JOIN CUB SCOUTS, SCOUTS BSA AND VENTURING

Outdoor fun and adventures await Chatham boys and girls in Cub Scouts, Scouts BSA and Venturing. With the start of the school year, our programs kick into high gear once again.

Chatham has three Cub Scout packs for boys and girls in grades K-5, three Scouts BSA troops for boys in grades 6-12, one Scouts BSA troop that is for girls only, and one Venture crew for girls who are ages 14-20.

Each Cub Scout pack is organized by dens of children who are in the same grade. Dens are boyonly or girl-only but they all have the same Cub Scout program. Dens meet weekly or bi-weekly. Pack meetings, where all the dens come together, are usually once a month gatherings. Packs also have special events like camping, hikes, picnics and community service.

In a Scouts BSA troop, the older youth are the leaders. Adult leaders are always present to mentor the youth leaders and make sure all safety rules are followed. Troops meet weekly to develop new skills. Troops usually camp, or have another outdoor experience like climbing or rafting, once a month. Scouts BSA troops are boy-only or girl-only.

In a Venturing crew, youth ages 14-20 join together for outdoor adventures, leadership, personal growth and service projects.

\$100K BEQUEST - SETS CHALLENGE MATCH

Bridges Outreach

Bridges is honored to announce a \$100,000 bequest from the estate of John J. Hurley of Chatham, NJ. Mr. Hurley found his way to Bridges through former Board Treasurer, Bob Rowan, and founders, Geoff and Ginger Worden, formerly of Summit, NJ. Bob and John's friendship during retirement was partially founded on a mutual connection to Bridges Outreach. Together they made numerous "Bridges Runs" to Newark. As John experienced the full impact of the Bridges Organization in action, he became a strong proponent of its work, ultimately working with Rowan and the former Executive Director, Lois Bhatt, to commit to this major gift.

Mr. Hurley was born in Glen Gardner before moving to Roselle Park, New Jersey. Having lost his parents early in life, he was raised by his godmother and her family as one of their own. After graduating from Roselle Park High School, he attended Rider University. He was also a US Army veteran. Professionally, Mr. Hurley worked for Wilkinson Sword, Inc. before it was associated with Gillette. While there, he was known for his attention to detail and respect of the family atmosphere. He ended his professional career as the Business Manager for Kent Place School. He managed the school's finances with respect for the program and the wisdom of careful spending. It is there that he connected with the Worden's, with whom he stayed in contact well after his retirement in 1997. Arlene Gibson, former Head of School at Kent Place, worked with John for nine years. She remembers him fondly as a man with a wry sense of humor who supported the school with care. "It is not surprising that John became involved with Bridges, a program in which the school's faculty, staff and students worked both to aid the homeless and to learn from them. I am touched by his gift and applaud Bridges in the effort to match his generosity."

Bridges is grateful for his commitment to our work, and we have begun the John J. Hurley Housing Success Fund with his bequest. This fund will help cover the cost of the voucher process, provide a basic care package, and extended transition support for those newly housed. Rich Uniacke, Executive Director, recognizes the long-term impact of this bequest. "Getting people out of homelessness and into housing, rather than shelter, is our highest aim. Keeping them successfully housed can itself be a challenging process which can last indefinitely. The establishment of this fund is meant to be a lasting tribute to the man who made this kind of impact possible."

Bridges' aim is to raise another \$200,000 dollars to match this gift by September 30, 2021 and transform the lives of those we serve-covering the costs of the housing voucher process and providing some basic items to start a new home. Bridges has raised \$96,000 of our \$200,000 goal, and we are asking for your help.

Founded in 1988, Bridges Outreach has supported people experiencing actively homelessness in New York City, Newark, Irvington, and Summit. Bridges works to end homelessness through volunteer driven outreach and case management focusing on health, and independence. We form housing, relationships with those experiencing homelessness while meeting their most urgent needs. With case managers at our drop-in center, Project Connect, in Newark, we have been the organization providing identity documents, access to health and social services, shelter, daily food, and connections to employment.

During the Covid-19 pandemic, Bridges has sustained Runs in New York City, Newark, and Irvington and self-care access in Summit. Bridges has also committed to Street Outreach in Newark seven nights a week to provide food, clothing, PPE, and access to Covid-safe shelter. We have worked tirelessly to permanently house 30 clients with HUD mainstream housing vouchers and are working to prevent imminent homelessness with rental arrears support. Since April 2020 with our volunteers and case managers hard at work, Bridges has had more than 1,100 shelter placements, distributed over 35,000 lunches, and served over 8,000 people.

JBWS HONORED ON 45TH ANNIVERSARY

Morris County recently honored JBWS for 45 years of service in combating domestic violence and aiding survivors of abuse during an anniversary dinner hosted by the organization in Florham Park.

JBWS, founded in 1976 as a hotline by a small group of domestic violence survivors, has since expanded its services to shelter and assist all people dealing with domestic violence. The organization works to protect and empower its clients as well as to rehabilitate family members, advocate for social change to prevent partner violence and educate the public about domestic violence and its consequences.

Morris County Commissioners presented a resolution. It declared that "JBWS be recognized and commended for its 45 years of outstanding service to the community and that all residents support those working diligently to end violence in our lives."

The Morris County resolution noted that, after the hotline calls increased in 1976, the need to help people find safety became more urgent following the tragic murders of two people who had reached out to the organization for help. The Morris County community responded by raising funds to open the Jersey Battered Women's Shelter in 1978. The organization later became known simply as the JBWS as its mission expanded beyond a hotline, safe house and counseling services.

Today, JBWS has more than 200 volunteers and provides transitional living arrangements. support for children and adolescents and provides batterers' intervention services. It also provides housing assistance, school-based teen dating abuse prevention programs, professional training and a multi-discipline family justice center.

More than 113,000 families have been sheltered or counseled by JBWS and 487,000 teens and adults have been educated about domestic violence.




The Fall Exhibit will run from September 26 through December 6, 2021 and is free and open to the public.

Susan Scarince Jones and Alan Jones, mixed media artists, are the combined solo exhibitors. The title for their show is "Nature's Impressions".

Susan, whose artwork is inspired by nature, especially landscapes of the southwest, enjoys creating impressionist paintings and collages using metal, copper and tin. Her colors range from warm earth and rust tones of the west to the cool blues, greens and pastel colors depicting spring gardens and trees of the eastern woodlands.

"I rarely use a plan other than the size of the canvas and the colors or textures I would like to use. Trusting my intuition, I let my art 'happen'. My main goal is to express myself and draw the viewer into my paintings," states Susan.

FRESH PRODUCE DELIVERED TO SENIORS

Morris County

Fresh produce picked at Ort Farms in Long Valley was packed in bags in August and distributed to senior citizens through a farm-to-table, pilot program operating this summer under a partnership between the long-time family farm and the Morris County Nutrition Program.

The cooperative arrangement allows senior citizens to order produce that will be bagged at the farm and delivered to their housing complex within 24 hours.

Morris County anticipates that nearly 200 bags of produce will be delivered this summer to seniors living in six Morris County senior housing units, said Christine Hellyer, director of the Morris County Division on Aging, Disabilities and Community Programming.

The Senior Farmers' Market Nutrition Program is a federally-funded program that provides low-income seniors with coupons that can be exchanged for eligible foods such as fruits, vegetables, honey, and fresh-cut herbs at farmers' markets, roadside stands, and community supported agriculture programs. In Morris County, the program is being administered through the Morris County Division on Aging, Disabilities and Community Programming's nutrition program.

The Morris County Nutrition Program provides seniors who meet certain income qualifications with hot nutritious meals,

education, and even opportunities for personal interaction through three program components: Congregate Meals, Home Delivered Meals and Weekend Meals. The program served 388,358 meals in 2020.

Now in its sixth generation, Ort Farms is a 400-acre farm currently run by three generations of the Ort family. The farm operates through all four seasons, offering home-grown produce and other goods at their market stand, as well as recreational activities for visitors.





20TH ANNIVERSARY 9/11 REMEMBRANCE CEREMONY

Morris County

Morris County will host a 9/11 rememberance ceremony on Sunday, Sept. 12, 2021, at 6 p.m. to observe the 20th Anniversary of the September 11, 2001 terrorist attacks with a special remembrance ceremony at the Morris County 9/11 Memorial on West Hanover Avenue in Parsippany-Troy Hills.

Keynote remarks will be provided by Firefighter Rebecca Asaro, who joined the Fire Department of New York (FDNY) along with three of her brothers in honor of their father, Carl Francis Asaro, one of 343 FDNY members killed on Sept. 11, 2001. He died just a month shy of his 38th birthday.

Asaro's firehouse in Midtown Manhattan was the hardest hit that day. Fifteen firefighters on Engine 54, Ladder 4, Battalion 9 - an entire shift - died as they responded to the devastation as it was unfolding at the Twin Towers.

Rebecca was only 9 years old when she, four siblings and her mother, Heloiza, lost their father and husband.

"I joined because my father was a firefighter who died in 9/11. Four of us followed in his footsteps, with my younger brother and me graduating the academy in 2019," Rebecca explained, noting she has uncles and close family friends who also are firefighters.

Carl, Jr., now 33 years old, was the first to join, followed by brother Matthew, age 32. Rebecca, 29, and younger brother Marc, 27, were featured in several news features when they graduated the academy two years ago.

Rebecca is now a member of Engine 54 – her father's unit.

FDNY veteran John Fila, a Boonton native and member of the Midtown firehouse, will join Rebecca in the Morris County ceremony. Fila had switched shifts that fateful day, or he too would have been among those killed. He has joined the Morris County ceremony in the past, sharing his experience and losses, including his food friend, Carl F. Asaro.

Fila will introduce Rebecca, who he has known since she was a child.

"John knew my family, my dad. He is a longtime family friend. It's an honor working with him," said Rebecca.

Morris County lost 64 residents in the terrorist attacks in New York, Pennsylvania and Washington D.C., on Sept. 11, 2001, and annually conducts a remembrance ceremony.

The Morris County 9/11 Memorial on West Hanover Avenue in Parsippany-Troy Hills was constructed to pay tribute to the nearly 3,000 people killed in the attacks, with an emphasis on the 64 Morris County residents lost that day. The names of all who died are engraved in ruby-colored paving stones set in the walkway surrounding the memorial, and the names of each of the 64 Morris County residents killed are additionally listed on individual, brass plates affixed atop of the memorial's inner wall.

The county's 9/11 event will include musical interludes, a chorus, and the march of a color guard up West Hanover Avenue to the Memorial that will include police, fire, rescue and emergency personnel from across Morris County. A special invocation will accompany a lighting of candles and the traditional reading of the names of each person from Morris County who died.

Seating at the Memorial is limited, so the public is encouraged to bring lawn chairs to the outdoor observance. Parking will be available at the Morris County Department of Human Services building at 340 West Hanover Ave., on the Morris Township side of the street. Shuttle buses will be available to transport those in need the short distance to the Memorial.




