KELLOGG FOUNDATION FUND SUPPORTS HOUSING PROGRAMS

The Gateway Family YMCA was awarded a \$50,000 grant from the J.C. Kellogg Foundation Fund to assist the YMCA in serving homeless and housing insecure residents through Emergency, Transitional and Supportive Housing Programs during this global pandemic.

"We are thankful for the generous support of the J.C. Kellogg Foundation Fund. This grant assists us in helping some of the families and communities feeling the greatest strain under the COVID-19 health emergency," stated Krystal R. Canady, CEO. "In 2020, our Y served 755 unduplicated men, women, seniors and children through YMCA housing programs."

The Gateway Family YMCA has served the local community for over 120 years, providing housing and social services for over 300 individuals, families and veterans each evening. Through residential housing programs in Elizabeth and Plainfield, as well as a supportive housing program throughout Union County, the Y provides emergency, transitional and affordable permanent housing opportunities along with wraparound social services focusing on employment preparation, life skills and case management. On average, 95% of residents make significant progress on their Individualized Service Plans, and 70% transition to permanent housing within 12-48 months.





"The reality of the COVID-19 pandemic meant our residents lost jobs, became food insecure and struggled to access mainstream resources in a world that turned remote overnight. We have seen an increased need for essential housing and social services during this global health crisis," said Melynda A. Mileski, EVP/COO, The Gateway Family YMCA. "We provide support 24 hours a day, 7 days a week for the most vulnerable individuals, families and veterans in our community. Extra precautions and facility improvements have been taken in our housing buildings for the protection of our residents and staff."

The Gateway Family YMCA's housing programs are open to all residents of Union County regardless of age, race, ethnicity, gender, sexual orientation, physical ability, primary language, or veteran status. As one of more than 25 agencies collaborating in Union County's Continuum of Care unit, The Gateway Family YMCA works with other partner agencies to end homelessness and prevent a return to homelessness in Union County, NJ



ADVOCATES TAKE OATH TO SERVE LOCAL FOSTER YOUTH

Nine Union County residents ranging from age 22 to 63 make up the newest class of volunteer child advocates for CASA of Union County, the only nonprofit advocating for the best interests of Union County youth removed from home due to abuse or neglect, and placed in foster care.

Superior Court Judge Marc R. Brown presided over the recent swearing-in ceremony via Zoom; advocates will now be matched to a foster youth or siblings and begin putting their 30 hours of training into practice. The class includes both non-parents and parents, and such backgrounds as teaching, freelance, law and homemaking. They are Jacqui Lenner and Nicole Sandstedt of Westfield, Laurie Litterio of Cranford, Rebecca Muston and Amy Saunders of Summit, Sue Pangis of Berkeley Heights, Tamara Parraga-Sez of Newark, Lydia Pernia of Linden, and Jackie Rodriguez of Clark.

Prior to administering the oath, the judge shared, "I find the value of CASA volunteers immeasurable. Although I practiced family law for decades, it involved pieces related to a family, like divorce. In these cases, everything we do is attuned to the entire family and it's the most rewarding in my career. I didn't previously realize the extent of need out there - from poverty, substance use, mental health, and the guidance needed, all of it. CASA is so significant; I always make a point of hearing from the CASA

volunteer during the hearing." Acknowledging that COVID-19 requires the swearing-in and court hearings remain virtual for now, he added, "I so look forward to being able to shake your hand and congratulate you. The assistance you will provide is, again, immeasurable. Thank you for doing this."

Currently, the organization serves just over 80 percent of all Union County foster youth in care. With a goal to provide an advocate for every youth that needs one, the organization has remained steadfast – despite the pandemic – in efforts to ensure its work continues. To that end, a fully online training and recruiting infrastructure was put into place, and protocols implemented to ensure advocates remained both connected to their youth and able to report to judges, and staff continued recruiting and training volunteers to help meet the need for youth still

awaiting an advocate.

Executive Director Mariel S. Hufnagel noted, "In the face of the challenging life circumstances we are all facing due to the COVID-19 global health pandemic, this tremendous group of women still made a decision to give of their time and energy, and train virtually to become advocates. I am so proud to welcome them to the CASA family and can't wait to see all of the ways in which they positively impact the youth to whom they will be assigned."

Upon being court-ordered to a case, CASA volunteers have access to the youth as well as foster parents, doctors, caseworkers, therapists and teachers in order to identify concerns and unmet needs, and protect best interests. 

FAITH LUTHERAN THANKS COMMUNITY FOR BIKE DONATIONS

Faith Lutheran Church, 524 South Street in New Providence, gives a substantial "Thank You" to the persons who donated 402 secondhand bikes, which will be used by needy persons in rural communities of African countries.

The parking lot of Faith, on Saturday, May 8, was the setting for the 402 bike collection, which had occurred over a few months. Generous persons from the following towns contributed bikes: New Providence, Berkeley Heights, Chatham, Summit, Basking Ridge, Long Hill Township, Cranford, Westfield, Maplewood, Scotch Plains, Mountainside, Watchung, Rahway and Wayne. These towns suggest that some Africa. persons had to travel a distance to contribute their bikes. The large source of towns was mainly due to articles in the town newspapers published by Renna Media.

On that wet May 8 day and the subsequent Tuesday, May 11, members of Faith and two members of Osceola Presbyterian Church in Clark repaired and processed the bikes in Faith's parking lot. The bikes were then placed on trucks of Pedals for Progress, an organization which annually recycles bikes for persons in developing countries of Asia, Africa and Latin America. Faith's bikes will shortly be on their way to

The bikes will provide reliable transportation for men and women to commute to work, transport produce to market, access health care and other services.

Since 2002, Faith has been collecting bikes for Pedals for Progress. The total of 402 significantly exceeds the number in any prior year. The persons giving their bicycles also donated \$1,248 toward the international shipping costs of the bikes. Faith will contribute \$2,800 toward the shipping expense.

Faith will continue its collection of secondhand bikes. Persons may drop off their bikes at the parking lot on any day. Those who have bikes but are unable to deliver them to Faith, may call the church office at 908-464-5177 or email the office at family.faith@verizon.net. Faith graciously asks that bikes with rusted frames, handlebars or rims not be left, as they cannot be repaired or used. The bikes are to be ridden, not scrapped.

Since 2016, the chairperson of this ministry of Faith has been Casey Walsh, who is a long time member of the church. Mr. Walsh lives in Bridgewater. His daughter, Anna, and son, Casey, helped repair and process the bikes.

Faith feels much gratitude toward the many persons who have kindly donated their bikes.
