

NEW POLICE DEPARTMENT AND COURT BUILDING OPENS

Township of Clark Mayor Bonaccorso welcomed citizens and


dignitaries to the grand opening of the Clark Police Headquarters and Municipal Court on Saturday, September 18. The ceremony included a statement by the mayor, a look at a time-capsule to be enshrined within the building and a ribboncutting.

"It's been a long time coming and we are proud to present this new space to our law enforcement officials and those they serve," said Bonaccorso. "We are also proud to have built it in a fiscally sound way so as not to burden the taxpayers of this town. May God bless those that serve here for all the years to come."

After the initial part of the ceremony, the mayor invited attendees inside to dedicate the courtroom and council chambers to John Laezza, the former Business Administrator of Clark Township for 20 years, prior to his death early this year. Laezza was directly involved in managing the funding, engaging architects and contractors and day to day oversight of project completion in his final years with the township. The facility is now officially named the John F. Laezza Council Chambers and Courthouse.

BLESSING OF The Animals – Oct. 3

The Episcopal Church of St. John the Baptist, 230 Melrose Terrace in Linden, will host their annual Blessing of the Animals on Sunday, October 3, 2021, at 2 p.m. A rain date is scheduled for October 10.

The Blessing will take place on the great lawn of the church. People participating in the event are asked to bring a folding chair. All persons coming to the event must wear a face mask to create a healthy environment and to comply with worship requirements established by the Episcopal Diocese of New Jersey. Spaces will be designated on the great lawn to allow for social distancing.

A short Christian prayer service will begin at 2 p.m. and will include an individual blessing of animals. The priest will come to each animal and, with the owner's permission, bless the animal without touching the animal. Donations will be accepted for a local animal shelter.

The Blessing of the Animals takes place on the first Sunday of October since the blessing remembers St. Francis of Assisi, the Patron Saint of Animals, whose feast is celebrated on October 4. Throughout his life, St. Francis was known to preach to the birds, release rabbits caught in traps or fish caught by people, and even make peace between a wolf and the people of Gubbio whom the wolf terrorized.

Pedals for Progress, in its continuing effort to recycle bicycles properly, is having a used bike collection sponsored by the Westfield Rotary Club. Anyone with an adult or child's bicycle in repairable condition is urged to donate his or her bike to this worthy cause.

Pedals for Progress does not accept bikes for parts or disassembled bikes. Bikes can be dropped off from 9 a.m. to noon on Saturday, October 9, rain or shine, at the board of education building, located at Walnut and Elm Streets in Westfield.

To date, more than 159,000 bikes and 5,100 sewing machines have been shipped to developing countries in Latin America, Africa and Eastern Europe. These bikes provide reliable transportation for commuting to work,

transporting produce to market, or accessing health care and other services.

It costs \$45 to collect, process, ship, rebuild and distribute each bicycle. A donation toward shipping costs is necessary (suggested minimum \$20 per bike). All cash and material donations are fully tax deductible and a receipt will be available at the collection site.

US SPACE FORCE: GUARDIANS OF THE HIGH FRONTIER

Civil Air Patrol Cadet Program (NJ-102)

As we explore new horizons, the United States expands beyond what is imaginable. With the creation of the US Space Force, the country truly embodies the notion of "reaching for the stars"! On June 29, 2021, Captain "Bud" Jackson Composite Squadron (NJ-102) of the Civil Air Patrol (CAP), an Auxiliary of the United States Air Force, had special guest speakers from the US Space Force - Major Jose Almanzar and Captain Ronald Nguyen. In a virtual meeting of over 110 participants, including visitors from other CAP squadrons, attended and the speakers shared the goal and purpose of this new branch of the military, talked about their jobs, gave advice to the cadets considering the path and much more. There was time for a Q&A session, where the speakers provided valuable information towards a wide range of cadet/senior member questions. Cadets took away extensive information to inspire them about this new exciting path of space research and operations.

Headquartered at the Pentagon, the US Space Force is an independent branch of the military that was carved out of the Air Force in December 2019. With their Command motto as "Guardians of the High Frontier", the US Space Force is considered a critical asset, impacting everyday life. Although it is currently the smallest of the US armed services, the Space Force is responsible for operating and defending military satellites and ground stations and supports communication and navigation on Earth. It provides a much needed position of strength, especially technology-wise, for protecting US interests in space or going on offense, if needed, in the future. Civilian life cannot survive without our space capabilities. Our military based missions are now largely supported by space operations. Additionally, as space tourism is about to lift off in the coming years, the US will have a growing space community.

As an empowerment message to the young cadets, Maj Almanzar and Capt Nguyen talked about the Space Force's need for bold and diverse leaders with new ideas. 


