FIRECRACKER SHINES BRIGHT:

Thousands Run and Watch the Annual Event Return In-Person

The Firecracker Four-Miler and Fun Run made a triumphant return in-person on July 4th, hosting 1,449 participants, one of the largest turnouts in the event's 42year history.

The annual race, organized by the Cranford Jaycees, was forced to go virtual last year with runners participating remotely. It wasn't clear until May whether the traditional format could return, but the event was able to proceed with minimal changes.

again," said Dave Farrell, who co-chaired the event with Roger Imhof. "We heard from so many runners how much community was overwhelmingly positive."

Cranford's Township Committee issued a proclamation at their July 13th meeting to commend and thank the Jaycees for the event, noting how the 70+ volunteers and the thousands of participants and spectators were brought

together safely.

Stephen Rathbun, 21, of Springfield won the four-miler event with a time of 20:01.0. Nicole Vanasse, 19, of Martinsville was the top female finisher at 22:52.8. The top male and female finishers in the one-mile fun run--Evan Surmay, 15, and Bella Giudice, 12--were both from Cranford.

CRANFORD PAL AWARDS 5 SCHOLARSHIPS

The Cranford Police Athletic League (PAL), a not-for-profit youth sports organization serving the Township since 1981, awarded 5 scholarships to graduating Cranford High School seniors this year during a ceremony at Memorial Field. Presenting the scholarships was veteran Board of Director Member Kim Capece.

The Glenn A. Owens Scholarship was established in honor of the late PAL board of director member who dedicated his life to service and community. A police officer, volunteer coach, and military veteran, Glenn played baseball for the Philadelphia Phillies from 1952 to 1956 as well as coached baseball in the Cranford baseball leagues for over 15 years. In 2002, Glenn was inducted into the Cranford Sports Hall of Fame. For the Glenn A. Owens Scholarship, applicants were required to demonstrate their shared similarities with Mr. Owens, who was affectionately known as a "doer". For 2021, Matthew Coates and Meghan Pitts were selected as recipients.

With an outpouring of community support and grassroots donations, the Cranford PAL was able to establish a second scholarship in memory of PAL Participant Will DeGregorio who passed away in 2020 after a courageous battle with pediatric cancer. Will loved anything and

everything related to sports and was a fierce competitor who demonstrated exceptional perseverance. After Will's passing, community groups such as the Cranford Knights of Columbus, Cranford Jaycees, and fraternity Sigma Alpha Epsilon TCNJ came together to hold fundraisers - including the Knights' Corned Beef Dinner and the Jaycee's Track Friday – to help fund a scholarship in his honor. Recently, the Brookside School PTA contributed to this fund. Will's family determined that students who have persevered through adversity would be eligible for this award. For the inaugural Will DeGregorio Memorial Scholarship, Dominic Fallone, Dane Hagstrom, and Kate Wilson were selected as award recipients.



ST. MICHAEL ROMAN CATHOLIC CHURCH

'Faith in Action' is a phrase we hear often – called to be the compassionate Face of Christ, His hands and feet for our most vulnerable brothers and sisters in need. This is a guiding principle of our parish family at St. Michael's, this thread is woven through the fabric of ministry life here. Throughout the pandemic, even during lockdown, St. Michael's found a way to make outreach to others work. During those early days of lockdown beginning on March 19, 2020, the Salt & Light Ministry and the Religious Education Department initiated a weekly stopdrop-go emergency food collection on Miln Street, which ran for 15 weeks into the month of June. Donations came from everywhere; parishioners, residents, schools, businesses and other houses of worship – 6-7 carloads of food would be dropped off weekly to St. Joseph's in Elizabeth. Also, during lockdown volunteers from our Salt & Light Ministry would shop and deliver groceries to seniors through a program at Catholic Charities – from March 31 – July 15, our volunteers made more than 100 trips to the grocery store, for seniors in need.

As day-to-day life begins to find its regular rhythm again, here at St. Michael's outreach continues with fervor though our many ministries - our Samaritan Ministry supplies on average 70 loaves of sandwiches to St. Joseph's every week; the Cranford Family Care pantry box is filled on a weekly basis; our parish coat drive provided the gift of warmth, our Reverse Advent Calendar saw

Mothers donated gloves to the Elmora Soup Kitchen, gift bags to Raphael's Life House; parishioners donated over 1,500 gifts to our St. Nicholas Giving Tree during the Christmas Season; a group of our Confirmation candidates raised funds for Memorial Sloan Kettering through the sale of homemade lollipops, while other candidates donated items for blessing bags for the mothers at the Mercy House; our Salt & Light Ministry cooked & provided 200 Thanksgiving meals for local seniors, provide a monthly dinner donation to the Dudley House, donated Christmas Stocking to the Soldiers' Angels Program, monthly they supply lunches to St. Joseph's and cook for the St. Joseph's Soup Kitchen on a bi-monthly basis; the Knights of

an abundance of food donations; the Ministry of Columbus cooked 500 corned beef dinners to raise funds for a local scholarship fund; our Feed My Lambs Snack Program has supplied nearly 4,000 snack bags and 300 weekend bags for children in need.

Blessed by God's tremendous Grace, this is just a glimpse of the outreach that occurs on a daily basis here. There are many small, quiet gestures of giving that go unnoticed but they all create a parish where time, talent and treasure is given so selflessly for others. It is indeed a place where you see firsthand The Face of Christ.

GIRLS SCOUTS OF CRANFORD EARN PRESTIGIOUS GOLD AWARDS

Three accomplished young women were recently awarded the most prestigious award in Girl Scouts. Julia Love, Amanda Newport and Desirée Santos each earned the Gold Award and were honored for their achievements by Girl Scouts of Cranford, Service Unit 48.

"We are extremely proud to honor these young ladies for their hard work and years of dedication to our community," said Elayna Torsone, service unit manager for the Girl Scouts of Cranford. "Each of their projects makes a positive, lasting impact in our community and they had the extra challenge of volunteering during the pandemic. They each showed a tremendous level of commitment."

The Girl Scout Gold Award is the highest and most prestigious award that Girl Scout Ambassadors and Seniors can earn and stands for excellence and leadership. Projects require a minimum of 80 hours of work including identifying an issue, investigating it thoroughly, building a team, creating a plan, gathering feedback, taking action, and educating and inspiring others.

Julia Love (Girl Scout Troop 40843) saw a need created by the dynamics of the "stay-at-home" orders and took action. She noticed how religious education programs were affected just like public and private schools. To prevent "backslide" and keep younger students engaged, she developed a Summer Sundays religious education program at Holy Trinity Greek Orthodox Church for students in kindergarten through grade 5. She created lesson plans and trained peers to lead sessions which provided spiritual enrichment. The program can also be turn-keyed at other churches creating a sustainable initiative. Julia is also the recipient of the George N. Boulukos National Scholarship from the Eastern Orthodox Committee on Scouting. She will be attending the University of Pittsburgh in the fall to study special education and developmental psychology.

Amanda Newport (Girl Scout Troop 40480) focused her project on raising awareness of the contributions of local veterans. She created a slide show celebrating 100 years of the Cranford VFW Post #335. She dedicated hours to organizing information on the post's history and past leaders as well as chronicling the contributions the organization has made to the Cranford community. She also held workshops to educate younger Girl Scouts about the role of the VFW and taught them how to care for the American Flag. The project will serve as an important part of the post's historical records and will be accessible for many years to come. Amanda will attend the University of New Hampshire in the fall to study zoology.

Desirée Santos (Girl Scout Troop 40113) used her artistic talents to create a webcomic that addresses the challenges often faced by parents of LBGTQ youth, something she felt is overlooked in mainstream discussion. Desirée earned her award the previous year, but due to the pandemic could not be recognized for her achievements in person until recently. In September she will be a sophomore at SCAD, The Savannah College of Art and Design, where she studies animation, storytelling and illustration. Beginning on July 2, 2021 during Cranford's Independence Day Celebration at Nomahegan Park, the Cranford Police Department combined cutting edge technology and extensive training to deploy equipment that enhances first responders' ability to respond to major events and emergencies in Cranford. With the support of the Cranford Township Committee and a partnership with Conrail (Consolidated Rail Corporation), the

In the ongoing effort to make streets safer for pedestrians, young and elderly, the Police Department will continue installation of flashing pedestrian crossing signs.

As of July 17, 19 signs have been installed at 18 locations. This does not include other warning signs and pedestrian safety signs throughout town. There are 7 additional locations, based on pedestrian volume and crash statistics, that are awaiting installation.

Deputy Mayor Brian Andrews, liaison to the Pedestrian and Bike Safety Committee, and Anthony Durante, chair, commend the Police Department's efforts to make streets safer and easier to cross. There is always more work to do but this is an excellent start.

Cranford Police Department began deploying Unmanned Aerial Systems (UAS/s) for the purpose of improving public safety and expanding first responders' situational awareness at critical events, fire scenes, missing persons responses, traffic crash investigations, pedestrian safety issues, and timely damage assessments after natural weather events.

In February of 2021, the Cranford Police Department worked in conjunction with senior management at Conrail which operates and manages the freight rail line that extends along the southern portion of the township. Citing concerns about the police department's accessibility to the tracks during calls for service about trespassers and high-tension power line issues, the Cranford Police Department and Conrail collaborated to discuss effective strategies to aid in emergency responses in these immediately-unreachable areas – which includes property abutting the Garden State Parkway, residential neighborhoods, an industrial business district, and the Rahway River. Conrail recognized this gap and also saw value in providing the Township of Cranford with a tool that could supplement public safety operations. The UAS/s has a powerful on-board camera that streams HD video back to the operator who in turn can immediately communicate critical, timely information with emergency personnel in the field. Because of Conrail's support and the Township Committee's approval, Cranford's

UAS/s Unit was established and supplied with the necessary equipment and training to ensure its successful implementation and operation.

The Cranford Police Department designated 4 officers as UAS pilots who received wideranging training and passed federal testing requirements to safely, effectively and legally operate newly-deployed UAS/s. This training includes receiving a Part 107 Remote Pilot Certification issued by the Federal Aviation Administration (FAA). Additionally, the Cranford Police Department has secured a Certificate of Waiver and Authorization by the FAA allowing public safety operations of the UAS program. Captain Guy Patterson currently serves as the Commander of the UAS/s Team.

"The purpose of the UAS/s program is to provide our officers and our emergency response partners with the necessary vantage point to assess, monitor, inspect, and assist in critical incidents or special events in our community," Chief Ryan J. Greco said. The Cranford Police Department's UAS/s program and all UAS/s operators shall be responsible for annual training, certification, deployment documentation and strict management oversight to ensure proper deployment practices. In addition to benefiting the Cranford Police Department, the opportunity to deploy UAS/s will serve the ever-changing, wide-ranging utility needs of other municipal departments in Cranford that require access to such technology.

LITERACY NEW JERSEY CELEBRATION HIGHLIGHTS SUCCESS

On June 23 over 140 students and volunteer tutors came together via Zoom to celebrate a year of commitment and success in learning English. Literacy New Jersey's English as a Second Language (ESL) program provides free classes to adults who want to improve their language skills in order to find jobs, help their children in school, and become more involved in the community. Featured speakers at the event were: Tom Ganley of Cranford who volunteered with Literacy New Jersey beginning in January 2020 and has earned over 207 hours of distance learning with his ESL students this year; and Mitch Grossman of Metuchen, a new volunteer tutor to Literacy New Jersey who experienced distance learning with ESL students for the first time.

Due to COVID-19, all classes were held online this year. Our volunteer tutors learned new technology skills and reinvented their lesson plans to accommodate online learning. Through the generosity of a donor, Literacy New Jersey was able to provide tablets to students who did not have a device and who would otherwise not be able to attend online classes. Despite the challenges presented by the

pandemic, students achieved over 50+ instructional hours during the course of the year and were awarded certificates and pins for their achievement and dedication to learning English. Quite a few students achieved over 100 hours of instruction in the program.

Lauren Sergeant, Program Coordinator, said "I am impressed with the tenacity and adaptability shown by both students and tutors to continue learning and working towards achieving their goals, despite the challenges we faced over the last year. I am delighted that so many students benefit from our program due to the dedication of our volunteer tutors and our ability to expand our class schedule despite the pandemic."

Literacy New Jersey generally provides daytime and evening classes at libraries throughout Middlesex County. In September, Literacy NJ is looking forward to resuming in person instruction and will continue some online classes. In addition to English classes for immigrants, Literacy NJ offers GED prep classes, citizenship classes, computer skills classes for ESL students, and support for adults who struggle with reading and writing.

Online and in person classes are planned for



No prior experience is necessary. Volunteers must be 21 years or older. Volunteers serve as companions and loving listeners for those who are grieving.

"In order to continue to grow our English and Spanish speaking programs, we need to constantly train new volunteer facilitators," said Veronica Ortiz, Imagine Program Manager.
