FANWOOD-SCOTCH PLAINS ROTARY INDUCTS NEW OFFICERS

Submitted by Maria LaMorte-Wright On July 20, 2021, the Fanwood-Scotch Plains Rotary Club held their Installation Ceremony for the 2021-2022 Rotary year. New President Deanna Dell Bene was sworn in by Past District Governor Charlie Minton. The following officers were also inducted: Al Smith, President-Elect 2022-2023; Talib Morgan, Secretary; and Don Rosenberg, Treasurer.

The evening started with a presentation by outgoing President Julie Murphy. She noted that she was honored to lead the club during a particularly difficult year. She presented a Paul Harris award to Rotarian Patty Laguna, for her outstanding work and dedication as Secretary of the club. Additionally, other Rotary members were recognized for their contributions during an unusual and challenging year. Several key initiatives were completed during Murphy's presidency, including: SPF Resource Central, led by Deanna Del Bene- a centralized Coronovirus information resource for the towns of Scotch Plains and Fanwood; and a Mask Team led by Carmela Resnick, who made fabric masks and raised \$16,000 for local food banks, from the sale of those masks. They also held their first virtual Trivia Night, led by Rotarian Wayne Zuhl. Past District 7475 Governor Ann Walko was recognized for her successful year and District conference, raising over \$50,000 for the Rotary International Foundation Annual Fund. Rotarian Mike Walko was given the District 7475 Military Service and EMT awards.

Murphy presented the Joseph Y. Qutub Service Award to two amazing Interactors from SPF High School. Interact is a Rotary service club for young people. Congratulations to Evelyn Liang and Marley Holston.

President Deanna Dell Bene will be one of FSP Rotary's youngest presidents. She began her Rotary year by reinstating in-person meetings and she hopes to bring back all of the Rotary traditions that were placed on-hold during the pandemic.

Dell Bene is "so honored and humbled to be trusted with the responsibility of leading the greatest Rotary Club in the Universe, the

MICHAEL BRAMHALL NAMED POLICE DIRECTOR

Borough of Fanwood

The Fanwood Borough Council passed a resolution during its regular monthly meeting August 16, 2021, to hire Michael Bramhall as Police Director.

Director Bramhall is the former chief of the West Caldwell Police Department where he served for 27 years, starting as a patrolman and rising through the ranks. He most recently was training officer for the Essex County Prosecutor's Office and worked for a year as Special Assistant to the Newark Public Safety Director. His official start date was Monday, August 23rd.

Director Bramhall has described himself as a

builder of relationships between police and the community, an important quality as Fanwood's Police Department strives to do the same. He visited Fanwood during the National Night Out held in August and got his first taste of the town and some of his officers. He told the Council that his first impression of Fanwood and its citizens is overwhelmingly positive.

The Fanwood Police Department entered a transitional period last August when Chief Richard Trigo retired and his two Lieutenants did the same shortly thereafter. Since then, the Union County Prosecutor's Office has been in charge of the department.

FRAZEE HOUSE SEPTEMBER AND OCTOBER FESTIVITIES

The progressing toward the second phase of renovation, will host September and October festivities on its site.

"We're excited to once again host activities at the Frazee farmstead, home of Aunt Betty Frazee, a brave woman who stepped onto her porch to defy the British on their march past her house in 1777," said Andy Calamaras, president of the Rotary Frazee House committee. The committee has spearheaded a 14-year project to rescue the house's structure and ready it for restoration to the American Revolutionary period. Last year,

ancient Frazee farmstead, now the external renovation of the Frazee House was orientation at the restored Frazee homestead, completed and this year the internal renovation is scheduled to begin.

> All three events, besides providing engagement to county residents and lovers of history, will benefit the "Save the Frazee House" project, an effort to complete the renovation of the historic house.

> First, the Frazee House Ghost Walking Tour will take place at the site during the weekends of September 18-19 and October 9-10. The 90 minute tours will be led by renowned psychicmedium Jane Doherty and will begin with a short



including details about the spirit world. It will proceed with a walk along the property, stopping at each "ghost hangout" to reveal the stories and secrets there. The Frazee House Committee is excited to introduce this new event. Tickets are \$25 per person and must be purchased in advance. Additional information can be found on the Frazee House website, frazeehouse.org.

Second, the Great Pumpkin Patch is ongoing from October 5 through 31. During this event, pumpkins of all sizes will be sold every day, from 11 a.m. to dusk at the Frazee site. The location will be decorated for Halloween and is the perfect setting for fall photos.

Finally, the Rotary Frazee House committee and the Township of Scotch Plains will host the 5th annual Harvest Festival at the Frazee Farmstead. Activities will entice every age group: live music, games, pony rides, a petting zoo, food trucks, pumpkin tossing, a haunted trail and the Great Pumpkin Patch. "We've made amazing progress on the Frazee renovation," said Calamaras. The Harvest Festival is another opportunity for the community to visit the site and see for themselves — rain or shine at the Frazee House site, 1451 Raritan Road in Scotch Plains, Saturday October 16, from 12:00 p.m. to 5:00 p.m.

FANWOOD SUMMER FANJAM – SEPT. 11

Greater Westfield Area Chamber of Commerce

On Saturday, September 11 from 11 a.m. – 7 p.m., the community will come together in Fanwood's LaGrande Park for the first major local event since New Jersey lifted Covid restrictions. The date is also special because it marks the 20th anniversary of the September 11th attacks. In addition to the signature combo of live bands, food trucks and classic cars that bring people to the festival, this year's Fanwood Summer FanJam, with major sponsors Dentalcare Associates and the Fanwood Animal Hospital, will feature tributes to First Responders, including an honor guard, to mark the somber anniversary. Because of the pandemic, the event

hasn't been held since summer of 2019, making this the 4th Annual.

"We didn't know if we were going to be able to bring FanJam back in 2021, and once we got the green light, we had to move quickly to organize everything," said Aimee Nuzzo, event director and Fanwood resident. "We are blown away by the positive response we're seeing from the community and from our sponsors."

The free festival is run by the Greater Westfield Area Chamber of Commerce (GWACC), with contributions from additional local sponsors OceanFirst Bank, Northfield Bank, The Soho at Fanwood Station and



Sheelen's Crossing.

"I'm overjoyed about the return of the FanJam! This has always been an exciting event for our town," said Fanwood Mayor Colleen Mahr. "This year we have the added element of honoring our local first responders and commemorating the 20th anniversary of the 9-11 attacks. Please bring your family to LaGrande Park on September 11."

Gene Jannotti, CEO of GWACC, stated, "The Chamber is very happy to once again be able to bring this community event to Fanwood where everyone can come together for a day of music, fun and relaxation while at the same time not forgetting that terrible day in our nation's history, 9-11."

This year's music lineup will feature double headliners: The Funktion Band mixes Funk, Soul, Pop & R&B to play favorites from Motown to today. Black Dog, the popular local Led Zeppelin Tribute band that headlined the 1st Fanwood Summer Fan Jam will return to rock the stage at LaGrande Park.

Other local acts will include Bored of Ed (hard rock), Velvet Jones (Grunge Rock / 80s & 90s) and up and coming young singer/actress Shiloh Verrico. All of the acts are New Jersey based and most have roots in Fanwood or Scotch Plains.

For 21 & Over: Adults 21 & older with ID can enjoy a front-seat view of the show from the Sheelen's Crossing Beer and Wine Garden.

For Kids: A centrally located Kids' Zone will feature children's rides and attractions within the park, with the purchase of tickets.

For Car Enthusiasts: The festival will draw more than 100 vintage and classic cars as part of a car show hosted by Hot Rod Mike. Portions of Helen Street, 2nd Street and LaGrande Avenue will be closed to traffic for the car show, which is open to all. Cars register upon arrival on a firstcome basis for a fee of \$10.

FanJam goers can sample a diverse cuisine from food trucks and local restaurants.

Bring your lawn chairs, picnic blankets and the whole family.

Free Parking is available at the South Side lot of the Fanwood train station.
