## **SCHOOLS GET TWO NEW ASSISTANT PRINCIPALS**

Kenilworth Public Schools

School's out, but two new assistant principals are in at Kenilworth Public Schools.

Veteran Kenilworth child psychologist Carol Carrara has been hired for the position at Harding Elementary. Madelyn Witchel, the new assistant principal at David Brearley Middle-High School. is a newcomer to the district who most recently worked as a middle school science coordinator and eighth-grade science teacher at Bridgewater-Raritan Middle School.

The two new administrators share some skill sets, including a background in using data-driven instruction. They each had a key role on their respective schools' Pandemic Response Teams. Kenilworth leaders expect both educators to make significant contributions to advance district goals, particularly in future-ready learning and enhanced intervention programs.

"We're familiar with Carol, but that's not why we recommended her for the assistant principal position. She works tirelessly to enhance programs, advise teachers and make sure students have all the resources they need for their education and well-being," said Harding Principal Ron Bubnowski.

Brearley Principal Jeremy Davies noted that Witchel was chosen from a competitive pool of 172 applicants.

"We're so excited about Madelyn joining the Brearley team. She brings enthusiasm to educating students, and champions inclusivity and achievement. As Brearley opens its Technology Lab this fall and expands its STEM curriculum, Madelyn's science background will be an incredible asset."

Here are more details about the district's newest leaders:

Carol Carrara, Harding Elementary School

Carrara, a school psychologist with the district since 2002, had a key role in the development of the social and emotional framework at Harding. She also facilitated the school's Pandemic Response Team. Harding will call on her mentalhealth expertise as the district navigates the return to full-day, in-person instruction in September.

Carrara collaborated with teachers to enhance early childhood programs and spearheaded the new kindergarten screening process. She took an interactive approach by working alongside teachers in the classroom to offer student-assistance strategies. Carrara formed the Bilingual Parent Advisory Committee to help ensure all parents have access to school resources.

Carrara applies data-driven methods to improve instruction and student outcomes, and will train staff members in these techniques.

Madelyn Witchel, Brearley Middle-High School

Witchel spent most of her career in the Bridgewater-Raritan Regional School District, where she led the middle school science department. She also was an eighth-grade Earth and Space Science teacher at the middle school since 2014, and worked in classrooms for nine years. Her varied leadership experience includes providing professional development, interviewing teaching candidates, and serving on school improvement and science program evaluation committees.

As a member of her school's Pandemic Response Team, Witchel trained staff in use of digital tools, created virtual school events, and designed protocols to support social distancing and contact training.

Witchel has routinely used student data to shape instruction. Her analysis helped her measure growth, suggest curriculum changes, and target improvement in student understanding and skills. Her responsibilities with the science department included organizing extracurricular opportunities such as the Science Bowl Team and Junior Solar Sprint.

The Kenilworth Board of Education approved the appointments of Witchel and Carrara at its June 23 meeting.



A Communitywide Garage Sale will be held in Kenilworth on Saturday, October 9 and Sunday, October 10. 



of the school year.

Those supportive strategies continue, but Kenilworth is also developing summer enrichment programs where middle schoolers can pursue "passion projects," touting the success of expanded interventions, and talking up plans to accelerate learning.

"Accelerated learning has such an optimistic ring to it," Superintendent of Schools Kyle Arlington said. "Educating our students during the pandemic has inspired us to become even more creative in our instruction and more collaborative in our work. As we prepare for summer programming and the next school year, we're excited about new opportunities.

"At the same time, we're working hard to make sure our students have mastered skills and are prepared for the next grade level."

Largely because of these 2020-21 academic interventions, Kenilworth doesn't buy into the sense of inevitability regarding widespread learning loss.

#### **EMOTIONAL SAFETY NETS**

Early on, Kenilworth recognized that students would need a high level of emotional support when they returned in the fall.

#### **ACADEMIC STRATEGIES**

As students settled into the school year, Kenilworth's interventions evolved to include more of an academic component.


#### **SUMMER PREVIEW**

#### **NO KNOCK ORDINANCE**

A registry has been established in the Borough Clerk's office which contains a list of addresses of those premises where the owner or occupant has notified the Borough Clerk that he/she wishes to prohibit persons and entities from canvassing, soliciting, peddling, itinerant vending or attempting door-to-door sales on his/her premises.

- A. Any owner or occupant who requests his/her property be listed on the No Knock Registry shall be able to procure at no charge from the Borough Clerk's office a sticker for display at his/her premises which shall serve as notice that this property is on the No Knock Registry. There shall be no charge for registering.
- B. If any premises is on the No Knock Registry, the owner or occupant shall be obligated to post the sticker for display in a readily observable location near the front door. Call 908-276-9090 to register for the No **Knock List**

#### **SECTION 7. PENALTY**

Any person violating the terms of this Ordinance shall be subject to revocation of Borough issued license as required by Chapter 144-3 of the Borough Code and the following

- A. First offense—a fine of \$250.00.
- B. Second offense—a fine of \$500.00
- C. Third or subsequent offense—a fine of not less than \$1,000.00, nor more than \$2,000.00 and, in the discretion of the court, jail of not more than ninety (90) days.

## **EDYTHE CLAIRE FRANK 100 YEARS OLD AND 90 YEARS WITH GIRL SCOUTS**

The blaring of a fire truck's siren as it approached a party, cars honking horns as they drove by, letters, cards, proclamations, flowers, and dozens of relatives and friends were part of a surprise yard party on Saturday, June 26 celebrating the 100th birthday of Edythe Claire Hansen Frank of N. 12th St., Kenilworth, NJ. Also stopping by were Mayor Linda Karlovitch and Councilman Louis De Mondo who extended personal congratulations to the birthday girl as did her minister, Father Andy Kruger, of Trinity Episcopal Church, Cranford. Edythe's actual birthday was the next day, having been born in Jersey City on June 27, 1921 to William E. and Laura Jane Silvers Hansen.

Not only does Edythe have the distinction of being a centenarian but she very well may be the oldest, and longest dues-paying Girl Scout in the United States. In 1931 at age nine she became a Brownie Scout and in 1935 a registered Girl Scout

One of three children, Edythe married Sgt. George J. Frank on Armistice Day, 1943 while he was on short leave from the US Army during WWII. She said, "He came home on short leave and we got married." During the war she tried to enlist with the Navy, Coast Guard, and Marines and they were not taking people at that time. The Army indicated they would take her but her parents and husband asked her to reconsider. Eventually she decided to remain at home.

After WWII they lived in a Millburn apartment and ran a luncheonette. They soon had two children – George (aka "Stretch") and Laurie-Jo. The couple bought some building lots in Kenilworth on N. 12th St. for a few hundred dollars and began to erect their own home with their own labor and that of relatives and friends. Edythe remarked, "I handed him the cinder blocks and he added the mortar." At last, in 1949, they moved in and later had two more children – Sue-Ellen and Donna-Claire. George passed way in 2012 at age 91 after 68 years of marriage.

Both Edythe and George were part of Kenilworth scouting – he with the Cub Scouts

and she with the Brownies and then the Girl Scouts. They were scout leaders for their own children and many more from town. Edythe started out as a Brownie leader and as her daughters grew older, she become a Girl Scout leader spanning a period of 14 years from 1957 to 1971

Edythe recalls trips to Camp Wild Cherry and the old Girl Scout cabin at the end of N. 18th and N. 19th streets adjacent to Black Brook Park. She mentioned, "There was really nothing around there at the time. There was a lot of open space." She reminisced about the wild cherry trees, poison ivy, dirt, and dust. Edythe stated, "We couldn't wait to wash off all of the dirt from camp. When we got home after day camp, the first thing we did was to shower to get rid of the dirt."

In 1995 Edythe was honored by the

Washington Rock Girl Scout Council with a 60-year service pin and again in 2005 with a 70-year pin. Still a dues-paid Girl Scout after 90 years, Edythe indicated a few years ago, "Everyone worked nicely together at Camp Wild Cherry. We really were sincere about following the Girl Scout Promise and Law. I still follow it today.

A special highlight of the day was the attendance of Natasha Hemmings, CEO of Girl Scouts Heart of New Jersey. Ms. Hemmings announced that Edythe had been awarded the distinct honor of "Life Time Girl Scout," and noted that among other benefits, was that no longer would Edythe need to pay dues. With a smile, Edythe said, "So glad to be a Life Time Girl Scout as at times I was late in paying my dues. Now I don't have to worry about it."

The hostess of the party was Edythe's granddaughter, Dionne Frank, who resides next door. She is one of Edythe's 10 grandchildren. Edythe also has 12 great-grandchildren and two great-great-grandchildren.

The celebration continued over to the following day with continued surprises as more relatives and friends arrived. On Sun., July 11, a third get together with old friends visiting was held in Ocean Beach, NJ where Edythe and her late husband, George, husband, had a home for over 30 years. Edythe concluded, "I never had any idea about the surprise party. I was pleased to see so many people."

Granddaughter Dionne, commented, "As a family, we are very blessed to have her with us, in good mental and physical health. Edythe is the true matriarch of the Frank Family and is always ready to dole out love and humor. The entire weekend was a surprise for Gramma so every person who walked up the driveway to greet her, made her more excited and filled with love and joy."


