RELAY FOR LIFE "LIGHT THE FIGHT" EVENT

The American Cancer Society (ACS) Relay For Life of Berkeley Heights hosted the "Light The Fight" Event at The Grove at Connell Park on Tuesday, June 1, 2021. Teams of students and members of the community joined forces for the annual fundraiser to help save lives from cancer. At this writing the event raised 50,382.09.

Due to the pandemic, Relay For Life events were adjusted this year but the passion and commitment to fight cancer remains unchanged. The "Light the Fight" event featured Luminaria bags designed by volunteers that illuminated the pathways of The Grove. The day also included an opening ceremony, singing of the national anthem from Rebecca Candelero, raising of the Flag by Boy Scout Troop 368, and two food trucks to choose from.

The annual Relay for Life event serves as a way to bring the local communities together; with participants from Berkeley Heights, New Providence, Summit, Mountainside, Springfield, and Watchung Hills.

Founded by Dr. Gordy Klatt in Tacoma, Washington, in 1985, Relay For Life continues to be more than just an event – it's a movement, a community of like-minded survivors, caregivers, volunteers and participants who believe that the future can be free from cancer.

For more than 35 years, participants and volunteers across the world have come together to honor and remember loved ones and take action for lifesaving change. Funds raised help the American Cancer Society

conduct breakthrough research, provide 24/7 support for cancer patients and access to lifesaving screenings.



SAGE Eldercare's Meals on Wheels volunteer, Lorelei Burns describes herself as "lousy at relaxing." A resident of Summit for 33 years, Burns has volunteered since 2015. What inspires this high energy woman to deliver meals two days each week year after year? Simple, she said, it's the meaningful relationships she has with her clients and the SAGE staff.

A former ATT executive, who appreciates competence and structure, Burns says she feels at home with the Meals on Wheels team. "I like organizations that are successful, well managed, and get things done."

She also praised SAGE for their timely response to the pandemic. "They didn't close their doors. They didn't stop doing business. The rules and procedures they put in place to keep the operation running were most impressive."

The most challenging part of being a volunteer, she said, are the losses. Whether it is saying farewell to an elderly client who has died or delivering food to a client who has lost their

spouse, it's difficult. A widow herself, Burns can empathize with these people and share their feelings of loss. Yet, even with the sadness, she said, the visits are positive and so necessary as many of the meal recipients have no other daily visitors other than their volunteer. While the food is vital "It is the visit that counts," she explains.

The passion Burns has for her giving and helping extends beyond Meals on Wheels. She is active at the Newark Museum, North Star Academy and has a shop at Covenant House, which provides clothes to homeless children.

Referring to SAGE, she said with modesty, "I am nothing more than a volunteer; I have no desire to be retired." For her, SAGE represents "friends, food and home." The relationship she has with the nonprofit is mutually beneficial, she said. "This is my home."

AMERICAN LEGION 20TH ANNUAL FLAG RETIREMENT CEREMONY

American Legion Post 433 held their 20th annual flag Retirement Ceremony on Flag Day, June 14, 2021. On hand were many residents and the New Providence Police Honor Guard, Fire Dept., Mayor Al Morgan, and Lions Club members.

The Ceremony for Disposal of Unserviceable Flags is outlined in Resolution No. 440, passed by the 19th National Convention of The American Legion in New York, Sept. 20-23, 1937. The ceremony has been an integral part of American Legion ritual since that date. The resolution reads in part:

WHEREAS, Americanism has been and should continue to be one of the major programs of The American Legion; and

WHEREAS, The observance of proper respect for the Flag of our country and the education of our citizenry in the proper courtesies to be paid the Flag is an essential element of such Americanism program; and

WHEREAS, It is fitting and proper that Flags which have been used for the decoration of graves on Memorial Day be collected after such service, inspected, and worn and unserviceable Flags be condemned and properly destroyed; and

WHEREAS, The approved method of disposing of unserviceable Flags has long been that they be destroyed by burning.







LEAGUE OF WOMEN VOTERS ANNOUNCES CITIZENSHIP AWARD WINNERS

The League of Women Voters of Berkeley Heights, New Providence and Summit is pleased to announce the winners of its annual Citizenship Award to High School Juniors. A junior from each high school is selected based on an essay addressing the topic: "How do you Promote Good Citizenship in your School and Outside Activities?"

The award recipient from Governor Livingston High School in Berkeley Heights is Alyssa Pradhan, whose experiences facing racial prejudice prompted her to action at the local and state level.

Here is an excerpt from her essay:

"As an Asian American female, navigating a dominantly white high school made me reflect on who I really was. In Spring 2020, some friends and I founded the Understanding Asian Cultures (UAC) Club and I became Co-President. We have

weekly meetings that focus on celebrating Asian cultures by presenting holidays and traditions and addressing societal issues that the AAPI community faces, especially in light of racially motivated hate crimes. As Co-President of UAC, I feel most proud during our meetings, as students of all backgrounds voluntarily attend during their lunch break to learn more about Asian cultures. This summer, the UAC Executive Officers will lead a virtual Summer Reading Circle for elementary school students across the Berkeley Heights School District on books representing Asian culture. I hope our presence will influence young leaders of the next generation to further our efforts for unity and inclusivity."

From New Providence High School, Grace Coimparetto won the award. She aspires to a career in medicine.

Here is an excerpt from her essay:

"No one is born a good citizen. Rather, they

are raised and molded into strong-willed and trusted members of society. Wealth, gender, ethnicity or age play no factor in determining the character of a person. For me, being configured into a respected citizen of your community means to be dedicated to bettering the lives of others. In my life I see this idea playing out in my dream job as a healthcare professional. Through clubs such as 'Future Medical Professionals', participating in Rutgers Medical classes in my high school and an internship in medicine and healthcare at American University this summer I hope to use my motivation and knowledge to bring more people to this field. Citizenship is a fundamental principle in building a working community with a strong moral code."

Summit High School's winner is Victoria MacArthur, who is active in student council and believes being a positive role model is key to good citizenship.


Here is an excerpt from her essay:

"Good citizenship means to actively create a supportive, safe environment instead of only being a bystander. I believe good citizenship is about integrating yourself into your community as a positive role model.

"I participate in the Student Council at Summit High School which allows me to fund raise, both for the school and for various charities, and use my leadership skills to navigate through peer discussions about how to implement change for the better of our school community. I also participate in the Unified Physical Education program where I work with students with special needs.

"Outside my school community, I show good citizenship by assisting my neighbors. For example, an elderly man lives next to me and I often walk his dog or shovel snow in his driveway since these are difficult tasks for him to complete alone.

"No matter how big or small a community is, showing good citizenship can go a long way. Whether it's being a member of leadership at the high school or taking time to talk to a neighbor, small acts create a ripple effect."

PILOTS TO THE RESCUE

A very special delivery was made from Aiken, South Carolina by volunteer pilots from "Pilots to the Rescue." Home for Good Dog Rescue (HFGDR), a 100% foster-based non-profit organization located in Berkeley Heights, NJ, accepted an offer from PTTR to transport 15 dogs from high kill shelters in the South. The precious cargo arrived at Caldwell Airport at 5:30 p.m. The dogs were then placed into loving foster families, where they await adoption into their forever homes.

Prior to their departure from the South, the dogs were filmed for a special "Meet-the-Pawsengers." Broadcasted on the live-streaming Internet service Twitch, viewers tuned in live to interact virtually and get to know the pups. They also met the crew: pilot and PTTR founder Michael Schneider, co-pilot Daniel Baumel, and social media influencer Savannah Vinson.

Toni Ann Turco, co-founder of Home for Good Dog Rescue, said of the mission, "This is a partnership a long time in the making. We are extremely grateful to Pilots to the Rescue for coordinating and executing this maiden voyage."

Pilots to the Rescue is a non-profit 501c3 aviation organization, whose mission is to transport animals at high risk of euthanasia. They rely on their trusted network of volunteer pilots. who fund their own rescue flights.



Faith Lutheran Church, 524 South Street in New Providence, gives a substantial "Thank You" to the persons who donated 402 secondhand bikes, which will be used by needy persons in rural communities of African countries.

The parking lot of Faith, on Saturday, May 8, was the setting for the 402 bike collection, which had occurred over a few months. Generous persons from the following towns contributed bikes: New Providence, Berkeley Heights, Chatham, Summit, Basking Ridge, Long Hill Township, Cranford, Westfield, Maplewood, Scotch Plains, Mountainside, Watchung, Rahway and Wayne. These towns suggest that some persons had to travel a distance to contribute their bikes. The large source of towns was mainly due to articles in the town newspapers published by Renna Media.

On that wet May 8 day and the subsequent Tuesday, May 11, members of Faith and two members of Osceola Presbyterian Church in Clark repaired and processed the bikes in Faith's parking lot. The bikes were then placed on trucks of Pedals for Progress, an organization which annually recycles bikes for persons in developing countries of Asia, Africa and Latin America. Faith's bikes will shortly be on their way to Africa.

The bikes will provide reliable transportation for men and women to commute to work, transport produce to market, access health care and other services.

Since 2002, Faith has been collecting bikes for Pedals for Progress. The total of 402 significantly exceeds the number in any prior year. The persons giving their bicycles also donated \$1,248 toward the international shipping costs of the bikes. Faith will contribute \$2,800 toward the shipping expense.

Faith will continue its collection of secondhand bikes. Persons may drop off their bikes at the parking lot on any day. Those who have bikes but are unable to deliver them to Faith, may call the church office at 908-464-5177 or email the office at family.faith@verizon.net. Faith graciously asks that bikes with rusted frames, handlebars or rims not be left, as they cannot be repaired or used. The bikes are to be ridden, not scrapped.

Since 2016, the chairperson of this ministry of Faith has been Casey Walsh, who is a long time member of the church. Mr. Walsh lives in Bridgewater. His daughter, Anna, and son, Casey, helped repair and process the bikes.

Faith feels much gratitude toward the many persons who have kindly donated their bikes.


