Green Brook flooded like many of our local towns during Hurricane Ida on September 1. Bright Beginnings Daycare, located at 923 Washington Ave., Green Brook, was right in the heart of the flooding.

As we know many people lost the first floor of their homes to flooding, so did Lisa Riccioni's daycare. Lisa and her staff lost all the kids toys, books and all basic office supplies. They had to gut the entire building and re-sheet rock and start over.

Green Brook Boy Scout Troop 129 heard of their need to rebuild and as a small business in town we were happy to help. The troop posted a flyer on social media and asked for toy donations and within a week or two we had a trailer full of toys, crayons, books and more.

On September 20, the Boy Scouts arrived, unloaded, cleaned and helped the daycare staff so they could reopen the doors 3 weeks after their flooding. A few of our high school scouts were welcomed back by Ms. Lisa and Ms. Josephine from 14-16 years ago when they attended the daycare. Lisa was extremely touched and grateful to all those who donated and the kindness of the Boy Scouts.





VOLUNTEER SPOTLIGHT ON CARRIE BROOKNER

CASA SHaW

Our Volunteer Spotlight this month highlights one of our CASA volunteers who has been an amazing CASA volunteer for some time now: Carrie Brookner!

Carrie has been married to her husband, Jeffrey, for 27 years. They have two amazing children, Dennis and Jessica. Dennis is 24 and in graduate school and Jessica is 19 and a rising college sophomore.

When Carrie is not engaging her CASA case, she enjoys spending time with her family and traveling when possible. At home, she enjoys playing mahjongg with her girlfriends and working on home improvement projects with her husband. She also recently enrolled in a graduate certificate program in Medical Device Regulatory Affairs. Her coursework is keeping her busy!

How did Carrie come to CASA SHaW? Well, she had spent many years as an active volunteer in her children's schools, serving as PTO president and chairing a variety of events. As her children became more independent and their schools needed less parental support, she was looking for a way to make a difference in the broader community. She recently said, "when I learned about CASA, I knew this was a great way to make a difference in the life of a child who was facing trauma or other challenges. I had the time and love to give and I feel strongly that every child deserves a trusted adult in their life who puts their needs first. It's heartbreaking to hear some of the children's stories, and I want to make sure each child has a dedicated advocate."

We also asked Carrie what she's gotten out of the "CASA experience" thus far. She said, "I have learned a lot by being a CASA advocate. The training program educated me in so many ways and further motivated me to stay involved. I have seen how truly important the 'little things' are to the children in our cases, just like they are to all kids. These children are in difficult situations through no fault of their own and they need unconditional love and support."

Carrie's current CASA child is 15 months old and she has been on her case since she was a

newborn. At first this case seemed very straightforward, and it was not always clear that her involvement was making a difference in the life of a baby. However, in the last few months the case has become more complicated and demonstrated how important an independent CASA voice has been. Adoption may end up being the best for her particular case. We asked Carrie what the most gratifying part of being a CASA volunteer has been. She said, "knowing that I really made a difference in a child's life and was able to make sure her home was safe before she returned. Hearing the law guardian often quote my reports in court, I knew my findings were taken seriously and had an impact. My CASA child really needed someone in her corner, and I am happy I was able to do that for her."

We are thrilled and happy that Carrie has been able to do that for her CASA child as well! As we are with all of our CASA volunteers, we truly are grateful for all that Carrie has done and will continue to do in the future for abused and neglected children in our region.

CASA of Somerset, Hunterdon, and Warren Counties is part of a statewide network of community-based, non-profit programs that recruit, screen, train and supervise volunteers to "Speak Up for a Child" removed from home due to abuse or neglect. CASA is the only program in New Jersey that uses trained volunteers to work one-on-one with children, ensuring that each one gets the services needed and achieves permanency in a safe, nurturing home. Did you know that approximately 14 million middle and high school students are on their own after school? In Somerset County, where individuals aged 18 years or younger makeup almost 22 percent of the population, the Somerset County Library System of New Jersey (SCLSNJ) provides inclusive spaces for students to discover new experiences; form connections with their community; and explore opportunities through programs, resources, materials, and services.

In order to continue to enrich the lives of tweens and teens in the community, SCLSNJ will participate in TeenTober, a month-long commemoration organized by the Young Adult Library Services Association (YALSA) that "aims to celebrate teens and promote year-round teen services and literacies," throughout October.

During TeenTober the Library System will offer a series of virtual and in-branch programs that focus on creative expression, traditional and digital literacy, workforce development, and peer-to-peer engagement.

According to YALSA, libraries "have a strong track record of providing a variety of key services that meet the unique needs of teens." In fact, data has shown that approximately 97 percent of public libraries have a designated section for teen materials.

In addition to programming, available digital resources include Brainfuse HelpNow, which offers free one-on-one online tutoring, a writing lab, and more; and LearningExpress Library, which provides interactive tutorials, practice tests, e-books, and other tools for academic skillbuilding and test preparation.






