only four months ago, was promoted to lieutenant on April 2, 2021, in a ceremony outside Fanwood Borough Hall.

Kranz was sworn in by Mayor Colleen Mahr in the presence of a number of his fellow officers, his family and members of the Borough Council Public Safety committee. His wife Holly held the bible and pinned his badge to his uniform.

Kranz is a 7-year veteran of the Fanwood Police Department. He joined after serving two years as a U.S. Capitol Police Officer. He began

Dan Kranz, who was promoted to sergeant his public service career as one of Fanwood's first civilian police dispatchers and served as a volunteer EMT on the Rescue Squad. He grew up in Fanwood, went through the SPF public school system and is a graduate of Rutgers University.

With his promotion today, Kranz becomes the highest ranking Fanwood police officer in a department being overseen by the Union County Prosecutor's office in the wake of the retirements last year of the chief and two lieutenants. The Borough is currently considering candidates for a civilian police director.

Marc Gottlick, who served the Borough of Fanwood as an EMT, firefighter and police officer, retired on March 31, 2021 after 25 years with the police department.

Raised in Fanwood and now a resident of Greenbrook, Gottlick was promoted to the rank of Lieutenant and helped run the Fanwood Police Department during a period of transition following the retirement of the Chief and two Lieutenants in 2020. The police department was being run day to day by a Captain from the Union County Prosecutor's office and Lt. Gottlick since September. The Borough is now seeking a civilian Police Director to run the department.

Robert Kruthers, who helped thousands of people as a member of the Fanwood Rescue Squad since 1957, died early Saturday, April 24, 2021, at Overlook Hospital. He was 94.

A Fanwood resident since 1954, Bob provided volunteer service to our town in ways that have touched three generations of Fanwood and Scotch Plains residents.

Bob held many positions with the Rescue Squad. He served in several elected posts. He served as the squad's treasurer since 1965, retiring from that position in 2017. He remained a trusted advisor and an inspiration to the rest of our volunteers until his passing.

As an EMT, first responder and ambulance driver, Bob helped literally thousands of sick or injured people with well over 5,000 call responses. He did so with humility and a sense of service to others.

Bob's other passion for many years was the church. As a member of St. Bartholomew the Apostle parish in Scotch Plains, Bob lent assistance in keeping their books, taught CCD classes, provided altar service and, as a Eucharistic minister, offered communion for homebound people. Bob was also active in the Knights of Columbus and as such was a fixture at the annual Shield Awards at which the Knights recognized first responders in Fanwood and Scotch Plains (attached photo from the 2017 awards). Bob also spent four years as a member of the Fanwood Library Board of Trustees.

Bob was married to his wife, Grace, for 72 years. They met at age 7 when they lived next door to each other in Jersey City.

In 2017, Fanwood Mayor Colleen Mahr and the Borough Council honored Bob for his 60 years of service. He was recognized several times by the Mayor and Council for his volunteer service. Bob was awarded the Lifetime Achievement award at the New Jersey Statewide EMS Conference in 2014.

In addition to his beloved wife Grace, Bob is survived by two daughters and three grandsons. Our thoughts are with them. Funeral arrangements are pending.

They are Christopher Eckerson, most recently of the Kean University Police Department, and Christopher Piniero, formerly with the Gibbsboro Police Department in Camden County. Both officers had family members and other supporters on hand.

The swearings-in, along with several others earlier this year, fill positions left empty by a

spate of retirements. Since last year's retirement of Chief Richard Trigo and two Lieutenants, the Union County Prosecutor's office has been in charge of the Fanwood Police Department. Captain Joe Vendas from that office recently assumed command after the retirement last month of Captain Kevin Grimmer, also of the prosecutor's office.

The Borough Council has decided to hire a civilian police director and is currently accepting applications for the position.

ADVOCATES TAKE OATH TO SERVE LOCAL FOSTER YOUTH

CASA of Union County

Nine Union County residents ranging from age 22 to 63 make up the newest class of volunteer child advocates for CASA of Union County, the only nonprofit advocating for the best interests of Union County youth removed from home due to abuse or neglect, and placed in foster care.

Superior Court Judge Marc R. Brown presided over the recent swearing-in ceremony via Zoom; advocates will now be matched to a foster youth

or siblings and begin putting their 30 hours of training into practice. The class includes both non-parents and parents, and such backgrounds as teaching, freelance, law and homemaking. They are Jacqui Lenner and Nicole Sandstedt of Westfield, Laurie Litterio of Cranford, Rebecca Muston and Amy Saunders of Summit, Sue Pangis of Berkeley Heights, Tamara Parraga-Sez of Newark, Lydia Pernia of Linden, and Jackie Rodriguez of Clark.

Prior to administering the oath, the judge shared, "I find the value of CASA volunteers immeasurable. Although I practiced family law for decades, it involved pieces related to a family, like divorce. In these cases, everything we do is attuned to the entire family and it's the most rewarding in my career. I didn't previously realize the extent of need out there - from poverty, substance use, mental health, and the guidance needed, all of it. CASA is so significant; I always make a point of hearing from the CASA volunteer during the hearing." Acknowledging that COVID-19 requires the swearing-in and court hearings remain virtual for now, he added, "I so look forward to being able to shake your hand and congratulate you. The assistance you will provide is, again, immeasurable. Thank you for doing this."

Currently, the organization serves just over 80 percent of all Union County foster youth in care. With a goal to provide an advocate for every youth that needs one, the organization has remained steadfast - despite the pandemic - in efforts to ensure its work continues. To that end, a fully online training and recruiting infrastructure was put into place, and protocols implemented to ensure advocates remained both connected to their youth and able to report to judges, and staff continued recruiting and training volunteers to help meet the need for youth still awaiting an advocate.

Executive Director Mariel S. Hufnagel noted, "In the face of the challenging life circumstances we are all facing due to the COVID-19 global health pandemic, this tremendous group of women still made a decision to give of their time and energy, and train virtually to become advocates. I am so proud to welcome them to the CASA family and can't wait to see all of the ways in which they positively impact the youth to whom they will be assigned."

Upon being court-ordered to a case, CASA volunteers have access to the youth as well as foster parents, doctors, caseworkers, therapists and teachers in order to identify concerns and unmet needs, and protect best interests.
