





WESTFIELD ROTARY SUPPORTS NIGERIAN MEDICAL CLINIC

Father Kingsley spoke to the Rotary Club of Westfield on Tuesday, July 20 to update them of the progress being made on the Medical Clinic in Nigeria. The Rotary Club of Westfield is supporting his project in Nigeria with a Rotary

International Global Grant. The Rotary Club Board of Directors voted to contribute \$7,000. Several other Rotary Clubs joined Westfield which were: Irvington, NJ, Hartford, CT, and the Rotary Club of Owerri, Nigeria. The Rotary District matched those funds raised by the clubs, and The Rotary International Foundation matched the whole package, so the Global Grant amounted to \$32,000. We are using these funds to purchase medical supplies for the Clinic. Past President Clark Lagemann has done the lion's share of the work. Rotarian Dr. D. Michael Hart is the Rotary District 7475 Foundation Chair and has been guiding the Global Grant process. Immediate past president Liz Ensslin has been very supportive of the project, and has motivated the club members.

Father Kingsley sends a container of supplies to the village of Obike, Nigeria several times a year. The container is shipped from Meriden, CT. It needs to be packed two weeks before leaving, is shipped to Lagos, Nigeria, then needs to be transported inland to the village. It takes more than a month to arrive.

Past President Clark Lagemann showed the club members a video of Father Kingsley touring the two-story medical facility with a birthing center, an emergency room, operating rooms and outpatient services. It includes a generator to supply power and a bore hole well with a water tower to supply water. The building is almost

finished and is ready to receive furniture and equipment. The video will be posted on the Rotary Club of Westfield website, westfieldrotary.com.

Father Kingsley showed the club members the foundation of the primary school next to the medical facility. The nearest school is an hour walk away. They plan to build three schoolsnursery, primary and secondary schools to serve about 400 children in the local village.

The advantage of a Rotary Global Grant is that the funds raised by the club are matched by the district, then matched again by the Rotary District, so it multiplies your funds and increases the effectiveness of the grant.

The Rotary Club of Westfield meets three times a month, twice by Zoom, and once in person. Rotary is a service club and business networking club, for successful business people who want to give back to the community. Guests are welcome at the meetings. MAKING MAGICAL MEMORIES AT CAMP FATIMA

Like most nonprofit organizations, Camp Fatima of New Jersey is experiencing major challenges due to COVID-19. Founded in 1968 by four Seton Hall seminary students, the camp offers free sleep-away programs for disabled children and adults. And it's determined to continue doing so. Seeing the smiles on the faces of those it serves, and providing a respite to their families, is not something that can be sacrificed due to a pandemic.

And smile they do. It's not called FATIMAGIC for nothing. The campers, regardless of their disabilities, get to do things that most able-bodied children and adults take for granted. They splash around in pools, sing songs, eat s'mores, dance, and take part in arts and crafts. Every child has his or her own dedicated counselor to ensure the utmost care, so each activity can be individually tailored according to the camper's ability.

Its mission statement, "Camp Fatima provides free, life enriching camp experiences for children and adults with developmental disabilities," says it all. Some of the campers are in wheelchairs, while others have neurological, sensory or other serious issues. Camp Fatima and its volunteers open their hearts to all who come. It truly is a magical place.

The volunteers come from diverse ethnic and socio-economic backgrounds. Most have experience working directly with the disabled,

and include teachers, nurses, police officers, firefighters, college students and other professionals. For these selfless individuals, the sounds of laughter and the looks of pure joy on the campers' faces are all the payment they need.

Many of these volunteers live locally. Billy Malone, a Scotch Plains firefighter and Fanwood resident, became a volunteer in 1994 and has been the chairperson for the past 13 years. Scotch Plains resident and former Scotch Plains police officer, Jamie Denman, has been a volunteer since 1979, and is the current director.

Even though no one at the camp is paid, all this magic requires funding. It costs several hundred thousand dollars to operate the two children's summer sessions and the four adult weekends each year. Funding to support and host the more

each year. Funding to support and host the more

than 200 campers and over 450 on site-volunteers comes from generous benefactors, corporate matching gifts, private giving, and fundraising. Because of COVID-19, many of the usual fundraisers are not able to take place. So this year, Camp Fatima is looking for individuals to sponsor a camper. The cost to feed, house, and supply materials to each camper is more than \$1,000.


Sebastián is accepted to SUNY Maritime College and will enter the Regiment of Cadets in August. His goal is to obtain a United States



"Being an ITS this past year has tested my perseverance but, each day, I have been in awe of the technology advances my colleagues and our students have made," says Rygiel who credits the district technology team for their hard work as well. "When life hands you lemons, you make lemonade. Well, the Westfield teachers have truly made some of the best lemonade in their use of technology this past year."

"Nancy's passion for math is infectious and helps motivate her students to do their best," says one letter of nomination. Another nominator writes: "In a year full of uncertainty and change, one thing has remained constant: Nancy Rygiel's passion, heart, perseverance, and determination."

The Philhower Fellowship was established in 1993 by the Rotary Club to honor former Westfield Rotarian Charles Philhower. An educator for more than 50 years, Philhower, who died in 1962, was supervising principal (superintendent) of Westfield schools for three decades as well as co-founder and past president of the Rotary Club of Westfield.

"I am deeply humbled and extremely honored to receive this award," Rygiel says. "I feel strongly that teaching, especially this past year, is a team effort, so I share this award with members of our community: my teacher friends who work tirelessly every day, but even more so this past year; our administrators, custodians, nurses, and secretaries who help things run smoothly and keep us safe; the Westfield parents who partner with teachers to help us and support our best efforts; and most importantly our students who have demonstrated how amazingly adaptive and resilient they are. This past year, every member of our community earned the title of Teacher of the Year."



After more than a dozen years championing Court Appointed Special Advocates (CASA) of Union and its mission – whether as a volunteer advocate who served five youth or as a longstanding board member - Dr. Ron Silver of Mountainside has completed his tenure at the helm of the nonprofit's Board of Trustees, and now begins a two-year post as Ex-Officio.

Said Silver, "As a former dentist, I've provided care for many people, but nothing prepared me for the passion I found helping children thrust into the foster system through no fault of their own. The best way to describe my years with CASA is 'honored.' I'm honored to have spent five years advocating for as many foster youth and honored to have been part of a Board that shares my commitment to changing children's lives for the better."

Executive Director Mariel S. Hufnagel noted, "While it is difficult to see Ron hand over the leadership reins after stewardship through unprecedented changes and growth - and on a personal note, the only President I've worked with thus far – the knowledge he will remain an active member of the Board of Trustees for two more years as Ex-Officio, makes it easier. That,

and the fact his successor is not only our current Gould, also of Westfield, has served as the Vice President, but also a former CASA volunteer with boots-on-the-ground experience, makes this transition seamless; and, I am hopeful and excited for all that lies ahead for our small-but-mighty organization and the vulnerable child-victims we serve. On behalf of the Board, my staff and our volunteers, I and they, extend our highest gratitude and deepest appreciation for Ron's years of stellar commitment."

Taking the reins as President is Anne Collart of Westfield, who trained as a CASA volunteer in 2008 and advocated for her foster youth for two years until permanency was achieved and the case closed. An associate at Gibbons in Newark, Collart joined the Board in 2017. She noted, "I am honored to follow in Ron's footsteps. This pandemic presented unprecedented has challenges for physical and mental health, housing, education and employment - all of which can have an even greater impact on those in the child welfare system. Our staff and volunteers have made great strides in pivoting to be responsive to those needs, and I hope to support that flexibility and innovation as we carry out our mission."

Newly named Vice President Teresa Torres

Board's Advocate Liaison since 2018, first trained as a CASA volunteer in Connecticut and, upon relocation to the Garden State, trained and advocated for a teen with no one else in his corner – or this country. Four years later, the young man is living independently, no longer in care and the duo remain in one another's life. Of her new role, Gould said, "It is truly gratifying and humbling to be selected the next Vice President. As a former advocate, I understand the needs of our foster children and have always believed and worked in establishing a safe and stable home for each child. I look forward to continuing that work as well as facing any new challenges that lay ahead."

Through court-ordered access to foster parents, doctors, caseworkers, therapists and teachers, CASA volunteers ensure the best interests of youth involved in the child welfare system remain priority as all parties work toward establishing a safe, stable and permanent home. VIRTUAL WELLNESS CENTER AVAILABLE AT NO-COST

The Mental Health Association in New Jersey is providing a new virtual wellness center that offers no-cost groups and workshops statewide to individuals interested in day-to-day wellness, support for substance use disorder and strategies for improving mental health.

Called United by Wellness, the center can be accessed online or by call-in. More than 45 groups and workshops are offered daily, including weekends. Among the variety of groups are Healthy Habits, Meditation, LGBTQ, Young Adult, Anxiety and Depression Support Groups, Grief and COVID, Too Much Stuff, Virtual Job Interviews, Peer Support Career Information, and Grief and Recovery.

Groups organized are into "communities" for like-minded people with similar goals, but participants are not limited to a specific track. The communities are general well-being; coping skills; co-occurring mental

health and substance use; and a community for those with a disorder who are seeking employment. Staff providing services are culturally diverse certified peer specialists, including some who are bilingual and facilitating groups in Spanish.

The Mental Health Association in New Jersey had been offering in-person meetings at satellite offices around the state, but during the pandemic all meetings were transitioned to online. That enabled interested participants from every county to access meetings. During COVID, the number of people attending online groups more than doubled, according to leadership at the nonprofit, which they attribute to increased need, ease of access, and reduced barriers related to transportation and childcare.

UNION COUNTY POSTMASTERS SHARE TIPS FOR RESPONSIBLE PET OWNERSHIP

Last year 169 letter carriers were victimized by dogs in New Jersey, including 16 in Union County. The 15 postmasters serving the 21 municipalities in Union County are therefore raising public awareness of the importance of responsible pet ownership in helping prevent dog bites.

To prevent dog bites, Union County Postmasters recommend the following responsible pet ownership tips:

- Obedience training can teach dogs proper behavior and help owners control their dog in any situation.
- When the letter carrier comes to your home, keep your dog inside, away from the door, in another room, or on a leash.
- Dogs can be protective of their territory and may interpret the actions of letter carriers as a

threat. Please take precautions when accepting mail in the presence of your pet.

 Dogs that haven't been properly socialized, receive little attention or handling, or are left tied-up for long periods of time frequently turn into biters.

By following these few simple tips, pet owners can significantly improve neighborhood safety for everyone.




