NETWORK HELPS VETS AND FAMILIES LIVE BETTER LIVES

Memorial Day weekend is one of the most challenging for the New Jersey Veterans Network and its team of volunteers and mentors. This is a difficult time for many veterans because they reflect on their brothers and sisters that didn't make it home. Every day our nation loses 22 veterans to suicide, and it seems that number isn't coming down. If you are a veteran, or a family member, who is feeling alone, or are in need of assistance, we are here for you. Please reach out to us.

Our team focuses on helping our veterans and first responders have a better way of life through our volunteer mobile outreach mentoring program. We believe by aggressively seeking out veterans in need and contacting them before they are in crisis, we can really have some positive results. Contacting a person in need first is a great way to build trust and make it easier to begin a friendship. People will do better when they have human contact in their lives, too many programs are automated and lack the empathy and compassion needed to help someone in crisis.

We are not afraid to tell our veterans and first responders that they are loved and we strive to give them purpose. The team immediately empowers and gives its members a new family unit to be part of again. Nearly everyone that joins the team wants to help others and make a difference in someone else's life. Helping others definitely is a medicine that will make you become a better person, and you'll feel really good about it.

New Jersey Veterans Network is constantly keeping active thru our Operation Rebound Racing Team which hosts numerous hikes, runs, bike rides and all other types of physically challenging events. However, we also focus on non athletic events like hosting a BBQ, comedy show, tailgate, camping trip, and several other fun outings throughout the year. But it doesn't stop there, the team works well with other charities and hosts numerous food drives and clothing events which normally take place at our veteran hospitals and shelters. If you would like to help, there is something for you to contribute.

Most recently, in April, our outreach director Frank "Doc" Schupp spearheaded our "Helping Heroes" program, and "Hero Day". These two programs were responsible for providing over 3,000 veterans and National Guardsmen throughout the state with food, PPE, and personal items.

In the last few years New Jersey Veterans Network has grown and has been able to save lives, provide cars, employment, housing, clothing, food, toiletries, and so much more to heroes.

In the next few weeks, we will be launching a statewide anti-suicide and PTSD awareness campaign. We have joined forces with the NJ VFW, NJ American Legion, NJSPBA, NJ FMBA, NJ FOP, NJ Veterans Affairs, State Legislators, and numerous other groups and organizations.

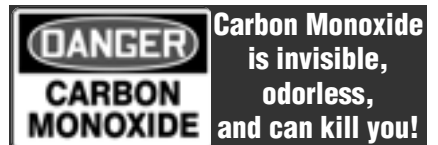

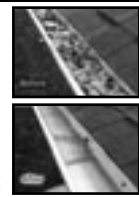

SIX HIGH SCHOOL SOPHOMORES JOIN RANKS OF EMERGENCY SQUAD

The Chatham Emergency Squad (CES) is proud to welcome its 19th Cadet Class. Joining CES after graduation in the spring are rising Chatham High School Juniors Molly Alperowitz, Jorah Burns, Shannon Carey, Bennett Marshall, Sarah Meyler and Ian Reardon. The new cadet class joins rising Senior cadets Kylie Finkelstein, Sophia Gagliardi, Mihir Rao, Risha Surana, Jack Tapper, Roma Welsh and the graduating class of 2021, Hayley Baumgartner, Sam Cooperman, Tanay Malla, Claire Silverstein, Amalie Srinivas, and Mary Kate Vowells.

The CES Cadet program welcomed its first Cadet class in 2003 as part of CES’s commitment to encouraging involvement in all aspects of the community. It is a highly competitive two-year program open to all high school sophomores who are Chatham residents and will be 16 years old by June 1. The successful candidates represent a variety of interests, experience and future plans. What they have in common is their willingness to make a commitment to an intensive, multi-year program combining hands-on experience and ongoing training. After graduation, each cadet

begins riding with their assigned crew, which they continue to do until the summer after their senior year of high school. Although they are students, they are considered full members of their crew, and once they pass the National Registry EMT exam, have all the rights and responsibilities of other EMTs on the Squad. This year, all six new cadets will attend the EMT training program as a group at the Union County Community College in Plainfield, NJ.

Many past cadets go on to pursue higher education in the field of medicine. Founding member Courtney DuBois Shihabuddin, now a Nurse Practitioner in Ohio said, “The Chatham Emergency Squad was like a family to me. It was such a joy bringing this program to life and getting to participate as a cadet EMT. My experience with CES helped to develop my passion for healthcare.”

Two current Squad members, Sarah Nelson (2009) and Jay Crigler (2013) are employed full time as Registered Nurses at area hospitals and continue to volunteer once a week on their regular crew. Sarah said about her cadet experience, “Having the opportunity to have

hands-on medical experience while I was still in high school crystallized my desire to become a nurse. Volunteering with CES is personally rewarding and makes me a better nurse.”

Numerous cadets continue to serve on the Squad through the summer after graduation to achieve regular member status and return to active service on vacations. Presently, this includes 9 members of the Cadet classes of 2017, 2018 and 2019. The application process for the 2022 Cadet class opens in early January; all area high schools are notified of the opportunity long before the application deadline.

The Chatham Emergency Squad never charges for its services; most of its annual expenses are paid for by donations from the community. In addition to providing Basic Life Support (BLS) service 24/7, 365/days/year, CES provides stand-by support for community events, such as the Chatham Turkey Trot, the Fishawack Festival, and school sports events. CES also hosts blood drives and provides free CPR training to residents, teachers, coaches, school crossing guards and emergency personnel, including fire and police. On June 10th Jim Burnet will discuss Hillside Cemetery on Main Street in Madison. In addition to his critical role in Madison as the Borough's Chief Financial Officer, Jim is very active in efforts supporting Hillside Cemetery – not only celebrating its history, but protecting and preserving this downtown treasure.

On June 17th Sandra Benedict, Development Director for the Interfaith Food Pantry in Morris County (IFP), will discuss food insecurity and the efforts of the IFP and other governmental and non-governmental entities to address this widespread dilemma. CASA recruits, trains and supervises community volunteers to be advocates, mentors and champions for each child. Lisa will provide an overview of CASA's mission, its programs and how CASA volunteers have had a positive impact on the lives of at-need children in our communities.

FIREFIGHTER MATHEW PRIBISH HELPS NJ SHARING NETWORK

NJ Sharing Network

Celebrated in April each year, National Donate Life Month features local, regional and national activities that encourage Americans to register as organ and tissue donors and to celebrate those who have saved lives through the gift of donation.

Linden, NJ firefighter Mathew Pribish helped NJ Sharing Network kick off National Donate Life Month by sharing his personal heart transplant story to help raise awareness about the importance of organ and tissue donation. Inspired by Mathew's story, Linden Mayor Derek Armstead and the Linden Police and Fire Departments teamed up to educate the community through speaking engagements and a public service announcement on LindenTV, which can be viewed on youtube.com. Mathew's personal story is detailed below.

A PERSONAL STORY FROM MATHEW PRIBISH

My gift of life story started more than a decade ago when I went to the doctor for a regular cardiology checkup because heart disease runs in my family and I wanted to make sure that, as a firefighter, my heart was healthy. I was told during one of these regular checkups that I have Marfan Syndrome, a connective tissue disorder that affects the heart, joints and other parts of the body.

In 2013, after being monitored for a few years, my aortic root was enlarged to the point that I needed replacement surgery. Although my surgery went well, I had an adverse reaction and went into advanced heart failure. The doctors

made the decision to implant a Centrimag BiVad, an external device to pump both sides of my heart. After a couple of weeks, my heart healed enough to remove the device and implant an LVAD-Left Ventricular Assist Device. That was my lifeline for four years and I was placed on the New York heart transplant list.

Life with an LVAD isn't easy and it was hard to adjust to at first - no swimming, limited showers, limited activities and lots of medication. Thankfully, with my family, my fire department family and my doctors, I was able to forge through into this new normal. I was able to return to work for the fire department as an Administrator and Fire Inspector. I started to walk/jog in local 5K events in a healthy condition so that I would be a perfect candidate for transplant.

In 2017, my cardiologist recommended that I also be put onto the New Jersey transplant list. In the time leading up to my approval on the New Jersey transplant list, the alarm of my LVAD

device started to sound, on and off. The team of doctors decided that it was a mechanical issue and that they would either need to either replace the LVAD or hold me in the hospital for transplant.

On June 22, 2017, I was informed by Newark Beth Israel Medical Center that I was officially listed on the New Jersey list. It was just four days later that my wife got the phone call early in the morning. They said, "Mrs. Pribish, we found a heart for your husband."

There were so many emotions that day. I felt happy and thankful that I now had hope that my health could be restored. I also felt a great deal of sadness for the family that lost their loved one. On June 27, 2017, I had a successful LVAD removal/Heart Transplant.

Since my transplant, I have been blessed to return to the life I had known before. In my donor's memory, I decided to become a transplant advocate through NJ Sharing Network.

In Fall 2018, I was released by the doctors to return to full firefighting duties. On January 3, 2019, I officially returned to the fire department for my first day back at the position I left almost six years before.

I never thought that the day would come where I could return back to active duty. But thanks to my donor, my doctors, and NJ Sharing Network, this dream became a reality. I hope that my story can give hope to others that may need a transplant to inspire them to keep the faith.

DONATE BLOOD LOCALLY DURING EMERGENCY BLOOD SHORTAGE

Every day, patients rely on blood transfusions and the transfusion of red blood cells, platelets and plasma to stay alive. But blood and blood products cannot be manufactured; they can only come from volunteer donors.

Blood products also typically have a short shelf life – ranging from five to 42 days, so constant replenishment is needed.

There remains an emergency blood shortage due to the coronavirus pandemic, which has limited the amount of walk-in community blood drives at such convenient locations as schools, libraries and houses of worship.

New Jersey Blood Services (2279 South Ave., Scotch Plains), a division of New York Blood Center, is part of one of the largest independent, community-based, non-profit blood centers in the United States that provides lifesaving blood products and services to nearly 200 hospitals in the tri-state area.

In order to be an eligible donor, you must be at least 16 years old (with parental permission or consent for those under 18 years of age), who weigh a minimum of 110 pounds, are in good health and meet all FDA and state Department of Health donor criteria. People over 75 years old may donate with a doctor's note.

IT'S MOSQUITO SEASON: REDUCE BUGS BY REMOVING STANDING WATER

County of Morris

Morris County's mosquito control teams are on the job inspecting and treating 10,000 wet areas around the county to eliminate breeding grounds for mosquitos and keep tabs on mosquito numbers and disease

While those efforts can pay major dividends in minimizing infestation, individual property owners have the ability to make a major difference, too, particularly after recent wet weather.

"If everyone would take steps around their own homes to eliminate standing water, it could reduce the number of mosquitoes by many hundreds of thousands, if not millions, where you live," said Morris County Mosquito Division Superintendent Kristian McMorland.

STEPS YOU CAN TAKE TO REDUCE MOSQUITO POPULATIONS INCLUDE:

- At least once a week, empty water from flowerpots, pet food and water dishes, birdbaths, swimming pool covers, buckets, barrels, and cans
- Check for clogged rain gutters and clean them out

- Poke holes in trash cans and recycling containers
- Recycle discarded tires, and remove other items that could collect water
- Check for containers in places that may be hard to see, such as under bushes or under your home;
- Aerate ornamental pools or stock them with fish like fathead minnows
- Do not allow water gardens to stagnate
- Clean and chlorinate swimming pools, including those not in use (mosquitoes may even breed in water that collects on pool covers);
- Dispose of cans, plastic containers, ceramic pots or similar water-holding containers that have accumulated on your property

In addition to the nuisance, mosquitoes also bring the possibility of diseases such as West Nile Virus, Eastern equine and St. Louis encephalitis, which are transmitted through mosquito bites.

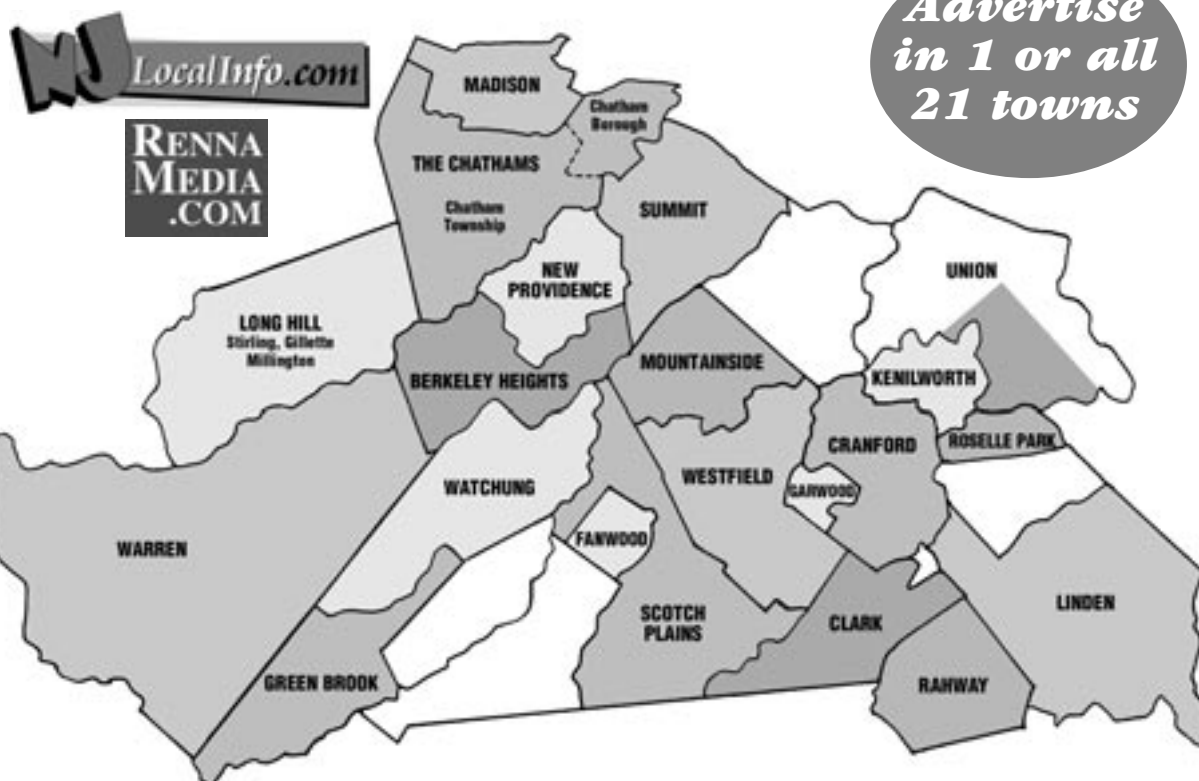
