FIVE SCOUTS HONORED WITH EAGLE COURT OF HONOR

On June 19, five Scouts from Troop 67 were honored in a joint Eagle Court of Honor ceremony held at a private home in Summit. Local dignitaries, including Summit Mayor Nora Radest, Marjorie Foxx, Common Council President, and Common Council member Greg Vartan attended the ceremony. The Scouts who achieved the Eagle Rank were:

Bryan Fok (May 13, 2020) His Eagle community service project involved the construction and installation of a Free Little Library, which is a community based book exchange, at Lincoln Hubbard School in Summit, NJ. Benches were also constructed and installed around the library to encourage reading and relaxation.

Coley Snyder (November 5, 2020) His Eagle community service project involved the planning and creation of a prayer garden and reflection area to honor the veterans at Saint Teresa of Avila Cemetery in Summit, NJ. He also installed an angle statue, paver walkway, plantings and stained cedar benches to the area.

Markus Seza Gokan (November 5, 2020) His Eagle community service project involved elevating a flood prone hiking trail in the Ash Brook Reservation. This is part of the Battle of Short Hills Historic Trail in Scotch Plains, NJ. He utilized a modified Native American technique known as corduroy construction. Native materials were applied to raise the trail above the flood line.

Will Cho (November 5, 2020) His Eagle community service project involved the planning, digging and creation of an ecofriendly rain garden at the Central Presbyterian Church in Summit, NJ. A bench was also designed and built to create a sitting area within the garden.

Kevin Ming-Yin Michael Cavicchia (March 14, 2021) His Eagle community service project involved constructing a traditional Native American wickiup at the Reeves Reed Arboretum in Summit, NJ. This wickiup structure will serve as a valuable teaching tool

for the Native American lessons taught at the arboretum.

To earn the Eagle Scout rank, the highest advancement rank in Scouting, a Boy Scout must fulfill requirements in the areas of leadership, service, and outdoor skills. The Eagle Service Project completed by each candidate for the rank is the culmination of many years of participation and leadership within a Troop, and includes earning at least 21 Merit Badges, as well as many hours of community service and troop leadership.

THE SUMMIT FOUNDATION DONATES \$13,000 TO CRISIS LISTENING LINE CARING CONTACT

Julie Keenan, President of the Board of Trustees of the Summit Foundation, presented a \$13,000 grant to Caring Contact on June 11, 2021. For nearly 50 years, the Summit Foundation has served the Summit community by growing and granting philanthropic resources to address local needs. During the last 10 years they have invested \$8.6 million through grants, scholarships, and donor-advised distributions.

"As a result of Covid, the number of individuals in need of emotional support grew and, fortunately, we were able to pivot to remote listening during the height of the pandemic. This allowed us to take over 15,000 calls in 2020," said Ms. Givelber. "The Summit Foundation's generosity will ensure that Caring Contact has more trained listeners available to answer the



increased number of calls either in our call center or remotely."

Caring Contact's goal for 2021 is to continue building hotline capacity to more effectively meet the increased number of crisis calls from the National Suicide Prevention Lifeline. This is particularly important as Congress has mandated the change to a three-digit code (988) for access to the Lifeline in 2022. The entire Lifeline network of 170+ centers is focused on building capacity to meet the anticipated increase in calls as a result of this change. The Summit Foundation's grant provides crucial support for this effort in North-Central New Jersey.

Caring Contact is an award-winning, volunteer-staffed caring and crisis hotline providing active listening support and best-inclass education to the Central and Northern New Jersey community. They attentively and compassionately serve those in emotional distress and educate communities about the power of personal connection. 3 SKILL SETS STUDENTS NEED TO THRIVE THIS FALL

LearningRx (www.LearningRx.com), the largest one-on-one brain training company, is sharing tips to help students ease the transition from summer to school. The tips highlight three key skill sets that students need to thrive in any setting.

This fall will be a return to in-person learning for many students across the country in nearly 18 months. In addition to the standard learning loss that typically occurs when formal education stops during the summer, this past year and a half was compounded because of school closures, disruptions, and new challenges with online learning. • SKILL SET #2: TIME MANAGEMENT AND ORGANIZATION

Summer often means late nights and sleeping in, making the transition to early morning starts particularly stressful. Start by gradually adopting a sleep schedule to best prepare your student for an earlier wake-up.



Like time management, organization often serves as a reflection of learning success. As one might imagine, a well-rested teen with strong note-taking skills, clearly labeled binders, and a detailed homework schedule will likely perform better than a sleep-deprived teen who struggles to stay on top of tasks. Invest in the tools your student needs to keep academics organized like colored markers, binders, notebooks, highlighter pens, a calendar, and a whiteboard. Designate a quiet space in your living quarters - whether it's a desk, fold-up, or dining room table - to establish a learning environment without distraction.

• SKILL SET #3: COGNITIVE SKILLS

Also known as "brain skills," cognitive skills are the underlying tools that enable kids to focus successfully, think, prioritize, plan, understand, visualize, remember, and solve problems. Those skills include auditory processing, visual processing, short and long-term memory, comprehension, logic, reasoning, and attention skills. If one of these skills isn't as strong as the others, it can affect the brain's ability to perform efficiently. Just imagine a bright student whose attention skills make it difficult to focus on the teacher's instruction. They might miss taking critical information while taking notes, a homework assignment, or project details. Imagine if every cognitive skill were strong, including their attention skill, they would thrive in school and perform at their highest potential.

A MESSAGE OF HOPE AND RESILIENCE

Summit Public Art

In 2021, public art has become more relevant than ever. A great example of one initiative to dynamize a city downtown after a year of pandemic is the one led by Summit Public Art.

For nearly twenty years, Summit Public Art (SPA) has infused Summit's downtown with contemporary art installations that provide public art experiences. Since 2002, the volunteer-based city organization has installed over 80 pieces of temporary art created by nationally and internationally acclaimed artists.

For the launch of its 2021-22 season, SPA has invited artist Laurence de Valmy (she/her), to create a mural art installation in the heart of Summit at the historic MONDO building, a space dedicated to the arts.

The installation presents three interactive artworks from de Valmy's POST series, which

revisits art history through anachronistic carries a message of resilience, hope and Instagram posts. The works, displayed on large banners, will share the stories behind three works by the artists Lee Krasner, Keith Haring and Jean Michel Basquiat.

De Valmy's work captures the trend of our times and connects it to art history.

Launched in 2010, Instagram is now the favorite platform for sharing art. But what if Instagram had always existed?

De Valmy intermingles her knowledge of art history along with her painting dexterities to share the stories behind iconic artworks. All of her pieces, depicted as Instagram posts from a time gone by, combine an original painting and a dialogue that is historically precise yet humorous. "I love art history but above all I'm fascinated by personal stories and relationships: how artists were connected with other artists, art dealers, writers, their lovers, etc. What made them create their work? Or for whom did they do it? That's what my series is about," says de Valmy. AN INTERACTIVE INSTALLATION

Each mural has its own QR code to encourage interaction with viewers and provide more stories and information such as videos of the artist in the studio. "Laurence's work is aesthetically appealing but also educational and fun at the same time. We hope that it will trigger people's curiosity and allow them to experience art in a unique way," says Brian Carpenter, Communications Chair for SPA.

Some will argue that our phones and social media can make us feel disconnected with real life. But De Valmy points to her own positive experiences with social media: "I have met so many friends thanks to that and was spotted by art dealers on Instagram. It's been a game changer for me. It will be great to connect with viewers who share their experience in Summit!"

Three artworks to represent resilience, hope, and inclusion

Created during the pandemic, de Valmy's POSTs were inspired by the stories of Krasner, Haring and Basquiat who all faced different challenges during their lifetime. Each artwork inclusion.

"Krasner as a woman had to make her way in a male-dominated art scene and break free from the shadow of her famous husband, Jackson Pollock," says de Valmy. Lee's Sun Woman by de Valmy is part of a collaboration with Art Girl Rising and Kahn Gallery to develop awareness about women artists.

"Keith Haring was snubbed by the art institutions, at least for a while, since he was labeled as a commercial artist and he was also a victim of AIDS. Despite these challenges, he was his whole life a strong advocate for art democratization, equality, tolerance, and love of life, which is very inspiring to me," says de Valmy.

Although Jean Michel Basquiat quickly rose to fame, he resented the racism he often faced along the way. The piece chosen by de Valmy is one of the rare flower paintings created by Basquiat, possibly as a tribute to the famous flowers of his friend Andy Warhol.

ABOUT SUMMIT PUBLIC ART

Summit Public Art is a volunteer-based city organization whose mission is to bring art to public spaces throughout Summit, NJ. Although it is a city entity, SPA receives no funding from the city. It raises money through individual donations, public and private grants and corporate sponsorships.

SPA was founded in 2002 as the Mayor's Partnership for Public Art. Its mission is to enhance the cityscape, infusing it with assorted contemporary art installations that provide public art experiences to those who live, work in, or visit Summit.

Over the past fourteen years SPA has installed over 80 pieces of temporary art throughout the community, The artists represented include many of national and international renown. The committee has also sponsored and facilitated two permanent installations on Broad Street: three bus shelters and the Gateway Tree sculpture welcoming people to town. 

ONE WOMAN'S WARTIME ODYSSEY

Longtime Summit resident Eva Cristina Hoffman Jedruch has lectured extensively about her mother's extraordinary journey during the first half of the 20th century. Now Jedruch's book, Crossing the Bridges: From Lvov Across the Steppes of Asia to London's Doodlebugs, is in print, published June 30 by the prestigious British firm of Austin Macauley.

Zofia Neuhoff was born in 1905 into an upper middle-class family in the Polish lands which had been annexed by Austria in the 18th century. When WWI upended their world, the family moved to Innsbruck for five years, returning only in 1918 to the newly-independent Poland. In the ensuing years, Zofia married happily, becoming Zofia Hoffman, and, unusually for a woman, earned a law degree.


Then, in 1939, Poland was invaded by both Nazi Germany and Soviet Russia. Zofia's husband was killed by the Russians in a massacre of Polish officers in1940. She herself was arrested by the Soviets, forced to leave behind Eva, her 18-month-old child, and sent to work in a stone quarry in Kazakhstan. Later, she managed to join a Polish military unit under British command, which initiated her journey, in fits and starts, across Persia, Iraq, Palestine and Egypt; she arrived in London just in time to work at General Headquarters during the worst of the German blitz. Even when the war ended in 1945, Zofia's "war" was not over: it remained for her to return to communist Poland, then under Soviet control, and try to smuggle her daughter out of the country. Three quarters of a century later, her story is still heart-stopping.


Jedruch has already published a book about her mother's odyssey in Polish. She notes that Crossing the Bridges is "not a translation but a substantially new book, with more extensive explanation of the political and geographical backdrop."

Eva Cristina Hoffman Jedruch was born in Lvov, Poland, months before the outbreak of WWII. She has lived in England, Argentina, and the USA. A chemical engineer by profession, Jedruch worked with her husband, a nuclear physicist and parliamentary historian. After his death, she returned to university to earn a doctorate in medieval studies at Drew University. She speaks five languages and is a vice president of the International Commission for the History of Representative and Parliamentary Institutions (ICHRPI). Her book is available at Amazon, Barnes & Noble, and independent bookstores.





(above) Summit resident and author, Eva Cristina Hoffman Jedruch has written a book about her mother's extraordinary journey, Crossing the Bridges.

RICHARD HERNANDEZ, RECEIVES STUDENT EXCELLENCE AWARD


Literacy New Jersey

Literacy New Jersey recently held its annual Literacy for Life Conference, a virtual conference for adult literacy practitioners. During the conference, Richard Hernandez received the Student Excellence Award from among more than 1,000 Literacy New Jersey students.

Program Director Barbara Bagger of Westfield said: "Richard is an outstanding choice for our Student Excellence Award. He is a model student and earned his high school diploma in record time. He aspires to attend college and join his brother's software business. He inspires other students to achieve their goals. We are very proud of Richard. I know that this is just the beginning for Richard."

Richard Hernandez came to Literacy New Jersey in September 2020 during the height of the pandemic. While many HSE students were discouraged from attending online classes and using unfamiliar computer technology, and faced with closed test centers, Richard persevered. Richard has lived in Elizabeth, New Jersey all of his life. He had trouble in high school because of test anxiety and accordingly did not earn his high school diploma. However, at 27, Richard made the decision to earn his high school diploma and called Literacy New Jersey to sign up for classes. Within 3 short months, Richard was a high school graduate.

His tutor, Vivian Saito, a Literacy New Jersey tutor from Westfield, describes Richard: "From the get-go Richard Hernandez was a 'go-getter';



earn his HSE diploma within the term allotted to do so.

"Even while taking family care of obligations, Richard made time to study his lessons and complete all practice tests for class each week. I knew Richard was

bound for success in earning his diploma after reading his initial writing essay (His was the first in the class to be submitted.). Richard's essay was like reading a page from a book and I told him so...Thank you, Richard, for allowing this tutor to feel my time spent has been so worthwhile with Literacy New Jersey and with students like vou."

Math tutor Peggy Tung, a Literacy New Jersey tutor from Berkeley Heights added, "Richard has all the qualities that make every student a success. It can be summed up in three words: goal-setting, conscientiousness and hard-work.

"First, he set his goal, in this case, to get his HSE certificate. Then, he meticulously did everything he could to reach that goal. He understood that 'practice makes perfect' was a necessary condition for learning math. As a result, he made every effort to attend all classes while meeting family obligations. He was attentive in all classes, trying to understand the

He was determined to subject at hand and asking questions for clarification. He did all the homework assigned to the students, which required tenacious pursuit. EDYTHE CLAIRE FRANK 100 YEARS OLD AND 90 YEARS WITH GIRL SCOUTS

The blaring of a fire truck's siren as it approached a party, cars honking horns as they drove by, letters, cards, proclamations, flowers, and dozens of relatives and friends were part of a surprise yard party on Saturday, June 26 celebrating the 100th birthday of Edythe Claire Hansen Frank of N. 12th St., Kenilworth, NJ. Also stopping by were Mayor Linda Karlovitch and Councilman Louis De Mondo who extended personal congratulations to the birthday girl as did her minister, Father Andy Kruger, of Trinity Episcopal Church, Cranford. Edythe's actual birthday was the next day, having been born in Jersey City on June 27, 1921 to William E. and Laura Jane Silvers Hansen.

Not only does Edythe have the distinction of being a centenarian but she very well may be the oldest, and longest dues-paying Girl Scout in the United States. In 1931 at age nine she became a Brownie Scout and in 1935 a registered Girl Scout.

One of three children, Edythe married Sgt. George J. Frank on Armistice Day, 1943 while he was on short leave from the US Army during WWII. She said, "He came home on short leave and we got married." During the war she tried to enlist with the Navy, Coast Guard, and Marines and they were not taking people at that time. The Army indicated they would take her but her parents and husband asked her to reconsider. Eventually she decided to remain at home.

After WWII they lived in a Millburn apartment and ran a luncheonette. They soon had two children – George (aka "Stretch") and Laurie-Jo. The couple bought some building lots in Kenilworth on N. 12th St. for a few hundred dollars and began to erect their own home with their own labor and that of relatives and friends. Edythe remarked, "I handed him the cinder blocks and he added the mortar." At last, in 1949, they moved in and later had two more children – Sue-Ellen and Donna-Claire. George passed way in 2012 at age 91 after 68 years of marriage.

Both Edythe and George were part of Kenilworth scouting – he with the Cub Scouts

and she with the Brownies and then the Girl Scouts. They were scout leaders for their own children and many more from town. Edythe started out as a Brownie leader and as her daughters grew older, she become a Girl Scout leader spanning a period of 14 years from 1957 to 1971.

Edythe recalls trips to Camp Wild Cherry and the old Girl Scout cabin at the end of N. 18th and N. 19th streets adjacent to Black Brook Park. She mentioned, "There was really nothing around there at the time. There was a lot of open space." She reminisced about the wild cherry trees, poison ivy, dirt, and dust. Edythe stated, "We couldn't wait to wash off all of the dirt from camp. When we got home after day camp, the first thing we did was to shower to get rid of the dirt."

In 1995 Edythe was honored by the

Washington Rock Girl Scout Council with a 60year service pin and again in 2005 with a 70-year pin. Still a dues-paid Girl Scout after 90 years, Edythe indicated a few years ago, "Everyone worked nicely together at Camp Wild Cherry. We really were sincere about following the Girl Scout Promise and Law. I still follow it today.

A special highlight of the day was the attendance of Natasha Hemmings, CEO of Girl Scouts Heart of New Jersey. Ms. Hemmings announced that Edythe had been awarded the distinct honor of "Life Time Girl Scout," and noted that among other benefits, was that no longer would Edythe need to pay dues. With a smile, Edythe said, "So glad to be a Life Time Girl Scout as at times I was late in paying my dues. Now I don't have to worry about it."

The hostess of the party was Edythe's granddaughter, Dionne Frank, who resides next door. She is one of Edythe's 10 grandchildren. Edythe also has 12 great-grandchildren and two great-great-grandchildren.

The celebration continued over to the following day with continued surprises as more relatives and friends arrived. On Sun., July 11, a third get together with old friends visiting was held in Ocean Beach, NJ where Edythe and her late husband, George, husband, had a home for over 30 years. Edythe concluded, "I never had any idea about the surprise party. I was pleased to see so many people."

Granddaughter Dionne, commented, "As a family, we are very blessed to have her with us, in good mental and physical health. Edythe is the true matriarch of the Frank Family and is always ready to dole out love and humor. The entire weekend was a surprise for Gramma so every person who walked up the driveway to greet her, made her more excited and filled with love and joy."






