GIRL SCOUT GOLD AWARD PROJECT CELEBRATES VETERANS

The names, ranks and stories of 14 military veterans will have a permanent place in Warren Township. Francesca Salas, a Girl Scout and rising junior at Mount Saint Mary Academy, interviewed veterans, and recorded the service and sacrifices they made for our country, for her Gold Award project. The Gold Award is the highest award that a Girl Scout can earn.

Francesca, a Warren resident, has honored these veterans with individual framed certificates placed in display cases with an American flag folded into a triangle.

On Flay Day, there was a ceremony to reveal the cases which hang in the Suzie B Boyce meeting room in the Warren municipal building. In attendance were all 14 veterans and their families, members of the Warren Lions Club, Watchung Hills Elks, local policemen, Brightview Senior Center veterans, and Chelsea veterans, members of the Township Committee, Township Administrator Mark Krane, Deputy Mayor Victor Sordillo, and Mayor George Lazo.

Francesca decided to do her Gold Award on veterans in appreciation for her deceased grandfather who served in the Navy.

"Honoring our veterans is something I felt our community needed," said Francesca. "The most rewarding part of my Gold Project was showing up at Starbucks in town greeted by 10 veterans who were just waiting to tell me their stories and share their lives with me about their service to our country. This project has made a lasting impression on me."

Deputy Mayor Victor Sordillo said "the display showed Salas' dedication to the community and to our freedoms and what makes Warren New Jersey great!"

Township committeewoman Jolanta Maziarz remarked "the township needs more aspiring female leaders like Francesca Salas."

WARREN HUSBAND AND WIFE TEAM FIND 100 DOGS LOVING HOMES

I am on the Board of Island Animal Alliance, a small Bridgewater-based rescue founded by President, Niki Dawson, that pulls abandoned dogs and cats from Puerto Rico and transports them to New Jersey where they are placed in loving homes. Puerto Rico has over 500,000 dogs that roam the streets with no access to food or veterinary care. As a result of this "stray dog epidemic," municipal shelters are constantly euthanizing these street dogs. My husband, Marc, and myself, with the help of several rescue groups in Puerto Rico, identify which dogs (and often cats) are going to be transported, arrange flights as well as receiving partners here in New Jersey. We then pick them up at Newark Airport and bring them to our home in Warren where receiving rescues await them. All this is funded through fundraising and by charitable donations.

Early August marked our 100th dog that we (as husband and wife team) transported from Puerto Rico in just 7 months into 2021.

Get your kids back on track!

10 TIPS TO HELP YOUR STUDENT WITH HOMEWORK AND STUDYING

The 2020-2021 school year might be the most diverse yet in terms of how kids and teens will be learning. Whether you're doing online classes, homeschooling, in-person learning or some hybrid mix, we've got some tips to help your student with homework and studying.

- **1.** Encourage your study to keep a planner with assignments, quizzes and tests, as well as long-term project deadlines. As a general rule, aim to complete work 3-5 day in advance so they'll have extra time if something unexpected goes wrong (like a power outage).
- **2.** Rather than cramming for a test the night before, encourage your student to study daily in small chunks of time; 15-20 minutes should be plenty if it's done regularly.
- **3.** Index cards or flash cards can help with vocabulary or math formulas. Use different colors to help your brain make connections by association for each fact.
- **4.** Don't allow your student to stay up all night to study. You're better off encouraging them to get a full night's sleep and then studying a bit more in the morning.
- **5.** Focus on nutrition, including a mix of protein and carbs with every snack or meal. The brain needs fuel to work

- properly and sugar, caffeine and saturated fats can hinder learning and memory.
- **6.** If you're not strong enough in a particular subject to help older students, consider pairing up with another parent who is or ask for extra help from teachers during scheduled online office hours.
- **7.** Remove all distractions during school-related sessions, including homework. This includes TVs, laptops and cell phones. Some students perform fine (or better!) with music, while others need complete silence.
- **8.** Set smaller goals for students to help them create a sense of achievement. As a general rule, the younger the child, the smaller the goal should be.
- **9.** Celebrate milestones. Finishing a book or project, wrapping up a semester or completing a particularly difficult chapter in a book may feel like an insurmountable task to some students. Mark the occasion with accolades!
- **10.** Review your student's homework nightly. Rushing through homework in order to watch a movie or get to soccer practice doesn't indicate learning or comprehension; their focus should be on understanding the material-not just completing it.



FLINTLOCKS RUN CUB SCOUT WOOD TOOLS BADGE PROGRAM

The Flintlocks BSA, Inc. ran the Cub Scout Wood Tools Program at the Watchung Mountain District Spring Cub Family Camporee at Boy Scout Camp Winnebago in Rockaway, NJ this spring.

Fifty-three Cub Scouts earned a Woodcraft badge by learning about how to use wood tools, safety measures, and building a small bird house. The program starts with one of the Flintlocks explaining how to use wood tools properly and important safety measures. After the Cub Scouts build their bird house, they may practice using screwdrivers and a coping saw. The parents work with the children, and the Flintlocks offer guidance.

The Camporee has many different activities, including Archery, Batting cages, BB guns, First Aid Classes, and Fishing Derby, Climbing wall, Basketball, Volleyball, a 2-mile Hike, Rockets and Catapults. The shooting sports programs have NJ State Certified Instructors. Since it is a family camporee, and since girls may now join scouts, entire families may enjoy the fun, and the scouts earn various badges. Attendance at the camporee was 150 scouts with an equal number of parents. This was one of the first big events at the scout camp since the shutdown over a year ago.

The Flintlocks BSA, Inc are a group of 27 retired scouters who volunteer every week all year round to help the scout camps of the Patriot's Path Council. They are incorporated as a separate 501c3. Facebook page is "Flintlocks". They do maintenance at the camps, build cabins, tent platforms, picnic tables, etc. In 2018 they built a STEM lab classroom for scientific related merit badges. The members also volunteer to help the scouts with various programs throughout the year. The Flintlocks purchase lumber from a lumber mill, then make the parts for the craft kits in their wood shop which are sold at the Council Scout shops. Bird houses have the bottoms attached with screws since a mother bird wants to build a new nest every year. The old nest needs

to be cleaned out in the fall so a new family can Fanwood, Garwood, Gillette, Long Hill start over again in the spring.



WELLNESS CENTER AVAILABLE AT NO-COST


The Mental Health Association in New Jersey is providing a new virtual wellness center that offers no-cost groups and workshops statewide to individuals interested in day-to-day wellness, support for substance use disorder and strategies for improving mental health.

Called United by Wellness, the center can be accessed online or by call-in. More than 45 groups and workshops are offered daily, including weekends. Among the variety of groups are Healthy Habits, Meditation, LGBTQ, Young Adult, Anxiety and Depression Support Groups, Grief and COVID, Too Much Stuff, Virtual Job Interviews, Peer Support Career Information, and Grief and Recovery.

are organized Groups into four "communities" for like-minded people with similar goals, but participants are not limited to a specific track. The communities are general well-being; coping skills; co-occurring mental health and substance use; and a community for facilitating groups in Spanish.

The Mental Health Association in New Jersey had been offering in-person meetings at satellite offices around the state, but during the pandemic all meetings were transitioned to online. That enabled interested participants from every county to access meetings. During COVID, the number of people attending online groups more than doubled, according to leadership at the nonprofit, which they attribute to increased need, ease of access, and reduced barriers related to transportation and childcare.

MIDDLE SCHOOL TEACHERS SEE AN INCREASE IN STUDENT ENGAGEMENT

Warren Township Public Schools

Warren Middle School (WMS) Teachers Mrs. Gina Banks, Mrs. Jessica Decelle, and Mrs. Leslie Ortega have implemented a strategy in their classrooms that has ignited a spark in their students as well as increased student engagement within their classrooms.

Using Podcasts in a classroom setting has been found to be a powerful educational tool to promote curiosity, interest, optimism, and a passion for learning. Since including digital audio files into their lessons, in addition to traditional reading, Banks, Decelle, and Ortega have noticed an improvement in their students' listening skills and classroom engagement. The increased classroom engagement has been extremely beneficial for the student's social and emotional wellbeing.

According to Banks, "Students must be 'all ears' while listening to the 15-20 minute episodes. They have learned a great deal about the art of note-taking since while they can go back and re-listen to the podcast episode, they can't 're-read' the text. Thus, they are learning to take great notes, and they are always prepared to discuss their notes which include key events, questions, clues, suspects, and theories with their peers."

The students are currently listening to The

Unexplainable Disappearance of Mars Patel. This story for middle school students, performed by middle school students, is a serial mystery adventure following a group of eleven-year-olds trying to find their missing friends.

Most importantly, the students are thrilled about adding podcasts to their classroom experience. When asked to give an example of one benefit of listening to a podcast, the students were excited to share their thoughts. Some found that a podcast can promote a different, or in one student's case, a better understanding of the story.

"I liked the podcast because there were sound effects and different voices of the characters to make me visualize it better," said 6th Grade student Alexandra.

"I enjoyed the Mars Patel podcast and podcasts in general because you can hear the characters talk and learn more about the characters. You can also understand the topic much better than you would in a book," explained 6th Grade student Jared.

While some students may prefer using a podcast as an educational tool, many of the grade 6 students agreed that they still love reading a book just as much.

"I like the Mars Patel podcast and podcasts in general because you can feel the feelings of the characters better and you can hear their voices. When you hear their voices it helps you envision what they would look like better than in a book. But I still really like books and their feel and the information in them," said 6th Grade student Abriel

All three middle school educators are delighted to see their students' enthusiasm. The teachers describe the students as eager and excited to listen to the podcast episodes to gather new information and clues to try and unravel the mystery.





PUBLIC ASKED TO BE ALERT FOR EHD IN DEER

The Division's Office of Fish and Wildlife nicole.lewis@dep.nj.gov. Health and Forensics is asking those who are out in the fields and woods of New Jersey at this time of year to be alert for deer that may be affected by Epizootic Hemorrhagic Disease (EHD) and to report any suspected cases to the Division.

Symptoms of HD in deer may include difficulty standing, drooling, lethargy, respiratory distress, emitting foam from the mouth or nose, and swelling of the face, tongue, and neck. Because the disease causes fever, sick or dead deer are often seen in or near water, after drinking or attempting to cool off. Affected deer may also show reduced activity, loss of appetite, and develop ulcerations on their tongue.

Deer exhibiting any of the above-mentioned signs in late summer and fall, or dead deer observed in or near water should be reported to the Bureau of Wildlife Management at any one of the following numbers: Deer Biologist - Jodi Powers, 609-259-6965; Division Veterinarian -Dr. Nicole Lewis, 908-735-6398 or email

HD is not a public health issue. Neither EHD nor BT viruses can be transmitted to people, and humans are not at risk by handling infected deer, being bitten by infected midges, or eating infected deer meat - though the Division of Fish and Wildlife strongly advises against consuming meat from any game animal that appears ill.

EHD virus rarely infects domestic animals, while BT is a known disease of domestic animals such as sheep, cattle, goats, and even domestic dogs. To date, no cases of livestock illness related to BT have been reported. People suspecting HD in domestic animals should have them tested for the virus.

Additional information may be obtained from the State Veterinarian's Office at 609-671-6400. The New Jersey Department of Agriculture's Animal Health Diagnostic Laboratory (AHDL) can assist in diagnosing suspected BT cases by offering testing and necropsy services. The AHDL can be contacted by calling 609-406-6999 or e-mailing jerseyvetlab@ag.state.nj.us.
