas spent many days making 100 colorful pinwheels. The ornaments were inspired by Gilberto and the Wind by Marie Hall Ets. The book tells how Gilberto plays with the wind. It takes his balloon up into the sky but does not fly his kite. He sees how his bubbles fly away, his pinwheels twirl around, and his paper boat sails across the water.

Ms. Nolas delivered a copy of the book and 100 pinwheel ornaments to Jardine Academy on March 9. The Academy staff will read the story to the students and decorate the tree. After enjoying the tree for a couple of weeks, each student will receive a pinwheel to take home.

The Jardine Academy, operated by the Cerebral Palsy League and approved by the New Jersey Department of Education, provides a comprehensive educational program designed to meet the cognitive and physical needs of children and young adults, 3-21 with multiple disabilities.

The Rake and Hoe Garden Club is affiliated with the Garden Club of New Jersey and the National Garden Club, Inc. The club meets on the second Wednesday of the month at 12:00 p.m. at the Scotch Hills Country Club. Membership is open to residents of Westfield and surrounding towns. There were excited reactions during a student virtual "watch party" at Roosevelt Intermediate School as NASA's Perseverance rover landed on Mars just before 4 p.m. on February 18.

"When the coverage of the landing started, some students and teachers logged in to participate in the virtual "watch party," says science teacher Melissa Czerwinski who organized the virtual event with fellow teachers Andrew Bausch, Dominick Ceccio and Katherine Vaccaro. "We watched the coverage together, discussed the science and engineering behind the landing, and cheered" when Perseverance touched down on the Red Planet.

Czerwinski says the group also cheered when

they saw and heard C.J. Giovingo, a friend of hers who is a systems engineer at NASA's Jet Propulsion Lab. Giovingo, the lead engineer for the Entry, Descent, and Landing Activity for the Perseverance rover mission, joined students in a virtual session on February 23 to talk about the Perseverance mission and to answer questions.

#### **CELEBRATING 10 YEARS WITH HEART TRANSPLANT**

Emma Rothman of Cranford, NJ will be graduating this spring from Syracuse University with a degree in Food Studies. Like most college graduates, she has mixed emotions about taking the next step in her life's journey.

"I am definitely a bit terrified, but I am excited about the variety of opportunities that lie ahead," said Emma.



This is a remarkable time for Emma as she is also celebrating the 10th anniversary of her life-saving heart transplant (April 1). She is humble and always thankful for her donor who gave her the gift of life and made her achievements possible.

"Everything after my heart transplant was working towards moments like this," said Emma. "It motivates me to appreciate the day to day – being able to travel, go away to school, and have life experiences without my health dictating what I can and cannot do is a blessing. I owe all of this to my organ donor's act of extraordinary humanity."

In March 2011, Emma was 12-years-old when she suddenly began to feel extremely fatigued and could not make it through an entire day at school. Her parents brought her to Newark Beth Israel Medical Center (NBIMC) for what was supposed to be a quick, routine blood test. However, Emma went into cardiac arrest, was put on life-support under an induced coma and was rushed to the pediatric cardiac intensive care unit at New York-Presbyterian/Morgan Stanley Children's Hospital.

Emma, who showed no prior symptoms, was somehow battling end-stage heart failure brought on by hypertrophic cardiomyopathy. On April 1, 2011, Emma, underwent a successful emergency heart transplant, which saved her life. Just 15 days later, Emma was discharged, taking with her new knowledge about what a heart transplant is

and how she could best care for her new heart at home.

"The last thing I remember was feeling uncomfortable while the nurses were attempting to draw blood at the hospital thinking I might have had mono or a virus," said Emma. "I woke up six days later and learned that I had a heart transplant. Prior to that, I had never heard of organ and tissue donation or transplantation."

In 2013, Emma and her family, guided by their firsthand experience, established Hearts for Emma, a 501 (c)3 organization that provides assistance to families of children with heart disease, and supports educational initiatives related to heart transplantation and promotes awareness of organ and tissue donation. As part of a joint outreach effort, Hearts for Emma established a Partner Fund within the NJ Sharing Network Foundation that has raised more than \$50,000 since its inception. The Hearts for Emma Partner Fund has helped educate more than 100,000 students in New Jersey about organ and tissue donation and transplantation through the production and distribution of education materials and related programs, and provides scholarships to high school seniors who are advocates of or personally impacted by the mission.



He joined the Rotary, as now his career path has brought him closer to home and he can now devote more time and energy to helping in the local community.



#### RESIDENTS ASKED TO LOCK THEIR CARS

On March 16, 2021, the Westfield Police Department announced the arrest of three (3) persons on criminal charges stemming from the investigation of a motor vehicle theft, which occurred on Monday, March 8, 2021. They released the following report and asked residents to do their part in protecting their property.

Reynold Henderson, age 18, of Irvington, Tyson Armour, age 19, of Newark, and Isaad Jackson, age 21, also of Newark, were all arrested at approximately 4:06 PM on Tuesday, March 9, 2021, on the 600 block of Grove Street in Irvington by detectives from the New Jersey State Police Motor Vehicle Crimes North Unit.

Henderson, Armour and Jackson were observed exiting the stolen 2018 BMW X5, which was taken from the driveway of a residence located on the north side of Westfield at approximately 11:15 p.m. the previous night while it was reportedly left unlocked with its key fob in it. They fled from Detectives, but were arrested following a foot chase.

Recovered in the stolen BMW X5 was a 9 mm handgun, and recovered during the foot chase was a discarded .40 caliber handgun.

Reynolds, Jackson and Armour were all subsequently charged with receiving stolen property. Additionally, all three (3) arrested persons have been charged with murder, conspiracy to commit murder, and weapons-related offenses, this for the shooting death of a 22-year old male that took place approximately ten (10) minutes earlier on the 20 block of St.

Paul Avenue in Newark's West Ward.

Reynolds, Jackson and Armour were turned over to the custody of the Essex County Prosecutor's Office, which is handling the homicide investigation. They are all currently being held in the Essex County Jail pending detention hearings.

Westfield Police Chief Christopher Battiloro stated that a Detective from the Westfield Police Department is currently detailed to the New Jersey State Police Motor Vehicle Crimes North Unit and participated in the investigation and arrests

"We are doing everything we can to try to eradicate Westfield's on-going motor vehicle theft problem," stated Chief Battiloro, "and this includes assigning personnel to the New Jersey State Police Motor Vehicle Crimes North Unit to investigate Westfield's motor vehicle thefts."

However, Chief Battiloro stated "Motor vehicle thefts will undoubtedly continue until Westfield residents start taking proper action to protect their property." This includes "locking their vehicles, taking their keys, hiding their things, and doing their part."

Westfield has received reports of six (6) motor vehicle thefts thus far this year, including three (3) in the last two (2) weeks. In all such instances, it is believed the stolen motor vehicles were left unlocked with their key fobs or keys left in them at the time of their thefts. There were a total of twenty-six motor (26) motor vehicle thefts reported in Westfield in 2020.

### JACQUI LENNER AND NICOLE SANDSTEDT OF WESTFIELD SWORN IN AS FOSTER YOUTH ADVOCATES

Nine community members ranging from age 22 to 63 make up the newest class of volunteer child-advocates for CASA of Union County, the only nonprofit advocating for the best interests of Union County youth removed from home due to abuse or neglect, and placed in foster care. Jacqui Lenner and Nicole Sandstedt of Westfield are among them.

Said Lenner, "I chose to invest my time in CASA because it's so important to help a child going through the system alone and find the light at the end of the tunnel with someone by their side. The lack of consistency and support they experience during the process can be so isolating. I want a child to know they're not alone in this scary process."

Superior Court Judge Marc R. Brown presided over the recent swearing-in ceremony via Zoom; advocates will now be matched to a foster youth or sibling set and begin putting their 30 hours of training into practice. This class includes both non-parents and parents, and such backgrounds as teaching, freelance, law and homemaking. In addition to Lenner and Sandstedt, they are Laurie Litterio of Cranford, Rebecca Muston and Amy Saunders of Summit, Sue Pangis of Berkeley Heights, Tamara Parraga-Sez of Newark, Lydia Pernia of Linden, and Jackie Rodriguez of Clark.

Prior to administering the oath, the judge shared, "I find the value of CASA volunteers immeasurable. ... CASA is so significant; I always make a point of hearing from the CASA volunteer during the hearing." Acknowledging that COVID-19 requires the swearing-in and court hearings remain virtual for now, he added, "I so look forward to being able to shake your hand and congratulate you. The assistance you will provide is, again, immeasurable. Thank you for doing this."

Currently, the organization serves just over 80 percent of all Union County foster youth in care. With a goal to provide an advocate for every youth that needs one, the organization has remained steadfast – despite the pandemic – in efforts to ensure its work continues. To that end, a fully online training and recruiting infrastructure was put into place, and protocols implemented to ensure advocates remained both connected to their youth and able to report to judges, and staff continued recruiting and training volunteers to help meet the need for youth still awaiting an advocate.

Executive Director Mariel S. Hufnagel noted, "In the face of the challenging life circumstances we are all facing due to the COVID-19 global health pandemic, this tremendous group of women still made a decision to give of their time and energy, and train virtually to become advocates. I am so proud to welcome them to the CASA family and can't wait to see all of the ways in which they positively impact the youth to whom they will be assigned."

Upon being court-ordered to a case, the CASA volunteer has access to the youth as well as foster parents, doctors, caseworkers, therapists and teachers in order to identify concerns and unmet needs, and protect best interests. 
