





What helped make the decision to study medicine were her experiences as a volunteer and a Medical Explorer at Trinitas.

As a high school sophomore, she entered the Teen Volunteer program, run by Lisa Liss. Director of Volunteer Services at Trinitas. "I wanted to be further exposed to the hospital setting to see if medicine was really the right path for me," Dimiana says. "Volunteering on the maternity floor allowed me to observe the ins and outs of how a hospital floor works. Helping different varieties of patients exposed me to how different and equally important each patient's story is. I was exposed to real-world hardships, celebrations, and stories that I would've never been able to see otherwise. It taught me the great importance of patience and compassion in the field, which is something you really have to feel and not just read about in a book."

Then Dimiana joined the Medical Explorers Club, for those interested in healthcare, nutrition, physical therapy, and nursing, among other careers. "Although short-lived due to COVID, it was an overall really fun and educational experience for my friends and me. I learned a lot

about different specialties in the hospital, like anesthesia and dialysis. It showed me how truly excited I felt learning about medicine. It helped me realize that this is the excitement I aspire to have my entire life when it comes to my chosen field. These experiences, along with many others, helped me achieve the self-reflection and discovery needed to not only find my career path, but to recognize how I intend to get there. Attending Princeton University will be one of my first of many steps towards becoming a physician."

Liss, who also oversees Nurse Camp for high school students and the Collegiate Medical Mentor program for college students, says, "I'm always thrilled to hear about students taking their experiences at Trinitas and running with them. Dimiana was a shining example of how enriching these programs can be for students who may either be on the fence about healthcare as a profession and figure out that they definitely want it, or know for sure they want to study medicine at some level and can't wait until college to get started. Dimiana took advantage of what we have to offer and we hope to see her in our Collegiate Medical mentor program as she excels at Princeton."

WHY RAHWAY RESIDENTS CONTINUE TO LEND A HELPING HAND

Rahway Food for Friends honors their volunteers, staff, and all helping hands in the City of Rahway. The community has stepped up to address the increasing number of citizens in the City of Rahway and surrounding cities who deal with food insecurity. Welcoming their 30th Anniversary, the nonprofit tackles larger demands to combat hunger during the COVID-19 pandemic. Established in 1991, it is necessary to highlight all those who selflessly dedicate their time, resources and love. So, how do they continue to combat food insecurity during heightened times such as these? Local churches, Rahway High School students and distinguished women in the community remain the backbone to manifest the world they hope to see.

The COVID-19 pandemic has affected many households across the country. With New Jersey approved for unemployment extended benefits, this still holds true over a year later. Food pantries needed more than ever. Meeting overwhelming demands and making healthier options a necessity, former Mayor of Rahway Samson Steinman, The Board of Trustees, and Executive Director Candance Ashe became quite innovative. The goal was to provide more than meals with the increased needs of many residents and those in surrounding cities. A Mobile Pantry and Mobile Meals Program was created to deliver meals to seniors, displaced veterans, and disabled patrons. This added on additional needs since Rahway Food for Friends already provides food supplemental packages to all families in the NJ area every second Monday, Tuesday, and Wednesday of the month from 9-2 p.m.

Many volunteers overextend themselves by being on call just in case any person or family has a need for food or toiletries in between that time. Visiting the food pantry, I got a glimpse of how much hard work goes into making the machine run. The display of being each other's keeper was heartfelt.

The food pantry is truly an established network of community agencies. The NJ nonprofit partnered with the RWJ Rahway Hospital to offer glucose testing, education, and prevention of dietary needs, focusing on clients with Type 1 and Type 2 Diabetes. This is separate from the food pantry. Taking on another responsibility, over 150 families are fed through their soup kitchen as well. The dates can be found on the website, rahwayfoodforfriendsnj.org/.

How does Rahway Food for Friends tackle such large but essential demands? The community ecosystem of course! For 30 years the food pantry and soup kitchen remain with the help of local businesses, Rahway students, Rahway High School ROTC, local churches such as Second Presbyterian, Second Baptist, Zion Lutheran, Ebenezer AME, Divine Mercy Parish, The Church of the Good Shepherd Episcopal, and Rahway natives. Many Rahway volunteers remain anonymous because the mission is more important than any applause. However, during my time there, it was not hard to spot two prominent women who assisted with conducting the orchestra.

Never looking for praise, Julia Major and Mary Johnson strategize to make sure enough packages are made for families, notate logs of what was given and what is needed, and make sure all packages are ready for the Mobile Meals Program. I would love to fill all readers in on a little background information on the women who embody supporting the community within healthcare, education, economic, and all other social sectors.

Julia Major continues to give herself for over 30 years to combat food insecurity and all intersectionalities that come along with that. So, where did the tenacity come from you may ask? Julia has been a part of the Black community in Rahway who experienced many sociological issues. Social justice was a big chunk of her life during numerous racial climates in our Nation. One can say she dedicates her time and experience to seeing the world she hoped for since a young girl. Julia came to Rahway Food for Friends when it was "just a soup kitchen and food pantry" with a group of women offering help. A member of the Red Hat Society, she brought in women who were like minded to assist. The program is geared towards helping women internationally encouraging fellowship, unity, and the betterment of the social society. No shock here as she supports women and mothers

donating time, guidance, and toiletries. Enough cannot be said to the type of woman Julia Major is.

Mary Johnson has volunteered her time for years to the food pantry as well. Living in Rahway since 1978, she gave time to helping the small group of Black homeowners in Rahway. They worked together to keep themselves encouraged and step in whenever anyone was in need. The mother of six children, over 20 grandchildren, and a handful of great grandchildren, Mary has been faithful and committed to assisting others. Mary embodies feeding the whole person as she knows many families by name and offers her advice and prayers to patrons.

Both women are members of Ebenezer AME Church, under the leadership of Reverend Dr. Marti Robinson, Esq.

Rahway Food for Friends continues to celebrate their helping angels who are deeply rooted in making sure no need goes unmet. It remains community driven, much like an ecosystem; interacting to keep the system going, knowing all components and people are important to its function, and understanding nothing would get accomplished if any part fails since they are all linked.



ARCHITECT, SEYMOUR WILLIAMS, GAINED STATE/NATIONAL PROMINENCE

For over forty years (1916-1960), Seymour Williams spent a career designing many of the city's public, civic, and religious buildings and many homes for Rahway's leading citizens as well as for clients from around the state. In the two decades following World War I, he was considered the architect of progress who provided valuable ideas for the future development and beautification of the city. By the 1930s, Williams had gained a state-wide reputation and in 1934 was named Supervisor of the New Jersey Historic American Buildings Survey (HABS). The survey, a project of the Emergency Relief Administration and the Works Projects Administration, was established by the federal government to collect data on buildings located throughout the United States that were of historic interest. His work in New Jersey was so well done, he would later be placed in charge of an area covering five states.

Williams was born in 1883 in Ludlow, England, came to the United States as a young man and graduated from the University of Pennsylvania in 1911. He arrived in Rahway in 1916 and within a short time became the most sought after architect in town. He sketched the plans for the Ilderan Clubhouse (1923), the Masonic Temple (1924), the Rahway Savings Institution (1925), Grover Cleveland Elementary School (1928), the original field house at Veteran's Field (1930), and the Robinson Building in the central business district (1930). He was hired to remodel the Citizens National Bank on the corner of Irving Street and Lewis Street (1925), and the police headquarters on Main Street (1927). He also designed the community halls for the First Presbyterian Church (1926), St. Paul's Church (1922), and the First Baptist Church (1928). Williams was also contracted to create the blueprints for many private homes, each built with a high standard of design, that still grace Rahway's neighborhoods.

Williams was good friends with Dr. Fred Albee, the famous orthopedic surgeon renowned for his bone-grafting techniques, and designed an elaborate addition for his Colonia mansion. During the Florida land boom of the 1920s, Dr. Albee purchased 112 acres in the city of Venice on the state's gulf coast with plans to develop the area. In 1925 he asked Williams to join him when he left for Venice to begin the layout of his property. Williams would draw the specs for numerous private and public structures including a bathing pavilion of Spanish architecture considered at the time to be the most beautiful building in that part of the state.

During the Great Depression of the thirties, the government created programs to provide work for millions of Americans. One such program was the Historic American Buildings Survey (HABS) providing work for architects, draftsmen, and historians. The aim of the survey was to establish a permanent record of all historical buildings in the nation that would be filed in the Library of Congress in Washington D.C. National in scope, teams were authorized to visit each state to select houses, bridges, forts,

barns, mills, churches, and public buildings of historic merit. Secretary of the Interior, Harold T. Ickes, selected Williams to serve as District Officer for the State of New Jersey.

Under the direction of the Rahway architect, the Jersey team, consisting of about 100 persons, traced, mapped, photographed, and certified some 600 buildings of historic interest in the state. The Merchants and Drovers (former Girl Scout House) on the corner of St. Georges Avenue and Westfield Avenue was included on the list. The New Jersey HABS was "one of the most thorough and well-organized, setting standards for documentation that eventually became the national standard." Due to his excellent management, Williams was promoted to lead a survey encompassing a five-state area.

Over his long career, Williams served as president of the New Jersey Chapter of the American Institute of Architects, the New Jersey State Society of Architects, and was vice-president of the Union County Society of

Architects. For twenty years (1930-1950), he was the Architectural Supervisor of school plans and buildings for the New Jersey Department of Education. On the local level, as a member of the Rahway Zoning Board and Board of Adjustments, he was instrumental in preparing new zoning ordinances. In a presentation given in 1946, he suggested the following measures to enhance the community: 1) Undertake a practical and complete improvement of the Rahway River and all its branches, 2) Place a curb on remodeling proposals in the city whenever the remodeling does not fit in with the general architecture of the neighborhood, 3) Form a general clean-up campaign to encourage the elimination of rubbish in backyards in both residential and business zones.

Seymour Williams passed on July 1, 1967. As the "Architect of Rahway's Progress," his artistic endeavors in the form of public and private, business and educational buildings have left a lasting visual legacy in all parts of the city.

using unfamiliar computer technology, and faced with closed test centers, Richard persevered. Richard has lived in Elizabeth, New Jersey all of his life. He had trouble in high school because of test anxiety and accordingly did not earn his high school diploma. However, at 27, Richard made the decision to earn his high school diploma and called Literacy New Jersey to sign up for classes. Within 3 short months, Richard was a high school graduate.

His tutor, Vivian Saito, a Literacy New Jersey tutor from Westfield, describes Richard: "From the get-go Richard Hernandez was a 'go-getter'; He was determined to earn his HSE diploma within the term allotted to do so.

"Even while taking care of family obligations, Richard made time to study his lessons and complete all practice tests for class each week. I knew Richard was bound for success in earning his diploma after reading his initial writing essay (His was the first in the class to be submitted.). Richard's essay was like reading a page from a book and I told him so... Thank you, Richard, for allowing this tutor to feel my time spent has been so worthwhile with Literacy New Jersey and with students like you."

AN UNKNOWN ILLNESS KILLING YOUNG BIRDS

An unknown illness affecting young birds that has been sweeping throughout the United States is now reported in New Jersey.

The morbidity and mortality event has been occurring in nestling and fledgling songbirds in the mid-Atlantic, extending into the Southeast and eastern upper Midwest, according to NJ Division of Fish and Wildlife officials. Since mid-May, numerous young birds, mainly blue jays, starlings, and common grackles, but also robins and cardinals, have been found with eye and neurologic issues, and in some cases these birds have been found dead in large numbers, officials said. Some, but not all, of the affected birds are showing neurologic signs consisting of head tremors, leg paresis (partial paralysis or weakness), ataxia (falling to the side) or inability to stand at all, and excessive vocalizations. Also, most of the birds are in good body condition, likely still being fed by their parents, officials said.

Cases have been reported in Washington, DC, TN, KY, VA, WV, MD, DE, IN, OH, FL, PA and NJ, officials said.

In 2020 there was reports of similar problems with young birds in Utah and New Mexico. At this time there is no evidence that the two events are related.

"Many theories have been posed as to the cause of this event; however, no cause has been determined at this time," officials said.

Dr. Nicole Lewis, the wildlife veterinarian for the New Jersey Division of Fish and Wildlife, has collected about 30 birds, all of them hatchlings and fledglings, that have died of the affliction, but estimates that it has killed upward of 100 birds in the state.

"We're seeing a lot of eye swelling with the discharge around it," Lewis said of the symptoms. "The bird's kind of seem like they're blind. Or we're also seeing neurological signs, such as impacting their brains, they're stumbling and they're falling over. They're not right."

These symptoms, Lewis said, impair the birds' ability to eat and fly, and eventually they die from it. Birds have been found alive with these symptoms and taken to wildlife rehabilitation centers, but none has seen the conditions improve, and most have died.

Though the nature of the disease has yet to be discovered, some known diseases, such as the West Nile Virus, which has killed millions of birds and can affect humans, have been ruled out. There have also been no reports of the disease affecting humans or any other animals.

When a dead bird suspected of having this disease is collected, a necropsy, the equivalent of a human autopsy, is performed and tests are run in hopes of ruling out other diseases. Once everything known, such as West Nile and salmonella, is ruled out, further testing is done to try to understand where the disease is coming

from, Lewis said.

"There's a lot of different options and a lot of different testing that goes on," Lewis said.

In New Jersey, blue jays have been the species most affected, but Lewis has also seen grackles, starlings, robins and one cardinal that have died from the disease.

Don Torino, president of the Bergen County Audubon Society, has been concerned with these mysterious deaths. "Birds are in trouble as it is," Torino said. "It's scary."

Torino said this disease is another concern for birds that already face significant dangers, particularly climate change and loss of habitat.

Torino has not found any birds that have died from the disease, but has been constantly seeking updates from scientists and officials.

"This is hopefully something we can get a handle on pretty quickly," Torino said.

But Lewis said it's a laborious process, involving a lot of trial and error to try to figure out what the underlying causes may be. Lewis has been working with experts from other states that have had birds die from the disease to determine what the disease is and how it spreads.

One possibility that has been bandied about is a connection between the disease and the Brood X cicadas, since they emerged at about the same time and place.

"We have been discussing that," Lewis said. "It is certainly on the table as a possibility, but we have not ruled that in or out. That's a bit of a challenge."

Lewis added that the areas that have the heaviest bird deaths have been those with a large cicada presence. According to Lewis, there has been information circulating about a fungus that the cicadas may have. But with so many uncertainties, it's difficult to label anything a direct cause.

One way the disease could potentially spread is at congregational spaces for birds, such as feeders.

"It is very possible that the adults are feeding

at feeders or in a local spot where they congregate and then going back to feed their young and giving it to them," Lewis said. "That's a possibility, but we don't know as of yet."

What to do if you find a dead bird

Lewis has been requesting that people who find dead, young birds email her at Nicole.Lewis@dep.nj.gov, and let her know.

"I've been getting a lot of emails alerting me, and it's extremely helpful," Lewis said.

Or you can call 1-877-WARN-DEP and for any additional instructions.

Lewis has been collecting birds from all over the state, driving to get them. So if you find a dead or sick fledgling, and she thinks it's worth collecting, you may be getting a visit from a wildlife veterinarian.

"Dead birds should be handled with gloves, double-bagged and kept cool until picked up.

WHAT CAN WE DO?

If you have a bird feeder, take it down and clean it out with 10% bleach solution.

Do the same with birdbaths, empty them out and clean with 10% bleach solution.

Hopefully this will curb the transfer of this virus from affected birds to other smaller birds who have not displayed any symptoms yet. As of now goldfinches and sparrows are among birds not affected. The birds will be able to fly to other wild sources of food and water.

Avoid contact between your pets and sick birds.

Hopefully with our assistance science can quickly find a resolution to this crisis.


